WHEREAS His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof, has quitted this Colony temporarily: It is hereby proclaimed that, by virtue of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies, dated the Eleventh day of September, One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty, Sir GRAEME THOMSON, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, has this day assumed the Administration of the Government of the Island, of which all persons concerned are required to take due notice.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirtieth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-two.
