THE terms of an Instrument received from the Imperial War Graves Commission, London, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, appointing an Agency in Ceylon to act on behalf of the Commission, are published for general information.

Whereas the Imperial War Graves Commission whose chief place of business is at 82, Baker street, in the County of London (hereinafter called "the Commission") was incorporated by a Charter of Incorporation approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the Tenth day of May, 1917 (hereinafter called "the Charter"):

And whereas the Charter provides that the Commission may from time to time constitute and maintain Agencies in British Dominions beyond the Seas and in British Protectorates and in Foreign States charged with the duty of aiding the Commission to carry into effect any of the purposes of the Commission, and may delegate to any such Agency such of the powers, authorities, and privileges conferred on the Commission by the Charter as may be specified in the instrument constituting such Agency:

And whereas the Commission are desirous of appointing an Agency to carry into effect in Ceylon the purposes of the Commission, and it has been agreed that such Agency shall consist of the members hereinafter appointed:

Now, therefore, the Commission hereby appoint the persons for the time being holding the offices of—

The Officer Commanding the Troops in Ceylon,  
The Director of Public Works in Ceylon,  
The Chairman of the Municipal Council and Mayor of Colombo,

to be an Agency of the Commission in Ceylon under the style of the Ceylon War Graves Committee (hereinafter called "the Agency"), and hereby give, grant, constitute, appoint, and declare as follows, subject to such instruction as may be issued from time to time by the Commission and under the general control of the Commission.

#### I.—ORGANIZATION.

1. The Chairman of the Agency shall be the Officer Commanding the Troops in Ceylon, who shall summon and preside at all meetings of the Agency for the despatch of business.
2. There shall be a Secretary to the Agency, who shall be appointed by the Chairman.  
The Secretary shall not be a member of the Agency, but shall attend every meeting of the Agency.
3. The Agency shall meet for the despatch of business, and shall from time to time make such regulations with respect to the summoning notice, place, management, and adjournment of such meetings, and generally with respect to the transaction and management of business as they think fit, subject to the following conditions:—
  - (a) The quorum of the Agency shall consist of two members;
  - (b) Every question shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question;
  - (c) The names of the members present at a meeting shall be recorded, and upon a requisition made by two or more members voting on a question the names of the members voting on that question shall be recorded.
4. (i.) In case of an equality of votes at any meeting, the person presiding at such meeting shall have a second or casting vote.



(ii.) If any member is unable to be present at any meeting, he may appoint, subject to the approval of the Chairman, some fit person to represent him at such meeting, and such representative shall be entitled to exercise all the powers and privileges of such member, save that he shall not be entitled or chosen to preside at such meeting.

5. (i.) The Agency may from time to time appoint Advisory Committees, consisting of such persons as the Agency may think fit, to advise the Agency either permanently or temporarily on any special subject.

(ii.) The members of such Advisory Committees shall hold their offices during the pleasure of the Agency. Such Advisory Committees shall have power to make or adopt such regulations as to the holding of their meetings, and the conduct of their business thereat as they may from time to time see fit, but shall obey any directions given them by the Agency as to the exercise of their powers with regard to the subject referred to them.

## II.—PURPOSES AND POWERS OF THE AGENCY.

1. The purposes of the Agency are the following:—

(i.) To acquire land to be held by the Commission for the purpose of cemeteries in Ceylon in which any officers or men of His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces raised in any part of the British Empire who shall have died from wounds inflicted, accident occurring, or disease contracted while on active service whether on sea or land during the present war, may be buried.

(ii.) To make fit provision for the care of all graves of officers or men as aforesaid in such cemeteries, to erect buildings and permanent memorials therein, and generally provide for the maintenance and upkeep of such cemeteries, buildings, and memorials.

(iii.) To maintain records and registers of all graves within such cemeteries.

(iv.) To make fit provision for the care of all graves of officers and men as aforesaid, who may be buried elsewhere in Ceylon than in such cemeteries as aforesaid.

(v.) To acquire land to be held by the Commission for the purpose of providing or building permanent memorials elsewhere in Ceylon than in such cemeteries as aforesaid, in honour of any officers or men aforesaid.

2. The Agency is hereby authorized and empowered, subject to such conditions as may be formulated from time to time by the Commission under the general control of the Commission for the purposes aforesaid from time to time:—

(i.) To erect and maintain buildings and permanent memorials on or in any such cemetery, to plant trees, shrubs, and flowers therein, to make and maintain all necessary fences, ways, and paths, and to do all such other things as may be necessary for the general maintenance and upkeep of such cemetery.

(ii.) To permit or prohibit the erection by any person other than the Agency of permanent memorials in any such cemetery, or in any part of such cemetery, and, where such memorials are permitted, to receive and deal with applications by any persons to erect any such memorial, and to reject any application if the proposed memorial appears to the Agency (whose decision shall be final) to be unsuitable.

(iii.) To provide for the method of keeping all registers or branch registers used for all graves in such cemeteries, and for their inspection by the public, and their safe custody.

(iv.) To provide for the care of graves of any officers and men as aforesaid who may be buried elsewhere in Ceylon than in such cemeteries as aforesaid, for the placing of memorials on such graves, and for the doing of all such other things as the Agency may think proper with regard to such graves.

(v.) To take such steps as may be necessary under local law, to enable the Commission to hold any land, other than any such cemetery as aforesaid, for the purpose of providing or erecting any permanent memorial in honour of officers or men as aforesaid.

(vi.) To appoint and employ such officers or servants as may be necessary to carry out the work of the Commission.

(vii.) To enter into any contract, within the limits of expenditure authorized by the Commission, with a view to the carrying into effect of any of the purposes or the exercise of any of the powers of the Agency.

3. In the construction of the part of this instrument the word "cemetery" may or shall include a Buddhist, Hindu, or other non-Christian cremation ground, and any action which may be taken in regard to a cemetery under the provisions of this instrument may be taken in regard to such a cremation ground in so far as may be consistent with Buddhist, Hindu, or other such religious customs as may be applicable in the case of any such cremation ground.

## III.—FINANCIAL.

1. The Agency is hereby authorized and empowered to administer, subject to such conditions as may be notified from time to time by the Commission, all funds which may be granted to them by the Commission, or be received by them for the furtherance of the purposes of the Commission.

## IV.—ESTIMATES, ANNUAL REPORT, AND STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTS.

1. (i) The Agency will submit to the Commission for approval, estimates of any proposed expenditure to be met out of funds to be provided by the Commission, or received by the Agency for the furtherance of the purposes of the Commission.

(ii.) The accounts of the Agency shall be audited annually by an auditor or auditors who shall be chartered accountants, and who shall be named by the auditors to the Commission for the time being.

(iii.) The Agency shall, once in every year at least, prepare a General Report of its proceedings for the year preceding, and attach thereto a duly certified statement of accounts and of the finances of the Agency.

(iv.) The Agency shall, on the completion of every such Annual General Report and Statement of Accounts, forthwith submit the same to the Commission.

In witness whereof C. H. Gosling, Esq., C.H.J.P., M.P., and Sir R. A. Hudson, G.B.E., two members of the Commission, duly authorized by resolution, signed these presents, and the Vice Chairman of the Commission as the proper officer countersigned these presents, this Twentieth day of September, One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-three.

SIR,—With reference to my letter 5/A/301/S.1 of the 5th January, 1922, addressed to the Official Secretary, and more particularly paragraph 4 thereof, the definition of a war grave as now adopted by the Commission is the place of burial of any officer or man of His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces raised in any part of the Empire, who has died during the period 4th August, 1914, to 31st August, 1921, inclusive, from wounds inflicted, accident occurring, or disease contracted while on active service.

2. The expression "Active Service" means any whole time Naval, Military, or Air Service during the period 4th August, 1914, to 31st August, 1921, inclusive, provided in the case of Ceylon and other Crown Colonies in a similar position that the local forces were by Proclamation declared to be on active service. Part time service in action against an enemy is also a qualification.

3. The definition also includes the graves of members of the Mercantile, Marine, and members of Civilian organizations employed with the armed forces of, and recognized by, the different Governments of the Empire. These two last classes are subject to the condition that death must have occurred during whole time service in the Mercantile, Marine, or in the Civilian organization; in the case of merchant seamen that death was due to enemy action, and in the case of civilians that death occurred either overseas or from wounds inflicted overseas.

4. With regard to the Navy, all officers and men of the Navy are regarded as having been on active service from the 4th August, 1914, to the 15th April, 1921.

5. Any graves which in view of the above may appear to come within the power of the Commission should be added to the lists. Doubtful cases should be referred here.

6. I should be glad if the lists forwarded with my letter above quoted could be returned completed at an early date.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 1, 1923.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 148 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 10 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1923, viz., 250,431) was 30·8, as against 24·1 in the preceding week, 30·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 195 (6 Burghers, 106 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 40 Moors, 2 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 40·6, as against 31·4 in the previous week, 33·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·2 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 195 deaths, 52 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 25 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 4 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Kollupitiya, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena South, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in St. Paul's, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 4 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 10 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. Fifteen deaths each were registered from *Infantile Convulsions and Debility*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Worms* and *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 78 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eighteen cases of *Chicken-pox*, 17 of *Enteric Fever*, 6 of *Plague*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 26, 24, 2, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79·6°, against 81·0° in the preceding week, and 79·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·919 in., against 29·899 in. in the preceding week, and 29·834 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·27 in., against 1·10 in. in the preceding week, and 2·10 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on October 20, 1923, at 12.45 p.m., in accordance with the Notice dated October 16, 1923.

Present:—Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Mr. W. D. Perera; Mr. P. M. Bingham; and Dr. R. F. La Brooy.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 15, 1923, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The Chairman moved a vote of condolence with the family of the late Mr. J. P. Lewis, who was Chairman of this Council for a period of over four years until his retirement in 1910. Mr. Ratwatte seconded and the vote was passed in silence all standing.

3. The following documents were submitted:—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1922 to September 30, 1923, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for September, 1923.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of September, 1923.

(e) Reservoir readings for September, 1923.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, stand-pipes, and house service taps inspected during September, 1923.

5. Mr. de Silva presented a petition from the residents of Getambe, praying that a stand post be erected near the Getambe Police Station.—Resolved that the petition be referred to the Superintendent of Works for estimate.

6. Mr. de Silva drew the attention of the Chairman to a public latrine in Katugastota, which in his opinion was of no use and should be demolished.

It was agreed to send papers to Mr. de Silva for remarks and bring the question up before the Sanitation Committee at their next Meeting.
