**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF JUNE, 1923.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The number of marriages of residents in the proclaimed towns amounted to 328 (240 General, 4 Kandyan, and 84 Muhammadan), as against 339 in the preceding month and 366 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the marriages numbered 132 (83 General and 49 Muhammadan), as against 126 in the preceding month.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,527 (781 males and 746 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·43 per 1,000, as against 33·20 in the preceding month, 29·65 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·87 the average for the corresponding months since 1913. The rate ranged from 15·10 in Kalpitiya to 70·28 in Kalmunai.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 554 (262 males and 292 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 26·91 per 1,000, as against 28·96 in the preceding month, 24·86 in the corresponding month of last year, and 22·74 the average for the corresponding months since 1913. The rate, excluding the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 10·99 in Kollupitiya to 24·32 in Maradana South.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,805 (1,001 of males and 804 of females). The deaths of town residents only numbered 1,462, which corresponded to a standardized rate of 31·51 per 1,000, as against 30·43 in the preceding month, 29·73 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·34 the average for the month of June in each year since 1913. The rate ranged from 73·53 in Vavuniya to 11·28 in Kegalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered were 685 (382 males and 303 females). The deaths of residents only numbered 598, which was equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 33·45 per 1,000, as against 31·18 in the preceding month, 31·63 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·07 the average for the month of June in each year since 1913. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 30·81 in Slave Island to 12·07 in Welawatta South.

7. The number of stillbirths registered was 110 (61 males and 49 females), as against 112 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 241 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June 30, 1923. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 253, as against 213 in the preceding month, 265 in the corresponding month of last year, and 252 the average for the corresponding months since 1913.

9. In the city of Colombo the mortality of children under one year was equal to a rate of 257 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June 30, 1923. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 273, as against 219 in the preceding month, 316 in the corresponding month of last year, and 276 the average for the corresponding months since 1913.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 17 per cent. of the total deaths was due. *Convulsions* caused 7 per cent. of the deaths, *Debility* (of children under one year), and *Phthisis* and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, each 6 per cent., *Diarrhoea*, *Enteritis*, and *Dysentery*, each 4 per cent., *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* and *Ankylostomiasis*, each 3 per cent., and *Influenza*, *Bronchitis*, *Prematurity*, and *Enteric Fever*, each 2 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 18 per cent. of the total deaths. Eight per cent. of the deaths were from *Phthisis*, 7 per cent. each from *Convulsions* and *Enteritis*, 5 per cent. from *Debility* (of children under one year), 3 per cent. each from *Influenza*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Diarrhoea*, 2 per cent. each from *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Dysentery*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Bronchitis*, and *Prematurity*, and 1 per cent. each from *Ankylostomiasis* and *Cancer*.

12. Eight deaths were registered from *Plague* in the city of Colombo (6 males and 2 females), as against 13 in the previous month and 8 in the corresponding month of last year. Two deaths from *Measles* were registered (1 in Colombo and 1 in Galle.)

13. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 101 cases were reported (87 in Colombo, 7 in Galle), *Chickenpox* followed with 90 cases (67 in Colombo, 7 in Kandy), *Measles* 52 (36 in Colombo, 9 in Galle), *Enteric Fever* 33 (24 in Colombo, 6 in Nuwara Eliya), *Continued Fever* 17 (11 in Colombo), *Plague* 7 (in Colombo), *Mumps* 7 (3 in Chilaw), and *Diphtheria* 3 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall.*—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (71·85 in.), and was followed by Hatton and Dikoya with 45·14 in. In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 29·59 in. in Gampola to 0·02 of an in. in Anuradhapura, Colombo recorded 7·96 in.

15. *Mean Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 61·0° in Nuwara Eliya to 85·9° in Batticaloa and was 81·2° in Colombo.

Four deaths, 1 each from Cerebral Haemorrhage, Meningocele, Syphilis and Imperforate Anus (in Colombo); 1 from Infected Navel (in Moratuwa); and 1 from Influenza (in Galle). This includes 2 cases mentioned in Table IV, footnote 1, death each from Abscess and Nephritis (in Negombo); 1 from Fever (in Matara); 1 from Bruselas (in Kurnell); 1 from Typhoid (in Colombo); 1 from Malaria (1 in Mannar and 2 in Kegalle); 1 from Peritonitis (in Jaffna); 3 from Malariasis; 1 from Asthma (1 in Wellawaya); 1 from Acne (in Galle).

This includes besides 9 cases mentioned in Table IV, 1 from *Peritonitis* (in Jaffna); 3 from *Malaria* (1 in Mannar and 2 in Kegala); 1 from *Erysipelas* (in Puttalam); and 1 from *Worms* (in Puttalam).
