"THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, No. 11 of 1920."

THE following by laws made by the Matara Urban District Council, under sections 164 and 168 (6) (d) and (e) of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920, and approved by the Local Government Board, have been confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, and are published for general information under section 166 (1).

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the District Council area, or for his heirs, or any one of them, or the legal representative of such mortgagee if diseased, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council, and every person holding any such mortgage, and desiring to have it registered, shall either by himself or by his agent furnish the Council with his name and address and with the name and address of the owner or mortgagor of the property so mortgaged, together with any other particulars connected with its description or otherwise necessary for the proper identification of the property; and thereupon, and upon the payment of a fee of fifty cents to be paid by such person, the Council shall cause the aforesaid particulars to be entered in a book kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

2. Every such register shall at all times, during the office hours of the Council, be open to the inspection of any person desiring to have such inspection, on payment

of a fee of twenty-five cents to the Council.

3. In the event of any property concerning which any such mortgage shall have been registered as herein above provided being seized in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, the Council shall at least fourteen days before advertising such property for sale, post or deliver to the party who shall have registered such mortgage notice in writing of the said seizure and of the amount of arrears of rates, taxes, or charges for the realization of which such property shall have been seized.

4. It shall be lawful for any such mortgagee, or for his heirs, or any one of them, or for his legal representative, to pay to the Council, at any time before the sale of such property seized as aforesaid, all arrears of rates, taxes, or charges, or the arrears in respect of which the seizure shall have been made, due by the owner or mortgagor of such property, and upon such payment being made the property shall be released

from seizure.

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Council, have been pleased, by virtue of the powers vested in Us under section 3 (2) of the said Ordinance, to authorize the purpose for which the said Society has been established as a purpose to which the powers and facilities of the said Ordinance ought

THE following regulations for admission of students for training in the Departmental Training School for Surveyors and for admission as Clerks and Draughtsmen to the Surveyor-General's Office are published for general information. The regulations published in the Notification dated January 2, 1920, and promulgated in the Government Gazette of February 6, 1920, are hereby cancelled.

Regulations referred to.

A .- FOR APPOINTMENTS IN THE DEPARTMENT.

(a) As Surveyors.

(1) Admission.—Candidates should apply for a nomination to take up the examination for entrance to the Departmental Class in the Training School for surveyors on the prescribed form. The date of the examination will be advertised from time to time in the Government Gazette and the local papers. No appointments to the field will be made except through the Training School.

2) Candidates must not be less than 19 or more than 25 years of age.

(3) Candidates will be required to furnish the following certificates, and must attach them to the form referred to in paragraph 4 below:-

(a) A certificate of age.

(b) A certificate of respectability and good moral character from two or more persons whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability.

(c) Elementary School-leaving Certificate, or its equivalent

(4) Candidates will be required to fill in an entry form, which can be obtained on application to the Surveyor-This form must be presented in person to the Assistant Surveyor-General at Colombo, accompanied by the certificates referred to in paragraph 3, or to the Superintendent of Surveys in a Province.

(5) Subjects for the examination are-

(i.) Mathematics-

(a) Arithmetic.

Algebra (up to and including quadratic equations):

- (c) Geometry (theorems and problems on the following:—angles at a point; parallel straight lines; side and angle properties of triangles and parallelograms; areas of triangles and quadrilaterals; the chord, angle, and tangent properties of the circle; the properties of the right-angled triangle).
- (ii.) English Composition (Essay).

(6) Candidates who are successful in the examination will be charged a fee of Rs. 5 for the medical examination, which will be held by the Principal Civil Medical Officer to ascertain if the candidates is physically fit to undertake the duties of a Surveyor. (7) Conditions of Admission to the Training School.—Securities for the sum of Rs. 100 in two sureties must be furnish

on admission, to cover the cost of lost stores or damage to instruments through wilful neglect or gross carelessness. Candidates, on selection for the Training School, will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve,

on the completion of their training, for a period of three years as Third Grade Surveyors.

(8) Payment of Students.—Candidates whose progress after one month at the Training School is such as to make them suitable for further training will receive Rs. 20 a month while in Colombo and Rs. 35 a month while completing their training out of Colombo, on condition that their progress is satisfactory.

(9) Course in the Field.—After completing a course of instruction in Colombo, such students as are proficient will

be sent out of Colombo to complete their practical training.

(10) Appointments to the Field.—Students will receive appointments as soon as they are reported fit to take up duty as Third Grade Surveyors. Surveyors will be appointed on probation for three years. If at any time during this period their work is found to be unsatisfactory or they are guilty of misconduct, their services will be dispensed with by the Surveyor-General, in which case they will render themselves liable to forfeit the cost of their training. (11) Pay and Conditions of Promotion.—Grade III.: The number in this grade is 190 at Rs. 1,200 to Rs. 3,600 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 120.

Grade II.: The number in this grade is 60 at Rs. 2,880 to Rs. 4,440 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 120. Grade I.: The number in this grade is 30 at Rs. 4,600 to Rs. 6,000 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 200.

Promotion to Grade II. is contingent on a surveyor passing the Junior Fxamination. He will be allowed to take examination after a year's service in Grade III. When he passes, he will be given a special increase of salary equal up the examination after a year's service in Grade III. to seven annual increments, i.e., Rs. 840, or the difference between his salary at date of passing and Rs. 2,760, whichever He will be required to serve a year on Rs. 2,760 before receiving promotion to Grade II. Similarly, he will not be entitled to promotion to Grade I. until he has completed a year's service on the maximum of Grade II., viz., Rs. 4,440.

A surveyor will be eligible to take the Senior Examination on passing the Junior, whatever his position may be

On passing the Senior Examination he becomes eligible for promotion to Assistant Superintendentship, provided he is suitable in every way. If not suitable, he at once becomes eligible for the Grade I. on a salary of Rs. 4,600 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 200 to Rs. 6,000. If suitable and there are no vacancies, he will draw the top increment of Grade I. until a vacancy occurs.

Promotion to the various grades will be contingent on the occurrence of vacancies.

Increments will only be paid, provided the officer gives satisfaction to the Surveyor-General in the discharge of the duties entrusted to him.

In order to pass in any part of the examination candidates must pass in all papers in that part.

The percentage of marks required for a pass is 50 in all papers of Part I., and 60 in all papers of Farts II. and III.

Candidates may present themselves for all three parts of the examination, or for the first two Parts only, or for the first part only, or for the second part only; or, if fully exempt from the first part, in the second and third parts, or

in the second part only, or in the third part only.

Candidates passing in any part or parts of the examination may pass in the remaining parts or part at a subsequent. examination, but candidates not exempt from the first part must take and pass in it at the same time as, or before, the

Exemptions from Part I.

Graduates of any University in the British Empire will be exempted from Fart I., provided they have taken Mathematics as part of their degree course; also holders of any of the following certificate:

London Intermediate Arts or Science, provided certificate includes Pure Mathematics.

London Matriculation, provided certificate includes Mathematics (more advanced).

Cambridge Senior, provided certificate includes Geometry, Algebra, and paper I. (Algebra and Trigonometry) of more advanced Mathematics.

Officers appointed from England through the Colonial Office, and Ceylonese probationers who have passed the entrance examination to the Training Class for Assistant Superintendents of Surveys, will also be exempted from Part I. of the examination.

EXEMPTIONS.

The examinations in 1923, 1924, and 1925 will be held concurrently on the old and new syllabuses, the pass percentages of the old regulations (viz.: 75 in technical and 50 in mathematical papers) remaining in force for the examinations under the old regulations.

The examination in 1926 will be held only under the new regulations.

After 1925, or at any time before, an officer who has not completed his examination under the old regulations may be granted exemptions, as defined below, from the examination conducted under the new regulations; but, having once elected to be examined under the new regulations, he will not be allowed to take a subsequent examination under the old regulations.

Part I.

Candidates who have passed under the old regulations in all of: Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, and Mensuration will be exempted from Part I. under the new regulations on passing only in English.

Part II.

Candidates who have passed under the old regulations in all of: Departmental Orders, Surveying and Levelling, and Engineering Surveys will be exempted from Part II. under the new regulations.

Part III.

No candidate will be granted exemption from Part III. unless he is entitled to full or partial exemption from Part I. Candidates who are entitled to full or partial exemption from Part I. will be exempted from Part III. under the new regulations if they have passed under the old regulations in all of: Triangulation, use of instruments, and reports on surveys.

Optional questions will also be set on the following: —The plane table and accessories. Intersection. Resection. Contouring. The determination of differences of height by the clinometer.]

- (viii.) Levelling.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Cross sections and the computation of earthwork.]

(ix.) Pian Drawing.

The percentage of marks required for a pass will be 50 in subjects (i.), (ii.), (vi.), (vii.), (viii.), and (ix.), and 33 in subjects (iii.), (iv.), and (v.).

Candidates will be required to pass in at least four subjects at their first examination, and will be allowed to pass in single subjects at subsequent examinations.

EXEMPTIONS.

The examinations in 1923, 1924, and 1925 will be held concurrently on the old and new syllabuses, but the pass percentages for the remaining examinations under the old regulations will be: in English Composition, Arithmetic, Surveying and Levelling, Adjustments of the theodolite and level, Plan Drawing, and Departmental Orders 50; in Geometry, Mensuration, and Trigonometry 33.

The examination in 1926 will be held only under the new regulations.

After 1925, or at any time before, an officer who has not completed his examination under the old regulations may be granted exemptions, as defined below, from the examination conducted under the new regulations; but, having once elected to be examined under the new regulations, he will not be allowed to take a subsequent examination under the old regulations.

Candidates who have passed under the old regulations in any of the following subjects (common to both syllabuses) will be exempted in those subjects in the examination under the new regulations:—English Composition, Arithmetic,

Geometry, Trigonometry, Departmental Orders, Plan Drawing.

Candidates who have passed under the old regulations in both surveying and levelling and adjustments of the theodolite and level will be exempted in both surveying and levelling in the examination under the new regulations, but candidates who have passed in either surveying and levelling or adjustments of the theodolite and level, but not in both, will not be entitled to exemption in either surveying or levelling in the examination under the new regulations.

There will be no exemption in the subject / lgebra in the examination under the new regulations.

Candidates who have passed under the old regulations in three or more subjects will be allowed exemption in the corresponding subjects under the new regulations (subject to the exceptions stated above) even if the number of subjects in which they are entitled to exemption is less than three.

Candidates must not be less than 17 or more than 23 years of age.

Candidates will be required to furnish the following certificates, and must attach them to the form referred to below:—

(a) A certificate of age.

NOTE.

(b) A certificate of respectability and good moral character from two or more persons, whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability.

(c) An Elementary School-leaving Certificate, or its equivalent.

Candidates will be required to fill in an entry form, which can be obtained on application to the Surveyor-General. This form must be presented in person to the Assistant Surveyor-General at Colombo, accompanied by the certificates referred to above, or to the Superintendent of Surveys in a Province.

The following are the subjects for the examination:—

Elementary Arithmetic.

English: Essay and Handwriting.

Plan Drawing.

Successful candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from a Government Medical Officer, testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island.

(2) Pay and Conditions of Promotion.—Clerks and Draughtsmen, Class III., will receive pay at the rate of Rs. 480 per annum, rising to Rs. 1,200 per annum, by annual increments of Rs. 48, with efficiency bars before Rs. 768 and Rs. 912.

Appointments to vacancies in Class II. of the fixed establishment will be made on the results of an open competitive examination, held annually.

Application for admission to the examination by persons not in the Survey Department must be addressed to the Director of Education, bearing a duly cancelled revenue stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the proper form, which can be

obtained from the Surveyor-General.

A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to be on the first day of the examination between the ages of 17 and 23, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application.

Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who have completed three years' service and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Surveyor-General.

The examination will be held at Colombo only, in the place and under the supervision of the officer specified in the Gazette notice, vide General Order 412.

The number of places assigned for competition will be notified in the Gazette.

Successful candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from a Government Medical Officer, testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island.

(b) Geometry will include questions on the ground governed by Euclid Books I., II., III., and IV., with deductions. Algebra will include definitions, the theory of indices, greatest common measure and least common multiple, extraction of square root, simplification of fractions, solution of simple and quadratic equations, and of problems producing such equations, the elementary rules of ratio and proportion, arithmetical and geometrical progressions, permutations, and combinations.

(c) Shorthand: Candidates will be required to write at a speed of 80 words a minute and to transcribe the shorthand

into longhand.

Typewriting: Candidates will be required to type accurately at a speed of 30 words a minute. Special attention will be paid to correct fingering. (Candidates may use their own typewriters.)

(d) Geometrical Drawing: Construction of triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons, and circles, from given data. Division of the circle and measurement of angles. Proportional division of lines, including third, fourth, and mean proportionals. Construction of scales. Problems relating to areas. Construction of the ellipse, drawing of its tangents and normals. Drawing of curves defined by simple conditions and forms of arches. Inscribing and describing rectilinear figures and circles within and about others. Application of geometrical construction to patterns drawn to scale. Plans and elevations of simple right solids, such as cube, cone, cylinder, prism, sphere, square, and hexagonal pyramid in easy positions.

Freehand Drawing: From a photograph or print. The examination will be designed to test the power of the candidates to draw accurately and intelligently. The drawings are to be executed in pencil.

(e) Draughtsmanship: The paper on this subject will be confined to drawing, colouring, and printing of a plan. Process Work: This paper may include any question on the methods and materials used in process and photo-

graphic work, as well as a practical test.

(g) Meteorological Office Work: This paper will cover such points as the decoding, checking, and reduction of outstation weather reports as received by telegram or post and the preparation of these statistics for publication whether in daily, monthly, or annual returns, together with general questions of procedure arising in the course of such work. The examination will not include observational work of the type for which an allowance is paid to observers, either in Colombo or elsewhere, in addition to their salaries, but will deal primarily with the work that is done in ordinary office hours by those who specialize in this branch, and for whom it occupies the place equivalent to that held by process work or plan drawing in the branches concerned.

The General Paper in English may include questions in English History, Geography, and Literature.

The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in handwriting, spelling, and arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for handwriting, or half the marks allotted for spelling or for arithmetic, will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred will be that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand.

The second part of the examination is in the remaining subjects. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 30 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted

for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

24. Any person who shall cut away the toe of the bank supporting an ela shall

be guilty of an offence.

When a breach occurs in the ela vella of any field, the Vel-Muladeniya shall inspect and report if the breach was due to unavoidable causes or was the result of the action or neglect of the cultivator. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 23, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 142 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 22 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 29.7, as against 20.5 in the preceding week, 24.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 143 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29 9, as against 35 8 in the previous week, 34 5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31 2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 143 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 42 in the preceding week, 49 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.-1. (a) Twenty-three deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 5 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 34 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in Pettah and San Sebastian, and 1 each

in New Bazaar and Slave Island as against 2 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

- 2. Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in Maradana hospital (of non residents) and Kotahena North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 9 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- Two deaths from Plague were registered, leach in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, as against nil in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.
 - 5. Fourteen deaths each were registered from Enteritis and Debility, 10 from Infantile Convulsions, 3 from Worms, each from Diarrhoea, Tetanus and Chickenpox and 50 from Other Cause.
- Fourteen cases of Chickenpox, 12 of Measles, 3 of Enteric Fever, and 2 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 20, 4, 5 and 3 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81 · 1°, against 81 · 7° in the preceding week and 82 · 7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.848 in., against 29.858 in. in the preceding week and 29.805 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.16 in., against 0.78 in. in the preceding week, and 0.30 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE LAXAPANAGALLA TEA ESTATES, LIMITED.

Ir is agreed as follows :--

1. Table C not to apply; Company to be governed by these Articles.—The regulations contained in Table C in the Schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

Power to alter the Regulations.—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or be lent on shares of the Company.

INTERPRETATION.

4. Interpretation Clause.—In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context:—

Company.—The word "Company" means "The Laxapanagalla Tea Estates, Limited," incorporated or established

by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The Ordinance.—"The Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinances, 1861 to 1918," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

Special Resolution.—"Special resolution" has the meaning assigned thereto by the Ordinance.

Extraordinary Resolution.—"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and

value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present at any meeting of the Company of which notice specifying an intention to propose such resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly. given.

These Presents.—" These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

Capital.—"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the

Shares.—" Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

Shareholder.—" Shareholder" means a Shareholder of the Company.

Presence or Present.—With regard to a Shareholder "presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present

personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

*Directors.—" Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors.

assembled at a Board.

Board.—"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a

Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

Persons.—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—" Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Com Seal.—" Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company. -" Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

Month.—" Month" means a calendar month.

Writing.—"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Singular and Plural Number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa. Masculine and Feminine Gender.—Words importing the mesculine gender only include the feminine, and vice verse.

BUSINESS.

5. Commencement of Business.—The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

6. Business to be carried on by Directors.—The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these

presents.

CAPITAL.

Nominal Capital.—The nominal capital of the Company is Five hundred thousand Rupees (Rs. 500,000) divided into Fifty thousand (50,000) shares of Ten Rupees (Rs. 10) each.

SHARES.

Allotment and Issue.—The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper; provided that such unissued shares shall be first offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares already held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors, may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company; provided also that the Directors may at their discretion allot any unissued shares in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company and may make arrangements on an issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid, and the time of payment of such calls.

9. Payment of Amount of Shares by Instalments.—If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalments shall, when due, be paid to the Company

10. Acceptance.—Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

11. Payment.—Payment for shares shall be made in such manner as the Directors shall from time to time determine and direct.

12. Shares held by a Firm.—Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies, but not more than one partner may vote at a time.

Shares held by two or more Persons not in Partnership.—Shares may be registered in the names of two or more

persons not in partnership.

14. One of Joint-holders other than a Firm may give Receipts; only one of Joint-holders resident in Ceylon entitled to Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint Shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

15. Survivor of Joint-holders, other than a Firm, only recognized.—In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders, other than a firm, of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

16. Liability of Joint-holders.—The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment

17. Trusts or any Interest in Share other than that of Registered Holder or of any Person under Article 38 not recognized .- The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under Article 38 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

18. Increase of Capital by Creation of new Shares.—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution from time to time, increase the capital by creation of new shares of such amount per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

Issue of new Shares.—The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct; and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting. The Directors shall have power to add to such new shares such an amount of

premium as they may consider proper.

20. How carried into Effect.—Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them. 22. Reduction of Capital and Subdivision or Consolidation of Shares.—The Company in General Meeting may by special resolution reduce the capital in such manner as such special resolution shall direct, and may by special resolution subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company or any of them.

SHARE CERTIFICATES.

23. Certificates how issued .- Every Shareholder shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or to several certificates, each for one or more of such shares. Every certificate shall specify the number of the share in respect of which it is issued.

Certificates to be nder Seal of Company.—The certificates of shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company. Renewal of Certificate. -- If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors

they may order the same to be cancelled and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or cestroyed, then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

26. Certificate to be delivered to the First named of Joint holders not a Firm.—The certificate of shares registered on the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first named on the register.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. Exercise of Rights.—No person shall exercise any right of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the register of Shareholders and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on every share in the Company held by him.

Transfer of Shares.—Subject to the restriction of these Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of

his shares by instrument in writing.

29. No Transfer to Minor or Person of Unsound Mind.—No transfer of shares shall be made to a minor or person of unsound mind.

30. Register of Transfers.—The Company shall keep a book or books to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

31. Instrument of Transfer.—The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

32. Board may decline to register Transfers.—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise; or to any person not approved by them.

33. Not bound to state Reason.—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the

- Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute. 34. Registration of Transfer.—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered,
- accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rs. 2.50, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid, and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 32, 33, and 35, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.
- 35. Directors may authorize Registration of Transferees.—The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

36. Directors not bound to inquire as to Validity of Transfer. - In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously

declared in respect thereof, but, if at all, upon the transferee only.

37. Transfer Books when to be closed.—The Transfer Books may be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also, when a dividend is declared, for the three days next ensuing the Meeting; also at such other times as the Directors may decide, not exceeding in the

whole twenty-one days in any one year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

38. Tills to Shares of Deceased Holder.—The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder

shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to shares of such Shareholder.

39. Registration of Persons entitled to Shares otherwise than by Transfer.—Any curator of any minor Shareholder, any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares on payment of a fee of Rs. 2.50; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers

hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

40. Failing such Registration, Shares may be sold by the Company.—If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under Article 39 shall not, from any cause whatever, within 12 calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such share, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same; the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

41. The Directors may accept Surrender of Shares.—The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon a surrender of the shares of Shareholders

who may be desirous of retiring from the Company.

42. (a) If Call or Instalment be not paid, Notice to be given to Shareholder.—If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the trustee or assignee in his bankruptcy, requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accured, at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by

reason of such non-payment.

(b) Terms of Notice.—The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid; the notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in

respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

(c) In Default of Payment, Shares to be forfeited.—If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

(d) Shareholder still liable to pay Money owing at Time of Forfeiture.—Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at 9 per cent. per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

43. Surrendered or Forfeited Shares to be the Property of the Company, and may be sold, &c.—Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

44. Effect of Surrender or Forfeiture.—The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof,

and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

45. (a) Certificates of Surrender or Forfeiture.—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Agents or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture; such certificate and the receipt of the 💝 Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company; such purchaser thereupon shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase, and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

(b) Forfeiture may be remitted.—The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit, as they shall think fit, not being less than 9 per cent. per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share bona fide sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 43 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

46. Company's Lien on Shares.—The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of othershares held by such holder or joint-holders or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls, resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

Lien how made Available. -Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

48. Proceeds how applied.—The nett proceeds of any such sale as aforesaid under the provisions of Articles 43 and 47.

hereof shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) shall be

paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

Certificate of Sale. —A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries that the power of sale given by Article 47 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

50. Transfer on Sale how executed:—Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title

to such shares.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

51. Preference and Deferred Shares.—Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right of preference, whether in respect of dividend or of payment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may, from time to time, by special resolution, determine.

52. Modification of Rights and Consent thereto.—If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the

capital is divided into shares of different classes-

(1) The holders of any class or shares by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders may consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares;

(2) All orany of the rights, privileges, and conditions attached to each class may be commuted, abrogated, abandoned, added to, or otherwise modified by a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, provided the holders of any class of shares affected by any such commutation, abrogation, abandonment, addition, or other modification of such rights, privileges, and conditions, consent thereto on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, by an

extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders.

Any extraordinary resolution passed under the provisions of this Article shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent as aforesaid in any

case in which but for this Article the object of the resolution could have been effected without it.

53. Meeting affecting a particular Class of Shares.—Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no Shareholder, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any Shareholder personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

CALLS.

(a) Directors may make Calls.—The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the registered holders of shares in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call.

(b) Calls, Time when made.—A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution authorizing.

the call was passed at a Board Meeting of the Directors or by resolution in writing in terms of Article 121.

(c) Extension of Time for Payment of Call.—The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

Interest on Unpaid Call.—If the sum payable in respect of any call or instalment is not paid on or before the day appointed for the payment thereof, the holder for the time being of the share in respect of which the call shall have been made, or the instalments shall have been due, shall paylinterest for the same at the rate of 9 per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment there of to the time of the actual payment, but the Directors may, when they think fit, remit

altogether or in part any sum becoming payable for interest under this clause.

56. Payments in Anticipation of Calls.—The Directors may at their discretion receive from any Shareholder willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the amount of his shares beyond the sum

actually called up.

Borrowing Powers.

57. Power to Borrow.—The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, but so that the amount at any one time owing in respect of moneys so borrowed or raised shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed the sum of Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 50,000). The Directors shall, with the sanction of a General Meeting, be entitled to borrow or raise such further sum or sums, and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. The Directors may, for the purpose of securing the repayment of any such sum or sums of money so borrowed or raised, create and issue any mortgages, debentures, mortgage debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, property, and rights or assets of the Company (both present and future), including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or give, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange. Provided also that before the Directors execute any mortgage, issue any debentures, or create any bebenture stock they shall obtain the sanction thereto of the Company in General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, notice of the intention to obtain such sanction at such meeting having been duly given. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled or discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued. A declaration under the Company's seal contained in or endorsed upon any of the documents mentioned in this Article and subscribed by two or more of the Directors, or by one Director and the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, to the effect that the Directors have power to borrow the amount which such document may represent, shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors, and no such document containing such declaration shall, as regards the creditor, be void on the ground of its being granted in excess of the aforesaid borrowing power, unless it shall be proved that such creditor was aware that it was so granted.

MEETINGS.

58. First General Meeting.—The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. Subsequent General Meetings. - Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place

as may be determined by the Directors.
60. Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.—The General Meetings mentioned in the two last preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General

Meetings.

61. Extraordinary General Meetings.—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one seventh of the number of

Shareholders holding not less than one seventh of the issued capital and entitled to vote.

Requisition of Shareholders to state Object of Meeting; on Receipt of Requisition, Directors to call Meeting, and in Default Shareholders may do so.—Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and at such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

63. Notice of Resolution.—Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the

Company.

64. Seven Days' Notice of Meeting to be given.—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomseover convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given either by advertisement in the Ceylon Government Gazette or by notice sent by post, or otherwise served as hereinafter provided, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate the

proceedings at any General Meeting.
65. Business requiring and not requiring Notification.—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat. to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever of which special mention shall have been made in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

66. Notice of other Business to be given.—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or

notices upon which it was convened.

67. Quorum to be Present.—No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or the election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business two or more persons, being Shareholders entitled to vote, or persons holding proxies

or powers of attorney from Shareholders entitled to vote.

68. If a Quorum not present, Meeting to be dissolved or adjourned; Adjourned Meeting to transact Business.—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of persons shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

69. Chairman of Directors or a Director to be Chairman of General Meeting; in Case of their Absence or Refusal, a Shareholder may act.—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; but if there be no Chairman, or if at any Meeting he shall not be present within 15 whether ordinary or extraordinary; but it there be no Chairman, or it at any Meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

70. Business confined to Election of Chairman while Chair Vacant.—No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting except the election of a Chairman whilst the chair is vacant.

71. Chairman with Consent may adjourn Meeting.—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall be given,

72. Minutes of General Meetings.—Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as preadicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

Votes.—At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present. In case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney; and unless a poll be immediately demanded in writing by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

Poll.—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other demanded.

than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

Poll how taken.—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by notice in writing signed by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall if necessary be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such a manner as the Chairman shall direct; and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

76. No Poll on Election of Chairman or on Question of Adjournment.—No poll shall be demanded on the election of a

Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

Voting in Person or by Proxy or Attorney.—Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney

duly authorized.

78. Number of Votes to which Shareholder entitled.—On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person or by attorney duly authorized shall have one vote only. In case of a poll every Shareholder present in person or by proxy or attorney shall have one vote for every one share held by him up to ten shares; he shall have an additional vote for every ten shares held by him beyond the first ten shares up to one hundred shares; an additional vote for every twentyfive shares beyond the first one hundred shares. When voting on a resolution involving the sale of the Company's estates or any of them or any part or portion thereof, or the winding up of the Company, every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

79. Curator of Minor, &c., when not entitled to vote.—The parent or curator of a minor Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such person as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such minor, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such

person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

80. Non-Shareholder not to be appointed Proxy; but Attorney, though not Shareholder, may vote.-No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but the attorney of a Shareholder, even though not himself a Shareholder of the Company, may represent and vote for his principal at any meeting of the Company.

Shareholder in Arrear or not registered at least Three Months previous to the Meeting not to vote.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote or speak at any General Meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares, or any of them, shall have been paid; and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote or speak at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of or as the holder of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote or speak, duly registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote or speak,

82. Proxy to be Printed or in Writing.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointor, or if such appointor be a corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such corporation.

83. When Proxy to be deposited.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

84. Form of Proxy.—Any instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form:—

to represent me and to vote for me and on my behalf at the Ordinary (or Extraordinary, as the case may be)

Objection to Validity of Vote to be made at the Meeting or Poll.—No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney), except at the meeting or poll at which such vote shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

86. No Shareholder to be prevented from Voting by being personally interested in Result.—No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

DIRECTORS.

87. Number of Directors.—The number of Directors shall never be less than two nor more than five. In the event of the number of Directors in Ceylon ever being reduced to one, such remaining Director shall immediately cause to be convened an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Shareholders for the purpose of filling up one or more of the vacancies; but, in the event of a quorum of Shareholders not attending such meeting, the remaining Director shall himself appoint a Director to fill one of the vacancies. Any Director so appointed shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting of the Company. Until such appointment the remaining Director shall not act except for the purpose of appointing

another, and if necessary enabling him to be placed on the register of Shareholders.

88. Their Qualification and Remuneration.—The qualification of a Director shall be his holding shares in the Company, whether fully paid up or partly paid up, of the total nominal value of at least One thousand Rupees (Rs. 1,000), and upon which, in the case of partly paid up shares, all calls for the time being shall have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Five thousand Rupees (Rs. 1,000) annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration for special or extra services hereinafter referred to nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company,

Appointment of First Directors and Duration of their Office.—The first Directors shall be Herbert Joseph Hanscomb of Colombo, Percy John Parsons of Colombo, and William John Rodney Hamilton of Ythanside, Kotagalla, who shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall all retire, but shall be

eligible for re-election.

Directors may appoint Managing Director or Directors; his or their Remuneration -One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Visiting Agents of the Company, or Superintendent or Superintendents of any of the Company's estates, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office; and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents, Superintendent or Superintendents, and the Directors may impose and confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be imposed or conferred on any Manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

91. Appointment of Successors to Directors.—The General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent General Meeting. No person, not being a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any General Meeting, unless he or some other Shareholder intending to propose him has, at least seven clear days before the meeting, left, at the Office, a notice in writing under his hand signifying his candi-

dature for the appointment or the intention of such Shareholder to propose him.

92. Board may fill up Vacancies.—The Board shall have power at any time and from time to time before the first Ordinary General Meeting to supply any vacancies in their number arising from death, resignation, or otherwise

93. Duration of Office of Director appointed to Vacancy.—Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors subsequent to the First Ordinary General Meeting may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

94. To retire annually.—At the Second Ordinary General Meeting and at the Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year, one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in Article 95.

95. Retiring Directors how determined.—The Directors to retire from office at the Second and Third General Meetings shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

Retiring Directors eligible for Re-election.—Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

97. Decision of Question as to Retirement.—In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

Number of Directors how increased or reduced.—The Directors, subject to the approval of a General Meeting, may from time to time at any time subsequent to the Second Ordinary General Meeting increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also, subject to the like approval, determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

99. If Election not made, Retiring Directors to continue until next Meeting.—If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place the place of the retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up,

unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

Resignation of Directors.—A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary, or by leaving the same at the office, or by tendering his written resignation at a

meeting of the Directors.

- 101. No contract, arrangement, or transaction entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director, or with any company or co-partnership of which a Director is a partner, or of which he is a Director, Managing Director, or Manager, shall be void or voidable, nor shall such Director be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by such contract, arrangement, or transaction by reason only of such Director holding that office, or of the fiduciary relation thereby established, provided that the fact of his interest or connection therewith be fully disclosed to the Company or its Directors.
 - When Office of Director to be vacated.—The office of the Director shall be vacated—
 - (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, or Secretary under the Company.
 - (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent or suspends payment or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
 - (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
 - (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office,
 - (e) If he is concerned or participates in the profits of any contract with, or work done for, the Company.
 - (f) If he ceases to ordinarily reside in Ceylon, or is absent from Ceylon for a period of six consecutive months.

Exceptions.—But the above rule shall be subject to the following exceptions:—That no Director shall vacate his office by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for, the Company, of which he is a Director, or by his being agent, or secretary, or proctor, or by his being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or proctors, of the Company; nevertheless, he shall not vote in respect of any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested.

103. How Directors removed and Successors appointed.—The Company may, by an extraordinary resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place

he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

104. Indemnity to Directors and Others for their Own Acts and for the Acts of Others.—Every Director or officer and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him respectively in or about the discharge of his respective duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, shall be liable for any other Director or officer, or for joining in any receipt or other acts of conformity, or for any loss or expense happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

105. No Contribution to be required from Directors beyond Amount, if any, unpaid on their Shares.—No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect

of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

Powers of Directors.

106. The Directors shall have power to purchase or otherwise acquire the said Laxapanagalla and Gallawatte

estates, as on and from the 1st day of May, 1923.

107. To manage Business of Company and pay Preliminary Expenses, &c.—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director, or with the assistance of an Agent or Agents and Secretary or Secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors for such period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors may pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, or acquisition of the said Laxapanagalla and Gallawatte estates, and the purchase, lease, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and in or about the working and business of the Company.

108. To acquire Property, to appoint Officers, and pay Expenses.—The Directors shall have power to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, or otherwise acquire for the Company any estate or estates, land or lands, property, rights, options, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire at such price and for such consideration and upon such title and generally on such terms and conditions as they may think fit; and to make and they may make such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and for that purpose may appoint such managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, buyers and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods and with such remune ration and at such salaries and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants, for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause.

109. To appoint Proctors and Attorneys.—The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms as

they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

110. To open Banking Accounts and operate thereon, &c. The Directors shall have power to open on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

To sell and dispose of Company's Property, &c.—It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, lands, and effects of the Company or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, or the assignment of the whole or any part or parts of its leasehold interests in any estate or estates, land or lands, or the sub-lease of the whole or any part or parts thereof to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or a special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary

the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

112. General Powers.—The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and in addition to the powers and authorities by the Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artizans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by the Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by the Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Ordinance and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulation made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made. The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

Special Powers.—In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers 113. conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say):—

(1) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or legal proceedings by and against the Company, or its officers or otherwise, concerning the affairs of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims and demands by and against the Company.

(2) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform the awards. (3) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims

and demands of the Company.

(4) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.

(5) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not immediately required for

the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time

to vary or release such investments.

(6) From time to time to provide for the management of the affairs of the Company abroad in such manner as they th nk fit, and to establish any local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company abroad, and to appoint any persons to be members of such local board or any managers or agents and to fix their

remuneration.

(7) From time to time and at any time to delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers hereby made exercisable by the Directors, excel t those relating to shares, and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained; and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of and at any time to remove such Director or other person or Company and to annul or vary any such delegation. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any Company and to annul or vary any such delegation. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any agent of the Company or other person, except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

114. Meeting of Directors.—The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

115. A Director may summon Meetings of Directors.—A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors. Who is to preside at Meetings of Board.—The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

117. Questions at Meetings how decided.—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be

decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition

to his vote as a Director.

118. Board may appoint Committees.—The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

119. Acts of Board or Committee valid notwithstanding informal Appointment.—The acts of the Board or of any committee appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed,

and as if every person had been duly appointed, provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.

120. Regulation of Proceedings of Committees.—The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

121. Resolution in Writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a Meeting of Directors.—A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being resident in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a

meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted, provided that not fewer than two Directors shall sign it.

122. Minutes of Proceedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.—The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, videlicet:

- (a) Of all appointments of officers and committees made by the Directors.
- (b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.
- (c) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings.
- (d) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors and of the committees appointed by the Board.
- (e) Of all orders made by the Directors.
- (f) Of the use of the Company's seal.

123. Signature of Minutes of Proceedings and Effect thereof.—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively; and all minutes perporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be prima facie evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded. and of the regularity of the Meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

COMPANY'S SEAL,

124. The Use of the Seal.—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed, certificate of shares, or other instrument, except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Agents and Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Agents and Secretaries, in the ovent of a firm being the Agents and Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, attorney, or agent of the said firm signing the firm name or the firm name per procurationem or signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Agents and Secretaries, and in the event of a company registered under the Ordinance being the Agents and Secretaries, being signified by a Director or the Secretary or the duly authorized Attorney of such company signing for and on behalf of such company as Agents and Secretaries. The sealing shall not be attested by one person in the dual capacity of Director and representative of the Agents and Secretaries.

ACCOUNTS.

125. What Accounts to be kept .- The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors, shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company; and the accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

126. Accounts how and when open to Inspection .- The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders; and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the Ordinance or authorized by

the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet to be furnished to General Meeting.—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the profit and loss account for the preceding financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up as at the end of the same period.

Report to accompany Statement.—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and 128. condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend

or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

129. Copy of Balance Sheet to be sent to Shareholders.—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

130. Declaration of Dividend.—The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amounts paid

on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

(a) Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part in sterling by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company or of any other company, or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction; and where any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution, they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets, or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed, in order to adjust the right of all parties.

131. Interim Dividend.—The Directors may also, if they think fit, from time to time and at any time, without the

sanction of a General Meeting, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Share-

holders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.

132. Reserve Fund.—Previously to the Directors paying or recommending any dividend on preference or ordinary shares, they may set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they shall think fit, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

133. Application thereof.—The Directors may from time to time apply such portions as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for the payment of accumulated dividends due on preference shares, or for equalizing dividends or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they may from time to time deem expedient.

Unpaid Interest or Dividend not to bear Interest.—No unpaid interest or dividend or bonus shall ever bear 134.

interest against the Company.

135. No Shareholder to receive Dividend while Debt due to Company.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

136. Directors may deduct Debt from the Dividends.—The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company

and, notwithstanding, such sums shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

137. Dividends may be paid by Cheque or Warrant and sent through the Post.—Unless otherwise directed any dividend may be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post to the registered address of the Shareholder entitled, or, in the case of joint-holders, to the registered address of that one whose name stands first on the register in respect of the jointholding; but the Company shall not be liable or responsible for the loss of any such cheque or dividend warrant sent through the post.



Other products: prices of green tea leaf and rubber have gone down somewhat. Good prices realized for kapok.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 7 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6 to Rs. 8 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 11 per 100 nuts; salt, 14 cents to 16 cents per measure.

Health of inhabitants: satisfactory. Fever and soreeyes prevailed in villages.

Health of cattle: hoof-and-mouth disease occured at Mailapitiya, Haragama, and Hatton.

Weather: a dry month.

SEASON REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1923.

CENTRAL PROVINCE. KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy: yala in plants. In some parts plants are dying owing to the drought. If the drought continues the maha cultivation will be impossible.

Dry grain: chenas being cleared.

Coconuts: flowering not satisfactory—the drought having had an adverse effect.

Other products: there has been a drop in the price of green tea leaf and rubber. Kapok fetch good prices.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 7 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6 50 to Rs. 8 per bushel; coconuts Rs. 6 to Rs. 11 per 100 nuts; salt, 14 cents to 16 cents per measure.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 21, 1923, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 17, 1923.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Dr. A. de Saram; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Mr. P. M. Bingham; and Mr. W. D. Perera.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 17, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

The following documents were submitted :-

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1922, to March 31, 1923, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

Health Officer's report for March.

(d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March.

(e) The reservoir readings for March.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies,

standpipes, and house service taps inspected during March.
4. Correspondence:—(1) Endorsement No. 4 of March 23, 1923, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re the proposed Infectious Diseases Hospital for Kandy.—Read.

Resolved that papers be circulated and brought up at the next Meeting of Council.

(2) Letter No. 6 of April 11, 1923, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary nominating Mr. P. M. Bingham to be a

Member of the Municipal Council, Kandy, as from April 4, 1923, vice Mr. J. Oorfoff, resigned.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 1,600 of April 6, 1923, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, re the proposed rail motor service.—Read.

(4) Letter of April 11, 1923, from the Assessor, Municipal Council, Colombo, re the assessment of Government

properties.—Resolved that the papers be circulated.

(5) Letter of April 4, 1923, from Mr. J. Oorloff resigning his seat as nominated Member of the Municipal Council of Kandy.—Resolved that this Council do place on record their sense of the value of Mr. Oorloff's services as a nominated Member of the Council.

(6) Letter of March 13, 1923, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer re the lighting of the Wardrop Memorial

Clock.—Resolved that the lighting be continued in its present form.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. De Silva moved—(1) "That the collection of poll tax be abolished within the Municipal limits of Kandy for the year 1924."—Mr. Perera seconded.

Mr. Vallipuram moved as an amendment—"That the abolition of the poll tax from 1924 be referred to a Special

Committee consisting of the Members of the Law and Finance Committee for report."—Mr. Ratwatte seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried by 7 to 2.

Ayes.—Mr. A. Vallipuram, Mr. L. H. S. Pieris, Mr. J. C. Ratwatte, Mr. P. M. Bingham, Dr. G. P. Hay, Dr. A. de Saram, and the Chairman.

Noes.—Mr. de Silva and Mr. Perera.
(2) Pursuant to notice Mr. De Silva moved—"That in view of the unnecessary restriction to trade and the consequent hardship to the people, the by laws re the control of the storage and sale of rice be referred to a Special Committee of this Council with a view to their revision and recommendation to His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council to give effect such revision."—Mr. Pieris seconded.

The Chairman and Dr. Hay spoke against the resolution, and pointed out the urgent necessity for enforcing the

regulations in their present form.

The motion was put to the Meeting and carried by 5 to 4.

Ayes.—Mr. De Silva, Mr. Pieris, Mr. Perera, Mr. Vallipuram, and Mr. Ratwatte.

Noes.—Dr. Hay, Dr. De Saram, Mr. Bingham, and the Chairman.

The following Special Committee was appointed: - Messrs. Ratwatte, Pieris, De Silva, Perera, the Chairman, and

(3) Pursuant to notice Mr. De Silva moved—"That the Government be asked to give immediate effect to the unanimous resolution passed by this Council with regard to the reform of this Council. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The motion was put to the Meeting and lost by 5 to 4.

Ayes.—Mr. De Silva, Mr. Perera, Mr. Ratwatte, and Mr. Pieris.

Noes.—Mr. Vallipuram, Dr. Hay, Dr. De Saram, Mr. Bingham, and the Chairman.

(4) Pursuant to notice Mr. De Silva moved—"That the Superintendent of Works be asked to furnish this Council with an estimate to lay a bigger water main along Ledy MacCarthy's road." Mr. Perera seconded.—Carried.

(5) Pursuant to notice Mr. De Silva moved—"That the water main laid along Malabar street be extended to a distance of about 50 yards from the present terminus." Mr. Perera seconded,—Carried.

It was agreed to call for an estimate for the purpose.

6. To obtain a vote of Rs. 500 for preliminary expenses in connection with the proposed new reservoir. Resolved that the amount be voted, and the Council thanked Mr. Bingham for taking up the work.

7. Estimate for extending the water main to Katugastota, Rs. 34,000.

Resolved that the papers be circulated and brought up at the next Meeting.

8. Report of March 23, 1923, from the Superintendent of Works, stating that standposts have not been yet erected along the new extension of mains to Peradeniya Gardens.

Resolved that Government be asked to erect standpipes at an early date.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

(1) That the Tamil Branch of the Municipal Free School at Katukele be abolished, and that salary available be utilized to secure the services of an English Teacher.

Standing Committee (C).

- (2) That the Attendance Officer be paid a travelling allowance of Rs. 10 per month, with effect from April 1, 1923.

- (3) That the rates for laying water service be reduced according to schedule suggested by the Superintendent of Works in his report of March 8, 1923.

(4) That the estimate of Rs. 150 for alterations to the retail grain sheds be passed.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

Resolved that the increments of Revenue Inspector, D. J. Abeysinghe, be stopped for three years.
