And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-first day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-two.

"THE ESTATE DUTY ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1919."

RULES made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Estate Duty Ordinance, No. 8 of 1919," in supersession of the rules promulgated with the Notification dated March 19, 1920, and published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 7,094 of March 26, 1920. These rules shall come into force from July 1, 1922.

RULES.

1. *Short title.*—These rules may be cited as the Estate Duty Rules of 1922.
2. *Interpretation.*—In these rules the term "Commissioner" means "the Commissioner of Stamps."
"The said Ordinance" means "The Estate Duty Ordinance, No. 8 of 1919."
"Prescribed form" or "Prescribed forms" shall mean the form or forms prescribed by the Commissioner under the provisions of section 4 of the said Ordinance.
3. *Affidavit as to Estate.*—The statement of property and declaration required to be lodged with the proper officer in terms of section 21 (1) of the Ordinance shall set forth the particulars and value of the estate of the deceased person according to the prescribed form and the statement of property shall be furnished in duplicate.
The statement of property and declaration required to be delivered to the proper officer in terms of section 21 (4) of the Ordinance shall set forth the particulars and value of the beneficial interest passing to the applicant upon such death according to the prescribed form, and, if accompanied by an application in terms of section 24 (2) of the Ordinance, shall further set forth the particulars necessary thereunder as shown in the said form.
4. *How Form to be filled.*—In the statement of property required to be lodged with the proper officer in terms of section 21 (1) of the Ordinance, the assets and debts of the deceased shall be classified according to the several headings shown in the prescribed form.
In any cases where no asset exists corresponding to the headings set out in the prescribed form the word "nil" must be written against each of them.
Property coming under each of the above headings must be particularized in schedules. If there are any assets not coming properly under any of these headings, such assets must be included in a schedule under the special heading provided.
5. *Aggregation.*—If it is claimed that any part of the property set forth in the statement of property furnished is not aggregable with the deceased's free property, but forms an estate by itself in terms of section 15 (1) and (2), a separate statement should be annexed showing the property not so aggregable.
6. *Claims to exemption from Duty.*—Property of the deceased in respect of which exemption from estate duty is claimed must be shown in the statement provided therefor in the prescribed form. If no property exists corresponding to the headings in the said statement the word "nil" must be written against each of them. The grounds upon which exemption is claimed must be fully set forth at the foot of the statement.
7. *Payment of Duty.*—If the person accountable for duty has been allowed to pay the duty by instalments, he shall forthwith appear before the Commissioner or other officer appointed by him for this purpose, and execute a bond according to the prescribed form.
8. *Payment to be in Cash.*—All payments to the Commissioner in respect of duties under the said Ordinance shall be made in cash.
9. *Address of Service ; Service by Post.*—Every account and statement furnished shall be headed with the address for service at which the person accountable under the said Ordinance, or the proctor acting on behalf of such person, may be served by the Commissioner with any notice which the Commissioner may require, or authorize to be delivered to such person accountable or his or her proctor. Any such notice may be given or served by the Commissioner by sending the same through the post addressed to such person accountable or his or her proctor at the address for service named as aforesaid.
10. *Who to comply with Notice or Demand, &c.*—Any notice or demand sent by the Commissioner for the delivery or lodgment of any account, return, or form required by the said Ordinance, or for any document, book, or other particulars or explanations required by him for the purposes of the said Ordinance, shall be complied with by the executor, administrator, or other accountable person, and within the time prescribed in any such notice or demand.
11. *Record of Estate.*—When an estate has been recorded at the Stamp Office, a reference number shall be given thereto, and such reference number must be quoted in any dealings, correspondence, or inquiries relating to such estate.
12. *Noting on Returns.*—The Commissioner may cause to be made on any completed forms or on any accounts or returns furnished to him for the purposes of the said Ordinance such additions, corrections, observations, or directions as he thinks fit. Such writing shall be made in a different coloured ink from that in which the original document has been made, and shall be noted by the person making it. Any writing so made shall not affect the validity of the original document, or relieve the person making the same from any proceedings or penalties incurred under the said Ordinance.
13. *Endorsement of Grant.*—Upon receipt of the certificate issued by the Commissioner under section 23 (3) of the Ordinance, the District Judge shall certify on the face of the grant of probate or letters of administration the fact and date of issue of the Commissioner's certificate, the value of the estate upon which duty was assessed, and the amount of duty assessed. No grant shall issue unless such certificate under the hand of the District Judge appears thereon. The certificate issued by the Commissioner shall be attached to the copy of the grant filed in the case.

14. *Subsequent Enhancement of Estate.*—If at the time when the final account is filed or at any time subsequent to the issue of the certificate by the Commissioner, it is brought to the notice of the District Judge that any property subject to estate duty is of greater value than that on which estate duty was actually computed, or that any property of the deceased not originally included in the estate was subsequently discovered, it shall be the duty of the District Judge to report the matter to the Commissioner. The District Judge shall also report to the Commissioner the results of sale of all property, movable and immovable, sold in the course of the testamentary proceedings.

15. *Forms.*—The forms prescribed from time to time by the Commissioner under section 4 shall be used for the several purposes of the said Ordinance to which they are respectively applicable.

When any form provides that a schedule or statement may or shall be annexed thereto, the full particulars relating to the items to which such schedule or statement is to relate shall be fully set forth in a schedule to be numbered and annexed to the form; and such schedule shall be verified by a declaration to be made by the person furnishing such form.

Any such forms may be modified to meet the circumstances of any particular case.

quantity which may from time to time be imported under it, and no consignment shall be delivered to the importer

RULES made by the Board of Agriculture under section 7 of "The Department of Agriculture Ordinance, No. 37 of 1921."

Rules as adopted by the Board of Agriculture at its Meeting held on August 24, 1921.

1. The meetings of the Board shall be held twice annually in the months of February and August, and on such other occasions as may be desired by the President. Such meetings shall be open to all members of Planters' Associations, the Estate Agents' Association, the Low-country Products Association, Agricultural Societies or Food Production Committees, and such other persons as may be allowed by the President.

2. The Estates Products Committee shall meet at Peradeniya six times per annum on the second Thursday of the months of January, March, May, July, September, and November.

3. The Food Products Committee shall meet four times per annum at different important centres in the months of February, June, August, and December.

4. *The President of the Board shall be Chairman at full meetings of the Board and of the Executive Committee of the Board. In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall be Chairman, and in the absence of both President and Vice-President, the members present shall elect their own Chairman.*

5. The Director of Agriculture shall be the Chairman of any meeting of the Estate Products Committee or of the Food Products Committee, and in his absence at any meeting the members present may elect their own Chairman.

6. Every member of any Committee who has not by December 31 in each year attended one-half of the meetings of such Committee during the preceding twelve months or during his tenure of office, shall be considered to have vacated his seat, unless he has been absent through ill-health or with leave.

7. At meetings of the Executive Committee five members shall form a quorum, and at meetings of the Estates Products Committee and the Food Products Committee twelve members shall form a quorum.

8. At each meeting the Chairman shall have an original vote, and in the case of equality of votes, he shall further have a casting vote.

9. Fourteen days at least before the date of the meeting of any Committee the Secretary of such Committee shall post notices of the meeting to the members of such Committee. Notice of any subjects that any members of any Committee may desire to place on the agenda of any meeting shall reach the Secretary of such Committee seven days at least before the date appointed for the meeting.

10. No subject shall be placed on the agenda for discussion at any meeting of the Estate Products Committee or of the Food Products Committee unless approved by the Chairman of such Committee. Provided, however, that where the Chairman has ruled out such subjects as being not relevant to the purposes of the Committee, it shall be open to the proposer of such subject to appeal to the Executive Committee for a decision as to whether it should be discussed or not, and the decision of the Executive Committee in the matter shall be final.

11. The meetings of the Estate Products Committee and of the Food Products Committee shall be open to the press. Proceedings of the meetings of the Executive Committee shall not be open to the press, but a précis of such proceedings shall be supplied to the press for general information.

12. It shall be the duty of each Secretary to keep a proper record of the minutes of the Board or of the Committee of which he is Secretary.

Rules for the Conduct of Voting by Ballot for or against the Existence of Arrack, Toddy, and Foreign Liquor Taverns, and Places Licensed for the Sale of Beer and Porter by Retail.

1. In these rules—

- (i.) The expression "area" means an area defined by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent, with the advice of his Advisory Committee.
- (ii.) The expression "tax-paying inhabitants" means persons who being liable under section 49 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1861 to perform labour upon thoroughfares in this Colony as residents within an area who during the previous twelve months and on or before March 31 of the year in which the list was prepared—

- (a) Have commuted or performed labour in that area;
- (b) Have been certified as *bona fide* efficient soldiers under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910.

NOTE.—(1) The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall cause lists of these tax-paying inhabitants to be prepared by or before May 1 of each year, wherever practicable. Such lists shall be available for inspection by opponents and supporters of taverns or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail. If it is shown to the satisfaction of the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent that any name has been wrongly entered in, or that any name which should have been entered had been omitted, in the lists, the same shall be amended accordingly. No name shall be added to or struck out from the lists after such amendment.

(2) The names of tax-paying inhabitants who have died in the interval between the preparation of the lists of such inhabitants and the recording of votes shall not be taken into consideration when determining the proportion of votes recorded to the number of road tax-paying inhabitants on the lists, nor the names of those who at the time of the ballot are in jail or otherwise prevented by operation of the law from being present.

2A. If it be shown to the satisfaction of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent and his Advisory Committee that 60 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of an area served by one or more arrack, toddy, or foreign liquor taverns or places licensed for the sale of beer and

porter by retail are opposed to the existence of such taverns or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail within such area, such tavern or taverns or such place or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail shall be abolished, with effect from the commencement of the rent period in respect of which the ballot is held.

2B. Voters shall have the power to vote only for or against the total abolition of arrack, toddy, or foreign liquor taverns or of places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail, whichever they so desire, but they shall not have the power to vote for a reduction in the number of arrack, toddy, or foreign liquor taverns or of places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in any area provided that this paragraph (B) shall apply only when the areas defined for such arrack, toddy, foreign liquor or beer shops coincide. In other cases each poll shall be separate.

2C. The area defined shall be the area served, but that area shall not exceed the area of a circle whose diameter is 4 miles, but where the 4-mile limit cuts a village in two, the whole of such village shall be excluded from the area defined, unless more than half the village falls within the circumference.

2D. Where there is more than one tavern or place licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in any area, provided that they are not more than one mile apart the area defined for all such taverns shall be one and the same but, if the area served by one is larger than the area served by the others, such larger area shall be defined as the area of all, and any ballot against any such taverns shall be a joint ballot against all the taverns and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in such area.

3. Information as regards the boundaries or definitions of areas can be obtained from Kachcheries.

4. Objections to the existence of the arrack, toddy, or foreign liquor tavern or taverns or of the place or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in any particular area will be accepted by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent on or before July 31, 1922,

in respect of the 1923-24 rent or licensing period; and on or before July 31, of each succeeding year in respect of each succeeding rent or licensing period.

Provided that the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall not make any arrangements to record votes, unless it be shown to his satisfaction that the number of persons raising any such objection represents not less than 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants in that area.

Provided further, that such objection shall be made in writing, and that unless the person objecting to the existence of an arrack, toddy, or foreign liquor tavern or taverns, or of a place or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail adds against his name the number of his last road tax receipt or the number of his last certificate of performance of labour, or in the case of a person exempted for military service, his rank, regimental number, and the unit to which he belongs, he will not be counted towards the 25 per cent. necessary to secure the ballot.

A similar procedure shall be followed in respect of applications to re-open taverns.

5. Where a Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent is satisfied that objections have been received on or before the due date as specified in rule 4 above from 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of any area against the existence of the arrack, toddy, or foreign liquor tavern or taverns, or of the place or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail within such area, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall fix a date, time, and place at which votes will be recorded for the purpose of ascertaining whether 60 per cent. of such tax-paying inhabitants are opposed to the existence of such tavern or taverns, or of such place or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail and shall give not less than twenty days' notice thereof. Provided that the place at which votes shall be recorded shall be within the said area, if such an arrangement is practicable.

6. Such notice shall be given by publication in one or more local newspapers, by fixing copies of the notice at the Kachcheri, the local Police Court, and the Village Tribunal within the jurisdiction of which the said area is situated, and at prominent places within the said area, and by beat or tom-tom, or such other method as the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall direct. The notice shall state the names of the villages comprised in the said area.

7. It shall be the duty of all division officers of the villages forming the said area to allow voters and any person or persons interested in the ballot to inspect the returns prepared by such division officers under sections 4 and 9 of the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, and to take copies thereof.

8. The recording officer in charge of the ballot shall be the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or some person deputed by him in writing, who shall preside at the ballot, and have power to decide all questions arising in connection with the ballot. Objections shall be noted, and the decision of the presiding officer on such objections shall be recorded; such records shall be at the disposal of the Advisory Committee.

9. An agent accredited by the voters in the said area may be present during the progress of the ballot.

10. No person shall be entitled to vote unless he either—

- (a) Produces at the time of voting a receipt for road tax paid by him within the twelve months preceding March 31 of the year in which the ballot is held as a resident within the area served by the tavern or taverns or by the place or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail proposed to be abolished; or
- (b) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as having performed the labour due by him under the Thoroughfares Ordinances, and produces such certificate at the time of voting; or
- (c) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as a *bona fide* efficient soldier of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910; and produces such certificate at the time of voting.

11. Polling shall be from 7 A.M. to 7 P.M., and shall be begun and finished on one day when practicable. But the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or the presiding officer shall have power to postpone the poll if in his opinion inclemency of the weather justifies postponement. Voting shall be carried on as expeditiously as possible. No voter shall be kept waiting merely because other voters from his village have not arrived.

12. The votes shall be counted as soon as possible after the close of the ballot, and the result declared immediately after it has been ascertained.

13. Only ballot papers in the forms annexed hereto and issued by the recording officer shall be used in recording votes. Each ballot paper shall have a number printed on the back, and shall have a counterfoil with the same number printed on the face.

14. At the time of voting the ballot paper shall be marked on both sides with an official seal and delivered to the voter within the polling station, and a number corresponding to the number of the voter on the list of tax-paying inhabitants shall be marked on the counterfoil. A mark shall be placed in the list of tax-paying inhabitants against the number of the voter to denote that he has received a ballot paper, but so that it shall not indicate which particular ballot paper he received.

The voter shall record his vote by marking a cross X on the right-hand side of the ballot paper opposite the words "Abolition of existing arrack, toddy, foreign liquor taverns, and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail," or "Retention of existing arrack, toddy, foreign liquor taverns, and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail," or "For re-opening of arrack, toddy, foreign liquor taverns, and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail," or "Against re-opening of arrack, toddy, foreign liquor taverns, and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail" as the case may be, and as he may decide, and in no other way. He shall then fold it so as to conceal his vote, and place it in a closed box in the presence of the presiding officer, after having shown him the official mark. The presiding officer, on the application of any voter who states that he is unable to read, shall cause the vote of such voter to be marked on a ballot paper in manner directed by such voter, but he shall take such steps as will secure that no one but himself and the voter knows how such ballot paper was marked.

Ballot papers which do not comply with this rule shall not be considered in recording the votes.

15. No votes shall be recorded by proxy. All votes shall be given by the voters personally.

16. The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall make all necessary arrangements for the ballot.

17. In the circumstances described in rule 2, paragraph D, and whenever areas coincide each ballot shall be a simultaneous ballot against all classes of taverns or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in the area concerned. In such case no application shall be received for a ballot against one class of tavern in any one area, unless it is at the same time directed against all other classes of taverns and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail in the same area.

If the area for each of the taverns or places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail affected by the ballot are identical, one ballot shall suffice.

18. Taverns and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail closed by ballot shall not be re-opened unless 60 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants vote for re-opening, and shall be re-opened if they so vote.

Applications for such ballots shall be made in the same manner as is prescribed by rule 4.

It shall not be competent for the licensing authority to issue, without the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, a new license for the sale of liquor in any area in which all the arrack, toddy, and foreign liquor taverns have been closed by ballots.

19. These rules shall not in any way apply to any arrack, toddy, foreign liquor tavern, or place licensed for the sale of beer and porter by retail which, in the opinion of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, mainly serves a population of Indian coolies.

RULES.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama Esala festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to seventeen days, namely, July 23 to August 8, 1922. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

3. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices.
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims.
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims.
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims.
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

4. The police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

5. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be deemed guilty of an offence. The issue of such permit shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp.

6. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 17, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 116 (4 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 15 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1922, viz., 246,273) was 24·6, as against 25·0 in the preceding week, 75·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 164 (5 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34·7, as against 28·4 in the previous week, 30·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 164 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-six deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in the hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena North, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Maradana South, and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 24 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 8 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's, the hospital, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week.

2. (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Kollupitiya, 3 in the hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, as against 12 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama Hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, the hospital, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 7 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in the hospital, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Diarrhoea*, 7 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Debility*, 3 from *Tetanus*, 4 each from *Worms* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 58 from *Other Causes*.

6. Seventeen cases of *Enteric Fever*, 6 of *Chickenpox*, 2 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 6, 8, 4, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·5°, against 81·9° in the preceding week and 83·5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·796 in., against 29·842 in. in the preceding week and 29·886 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·87 in., against 3·56 in. in the preceding week and 0·01 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"Improvements in the process of manufacturing match boxes."

Abstract.—The applicant states that match boxes are at present made of a particular variety of wood which is capable of being split by machinery into suitable thin strips. He takes advantage of the fact that a material of a suitable thinness already exists in the leaves of certain palms and describes a method of making match boxes out of palm leaves.

The claim is:—

The manufacture of match boxes from the leaves of the palm family in place of wood, substantially as described.

"Improvements in the manufacture of desiccated nuts and oil from coconuts or other oil bearing nuts and fruits and seeds and the like."

Abstract.—The applicants state that in the ordinary process for obtaining oil from nuts, the oil obtained generally contains free fatty acids, and that these free fatty acids are formed during the period when the kernels are exposed to the sun, or hot air, in the drying process. They state that the formation of the free fatty acids can be prevented by the formation of a protective coating on the kernel, immediately after the nut is broken and before the kernel is exposed to dry. They explain how a protective coating can be produced by the use of chemicals, either in the form of solution, gas, or powder. As examples of such chemicals they give substances which coagulate albumens, such as alums, substances which react superficially on organic matter, and harden it at the ordinary temperature, such as chlorine, and substances which act as mild antiseptics, such as boric acid.

The claims are:—

1. In a process comprising several steps for manufacturing desiccated nuts and oil from oil-bearing nuts, fruits, seeds, and the like, the steps consisting in forming a protective layer of the tissues adjacent to and bounded by the exposed surfaces of the flesh of the nut, fruit, seed, or the like after it is released from the shell and/or husk and made ready for being dried as the next step.

2. In a process, comprising several steps for manufacturing desiccated nuts and oil from oil-bearing nuts, fruits, seeds, or the like, the step consisting in treating chemically the freshly exposed surfaces of the nut, fruit, seed, or the like with one or more selected substances in solution or a selected gas to form the protective layer claimed in claim 1.

3. In a process comprising several steps for manufacturing desiccated nuts and oil from oil-bearing nuts, fruits, seeds, and the like, the step consisting in forcing into intimate contact with a selected substances in solution (preferably formaldehyde, potash alum) the exposed surfaces of the freshly released kernel, fruit, or seed, or the like to form the protective layer claimed in claim 1.

4. In a process comprising several steps for manufacturing desiccated nuts and oil from oil-bearing nuts, fruits, seeds, and the like, the step consisting in forcing into intimate contact with a selected gas (preferably formaldehyde) the exposed surfaces of the freshly released kernel, fruit, or seed, or the like to form the protective layer claimed in claim 1.

5. In a process comprising several steps for manufacturing desiccated oil from oil-bearing nuts, fruits, seed, and the like, the step consisting in subjecting into intimate contact with powdered chemicals (preferably potash alum) the exposed surfaces of the freshly released kernel, fruit, or seed, or the like to form the protective layer claimed in claim 1.

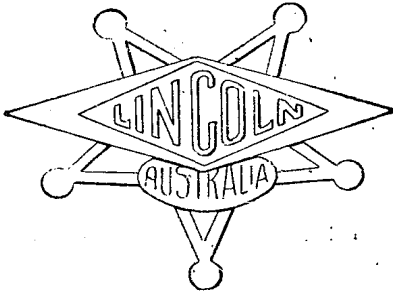

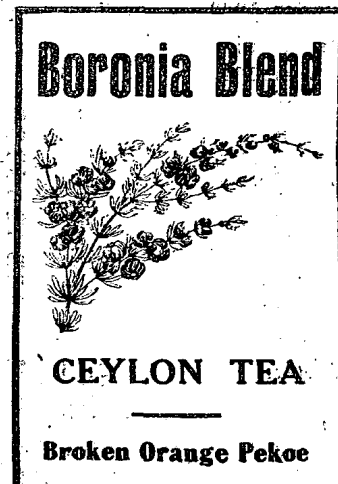

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 20, 1922, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 16, 1922.

Present :—Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Dr. C. de Vos; and Mr. A. Vallipuram.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 29, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—(a) statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1921 to April 30, 1922, on account of the Municipal Fund; (b) progress report of works brought up to the same date; (c) Health Officer's report for April; (d) statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April; (e) the reservoir readings for April.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during April.

4. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. 14 of May 12, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary calling for a further report on the suspected case of plague in King's street, Kandy, reported on the night of May 2, 1922.—Read.

(2) Endorsement No. 1 of May 1, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary inquiring what action is proposed to be taken with regard to paragraph 17 of the report of the Colonial Auditor for the year 1921.—Resolved that, in future, in sanctioning estimates under which purchase of material of over Rs. 1,000 is necessary, Council should specifically authorize the purchase.

(3) Petition of April 13, 1922, from the residents of Kandy, praying that steps be taken to reduce the price of beef to 25 cents a pound.—Resolved that the Superintendent of Works be asked to submit estimates and site plans for one beef stall in Katukele and one in Trincomalee street.

The question of fixing the maximum price of beef at 25 cents a pound to be considered before the issue of licenses for next year.

(4) Letter of April 20, 1922, from the Honorary Secretary, Kandy Ratepayers' Association *re* (1) the raising of rates, (2) the construction of model dwellings.—Resolved that a copy of the Accountant's memorandum dated April 27, 1922, be sent in reply to (1) and as regards (2) that he be informed so far no plans and estimates for a further set of model tenements have yet been approved either by the Board or the Council.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva asked—(1) were tenders called for the lease granted in favour of Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle with regard to the Old Toll House, situated at Katugastota bearing assessment No. 1? (2) If the terms of the said lease were not complied with, why did the Council not take action to resume possession of the said premises?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) The rents and profits of the premises known as the Katugastota Old Toll House for a period of three years from January 1, 1920, were put up to public auction on December 20, 1919, and the present lessee's bid was then accepted.

(2) The lessee was allowed time by the Finance Committee to pay up the arrears of rent dues up to March 31, 1922, have now been paid, and a further sum of Rs. 45 is held by the Council as a deposit. Lease expires on December 31 next.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved—"That the Council do take immediate steps to resume possession of the premises No. 1, Madawela road, leased to Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle and cancel the lease.

The motion fell through for want of a seconder.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved—"As the road leading from Bogambara to hospital is dangerous for motor and other traffic, that immediate steps be taken to improve the road." Mr. Pieris seconded.

It was agreed that the Superintendent of Works be asked to furnish report and estimate for improvements to the road.

8. Report of the Colonial Auditor on the accounts of the Kandy Municipality for the year 1921.—Tabled.

9. Papers *re* the proposal to extend the water main along Kalugastota road utilizing all the pipes that have been taken out along Peradeniya road.—Resolved that the estimate of Rs. 5,500 for carrying out the work be passed and that tenders be called for.

10. Papers *re* the enforcement of regulations relating to the storage of grain in the Municipal area beyond the Katugastota bridge.—Resolved by 5 to 2, Messrs. Pieris and Silva dissenting, that the by-laws be enforced from June 15, 1922.

11. Papers *re* the proposed level crossing opposite to the Police Station.—Tabled.

12. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the registration fee of rickshaw coolies be raised from Re. 1 to Rs. 2.

(2) That Overseer O. A. Philips be granted full-pay leave during the period of his illness from February 6, 1922, to March 31, 1922.

Finance and Assessment.

(3) That the salary of the Assistant to the Supervisor of Conservancy be raised from Rs. 30 to Rs. 37·50 per mensem with effect from January 1, 1922.

(4) That a gratuity of Rs. 39 be paid to the widow of the late Market Cooly Sekken.

(5) That a sum of Rs. 29·75 be paid to Distraint Officer, K. B. Seneviratne, cart hire for distraint movables.

(6) That the Market Rent Collector be not discontinued till the report of the Reorganization Committee is submitted.

(7) That six trees, *peltophorum ferrugineum*, be planted, three on each side of Ward street.

(8) That the estimate for Rs. 340 for widening the road opposite the octagon be sanctioned.

(9) That brass badges with the letters M. C. K., S. I. and M. C. K., R. I. be issued to be worn by the Municipal Inspectors.

(10) That the estimate for Rs. 900 for building a motor bus stand at Katugastota be sanctioned.—Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

(11) That the use of the toll house at Katugastota as a rice store be allowed, if alterations are effected as recommended by the Medical Officer of Health and the Superintendent of Municipal Works.

The Committee, however, wishes to point out that the lease does not appear to be assignable.—Resolved that the recommendation be adopted, on condition that the lessee has no claim for compensation at the termination of his lease.

Municipal Works.

(12) That the following applications for house-service pipes be allowed on usual terms :—No. 892, Peradeniya road, M. K. M. Segu Hamidu ; Nos. 761 and 761A, Peradeniya road, J. D. Wikramanayake ; No. 682, Peradeniya road, J. Ratnayake ; No. 288, Peradeniya road, M. C. Samed ; No. 363, Peradeniya road.—Resolved that the applications be allowed on usual terms.

13. Recommendations of the Special Committee on Electric Lighting :—

(1) That the following proposals be agreed to :—(1) "All bills to be made out and served by the Electric Works Department" with instructions to tender payment at the Municipal Office or at the Mercantile Bank ; (2) all payments to be made at the Municipal Office on vouchers certified to by the Engineer ; (3) detailed cost statement to be furnished monthly by the Engineer and checked by the Accountant before submission to the Council ; (4) the monthly account of income and expenditure and balance sheet to be prepared at the Municipal Office, and submitted to the Council with the monthly returns ; (5) the store accounts to be kept on the same lines as the Municipal store accounts ; (6) the Accountant to exercise constant supervision over all accounting work both at the Electric Works Department and at the Municipal Office.

(2) That the under-mentioned Municipal officers be remunerated for the extra work to be done at the Municipal Office as follows :—(1) Secretary, Rs. 25 per mensem ; (2) the Accountant, Rs. 75 per mensem ; (3) the Shroff, Rs. 25 per mensem ; (4) the Accounting Clerk, Rs. 25 per mensem.

The Secretary to be also allowed free lights for his quarters.
