RULE REFERRED TO.

Rule 49 in sub-section (12) (Gambling and Cock-fighting) of the rules published in Government Gazette No. 6,648 dated August 14, 1914, is hereby repealed, and the following rule substituted therefor:—

49. Gambling.—No gambling with dice, or cards, or betting of any kind shall be permitted within the subdivision. Every person gambling or allowing other persons to gamble in his house or premises shall be liable to a fine on conviction.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. Every village or group of villages shall be provided with a burial ground or crematorium or both, as the Committee shall consider necessary, for the burning or burying of the dead, and every such ground shall be registered by the Committee for the purpose.

2. Every registered burial ground shall be demarcated by a trench or enclosed

2. Every registered burial ground shall be demarcated by a trench or enclosed by a fence, and shall be kept clear of jungle or underwood, and the villagers for whose use the burial ground is provided shall contribute labour thereon as the Committee shall consider necessary.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to bury or burn any corpse, except in a duly registered burial ground or crematorium.

4. No land which has been registered as a burial ground shall be sold, disposed of, or used for any other purpose.

5. The Chairman of the Village Committee shall, if necessary, alot portions in each burial ground for the different communities in each village or group of villages, and it shall be incumbent on each community to confine its burials to each such portion.

"THE LAND SURVEYORS, AUCTIONEERS, AND BROKERS ORDINANCES, 1899 AND 1909."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of "The Land Surveyors, Auctioneers, and Brokers Ordinances, 1889 and 1909," has been pleased to make the following regulations, and to revoke the regulations published in the Notification dated July 9, 1917, promulgated in the Government Gazette of July 13, 1917.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

B.—Course for License to practise as a Surveyor and Leveller.

1. The Entrance Examination shall be held by an officer of the Survey Department appointed by the Survey or-General and on such dates as shall be duly authorized by His Excellency the Governor.

Before admission to the examination candidates must fill up the Form "A" printed at the end of these regulations.

3. The subjects of the examination shall be as follows:—

(i.) English.—[An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.]

(ii.) Arithmetic.—[The principles and processes of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal

(ii.) Arithmetic.—[The principles and processes of arithmetic applied to whole fulfilder and declinal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.]

(iii.) Geometry.—[Theorems and problems, including graphical exercises, on the following: angles at a point; parallel straight lines; the side and angle properties of triangles and rectilinear figures; easy loci; the areas of triangles and quadrilaterals; the chord, angle, and tangent properties of circles; proportion; similar triangles.

Candidates will also be expected to be acquainted with the forms of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the

rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.]

(iv.) Algebra.—[Elementary algebraic operations. Simple equations. Simple simultaneous equations containing not more than two unknown quantities; problems leading to such equations. Resolution into factors, fractions, quadratic equations containing only one unknown quantity; problems leading to such equations. Fractional and negative indices (formal proofs not required). Logarithms to base 10 and use of four-figure tables. Graphs and their applications. Graphs and their applications.
Variation. The gradient of a The solution of two simultaneous equations, one being linear and one being quadratic. Variation. The gradient of a graph. Arithmetical progression and finite geometrical progression.]

(v.) Trigonometry.—[Plane Trigonometry, including the solution of triangles and the use of logarithms. Questions

will not be set involving angles greater than 360 degrees.]

In order to qualify for admission to the class, candidates must obtain not less than 40 marks per cent. in each subject and 50 marks per cent. in aggregate.

The number of students admitted to the class shall be limited to ten.

The fees for the course shall be Rs. 200, payable in advance; in addition, a deposit of Rs. 100 must be made on admission, to be returned to the student at the end of the course, less the estimated value of any damage he may have done to instruments or other property of Government.

The course shall be of eighteen months' duration, and shall comprise the following:-

Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Computation of earthwork. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom. Subtense methods and tacheometry. Plane table surveying. triangulation. The determination of azimuth.

The work done will be both practical and theoretical, and the course will include mathematics of a standard more

advanced than that prescribed for the entrance examination.

Students shall be required to provide themselves with drawing instruments and text books as prescribed for the

course from time to time by the Surveyor-General.

8. All students shall be under the authority of the Surveyor General. They will be expected to attend the school at the times appointed, and the Surveyor General is authorized to dismiss them from the class for irregular attendance, bad conduct, insufficient progress in practical work, or failure at terminal examinations.

9. Annual licenses in surveying and levelling will be granted to students who complete the course and pass the

final examination set on the work done in the course.

10. Students who have obtained the Surveyor-General's license in surveying and levelling are, on the recommendation of the Surveyor-General, eligible for appointments in the Survey Department on the same terms as those who have been trained under Regulations A.

Annual Examination for the Surveyor-General's Licenses in Surveying and Levelling, Surveying, and Levelling.

The examiners shall be one or more officers of the Survey Department appointed annually by the Surveyor-General.

The examination shall be held during the last quarter of each year. A notice of the date of the examination and the centres at which it will be held shall be published six weeks beforehand in the Government Gazette.

Before being admitted to the examination candidates shall be required to fill up Form "A" and to furnish copies of their school certificates in support, and, in addition, a certificate of good character from a Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, District Judge, or Police Magistrate.

Applications of candidates must reach the Surveyor-General a fortnight before the date fixed for the examination to begin.

The fees, which must be paid on or before the date of closing of entries, shall be

No candidate shall be allowed to take part in the examination unless he has paid the prescribed fees.

- 5. The examination shall be held in two parts, written and practical, with an interval of about a month between the two parts.
 - 6. The subjects of the written examination shall be as follows:—
- (i.) English—one paper.—[An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.]
- (ii.) Arithmetic and Algebra—one paper.—[Arithmetic.—The principles and processes of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions. Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices. Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.]

(iii.) Geometry and Trigonometry-one paper.

[Geometry.—The subjects of Euclid I.—IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable lengths. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon.) Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle. Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.]

- (iv.) Surveying—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolite and compass traverses. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tacheometry. Plane table surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth.]
- (v.) Levelling—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earthwork. Road and railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.]

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 17, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 144 (3 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 15 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1923, viz., 250,431) was 30.0, as against 24.8 in the preceding week, 26.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 163 (I European, 4 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 27 Moors, 3 Malays, and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.9, as against 33.3 in the previous week, 29.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths .-- Of the 163 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 5 in Slave Island, 2 in Maradana South, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, Köllupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 19 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Six deaths from Influenza were registered, 4 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 5 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) One death from Bronchitis was registered in Kotahena North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Thirteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, and Maradana East, as against 16 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals and 1 in New Bazaa, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- . Fifteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 10 from Dysentery, 9 from Debility, 6 from Diarrhæa, 5 from Enteritis, 3 from Worms, 2 from Puerperal Septicæmia, 1 from Tetanus, and 66 from Other Causes.
- 5. Fourteen cases of Chickenpox, 9 of Enteric Fever, 2 of Measles, 2 of Plague, and 1 of Smallpox were reported during the week, as against 19, 14, 2, 2, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·1°, against 79·1° n the preceding week, and 79·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.858 in., against 29.927 in. in the preceding week, and 29.924 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.40 in., against 2.4 in. in the preceding week, and 4.58 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE ERROLL TEA COMPANY, LIMITED.

THE regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regula-

tions of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context, viz.:-

The word "Company" means "The Erroll Tea Company, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The "Ordinance" means and includes "Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance

from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the

Company from time to time in force.

"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

"Shareholder" means any person whose name is entered in the Register of Shareholders as owner or joint-owner of any share in the Company.

"Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney.

"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled

at a Board.

"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Month" means a calendar month.

"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa. Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and vice versa. "Holder" means a Shareholder.

means a Shareholder.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy (in cases where by these Articles proxies are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly

BUSINESS.

2. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors,

and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents.

CAPITAL.

4. The nominal capital of the Company is Two hundred and Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 250,000), divided into

25,000 shares of Ten Rupees (Rs. 10) each.

- 5. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.
- 6. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls, and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

 7. The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company.

SHARES.

8. The Company may issue the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid and the time of payment of such calls.

9. If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the *Holder* of the shares.

10. The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided, shall first be offered by the Directors to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. In case of the increase of the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares, such new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights and privileges annexed thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof, or any other General Meeting of the

Company shall direct, and if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends, and in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and with

a special or without any right of voting.

Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may, at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

12. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand

in such form as the Company may from time to time direct.

13. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership, and any one partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm.

Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-Shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the

only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

17. The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except an absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 36 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls

due in respect of such share.

19. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates under the common seal of the Company,

specifying the share or shares, held by him and the amount paid thereon.

20. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors, they may order the same be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof may be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

21. The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the

erson first-named on the register.

- The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that three months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors.
- If any Shareholder fail to pay the amount of any call due by him on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

 24. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such

call was passed.

25. The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine.

But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

26. The Directors may at their discretion receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the moneys uncalled upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called up; and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof as from time to time and at any time thereafter exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon and due in respect of the shares in respect of which such advances have been made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholders paying such sums in advance, and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, eight per centum per annum.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. Subject to the restrictions contained in these articles any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing.

No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or person of unsound mind.

The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered

the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

- 30. The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise; or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved by them; and in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be
- Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty cents, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 30, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the instrument of
- The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

- 33. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only, if at all, upon
- 34. The Register of Transfers may be closed at such times and for such periods as the Directors may from time to time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than twenty-one days in any year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

35. The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder (other than one of several joint-

Shareholders), shall be the only persons recognized by the Company, as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

36. Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Directors think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

37. If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 36 shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or, if in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such shares, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same; and the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

38. The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company, provided

such acceptance is properly legalized.

39. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at,

which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid; the notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay, and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from time to time of forfeiture until payment at nine per

centum per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

41. Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

42. The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and

demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share,

except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

43. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

44. The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the

date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share bona fide sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 41 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

45. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders, or in respect of any other debt, liability, or engagement whatsoever, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

46. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

47. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

48. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that the power of sale given by Article 46 has a risen and is avergicable by the Company of the Secretary or Secretaries that the

power of sale given by Article 46 has arisen and is exercisable by the Company under these presents shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

49. Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such share.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

50. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms

as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine.

51. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes then the holders of any class of shares may, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been effected without it.

52. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any member personally present and entitled to vote at such meeting.

Borrowing Powers.

53. The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose, or defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed Rupees Seventy-five thousand (Rs. 75,000).

54. With the sanction of a General Meeting the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at

such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions

between the Company and its creditors.

55. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

56. Any such securities may be issued, either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.

57. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

58. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorpora-

tion of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is so prescribed, then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

60. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.
61. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

62. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called shall be addressed to the

Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such place and such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same

to a meeting.

64. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

65. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given by the advertisement the Coulon General or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General in the Ceylon Government Gazette, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution, the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice, and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being

passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

66. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof and to declare dividends and to lead the state of the second of t to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever, of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

67. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

68. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended

by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement of the business two or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

69. If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

70. The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting, he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Director be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall

choose one of their number to be Chairman.

71. No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair is vacant.

The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice thereof shall be given.

73. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in case of a special resolution entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in case of a special resolution by five Shareholders present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this clause may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

75. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder present, his proxy or attorney, or in case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, their proxies or attorneys at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinstored.

direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a castig vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder or proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

76. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

77. No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

79 On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present 78. On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder, such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands.

In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

79. The parent or guardian or curator of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian or curator of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

80. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

81. No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held. after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

82. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but this rule shall not

apply to a power of attorney.

83. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointor (whether a Shareholder or his attorney), or if such appointor be a company or corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such company or corporation.

84. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes

No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such votes shall be tendered, and every vote whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

86. No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of

the voting.

DIRECTORS.

The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than four; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

88. The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least one hundred fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to

the first Directors as to all future Directors.

89. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding One thousand Five hundred rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company. The Directors may repay to any Director all reasonable travelling and hotel expenses incurred by him in or about the bona fide performance of his duties as a Director, including all reasonable travelling expenses to and (or) from Board meetings.

90. The first Directors shall be Claude George Spiller of Hatton and Robert Francis Battams and Gilbert Barsham The first Directors shall hold office till the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when Traill, both of Colombo.

they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

91. One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents of the Company for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents.

The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might

be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

92. At the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company all the Directors shall retire from office, and at the first Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 93.

93. The Director to retire from office at the second Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who

have been longest in office.

94. In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors

to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

97. Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

98. A General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine in what rotation such increase or reduced number is to go out of office.

99. If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place, the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or Secretaries, or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office

shall become vacant.

101. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall, nor shall the heirs, executors, or administrators, of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

103. No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

DISQUALIFICATION OF DIRECTORS.

104. The office of Directors shall be vacated—

(a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, or Secretary of the Company.

(b) If he becomes bankrupt, or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors.

If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.

(d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.

(e) If he resigns his office under the provisions of clause 100.

(f) If he ceases to ordinarily reside in Ceylon, or is absent from Ceylon for a period of three consecutive months.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with, or doing any work for, the Company, or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for, the Company, or by eason of his being Agent, or Secretary, or Solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are Agents, or Secretaries, or Solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

Powers of Directors.

The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the acquisition of the said Erroll estate, and the lease, 105. purchase, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property they may think fit, or any share or shares thereof.

106. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing

Director, or with the assistance of an Agent or Agents, and Secretary or Secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors subject to the provisions of Article No. 124 for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, or acquisition of the said estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and otherwise in or about the working and business of the Company.

107. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and, in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, treasurers, accountants, officers, clerks, or servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

108. The Directors shall exercise, in the name and on behalf of the Company, all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting, and shall generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinances and of these presents, and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been really in the company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been

valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

109. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys

109. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company on such terms as they may consider proper, and from

time to time to revoke such appointment.

110. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

111. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the

Directors, or of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf

of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.

of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.

112. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect, so far as a resolution or a special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

. 113. In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice, to the general powers conferred or implied in any of the preceding clauses, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that

the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say):

(a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company and any claims or demands made by or against the Company. (b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce

the awards.

(c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company, and for claims and demands by the Company.

(d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents, with power to accept

the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.
(e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company, which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or realize such investments.

(f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors, and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient, and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in the substitution for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or company

to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

- 114. The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

 115. A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

 116. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman if one her heart and the part but if there
- and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there

be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting

Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and

in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

118. The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

119. The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded

by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation inposed by the Board.

120. The acts of the Board or of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the Committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy or defect.

A resolution in writing, signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon, shall be as valid and effectual

as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

122. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose—

 Of all appointments of (a) officers and (b) committees made by the Directors. (2) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.

(3) Of the names of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.

(4) Of all orders made by the Directors.

(5) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company.

(6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.

(7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of committees appointed by the Board.

All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

AGENTS AND SECRETARIES.

124. The firm of Bosanquet & Company, Limited, shall be the first Agents and Secretaries of the Company.

ACCOUNTS.

The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such sums were received and expended, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company. The accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

126. The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places,

and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholders shall have any right of inspecting any account, or book, or document of the Company except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in

General Meeting.

127. At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the previous financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary

of the property and liabilities of the Company, made up to the end of the same period.

128. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other heads of expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting, and in case where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been mcurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

129. The balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company, arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance,

or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

130. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which the Directors recommend should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

131. A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

132. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

AUDIT.

133. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or office of the Company shall, during the continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

134. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the second General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such meeting shall hold office only until the first Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment, or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

137. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.

Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers

relating thereto, and to report thereon to the meeting, generally, or specially, as he may think fit.

139. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the daytime have access to all accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of audit.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

140. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

141. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus

to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.

The Directors may, before recommending any dividend or bonus, set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they may select, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investment and apply such reserve fund or such portion thereof as they think fit, to meet contingencies or for special dividends, or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises of the Company, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purposes connected with the interest of the Company that they may from time to time deem expedient

without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

143. Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend or bonus declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends or bonuses which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part, by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures stock of the Company or of any other company, or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction, and when any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or bonus as may seem expedient to the Directors.

No unpaid dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

145. No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact

that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.

147. Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or of any bonus to be paid, shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augment tation of the reserve fund.

148. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual

receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

149. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

Notices.

150. Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

151. Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall

be registered as such in the books of the Company.

152. A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by being sent through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode, and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors, or to the Agent or Secretary, or Agents or Secretaries of the Company, their own or some other address in Ceylon to which notices may be sent.

153. All notices directed to be given to Shareholders shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly

entitled, other than a firm, be given to whichever of such person is named first in the register of Shareholders, and notice

so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

154. Any notice, if served by post, shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in the ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post office or post box, and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient a evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

Any Shareholder who fails to give and register an address in Ceylon as provided in Article No. 151 shall not

be entitled to be given any notices.

156. All notices required to be given by advertisement shall be published in the Ceylon Government Gazette.

ARRITRATION.

157. Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other company or person, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration.

EVIDENCE.

158. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company,

nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

159. Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

160. INTERPRETATION.

4. Depôt weights must be accepted, but buyers can have the right of giving notice, before the expiration of the date of payment, of having the actual weight ascertained. Should the difference between the depôt weight and the weight ascertained after re-weighing be more than 1½ per cent., the cost of re-weighing is to be borne by the Forest Department, and if within 1½ per cent. by the purchaser; any difference between the depôt weight and the weight ascertained after re-weighing is to be paid or allowed for, as the case may be. 5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depôt within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid, and will be at the risk of the

purchasers until removed.

6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid, or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid when so required, or refuse or fail to pay the full purchase amount or balance thereof, as the case may be, and to remove the timber within the time specified in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the re-sale, while, if an enhanced price is realized at such re-sale, he shall, however, have no claim to the profit which shall accrue to Government.

7. Agents bidding for others will be required to produce a written authority from the firm or persons for whom they bid, such authority will be retained by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, and will hold good only at the particular sale at which

it is produced.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, October 3, 1923, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 26, 1923.

Present:—Mr. T. Reid, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E., M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, M.L.C.; Mr. W. Philps; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee; Mr. A. D. Prouse; Mr. A. H. F. Clarke; and Mr. A. J. Wickwar.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 5, 1923, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of September 5, 1923, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Batnam asked the Chairman, the following questions:—(i.) If he has any information as to the reason why the Reform of the Constitution of the Municipal Council of Colombo is so long delayed? (ii.) Whether he took any action, if so what action he took to see that policemen were placed on duty at all important junctions of the City, as suggested in question No. 4 of the questions I asked him at the Meeting of Council, held on December 6, or the City, as suggested in question No. 4 of the questions I asked into at the Meeting of Council, held on December 6, 1922? (iii.) Whether he has ascertained why a policeman was not detailed for duty at the junction of Regent street with Maradana 2nd and 3rd Divisions, throughout the traffic hours of the day until after the occurrence of the last serious motor car accident, which resulted in the death of two men and injury to a boy; and (iv.) Whether he does not consider that some, at least, of the accidents that took place here could have been averted had this simple precaution been taken

The Chairman replied as follows:—(i.) The Hon. the Colonial Secretary informs me that the Government proposes to await the report of the Commission appointed to inquire into the interest relations between the content covernment and Local Authorities before taking further action in this matter; (ii.) In March, 1920, the Chairman conferred with the Inspector-General of Police about street accidents and inter alia, regarding the detailing of constables for duty at road The Inspector-General of Police arranged then to place police at all dangerous junctions. The questions to await the report of the Commission appointed to inquire into the financial relations between the Central Government Inspector-General of Police about street accidents and inter alia, regarding the detailing of constables for duty at road junctions. The Inspector-General of Police arranged then to place police at all dangerous junctions. The questions asked in December, 1922, were referred to the Police who reported that constables were posted at all hours of the day and up to certain hours at night at important junctions; (iii.) I am informed by the Inspector-General of Police that a constable is stationed at the Regent street, Maradana junction usually, but that no constable was on duty at the time of the accident as none were available owing to shortage of men due to sickness. The question is whether the presence of a constable would have prevented the manner of driving which caused the accident. This must be a matter of opinion; (iv.) I am not aware of the circumstances connected with any previous accidents, or whether they were due to absence of police from duty at the junction.

police from duty at the junction.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam further inquired whether the Chairman was aware that there has been no policeman on duty at this junction for the last year from 7 A.M. to 12 noon.

The Chairman said he was not aware of it, but he would inquire.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council desires to record its regret at the death of Sir Walter Davidson, K.C.M.G., Governor of New South Wales, who was Chairman of this Council from July, 1897, to September, 1898, and, who evinced the keenest interest in the welfare and advancement of this City. The motion was carried, in silence, all the Members standing.

Morgan, V.D., Barrister-at-Law, who was a zealous Member of this Council from February, 1891, to October, 1902, and to convey to his family an expression of its sympathy in their bereavement. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—The motion was carried, in silence, all the Members standing.

Provided further that this privilege shall not in any way interfere with the power of the Council to dispense with the services of any such officer or servant or to reduce his salary in case of reorganization or abolition of office and no claim to any additional grant on account of such reduction or abolition shall in any case be recognized. Any such officer or servant shall continue to be liable to suspension, dismissal, or removal from office in the same manner as if this rule did not exist.

No Medical Board is required if the officer or servant is proved to be over 60 years of age.

ANNEXURE A.

The amendments to Rabies Ordinance, No. 7 of 1893.

(The amendments are shown in italics.)

Definitions

" Disease."

Stray dogs."

" Suspected."

" Local authority."

- Section 3. In this Ordinance, unless the subject or context otherwise requires-
- "Disease" means rabies, and "diseased" means affected with rabies.
- "Stray dog" means any dog wandering at large and not being under the control or charge of any person.
- "Suspected" means suspected on reasonable grounds of being diseased, and when applied to dogs or other animals includes any dog or other animal which has been bitten by, or has been in contact with any diseased or suspected dog or other animal, or has been in circumstances in which it was likely to become infected with disease.

The words "local authority" denote a person falling under any of the descriptions hereafter following, viz.:-

- (a) Within the limits of a Municipality, the Chairman of the Municipal Council.(b) Within the limits of a Local Board, the Chairman thereof.
- Outside the limits of a Municipality or Local Board and within the limits of the Province or district respectively, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent thereof.
- Every police officer and every person duly authorized in writing by the Chairman of a Municipal Council or Local Board or by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent to act in his behalf for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance.
- "Police officer" includes inspectors, sergeants, and constables of police, and all headmen and peace officers.

Section 4. (2) If the dog so seized and detained be not claimed within twenty-four hours after the notice aforesaid has been served, or, in case no owner or other person is known to be in charge of the dog, within twenty-four hours of such seizure, or in case of non-payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such seizure and detention, it shall be competent to the local authority to cause the dog to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the local authority shall deem expedient.

" Unclaimed dogs."

Provided that when a dog is known to be registered or is wearing the metal ticket or badge in proof of registration, the period of detention shall not be less than three days.

Section 7. (1) Every owner or other person having under his charge a dog or other animal which is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a dog or other animal reasonably suspected, shall cause such dog or animal to be securely tied or otherwise confined, and shall forthwith give notice of the fact of such dog or animal being so diseased, suspected, or bitten, to a Police Officer or other person duly authorized under section 3 (d) of this Ordinance, of the district wherein the dog or animal so diseased, suspected, or bitten, is or was.

Notice by owner or possessor of diseased dog or other animal to police officer.

Section 7. (2) Any police officer receiving such notice shall forthwith transmit the information to the local authority specified in (a), (b), and (c) of section 3 of this Ordinance, who shall likewise inform the Principal Civil Medical Officer and the Government Veterinary Surgeon.

Section 7. (3) It shall be the duty of every such police officer, or other person duly authorized under section 3 (d) of this Ordinance—

Duty of police officer.

(a) To kill every dog or other animal which is diseased or which after any visit and inspection is found to have become diseased;

From time to time to visit and inspect any such suspected or bitten dog or other animal; After every visit and inspection to report the condition of such dog or other animal to the local authority specified in (a), (b), and (c) of section 3, within whose jurisdiction such dog or other animal is; and such local authority shall determine the time when such visits and inspection shall cease.

Section 8. A police officer or other person duly authorized under section 3 (d) of this Ordinance, receiving credible information of the existence of rabies, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of rabies, shall forthwith proceed to the place where such rabies is reported to exist, and put in force the powers conferred on him by this Ordinance or by the regulations made thereunder.

Police officer to proceed to place where rabies exist.

Section 11. Every police officer and every person duly authorized under section 3, sub-section (d), shall cause to be destroyed every diseased dog within his district, and if he thinks fit any suspected dog or any diseased animal other than a dog within his district, provided that if the owner of such dog or animal gives notice in writing to the local authority that he objects to such dog or animal being destroyed, the local authority shall cause it to be examined by a qualified Veterinary Surgeon or Medical Officer of Health, or a Medical Officer of the Civil Medical Department, and if such officer is of opinion that such dog or animal ought to be destroyed the local authority shall cause the same to be destroyed.

Destruction of diseased dog. Destruction of suspected dogs and diseased animals other than dogs. Notice by owner to local authority.

(a) The owner of every suspected dog which is not destroyed shall keep the same at his expense in such manner and in such place as the local athority may from time to time prescribe for a period not exceeding three months, and on failure such dog or other animal may be destroyed.

Section 12. (2) Any owner or person knowingly having in his possession a diseased or suspected dog or other animal, or a dog or other animal which has been bitten by a dog or other animal reasonably suspected to be diseased, shall, if he fail to give notice of the same to a police officer or other person duly authorized under section 3 (d) of this Ordinance as required by section 7 of this Ordinance, be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months, or both.

Penalty for failure to give notice under section 7.

Regulations framed under The Rabies Ordinance, No. 7 of 1893.

Regulation 1. Every owner of a dog shall cause such dog to be muzzled or led by a chain when in any public road or place, or road or place to which the public have access habitually whether as of right The muzzle shall be so constructed as to render it impossible for the dog, while wearing the same, or not. to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent the dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

Regulation 3. Any dog not effectually controlled found in any public road or place, or road or place to which the public have access habitually whether as of right or not, may be (a) destroyed by any police officer or by any person specially authorized thereto by the local authority, or (b) seized by any police officer or any person duly appointed for the purpose by the local authority. If seized, a dog shall be removed to such place as may be appointed, there to be dealt with in the following manner:—

(iii.) If the dog so seized and detained shall not have been claimed by such owner or person within 24 hours after the seizure, the local authority; shall cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the local authority may deem expedient.

Provided that when a dog is known to be registered or is wearing the metal ticket or badge in proof of registration, the period of detention shall not be less than three days.

Dog Registration Ordinance, No. 25 of 1901.

Section 10. (1) Every dog so seized shall be detained in some proper place and be there kept for such period [*not less than three days from the date of such seizure] as the proper authority may think expedient, provided that where the owner or other person who had charge of the dog is known, think expedient, provided that where the owner or other person who had charge of the dog is known, the proper authority shall cause notice to be forthwith given to either of them of the seizure and detention of the dog; and upon receiving payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such seizure and detention, together with the registration fee in the case of an unregistered dog, shall, unless the proper authority shall refuse to issue a certificate in respect of such dog, deliver the dog to the person noticed or his agent, without prejudice however to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of any of the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 10. (2) If the dog so seized and detained be not claimed within twenty-four hours after the notice aforesaid has been served, or in case no owner or other person is known to be in charge of the dog, within such period not less than twenty-four hours after such seizure as the proper authority may think expedient, or in case of non-payment of the reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such seizure and detention, and the registration fee if it be due as aforesaid, it shall be competent to the proper authority to cause the dog to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of in such manner as to the proper authority shall seem fit.

Provided that when a dog is known to be registered or is wearing the metal ticket or badge in proof of registration the period of detention shall not be less than three days.

Registration Fee on Dogs. (Chapter V. of M. C. By-laws.)

By-law No. 4. A fee not exceeding seven rupees and fifty cents in the case of female dogs and not exceeding five rupees in the case of male dogs shall be charged for each certificate issued. Provided that in the case of a dog which is under six months of age at the time of the issue of the certificate no fee shall be chargeable at the time of issue, but the owner or person in possession of it shall pay the fee as soon as the dog reaches the age of six months. Should any question at any time arise as to the age of any dog, the decision of the Chairman on the question of its age shall be final.

Dog to be produced when required.

By-law No. 7. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled because the conditions attached to the certificate have not been complied with shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Municipal dog pound at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it over to the pound-keeper, and it shall be competent to the local authority to cause the dog to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the local authority shall deem expedient.

T is notified for information that all previous regulations regarding the grant, forfeiture, and restoration of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal are hereby cancelled, and the following substituted:—

Regulations issued by His Excellency the Governor, Ceylon, as to the Grant, Forfeiture, and Restoration of "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal" issued under Royal Warrant of January 25, 1923.

Persons eligible.

- (a) Duly qualified members of the Ceylon Defence Force.
 - (b) Duly qualified members of the Ceylon Defence Force who have retired.
 - (c) Duly qualified reservists of the Ceylon Defence Force.

Qualifying service.

2. (a) Service requisite to qualify for the Medal shall be 20 years in all authorized Auxiliary Military Forces (i.e., other than Permanent Forces) of Dominions, Colonies, and Dependencies (except India), and of countries under British Protection (hereinafter referred to as Protectorates), whether designated as Militia or Volunteers or otherwise, and that service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon two-fold as qualifying service. The Medal may also be and that service on the West Coast of Africa small revision as quantying service. The Medal may also be granted to members who have retired after completing 20 years' service, and officers who have served in the ranks, but have not qualified for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration. Reservists who carry out the full training required from an Active member and earns the full Capitation Grant will be permitted to count each year during which he carries out such training and earns such grant as qualifying service for the Medal.

(b) Service rendered wholly in the Auxiliary Forces of one or more Dominions, Colonies, or Protectorafes. or partly in the Auxiliary Forces of one or more Dominions, Colonies, or Protectorates, partly in the Territorial Army of Great Britain, or partly in any Naval or Military Volunteer Forces of any part of the British Empire (except service since August 4, 1914, in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain raised under the Volunteer Acts, 1863-1916). shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Medal.

(c) Members who were serving in the Ceylon Defence Force on August 4, 1914, and did before November 11. 1918, actually serve or sign an agreement to serve beyond the boundaries of the Dominion, Colony, Dependency, or Protectorate, shall reckon all such embodied service on the active list two-fold as qualifying service towards the requisite 20 years, whether such service was in the Naval Forces, Military Forces, or Air Forces. Nothing in these

regulations shall permit service to count more than two-fold towards the award of the Medal.

(d) Service on the Permanent Staff shall not reckon as qualifying service for the Medal. (e) Service qualifying for the Medal shall also count towards the qualifying service necessary for "The Territorial Efficiency Medal" and vice versâ.

(f) An officer who has served in the ranks of the Territorial Army of Great Britain, or of the Auxiliary Forces of a Dominion, Colony, or Protectorate, but who is not qualified for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration, shall, on completing 20 years' service in all, be eligible to receive the Medal, but, should the aforesaid decoration subsequently be conferred upon him, he shall not be called upon to surrender the Medal, but shall not be permitted to wear it until such time as he has completed the full periods for both Decoration and Medal.

Application.

3. Application for the Medal will be made on Form D, through the usual channel of correspondence, to the Governor, whose decision upon the validity or otherwise of any claim to the Medal will be final. Retired members will apply through the Officer Commanding the Regiment (or Corps) in which they last served. Commanding Officers will forward with Form D their recommendation and a nominal roll arranged alphabetically on Form E. This roll will be forwarded with his recommendation to the Governor by the Commandant, Ceylon Defence Force.

Publication.

The grant of the Medal will be published in the Government Gazette.

Forfeiture.

5. When the conduct of any member after he has been awarded the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal has been such as to disqualify him from wearing it, he may be deprived of it by the Governor.

Restoration.

6. A Medal forfeited by any member under the provisions of paragraph 5 may be restored to him by the Governor.

Loss.

7. When a Medal has been lost, and it is desired to replace it, a declaration must be made before a Magistrate stating the circumstances under which the loss occurred, and the rank, name, and Corps of the individual to whom the Medal belonged. This declaration will be forwarded to the Governor through the usual channel of correspondence in the case of an individual still serving, and direct to the Governor in the case of one who has retired. The Medal will be replaced at the expense of the recipient if the explanation as to its loss is considered satisfactory.

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
