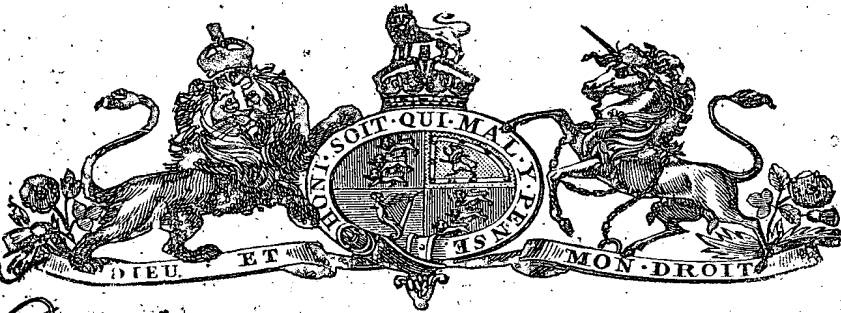

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated September 29, 1920, the Kotmale division of the Nuwara Eliya District of the Central Province was divided into six korales, viz., Pallepane korale, Tyspane korale, Medapane korale, Udapane korale, amboda korale, and Dimbula korale:

And whereas it is expedient to alter for revenue and administrative purposes the boundaries of Udapane and Ramboda korales, so as to include Otalawa wasama in Udapane korale:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, do hereby proclaim and appoint that from and after October 1, 1923, the boundaries of the said two korales shall be as set out and defined in the schedule A hereto, and the said Otalawa wasama shall be included in the Udapane korale of Kotmale division of the Nuwara Eliya District of the Central Province.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Second day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-three.

SCHEDULE A.

*Udapane Korale.**North.*—Pannale-oya.

East.—Ambahela-ela, Ketawerella-ela, the southern boundary of Choisy estate, the eastern boundary of Eton estate, and thence to the north-western point of north Pundaluoya estate, the northern and eastern boundary of North Pundalu-oya and Dunsinane estates until it touches the point marked 4,891 feet elevation on the Dunsinane-Pundalu-oya road, the Dunsinane-Pundaluoya road until it meets the division boundary at Dunsinane-Pundaluoya road.

East.—The division boundary from the point marked 6,815 feet elevation following the Pedro Kondagolla ridge to a point ¼ mile north of the point marked 7,725 feet elevation.

South.—From this point along the division boundary to where it meets the Dunsinane-Pundaluoya road and along the Dunsinane-Pundaluoya road to a point marked 4,891 feet elevation, the eastern and northern boundaries of Dunsinane and North Pundaluoya estates, and thence to the south-eastern corner of Eton estate.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The areas defined in the schedule hereto are hereby declared to be residential areas.
2. The remainder of the area within the limits of the Local Board, Kegalla, is hereby declared to be a commercial area.
3. Within the limits of the residential areas, no range or block of buildings wholly or mainly adapted to be inhabited in tenements by persons of the poorer or the labouring classes, and no building intended for commercial purposes or for any other purpose than that of a dwelling house shall be erected or re-erected without the special sanction in writing of the Chairman. Such sanction shall be refused if, in the opinion of the Board, the situation or design or the use to which it is proposed to put the building would not be in keeping with its surroundings or would detract from the amenities of the town.

Schedule.

- (a) An area extending 100 yards on either side of the Colombo-Kandy road from the Jubilee ambalam to Meepitiya bridge.
- (b) An area extending 100 yards on either side of the South Circular road.
- (c) An area extending 100 yards on either side of the Kegalla-Bulatkohupitiya road from Welimannatota-bridge to the limits of the Local Board area.

“THE DISEASES (LABOURERS) ORDINANCE, NO. 10 OF 1912.”

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend the second section of Schedule A to the rules dated July 24, 1923, published in the *Gazette* of July 27, 1923, to read as follows:—

Dimensions, Ventilation, and Drainage.—Every living room shall have a minimum superficial floor area of 120 square feet, and shall be provided with a window space of not less than one-fifteenth of the floor area, and shall have no ceilings erected therein, except when the roof is of metal. The verandah shall be of a minimum width of 6 feet and may be enclosed by a dwarf wall not more than 3 feet high, and partition walls not exceeding 6 feet in height. The verandah posts shall have a minimum height of 6 feet, and the eaves a minimum overhanging of 2 feet 6 inches. Smoke outlets shall be provided. A water-impervious ramp pavement and a partition or barbecue of a minimum width of 5 feet shall be constructed adjoining the whole length of the verandah sloping away into an impervious drain. Adequate provision shall be made for ventilation and lighting by windows or ventilation apertures. The external walls shall be of metal brick (sun-dried or burnt) stone, cabook, or rubble, and shall be lime-washed or lime-plastered. The internal walls shall be lime-plastered. The roofs shall be of tiles, shingles, metal, or other permanent roofing material.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. Rule 26 of the Rules and Rates for the conveyance of Goods Traffic published by Notification dated October 11, 1907, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,210 of October 11, 1907, is hereby revoked, and the following rule substituted therefor:—

26. Fruits and vegetables in lots not exceeding 56 pounds, from one consignor to one consignee, will be booked by goods trains at goods rates from goods stations above Peradeniya Junction at actual mileage rates to the following passenger stations:—

Hunupitiya, Kelaniya, Kollupitiya, Bambalapitiya, Wellawatta, Dehiwala, Mount Lavinia, Angulana, Lunawa, Kalutara North, Katukurunda, Paiyagala North, and Maggona.

Fruits and vegetables so booked will be conveyed by goods trains to Hunupitiya and Kelaniya, and to the Coast Line stations above named by goods trains as far as Maradana, and from Maradana by passenger trains.

2. Any provision contained in any rule or classification made under “The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902,” in any way contrary to the provisions of the said rule 26 as set out above, is hereby repealed.

"THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL WATERWORKS ORDINANCE, 1907."

IT is hereby notified that the Municipal Council of Kandy, under the provisions of section 17 of Ordinance No. 18 of 1907, read together with Ordinance No. 12 of 1918, has with the consent of the Governor in Executive Council revoked the exemption from water-rate, notified by Notification dated March 20, 1919, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,005 of March 28, 1919, of the parts of the divisions numbered 1, 3, 4, and 5 of the Kandy Municipality, and defined in the schedule annexed to the said Notification:

REGULATION REFERRED TO.

Regulation 1 of Chapter XII. of the regulations published by Notification dated November 19, 1920, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,142 of the same date, is hereby repealed, and the following regulation substituted in lieu thereof:

1. All owners, tenants, or occupiers of lands within the limits of the Sanitary Board shall keep the same clean and free from all refuse, rubbish, rank or noisome vegetation, and from all weeds or vegetation likely to prove prejudicial or injurious to health.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 29, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 122 (3 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 15 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1923, viz., 250,431) was 25.4, as against 22.7 in the preceding week, 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 193 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 40 Tamils, 27 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 40.2, as against 34.1 in the previous week, 24.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 193 total deaths, 48 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-six deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospital (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 13 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eleven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana hospital, same as in the previous week and against 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Kollupitiya, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Pettah and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and Maradana North, as against 28 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo Town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana East, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in Maradana South and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twenty deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 15 from *Debility*, 11 from *Enteritis*, 9 from *Dysentery*, 2 each from *Worms* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 from *Diarrhæa*, and 66 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 8 of *Measles*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, and 3 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 8, 12, 14, and 8, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.9°, against 80.4° in the preceding week and 81.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.881 in., against 29.875 in. in the preceding week and 29.917 in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.08 in., against 2.81 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Fifty per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 50 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid within 14 days of the approval of sale by the Conservator of Forests.

Bids over Rs. 500 and up to Rs. 1,000.

Fifty per cent. of the bid and security of Rs. 75 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be

paid regularly in two monthly instalments within two months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

Bids over Rs. 1,000.

Fifty per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 150 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in three monthly instalments within three months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

4. Should the required deposit not be made immediately on conclusion of the sale, the right to collect the produce will be at once offered again to public competition, and the person who failed in the first instance to make the required deposit will not be allowed to bid, unless he deposits in advance a sum of Rs. 50, which will be forfeited if he again refuses to make the required deposit on acceptance of his bid.

5. The balance of the purchase amount, if any, shall be paid as specified in condition 3.

6. Should the person decline or fail to enter into an agreement within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Divisional Forest Officer, Eastern Division (South), Batticaloa, to the effect that his bid has been accepted by the Conservator of Forests, or to pay the balance of the purchase amount when due, the deposits already made on account of the purchase and the security shall be forfeited and the right to collect the produce in question re-sold at the risk of the original purchaser, who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such re-sale, but, on the other hand, he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by any re-sale.

7. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, re-sold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.

8. Should the purchaser or his employees cause any damage to trees in the forests or commit any forest offence, the purchaser shall be held liable to pay compensation for all such damage or loss, and on failure to pay, he shall be liable to prosecution.

9. The collection of all minor forest produce should cease on August 31, 1924, to admit of the minor forest produce collected being transported to the Central Stores before September 30, 1924, after which date the purchasers will not be allowed to transport any produce to the Central Store, no matter when the minor forest produce might have been collected in forest.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting the purchaser's employees, and of rescinding the agreement if the above conditions are not adhered to.

Electric Lighting of Small Towns.

Electricity Ordinance No. 26 of 1906.

THE following Specification has been accepted :—

No. 2,007 of August 22, 1923.

"A sun protector for corrugated roofings."

Abstract.—The applicant describes a covering for corrugated roofing composed of tiles of semi-circular or corrugated section and made of a non-conducting material. Grooves and tongues are provided for connecting the ends of the tiles, and perforations may be used to allow the passage of water through the tiles when necessary.

The claims are :—

1. A design for a sun protector for corrugated or other roofings made of various suitable materials incorporating by the addition of the said sun protector to corrugated or other roofings a domed or tubular air passage through which a current of cooling air will be induced to pass freely, and cool the corrugated or other roofings covered by the sun protector.
2. A design of sun protector of the kind referred to which when placed in multiples on a roof will fit so closely as to completely exclude any rays from the sun penetrating to the roof.
3. A design of sun protector of the kind referred to incorporating a system of tongues and grooves dovetailed into one another for the purpose of safeguarding the separate segments or sun protectors from the action of high winds, or from the possibility of the segments slipping down a steep-pitched roof, which said system of tongues and grooves consolidates and renders rigid each complete line of sun protectors, substantially as described on paragraph 2 of page 3 of the Specification.
4. A design of sun protector of the kind referred to, incorporating a system of angled perforations, and water collecting ridges on its upper surface for use in very wet countries for the purpose of relieving the outside corrugated roofing channels in which the sun protector rests from over flooding, and possible leaks where the overlapped corrugated channel may happen to be the channel in which the legs of the aforementioned sun protector may rest.
5. A design of sun protector of the kind referred to for use in very dry countries with a plain upper surface, but tongued and grooved and otherwise substantially designed as herein described with reference to the example illustrated by the accompanying drawings for the purpose specified.
6. A design of sun protector of the kind referred to which may additionally be adapted to the main-ridges, hip-ridges, or valley-gutters of corrugated or other roofings and which may be held in place, substantially as described in claim 3 and paragraph 2 of page 3 of the Specification.
7. A design of sun protector for corrugated or other roofings, which may be more easily and more cheaply manufactured in large quantities than any other type of sun protector possessing the same advantages and functions.
