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"THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, 1902."

RULE made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 5 of "The Railways Ordinance, 1902," in substitution for the additional sub-clause (e) of rule 44 of the rules and rates relating to the Conveyance of Goods Train Traffic, published in *Gazette* No. 6,730 of July 30, 1915 :--

**RULE 44**.

Additional Sub-clause (e).

In addition to the receptacles specified in sub-clause (b), receptacles of capacity in excess of 5 gallons and not exceeding 65 gallons will be accepted for conveyance by goods train unpacked, provided they are in accordance with the samples approved by and deposited with the General Manager of the Railway.

Any provision contained in any rule made under the said Ordinance in any way contrary to the provision of this rule shall, as from the coming into operation of this rule, be repealed.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 3, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 108 (4 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 12 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1922, viz., 246,273) was  $22 \cdot 9$ , as against  $29 \cdot 0$  in the preceding week,  $30 \cdot 4$  in the corresponding week of last year, and  $32 \cdot 8$  the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 149 (8 Burghers, 82 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was  $31 \cdot 5$ , as against  $32 \cdot 0$  in the previous week,  $24 \cdot 8$  in the corresponding week of last year, and  $30 \cdot 5$  the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 149 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 41 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Still-births.-The number of still-births registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Deaths—1. (a) Nineteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 8 in the hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 23 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

 $(\check{b})$  Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Maradana North, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 2 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered in New Bazaar as against 5 in the previous week.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in the hospitals (of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, and Maradana East, as against 6 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and the hospital (of a non-resident), as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Thirteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 10 from Debility, 9 from Enteritis, 6 from Worms, 5 from Diarrhea, 4 from Dysentery, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Puerperal Septicæmia, and 54 from Other Causes.

6. Thirteen cases of *Enteric Fever*, 12 of *Chickenpox*, 2 of *Measles*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 10, 7, 5, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was  $82 \cdot 1^{\circ}$ , against  $82 \cdot 8^{\circ}$  in the preceding week and  $83 \cdot 2^{\circ}$  in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was  $29 \cdot 870$  in, against  $29 \cdot 818$  in in the preceding week and  $29 \cdot 879$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was  $1 \cdot 99$  in., against  $2 \cdot 30$  in. in the preceding week and  $0 \cdot 44$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
