CHAPTER XII.

After by-law No. 139 add:

Catchment area of reservoir not to be entered without permit.

139 A. No person shall enter that portion of the catchment area of the reservoir which is vested in the Municipal Council without a permit from the Chairman.

CHAPTER XI.

After by-law numbered 131 add :—

Sale of dry fish.

131 A. The trade of selling dry fish at any place within Municipal limits is hereby declared to be an offensive trade within the meaning of section 212 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

131 B. No person shall engage in or carry on the trade of selling dry fish without obtaining a license authorizing such trade in any particular place from the Chairman of the Municipal Council, who may refuse to grant such license, if, in his opinion, such trade in any particular place would be offensive to persons living in the neighbourhood.

131 C. A breach of the preceding by laws will be an offence punishable under section 212 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

131 D. For any license to be issued permitting the trade of selling dry fish in any particular place an annual fee of 50 cents shall be paid to the Municipal Council before the issue of the license.

8. A Society shall raise its capital in one or more of the following ways:—

- (a) By the issue of ordinary shares;
- (b) By making a member pay in respect of membership a sum of not less than Re. 1;
- (c) By deposits from members or from other than members;
- (d) By loans from members or from persons other than members.

Capital raised by loans or deposits from other than members shall not exceed, without the deposit of collateral security, in the case of societies registered with unlimited liability, three times the paid-up share capital of members and reserve fund, and in the case of societies registered with limited liability, an amount equal to the paid-up share capital of members and reserve fund. Provided that a loan not exceeding Rs. 2,000 may be granted to a society with unlimited liability with a paid up share capital less than Rs. 600, on condition that the application is recommended by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, and endorsed by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, and on condition that the Society undertakes to have as its president, during the period of indebtedness to Government, an officer of Government, approved by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The following market area is assigned to the public market established under the control of the Urban District Council at Pattiya North, Panadure, and shall be called the Pattiya North market area, viz. :—The area bounded by a line drawn two chains to the north of and parallel to the centre of the 4th Cross road and continued westwards to the centre of the river, along the centre of the river to the sea, along the seabeach to meet the continuation of a line drawn two chains to the south of and parallel to the centre of the Seabeach road, the last-mentioned line produced eastwards to meet a line drawn two chains to the east of and parallel to the centre of the Galle-Colombo high road, the last-mentioned line up to its point of intersection with a line drawn two chains to the south of and parallel to the centre of the Horana road, the last-mentioned line produced eastwards to meet the continuation of a line drawn two chains to the east of and parallel to the centre of the Gravets road, the last-mentioned line produced northwards to meet a continuation of the line drawn two chains to the north of and parallel to the centre of the 4th Cross road.

2. Within the Pattiya North market area no meat, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables shall be sold, except at the public market.

3. Nothing in these by-laws shall prevent:—

- (a) The sale by auction of fresh fish landed by fishing boats on that portion of the bank of the river lying between the railway line and the mouth of the river.
- (b) The sale of poultry, fruit, or vegetables by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places or do not for the purpose of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places.
- (c) The sale of plantains in boutiques duly licensed by the Chairman.
- (d) The sale of young coconuts.
- (e) The sale of ripe plantains at licensed eating-houses, tea and coffee boutiques.

4. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

COMMUNIQUE.

NEW LICENSE FORM FOR KANGANYIES RECRUITING LABOUR IN SOUTH INDIA.

Under the Indian Emigration Rules of 1923 all persons recruiting unskilled labourers for employers in Ceylon will be known as "kanganyies." Indian Emigration Rule 7 (2) limits the issue of kangany licenses as follows:—

"A kangany must be an Indian of the labouring class and must have been previously employed as a labourer under the employer for whose service he desires to obtain emigrants."

2. Rule 8 enacts that—

Sub-rule (1) "No person shall operate as a kangany unless he is in possession of a valid license issued by the authority appointed in this behalf by the Government of the country from which the kangany is despatched and endorsed by the Agent, if any, appointed for that country under section 7 of the Act or by his Deputy."

Sub-rule (2). "On arrival in India the kangany shall present his license to the Emigration Commissioner who after such inquiry as may be necessary shall endorse it, or if he refuses to endorse it shall return it to the authority by whom it was granted."

Sub-rule (3). "No license issued under sub-rule (1) shall be valid unless and until it has been endorsed by the Emigration Commissioner under sub-rule (2)."

Sub-rule (6). "A license issued under sub-rule (1) shall be in a form approved by the local Government (*i.e.*, the Madras Government), and the name and description of every intending emigrant shall be entered thereon by the kangany in a space provided for the purpose.

3. The Government of Madras has now approved of the form to be used by Ceylon recruiters. A copy of the form is reproduced at the end of this communique.

The Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour will be the authority appointed in Ceylon for the issue of licenses. All recruiters proceeding from Ceylon to South India on and after October 1, 1923, will be required to possess the new form of license, and the temporary licenses now issued by the Emigration Commissioner will be discontinued.

4. All employers intending to recruit labour should therefore study carefully the directions given below regarding the issue of the new form of licenses.

A.—Arrangements for Employers of Estates paying Acreage Fees.

(1) The Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour has made arrangements for the printing and binding of the new license forms in books of 50 copies. The licenses will be in triplicate, viz., the original for the kangany, in English and Tamil, copies in English for the use of the Emigration Commissioner and District Magistrate in India, and a counterfoil on which the employer can enter the necessary particulars.

The inside cover of the book will contain: (a) printed directions to the employer regarding the conditions to be fulfilled under the new system of issuing licenses; (b) directions in English and Tamil for the information of kanganies proceeding to the Coast to recruit.

(2) *Steps to obtain a Book of Forms.*—These books will be available for issue in the latter part of September. Any estate which has paid acreage fees will be entitled to receive a book of license forms free of charge on application to the Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour, Colombo. Application may be made at once, and books will be issued in rotation as soon as supplies are received from the Printer. Employers paying acreage fees do not need to use form schedule C of Ceylon Labour Ordinance, No. 1 of 1923.

(3) *Steps to obtain a License.*—When an employer wishes to send an employee to the Coast for recruiting, he should fill in a license form which is in triplicate, and send the three copies to the Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour, Colombo, who will, if he has no objection to the issue of the license, and if the forms are properly filled in, sign the license and obtain the counter-signature of the Agent of the Government of India in Ceylon, if such Agent has been appointed. The kangany's copy will then be returned to the estate for issue to the kangany, and the other two copies will be forwarded by the Controller to the Emigration Commissioner. Licenses improperly filled in will be returned to the employer for completion or amendment. When the employer receives the license, duly endorsed, from the Controller, he should hand it to the kangany who can then start for the Coast. The kangany should be instructed to apply, immediately on his arrival at Dhanushkodi, at the Office of the Ceylon Labour Commission at Dhanushkodi Station for the endorsement of the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner, without which the license is not valid. Should he attempt to recruit without having the license complete in all respects, he is liable to be prosecuted under the Indian Emigration Act and fined or imprisoned.

(4) *Payments to License Holders.*—The kangany recruiting license is an authority from the Controller and Emigration Commissioner to recruit. Labourers accepted under such a license by the Emigration Commissioner at an Agency of the Ceylon Labour Commission will be forwarded to the estate free of charge, but no cash payments whatever will be made to recruiters by the Emigration Commissioner, nor will such payments be made by the Ceylon Labour Commissioner unless the license holder also holds an authority from the employer to the Labour Commissioner authorizing such payments. Subscribers to the Labour Commission who wish payments made to their kanganies on account of labourers recruited should issue an A form to the kangany, and send the duplicate to the Labour Commissioner at Trichinopoly in the usual way. The current Ceylon Labour Commission A form may be used, but it need not be filled up to the same extent as at present. It will be sufficient if the kangany's name, the number of his license, the amounts to be paid, the Agency of payment, and any special conditions governing payment are shown. It is important to show on the A form the kangany license number, *i.e.*, the serial number on the Controller's license, as the rate authorized in the A form will be paid only to the holder of the license. A new type of A form has been drafted by the Ceylon Labour Commissioner, and will be issued by him to subscribers.

(5) *Licensing of Kanganies or Recruiters who may be at the Coast.*—When a recruiting license is required for a kangany or prospective recruiter who is already at the Coast, a license form properly filled in and containing all particulars, except the signature or thumb mark of the kangany, should be sent to the Controller as required by paragraph (3) above. Such kangany must be an Indian of the labouring class and a previous employee of the estate for which he proposes to recruit. When the employer receives back the license from the Controller, he should send it to the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner, Trichinopoly, with an application to have it perfected by the signature of the licensee, to whom it will be issued if the license is approved.

A License for a Kangany at the Coast must not be sent direct to the Kangany.

(6) *Licenses for Kanganies already recruiting at the Coast on October 1, 1923.*—Employers should take steps to obtain licenses in regard to all A form holders, identification slip holders, or other employees at the Coast, if such are considered likely to recruit and are already at the Coast on October 1, 1923. The licenses should be filled in as required in the last paragraph, and on their receipt from the Controller should be sent to the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner, Trichinopoly, who will make arrangements for the delivery of the licenses to the persons named therein as early as possible. When forwarding the license to the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner, the employer should state the Agency most convenient for the license holder, so that delay may, as far as possible, be obviated. At the same time employers should write to their employees at the Coast instructing them to apply at the Agency concerned for their new licenses. Any kangany who has not within a reasonable time exchanged his present license for one under the new form will be liable to have his labourers rejected by the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner or the Indian Protector of Emigrants.

B.—Arrangements for Employers not paying Acreage Fees.

Employers who do not pay acreage fees and who wish to recruit should study carefully Chapter II. of the rules framed under section 14 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1923 (*vide* Notification No. 1, Department of Indian Immigrant Labour, of July 13, 1923). Books of kangany license forms will not be issued to such employers. They should apply for permission to recruit to the Controller of Indian Immigrant Labour on form schedule C, copies of which may be obtained from the Controller. The Controller after he has checked the application will notify the employer of the amount of deposit or bank

guarantee required from him, and will at the same time issue to him the requisite kangany license forms. The employer should when forwarding the deposit or bank guarantee enclose the kangany license forms duly filled in as shown in paragraphs (3), (5), or (6) of the "Arrangements for Employers Paying Acreage Fees."

REGULATION REFERRED TO.

Where a pail latrine has been provided for the use of a building it shall be incumbent on the occupant to provide a suitable bucket or buckets therefor, to register his name at the Kandy Kachcheri, and to pay the Kandy Sanitary Board a sum not exceeding Rs. 2 per mensem (to be fixed by the said Board) as fee for the conservancy of the latrine, unless the owner has by written agreement with the occupant taken upon himself the duties mentioned above. Where latrines are built to serve a set of tenements in common the above duties shall fall on the owner.

PASSPORT REGULATIONS.

THE following regulations in connection with the visa of passports are published for general information :—

1. (a) All British-born subjects in possession of valid passports (except those intending to take up employment there) may travel to Switzerland without a visa from the Swiss Consul ; and
- (b) All Swiss nationals may similarly travel to the United Kingdom and to the British Colonies (except Gibraltar and Malta) and Protectorates without obtaining a British visa on their passports.
2. (a) All British-born subjects in possession of valid passports may travel to Spain, the Netherlands, and Luxemburg without obtaining a visa from the respective Consuls ; and
- (b) All nationals of Spain, the Netherlands, and Luxemburg may similarly travel to the United Kingdom without obtaining a British visa on their respective passports. This arrangement does not apply to the nationals mentioned above proceeding to the British Colonies and Protectorates.
3. (a) All British-born subjects in possession of valid passports may travel to Belgium and Italy without obtaining a visa from the respective Consuls ; and
- (b) All nationals of Belgium and Italy may similarly travel to the United Kingdom without a British visa on their respective passports.

Note.—The arrangements in 1 (a); 2 (a), and 3 (a) above do not excuse the bearer of the passport from having it vised by the British authorities for the foreign countries mentioned.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 25, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 126 (3 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 11 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1923, viz., 250,431) was 26·2, as against 28·3 in the preceding week, 27·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 180 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 37 Tamils, 20 Moors, 5 Malays, and 13 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37·5, as against 37·3 in the previous week, 32·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 180 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 46 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Twenty-five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South, 2 each in Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 21 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 8 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, 3 at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, in Wellawatta North, and 2 in St. Paul's, same as in the previous week, and against 2 the weekly average for last year.

5. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 12 from *Enteritis*, 10 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Debility*, 7 from *Dysentery*, 1 each from *Worms*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 63 from *Other Causes*.

6. Seventeen cases of *Enteric Fever*, 17 of *Measles*, 11 of *Chickenpox*, and 8 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 10, 8, 6, and 5 respectively of the preceding week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·7°, against 79·7° in the preceding week and 80·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·887 in., against 29·886 in. in the preceding week and 29·829 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·46 in., against 2·93 in. in the preceding week and 0·54 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

APPLICATIONS are invited for one or more posts as Travelling Inspectors in the Department of Indian Immigrant Labour.

Qualifications.—Applicants must have had a fair education in English. They must possess a thorough knowledge of colloquial Tamil, be able to read and write Tamil, and be familiar with planting life and conditions. Previous experience in Court work, is desirable.

Duties.—General inspection work: (1) To see that estates are complying with the provisions of the law in regard to the monthly declarations of payment under Ordinance No. 13 of 1889, and the assessment of fees under Ordinance No. 1 of 1923, and to conduct any necessary prosecutions for contravention of these provisions; (2) to make preliminary inquiries into complaints and petitions from unskilled Indian immigrant labourers.

Pay and Conditions.—Any posts will, in the first instance, be temporary, for a period of one year. A month's notice may be given on either side. After one year any permanent appointment will depend on the requirements of the department and the qualifications of the officer. The pay offered will be Rs. 200 to Rs. 300 per mensem, according to the age and qualifications of any candidate selected. 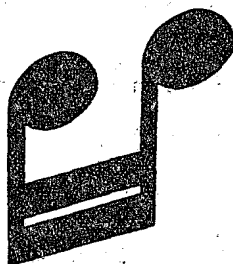
