## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 15, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 135 (3 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 18 Moors, 2 Mallays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1923, viz.; 250,431) was 28·1, as against 30·8 in the preceding week, 30·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 169 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 24 Moors, 4 Malays, and 14 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 35.2, as against 33.3 in the previous week, 36.6 in the correspond-

ing week of last year, and 31 · 2 the weekly average for last year.

\*\*Infantile Deaths.\*\*—Of the 169 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 45 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 16.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. Twenty-five deaths from Phthisis were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Maradana North, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana East, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 21 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(a) Thirteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana hospital, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 15 in the previous week, and 22 the

weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 7 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospital, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year. 3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Mara-

dana North, and Wellawatta North, same as in the previous week, and against 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and

Maradana hospital, as against 4 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

5. Seventeen deaths were registered from Debility, 15 from Enteritis, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Dysentery,

6 from Worms, 5 from Diarrhæa, 3 from Puerperal Septicæmia, and 53 from Other Causes.
6. Twenty-five cases of Chickenpox, 8 of Plague, 5 of Enteric Fever, 2 of Smallpox, and 1 of Measles were reported

during the week, as against 13, 4, 18, nil, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·1°, against 80·1° in the preceding week and 75·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29:851 in., against 29:895 in. in the preceding week and 29:931 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2:05 in., against 1.47 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Thursday, November 8, 1923, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 1, 1923.

Present:—Mr. T. Reid, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C; the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E., M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, M.L.C.; Mr. W. Philps; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. E. W. Jayewardene, K.C.; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee; Mr. A. D. Prouse; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. H. F. Clarke; Mr. A. J. Wickwar; and the Hon Mr. L. Macrae, M.L.C.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 3, 1923, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of October 3, 1923, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E., asked the Chairman the following questions:—Will the Chairman submit to the Members of this Council at an early date the following information:—(a) List of sanitary improvements estimated for and awaiting the allocation of funds; (b) Street improvement scheme with estimated cost; (c) Public market and laundry scheme with estimated cost; (d) Any other measures for the welfare of the city which have to be undertaken in the near future; (e) Improvements to waterworks by laying of new mains, &c.; (f) Any other equipment or plant needed for Municipal service.

The Chairman replied as follows:—The pressing needs of the city have been tabulated and in several cases detailed or approximate estimates have been worked out for the small fraction of these needs for which funds might possibly be available in the near future. The list of needs is placed before the Council's Committees annually to enable them to frame a policy of expenditure based on a comprehensive survey of the City's needs and financial resources. Taking the headings set out in the question, seriatim, the following is a list of the chief needs of the moment:—

Sanitary.—Underground rainwater drains in the slum areas and in congested districts with kerbs, channels, and pavements. The estimated cost of two such schemes sanctioned, Wolfendahl street and Malay street, was Rs. 61,500. About a million rupees would be needed to deal with some of the worst streets. Demolition of slums and opening up wide thoroughfares therein. The estimate for opening up such a thoroughfare from Wolfendahl street to the Harbour road, a distance of 230 yards, is about Rs. 340,000. Many millions of rupees could be expended on slum clearance. The arterial drainage only of the Timbirigasyaya area, 600 acres odd, where undrained buildings are now being erected, would cost about Rs. 600,000. Even in the areas where skeleton sewers and drains exist, 1,623 acres roughly, the laying of lateral sewers and drains would cost several million rupees. The laying out of the cemetery at Kirillapone will cost over Rs. 100,000. Extension of the sewage treatment works is needed at a cost of about Rs. 200,000. To instal mosquito proof gullies would cost is. 125,000. A refuse destructor for South Colombo would cost about Rs. 400,000.

Streets.—The wideing even of the main streets, which are far too narrow, would cost several million rupees. To widen Symond's road from Maradana to the Dean's road bridge, a distance of 500 yards, would cost about Rs. 400,000. To widen Bambalapitiya read between Buller's road and Brownrigg road, a distance of 350 yards, would cost, without underground drains, Rs. 89000. To construct new roads needed would also cost millions of rupees. For instance, the cost of a road from Turret read to Dickman's road, parallel to the Galle road, might be about Rs. 750,000. Several roads need stone setts at Rs. 140, per square, others need asphalt surfaces at Rs. 35, per square. The cost of paving Keyzer street, 495 yards in length, is estimated at Rs. 68,000. A sum of about Rs. 1,000,000 would enable a good start to be made on the construction of permanent road surfaces. The Council would require a large capital sum (to be recovered later) for the construction of private roads. To widen and make up one such road, Alfred place for instance, would cost about Rs. 110,000.

 ${\it Markets.}$ —In addition to the four new markets sanctioned or built recently, markets are needed at least at Wellawatta, Mutwal, Grandpass, and Urugodawatta.

Laundries.—Laundries are needed at Polwatta, Old Moor street, Kanatta and possibly other places. A sum of about Rs. 1,000,000 would be needed to provide the markets and laundries now needed.

Waterworks.—Three additional filters are needed at Labugama at a cost of about Rs. 175,000. A 30-inch main is needed for South Colombo from Maligakanda Reservoir to Union place at a cost of Rs. 217,000. Spindle and valve hydrants are needed at a cost of about Rs. 100,000. Deacon waste metres at a cost of about Rs. 100,000.

Plant and Equipment.—The supercession of bullock drawn by mechanically propelled vehicles is desirable where savings would ultimately result. The initial cost would be great. Barges and winches and haulage plant will be needed for the Biyagama quarry at a cost of about Rs. 85,000. At least one more Fire Station is needed and a motor turntable and street alarm points for the Fire Brigade. The cost would be perhaps two lakhs of rupees. Should any further details be required, I shall be glad to supply them, if possible.

3. Notice of the following questions by Dr. E. V. Ratnam, not having been given in time, the Chairman asked the meeting whether permission should be granted that the questions be put.

The permission having been granted, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, asked the Chairman—(1) Whether he is aware that the tram cars licensed under the Vehicles Ordinance of 1916, generally carry more passengers than they are by their licenses authorized to carry, often to the point of uncomfortably overcrowding them? (2) If he is aware, what steps he has taken to prevent this condition of the license being so flagrantly violated? (3) What are the reasons for the issue of a printed notice curtailing from 1924 the time now allowed to rate-payers to pay the quarterly rates in, especially at the present time when the rate-payers, the majority of them, are endeavouring with great difficulty and hardship to themselves to pay the rates within the time allowed and when as a result rates are being collected better than ever before?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) and (2), I have frequently seen tram cars overcrowded. This matter has been the subject of correspondence between the Police, the Tram Company, and the Municipality at least since 1915. The Police intervene only when overcrowding is dangerous as, for instance, when passengers stand on the footboards or the like. In 1920 the whole matter was discussed afresh, and the Tramway Company was allowed to use trailers so as to meet the public needs. This greatly alleviated the trouble. At the end of last year the matter was again investigated without much result. The overcrowding occurs at certain times in the day when people are proceeding to or from the days' work. They rush the cars available instead of waiting for the arrival of other cars. This occurs in practically every city, London

included, and an effective remedy has not been discovered. It would be no easy matter to prevent a rush on a tram car and it is doubtful whether people would not prefer to travel in some discomfort rather than be kept waiting. The Tramway Company now inform me that they will try to put on cars every three minutes, instead of every four minutes as at present, during the busy hours. They state they have an ample number of cars, but they cannot utilize them all during the busy hours without blocking up street traffic.

- (3) It was known in 1920 that arrears of rates to the end of 1919, fourth quarter, were about 1½ million upees, and that several people would have to pay current rates and arrears at the same time till the arrears had disappeared. I was asked to give time for the payment of current rates and I laid down temporarily in 1920 that warrants in respect of overdue current rates should not issue for a month after the last day of each quarter. The total arrears at the end of September were Rs. 228,427, all of which, except Rs. 94,560, are due on current rates. Arrears have largely disappeared, and the najority of the rate-payers are now merely paying rates as they fall due. Unfortunately, the concession of a month's grace, which was meant for rate-payers in arrears, is being made use of generally. In England rates are generally payable in advance. Here the Ordinance allows the Chairman to demand the rates within any time he shall deem reasonable, and I have decided after due notice to ask for payment within the quarter for which they are due.
- Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 10 (inclusive) on the agenda. The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on November 28, 1923, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated November 23, 1923.

Present:—Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. W. D. Perera; Mr. P. M. Bingham; and Dr. R. F. LaBrooy.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on October 20, 1923, and of the joint meeting of the four Standing Committees held on November 7, 1923, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

1a. Chairman moved—That the Council do place on record an expression of grief on the occasion of the deaths of Mr. Allenson Bailey and Mr. L. W. Booth, who were Chairman of this Council, and convey their sympathy to the relatives.

Mr. Ratwatte seconded, and the motion was passed all members standing.

2. The following documents were submitted:—(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1922 to October 31, 1923, on account of the Municipal Fund; (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date; (c) Health Officer's report for October, 1923; (d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by

the Municipal Magistrate during the month of October, 1923; (e) the reservoir readings for October, 1923.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in

the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies,

stand-pipes, and house-service taps inspected during October, 1923.
4. Correspondence:—(1) Letter No. 35 of October 26, 1923, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, requesting the Council to reconsider the question of grant to Palle Mahaiyawa school, as the Director of Education has reported that the school is not fit for registration.—Read.

Resolved that the Colonial Secretary be informed that the grant was made in order to enable the school to become fit for registration, and, as on the strength of this grant a certificated teacher has been obtained, Council desires that the

grant be sanctioned.

(2) Letter No. 41 of November 21, 1923, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, stating that His Excellency the Governor has sanctioned a loan of Rs. 50,000 for the construction of Model tenements.—Read.

(3) Endorsement No. 9 of November 22, 1923, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 165 to the widow and three minor children of the late K. M. Werellagama, Process Server.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 3,207 of November 15, 1923, from the Director of Public Works, stating that the Council should bear the bulk of cost of widening Cemetery road, estimated at Rs. 9,200.—Read.

Resolved that the Director of Public Works be asked to reconsider in view of the congestion as far as the Railway

Station.

(5) Letter No. 6,124 of November 19, 1923, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, stating that no funds are available for making a contribution for widening of the Cemetery road.—Read. (6) Two petitions dated November, 1923, from the Daily Space Holders complaining of the increase in the daily

-Resolved that the petitions be referred to the Finance Committee.

5. Pursuant that the petitions be referred to the Finance Committee.

5. Pursuant that the Mr. de Silva moved—That a Committee be appointed to consider the advisability of opening an Industrial School within Municipal limits. Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

Messrs. Ratwatte, Perera, and the mover were elected to form a Committee to confer with the Trustees of the late Kandy Industrial School and submit a report to the Council.

6. Mr. Bingham's report on the Kandy water supply, with remarks thereon from the Director of Public Works, and further report from Mr. Bingham.—Tabled.

Chairman stated that the Director of Public Works will shortly inspect the site of the proposed reservoir and personally investigate into the Scheme.

Mr. de Silva suggested that the Director of Public Works he asked to inspect and report on the Ampitive streams too.

Mr. de Silva suggeted that the Director of Public Works be asked to inspect and report on the Ampitiya streams too. 7. Papers relating to the loan of Rs. 100,000, obtainable from the Disabled Ceylon Men's Fund, for the Kandy Water Supply Scheme.—Tabled

Resolved that inquiry be made from the Secretary of the Disabled Ceylon Men's Fund whether he would agree to a

condition allowing repayment of the whole outstanding sum at any time.

8. To obtain sanction for the payment of a bonus of Rs. 300 to Mr. J. Oorloff, Assistant Engineer, Board of Improve-

ment, for overtime work done in working out the details of the Water Supply Scheme out of the vote of Rs. 2,500 taken for the purpose.—Resolved that payment be sanctioned.

9. To fix rents—(1) for the Model tenements at Mahaiyawa; (2) for the rat-proof rice boutique at Mahaiyawa; (3) for the sundry goods boutique at Mahaiyawa.

Resolved (1) that the rent for each room in the Model tenements be fixed at Rs. 4 per mensem, and that the rent of the rice boutique and the sundry goods boutique be fixed as Rs. 15 and Rs. 25, respectively, per mensem, and the right of their occupation be sold by auction for a period of 12 months.

10. To obtain sanction for the acceptance of the following tender for the privilege of collecting market daily rents for 1924:—S. A. A. Fernando, Rs. 15,500.—Resolved that the tender be accepted.

11. Chairman's Administration Report for 1922.—Tabled.

12. Supplemental Budget No. 1 of 1923.—Tabled.—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget be adopted.

Draft Budget for 1924 and schedule of rates and taxes leviable in 1924 as approved by the four Standing 13. Committees

Mr. de Silva moved—That the increase of 2 per cent. in the property rates approved of at the meeting of the four Standing Committees be not imposed in 1924, and the Budget be adjusted by deleting the item of Rs. 20,000 provided on the expenditure side for payment of the yearly instalment of principal and interest on the proposed Water Works Loan. Mr. Pieris seconded.

Mr. Ratwatte moved as an amendment—That the increase of 2 per cent in the property rates be levied in 1924, and the item of Rs. 20,000 be not deleted from the Budget, as any further postponement of the improvements to and extension of the water supply is not in the interests of the town. Mr. Bingham seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried by 4 to 3. Ayes:—Mr. Ratwatte, Mr. Bingham, Dr. LaBrooy, and the Chairman. Noes:—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Pieris, and Mr. Peréra.

At this stage Dr. Hay attended the meeting.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, November 10, 1923, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated November 5, 1923.

Present:—Mr. F. Bartlett, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene; Mr. H. M. Macan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. W. W. Morgan; and Dr. F. R. Alles.

- 4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(2) That the causes of the periodical discolouration, bad smell, and fishy taste of the water supply in the Talapitiya area be explored, and that steps be taken to improve the water in that locality." Mr. D. G. Goonewardene seconded.—Carried.
- 5. Letter No. 16/25371 of October 31, 1923, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, conveying the thanks of His Excellency the Governor for the resolution passed by the Council at the meeting held on October 13, 1923.—Read.

- 6. Letter from the Secretary, Municipal Council, Kandy, inquiring if the Council would adopt the amendment to the Government Pension Minute, published in the Government Gazette of February 16, 1923.—Resolved that the Council is willing to reciprocate.
- 7. Letter from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, requesting permission to construct a rifle range on the seaward side of Victoria park, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved—That the application be disallowed. Mr. G. E. Abeywardene seconded.—Carried.
  - (Mr. W. W. Morgan left the meeting at this stage.)
- 8. Supplemental Budget for 1923.—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1923, as published in Government Gazette of October 26, 1923, be passed.


