BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The following market area is assigned to the public market established under the control of the Urban District Council at Pattiya North, Panadura, and shall be called the Pattiya North market area, viz. :—The area bounded by a line drawn two chains to the north of and parallel to the centre of the 4th Cross road and continued westwards to the centre of the river, along the centre of the river to the sea, along the seabeach to meet the continuation of a line drawn two chains to the south of and parallel to the centre of the Seabeach road, the last-mentioned line produced eastwards to meet a line drawn two chains to the east of and parallel to the centre of the Galle-Colombo high road, the last-mentioned line up to its point of intersection with a line drawn two chains to the south of and parallel to the centre of the Horana road, the last-mentioned line produced eastwards to meet the continuation of a line drawn two chains to the east of and parallel to the centre of the Gravets road, the last-mentioned line produced northwards to meet a continuation of the line drawn two chains to the north of and parallel to the centre of the 4th Cross road.

2. Within the Pattiya North market area no meat, fresh fish, fruits, or vegetables shall be sold, except at the public market.

3. Nothing in these by-laws shall prevent :—

(a) The sale by auction of fresh fish landed by fishing boats on that portion of the bank of the river lying between the railway line and the mouth of the river.

(b) The sale of poultry, fruit, or vegetables by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places or do not for the purpose of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places.

(c) The sale of plantains in boutiques duly licensed by the Chairman.

(d) The sale of young coconuts.

(e) The sale of ripe plantains at licensed eating-houses, tea and coffee boutiques.

4. Any person committing a breach of any one of the above by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50 for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25 for every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or written notice from the Chairman of such contravention.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of about 100 crossing timbers and 140,000 broad gauge and 10,000 narrow gauge sleepers for the Ceylon Government Railway in lots, for immediate delivery, in numbers as shown in paragraph 22 and in accordance with the under-mentioned specification and conditions. Rates may be quoted for the whole supply if desired.

2. (a) The broad gauge sleepers for the 5 ft. 6 in. gauge are to be 9 ft. long, 10 in. wide, and 5 in. deep, subject to a variation in length of 1 in. either way, and the narrow gauge sleepers for the 2 ft. 6 in. gauge are to be 5 ft. long, 9 in. wide, and 4½ in. deep, subject to a similar variation.

The crossing timbers are to be 12 in. wide and 5 in. deep and of the lengths given below, subject to a similar variation of 1 in. either way.

50 of 15 feet. | 50 of 16 feet.

(b) All crossing timbers and all sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber named in paragraph 22 felled in the proper season when the sap is not in circulation.

(c) All crossing timbers and sleepers may be sawn or hewn, and shall be good sound strong timber free from heartwood and sapwood, dryrot, and knot holes, shall be cut square and out of winding and straight, except that hewn sleepers may have camber to the extent of half an inch. They shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of ¼ in. in width and ½ in. in thickness to allow for shrinkage, and no further allowance shall be made, but will allow slight variation in cutting sound gum veins, gum pockets up to 6 in. by ¾ in., surface sun shakes; end shakes up to 6 in., a few pin holes, but not in groups; sap or wane not to exceed 2 in. on either face and not to come under rail seat; also sound and firm knots up to 2 in. in diameter.

3. The total consignment must be delivered at Colombo as early as possible, and tenderers must specify in the tenders the dates on which deliveries will be begun and completed. Should a contractor fail to complete delivery by the specified date, he shall be liable to a deduction as damages of 10 per cent. on the value of the sleepers and crossing timbers not then delivered.

4. Should the contractor at any time during the execution of the contract find that he will be unable to deliver the crossing timbers or sleepers or any portion of them within the period named, he shall at once give notice accordingly to the General Manager of the Railway.

5. The crossing timbers and sleepers shall be subject to inspection as stipulated in paragraph 25, and any sleepers or crossing timbers rejected at such inspection will not be accepted by the Ceylon Government.

6. If any difference or dispute shall arise between the parties of this contract as to the true intent and meaning of any of the conditions herein contained, or to any matter in dispute arising out of this contract, such difference or dispute shall be referred to a Board of Arbitration, of which each party shall appoint one arbitrator, and the two arbitrators so appointed shall, before proceeding with the reference, appoint an umpire. The award of the arbitrators and umpire, or of the majority of them, shall be conclusive and binding on both parties hereto.

7. The suppliers shall inform the General Manager by telegraph immediately the steamers commence to load, stating the probable date of sailing and shall again telegraph immediately the vessel has sailed. As each consignment is shipped the contractor must send direct to the General Manager in care of the master of the vessel conveying the sleepers or crossing timbers—

- 1 bill of lading (stamped).
- 1 copy of invoice.
- 1 copy of charter party (if any).
- 1 copy of insurance policy.

8. The contractors shall take all risk of accident or damage to the crossing timbers and sleepers from whatever

cause arising, and shall insure them against all marine risks from shore to shore with a first class Insurance Company or Companies whose names have been approved by the Government of Ceylon.

9. All tenders should be in duplicate, and must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract. The documents must be sealed under one cover marked "Tender for Sleepers" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

10. Tenders should be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or sent through the post so as to reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than noon on Tuesday, December 4, 1923.

No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person, whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors or any other person to whom the General Manager, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

15. All tenders for imported articles will be accepted only on the condition that the tenderer shall give the Government the benefit of any decrease in the Customs Duties made after the signing of the tender and up to the expiry of the contract entered into hereafter, and the Government likewise undertakes to pay over and above the tendered rate such sum as shall adequately compensate the tenderer for any increase in the Customs Duties during the period aforesaid.

16. Applicants must satisfy the General Manager that they are in a position to execute the contract in a satisfactory manner, documentary or other evidence being produced for the purpose if called for, and in the case of tenderers who are not resident in the Colony by a duly constituted agent specially empowered in that behalf.

17. Tenders from tenderers not resident in the Colony will not receive consideration, unless submitted by a duly constituted agent resident in the Colony specially empowered to tender for the same, and to execute a valid contract in that behalf and to fulfil all the terms of the contract.

18. Should any tenderer decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Ceylon Government contract. 19. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of each contract. The amount of security required will be Rs. 1,000 in cash or fixed deposit for every 20,000 sleepers and crossing timbers or lesser number contracted for.

20. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions laid down have been strictly fulfilled

21. The Ceylon Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender. If any special conditions attach to the acceptance of part of a tender or of lots in other numbers than those specified they must be clearly laid down in the tender.

22. Tenders will be considered for the following species of timber for sleepers:—

(a) For the whole supply from jarrah (*Eucalyptus marginata*), ironbark (*Eucalyptus crebra* or *siderophloia*), *Powellized Karri* (*Eucalyptus diversicolor*), blackbutt (*Eucalyptus pilularis*), *Burmese pyingado* (*Xylia dolabriformis*) or *Java* or *Burma teak* (*Tectona grandis*).

(b) For lots of 5,000 from Western Australia, Karri (*Eucalyptus diversicolor*); Tasmania, Celery top pine (*Phyllocladus rhomboidalis*); New South Wales, Grey box (*Eucalyptus hemiphloia*), Turpentine (*Syncarpia laurifolia*); Queensland, Grey gum (*Eucalyptus propinqua*); India, Sal (*Shorea robusta*), Irul (*Xylia dolabriformis*), Asna, Taukkyan, Thambavu or Walnut (*Terminalia tomentosa*); Federated Malay States, Chenghai (*Balanocarpus maximus*), Creosoted Oregon pine; Siam, Mai Teng Rang or Thitya (*Shorea obtusa*).

The narrow gauge sleepers and crossing timbers are to be jarrah.

23. Tenders must state the country or State in which the timber for the sleepers and crossing timbers to be supplied was grown, and must give the correct botanical name of the timber. No tender will be considered which does not give this information.

24. Tenders should state the number of each species they are prepared to supply, and if more than one kind is offered in any tender, the rate for each kind should be specified, with the minimum and maximum number of a kind that can be supplied. Tenders must also state whether sleepers are sawn or hewn.

25. In cases of Australian woods all sleepers and crossing timbers must be passed before shipment by the Government Inspector of the state from which the timber is obtained.

Arrangements will be made for a preliminary inspection before shipment of sleepers from India (including Burma), or the Straits Settlements. In the case of sleepers from other countries delivery will be accepted in Colombo, subject to the sleepers being strictly in accordance with the specification.

26. In case of failure to comply with the specification, the General Manager may deduct such sum from the payment as he may consider justifiable, by reason of the inferior quality of sleepers and crossing timbers supplied, whether the same shall have been previously inspected or passed as provided in the last preceding clause or not. Any dispute as to the amount so deducted shall be referred to a Board of Arbitrators, of which each party shall appoint one arbitrator, and the two arbitrators so appointed shall, before proceeding with the reference, appoint an umpire. The award of the arbitrators or umpire, or a majority of them, shall be conclusive and binding on both parties hereto.

27. The price quoted in the tender is to include all costs, till delivered in ship's slings at vessel's side in Colombo harbour, and sleepers and crossing timbers to be at risk of contractors till so delivered.

Freight must be provided by the contractor.

28. Payment will be made to the contractors by the Treasurer for each separate shipment on delivery of the sleepers, and crossing timbers, subject to such deductions as may be made under clause 26.

29. The contractor shall not assign or transfer the contract without the permission of the General Manager of the Railway.

30. Delivery shall not be made in lots of less than 1,000 sleepers and may commence from date of acceptance of tender.

31. If any contractor fails to supply the sleepers or crossing timbers or any of them in accordance with his contract, or commits a breach of any of the covenants of the contract, the General Manager of the Railway shall be at liberty, by notice in writing, to forthwith determine the contract; and thereupon the contractor will be liable to pay the excess cost of purchasing crossing timbers or sleepers elsewhere at such price as the General Manager of the Railway shall deem fit to the quantity which he contracted

to supply, and shall, in addition, be liable to forfeit the security mentioned in paragraph 19.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 1, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 118 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 13 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1923, viz. 250,431) was 24·6, as against 26·2 in the preceding week, 24·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 195 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 31 Moors, 9 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 40·6, as against 37·5 in the previous week, 25·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 195 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 13 in Maradana Hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 5 in Kotahena South, 4 in Slave Island, 3 each in St. Paul's and Maradana North, 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 25 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 2 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana South, 3 each in New Bazaar and Maradana Hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 12 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana Hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Seven deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 each in Pettah, Slave Island, and the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 5 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eleven deaths were registered from *Dysentery*, 11 from *Worms*, 10 from *Enteritis*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 each from *D. bility* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 60 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-one cases of *Chickenpox*, 13 of *Enteric Fever*, 7 of *Plague*, and 4 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 11, 17, 8, and 17 respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·5°, against 81·7° in the preceding week and 80·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·851 in., against 29·887 in. in the preceding week and 29·862 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·37 in., against 0·46 in. in the preceding week and 0·07 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

1. The purchase of the Lease of Rustom estate at Ratmalana South will be for a period of five years from October 1, 1923.

2. The Lessee shall deposit six months' rent in cash security on the date of sale, and shall pay rent quarterly in advance to the General Manager of Railways.

3. The Lessee will be entitled not only to the produce of the land and to the occupation of the buildings, &c., standing thereon, but will be at liberty to cultivate the same with any suitable product with the approval of the General Manager of Railways.

4. Any cattle kept on the land should not be allowed to trespass on the public road.

5. The Lessee or his employees shall not cut down any trees or interfere with any existing fence, boundary, or any buildings.

6. The Lessee shall not remove young coconut plants, sand, gravel, &c., from the demised land; and further he is not to spoil or damage any portion of the said land.

9. The Lessee shall pay all rates and taxes and fully comply with the Sanitary Board or Village Committee's regulations.

10. The Lessee shall not assign, transfer, or sublet the premises without the written consent of the General Manager of Railways.

11. The Lessee shall not cause the coconut trees standing on the premises to be tapped for sweet or fermented toddy.

12. If the whole or any portion of the estate is required by the Railway Department before the expiry of the lease, such whole or portion thereof, shall be surrendered on one month's notice being given in writing by the Lessor; in which case a proportionate refund or reduction in the rental per acre will be made for the unexpired period, for which rent has been paid.

Improvements in washing crude rubber and other materials containing grit.

Abstract.—Access of gritty impurities between the revolving rolls and the guide plates and so to the bearings is prevented by a liquid seal or a baffling flow of liquid. A groove is turned in the shoulder of the roller and a pipe passing through the guide plate introduces water under pressure into this groove forming a water seal and the water escaping between the shoulder and the guide plate forms a baffling stream.

The claims are:—

1. A machine having rollers or the like moving parts for treating gritty material such for instance as crude rubber in which a baffling stream of fluid seal prevents access of said gritty material to the bearings of the rollers or the like.
2. A machine for washing crude rubber or the like in which access of the gritty material to the bearings of the roller is prevented by a stream of water under pressure and or alternatively a water seal.
3. A rubber washing machine constructed and arranged to operate substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

TODDY RENTS, WESTERN PROVINCE, 1923-24.—COLOMBO DISTRICT.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government Agent for the Western Province will, at the Colombo Kachcheri, at 10 A.M. on September 13, 1923 (and on such subsequent days as the Government Agent shall, if necessary, notify), expose for sale by auction, subject to the Conditions in the Schedule A hereto, the privilege of selling Fermented Toddy by Retail from October 1, 1923, to September 30, 1924, at Taverns to be established by the purchasers in the villages specified in the Schedule B hereto, not more than one shop being allowed in each such village, at a site to be approved by the Government Agent.

2. No sale of Fermented Toddy will be allowed in villages other than those in the said Schedule B expressly specified.

3. (a) If taverns are to be moved from present sites, a month's notice has to be given by the Government Agent under paragraph 5 of IV. of Excise Notification No. 85 of February 12, 1919. Application should therefore be made by purchasers to the Government Agent for sites without delay.

(b) No rebate will be allowed in respect of any taverns in the event of objections to sites being upheld after inquiry by the Government Agent.

4. The purchasers will be required to pay in stamps the stamp duty under the Stamps Ordinance of 1919 in respect of the Conditions of Sale as well as of the security bond referred to in clause 2 (a) of the Conditions of Sale.

5. The attention of intending purchasers is specially drawn to clause 2 (b) of the Conditions of Sale.

6. Save in exceptional circumstances no trees will be licensed in dry areas.

Schedule A.—TODDY RENT SALE CONDITIONS.

The conditions on which the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within the villages described in Schedule B, from October 1, 1923, to September 30, 1924, is sold are, in addition to the general conditions applicable to all Excise licenses published in the *Government Gazette* No. 7,330 of May 25, 1923, as follows:—

1. The Government Agent shall have power, in his discretion, to refuse to accept any bid or tender, subject to which power the highest bidder or tenderer shall be the grantee of the privilege, and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which the privilege is sold.

2. (a) The grantee shall, immediately on being declared the grantee, sign these conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege as a security deposit, which amount shall be liable to forfeiture in whole or in part, at the discretion of the Government Agent, for breach of any of the conditions; and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by the conditions for such breach. The grantee shall hypothecate the said security deposit by a bond in form Excise T 23 within fourteen days of sale of the privilege above prescribed.

(b) If the highest bid or tender under condition 1 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the same time execute, if so required by the Government Agent, in the form sanctioned by law, a power of attorney to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege.

(c) The grantee shall, on signing the conditions of sale, elect, and under his hand signify a post office to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the above said privilege shall be addressed under registered post; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid so addressed to the post office so elected and posted in due course shall be considered as good and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the same were served personally.

3. The grantee shall pay to the Government Agent the purchase money or rent in twelve equal monthly instalments, and also any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from him. The first instalment of the purchase money or rent shall be considered due and payable on September 30, 1923, and the remainder on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum shall be payable on all arrears.

4. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be considered as duly made unless the grantee shall produce a Kachcheri receipt therefor; and no money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of the Shroff or any other officer of the Kachcheri shall be considered as money paid under this contract.

5. If an instalment or part of the instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after 15 days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so without further process of law, to cancel the license or licenses issued to the grantee, and to re-sell the privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. The notice referred to may be given in such manner as the Government Agent may direct.

6. The grantee shall, on receipt of the license to sell, furnish to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and situations of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern, and no tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn for this purpose except under cover of a license setting forth the numbers and situations of the trees, the name of the drawer, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended. The Superintendent of Excise or Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall have power, subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, to refuse any application to tap trees for any tavern if such application is, in his opinion, open to serious objection.

7. No tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn therefrom for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at a tavern unless such tree shall first have been marked for this purpose in a manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; nor shall toddy be transported to the tavern except under cover of a pass granted by the Superintendent of Excise or the Assistant Superintendent of Excise. Such pass shall set forth the name of the person who transports the toddy and shall be issued to the grantee, who shall hand it to the person who transports the toddy.

(a) Any renter wishing to make vinegar from toddy shall first obtain a vinegar license from the Government Agent.

(b) The holder of a vinegar license shall store such vinegar in premises approved by the Excise Commissioner, and shall keep a true account of all toddy converted into vinegar and of all sales of vinegar in the form prescribed by the Excise Commissioner.

8. The grantee, if he taps the trees and draws the toddy himself, or, if he delegates the work to another person, such person shall, at the time of tapping the trees or drawing the toddy, invariably carry the license on his person, and shall produce it forthwith on the demand of any Excise Officer or village headman.

9. The grantee shall have no concern or interest, direct or indirect, in the sale of arrack, or in the purchase of any privilege for the sale of arrack, within the Revenue District in which he possesses the privilege of selling toddy.

10. Except under the written authority of the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, no toddy, except toddy drawn from trees licensed and marked for a particular tavern, shall be kept, offered for sale, or sold in that tavern.

11. No fermented toddy shall be sold at a lower price than 40 cents per gallon, and in proportion for any smaller quantity.

12. The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site. No tavern shall be opened at any place except with the approval of the Government Agent.

13. The purchaser shall, within ten days from the date on which the privilege commences to run, or within such extended time as the Government Agent may grant, apply to the Government Agent and obtain a license or licenses for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by the privilege.

14. (a) The grantee shall have no claim to a remission if the Government Agent or his Assistant shall find it necessary to order the tavern upon any road to be closed for a limited period during the march of troops, or upon the plea of losses arising from any cause whatever.

(b) On days of polling the Government Agent or his Assistant shall order the closure of all taverns in the area in which polls are held, and the grantee shall have no claim to a remission on this account.

15. (a) No bids will be accepted from any person who is a habitual criminal as defined by Ordinance No. 32 of 1914.

(b) The purchaser shall, whenever called upon to do so by the Government Agent, satisfy him that he is not a habitual criminal within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

16. The taverns within the areas of the exclusive privilege granted under the foregoing conditions shall open and close at the hours specified in Schedule C, and no toddy shall be sold at such tavern between the hour of closing and that of opening.

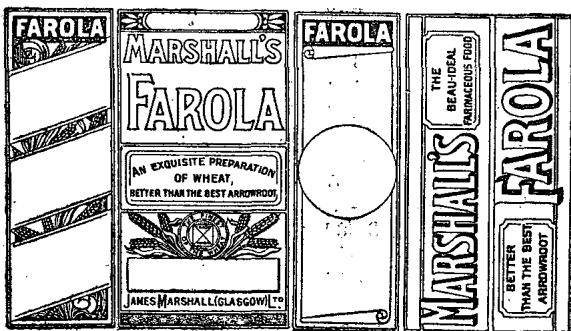

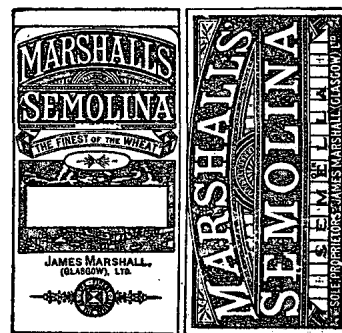
