**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE  
MONTH OF MARCH, 1922.**

**REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.**

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

**Marriages.**

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 306, viz.: (243 General, 2 Kandyan, and 61 Muhammadan), as against 379, the number registered during the previous month.

**Births.**

3. The births registered numbered 1,565 (847 males and 718 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·50 per 1,000, against 33·30 in the previous month, 28·14 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·17 the average for the corresponding months since 1912. The rate ranged from 4·95 in Trincomalee to 50·23 in Puttalam.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 608 (329 males and 279 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 28·91 per 1,000, against 30·16 in the previous month, 20·87 in the corresponding month of last year, 23·88 the average for the corresponding months since 1912. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 7·07 in San Sebastian to 27·02 in Maradana East.

**Deaths.**

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,917 (1,038 males and 879 females). There were 1,491 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 31·64 per 1,000, against 33·15 in the previous month, 33·69 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·54 the average for the month of March in each year since 1912. The rate ranged from 77·77 in Anuradhapura to 7·49 in Nuwara Eliya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 724 (396 males and 328 females). There were 614 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 33·87 per 1,000, against 33·53 in the previous month, 27·61 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·04 the average for the month of March in each year since 1912. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 30·14 in Slave Island to 11·01 in Wellawatta North.

7. The stillbirths registered numbered 115 (57 males and 58 females), as against 113 in the preceding month.

**Infant Mortality.**

8. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 198 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1922. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 235, against 255 in the previous month, 264 in the corresponding month of last year, and 229 the average for the corresponding months since 1912.

9. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 191 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1922. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 235, against 248 in the previous month, 294 in the corresponding month of last year, and 241 the average for the corresponding months since 1912.

**Causes of Death.**

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 17 per cent. of the total deaths was due, *Debility* caused 8 per cent., *Convulsions* and *Phthisis* 6 per cent. each, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* and *Diarrhoea* 5 per cent. each, *Anchylostomiasis* and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* 4 per cent. each, *Enteritis*, *Influenza*, and *Dysentery* 3 per cent. each, *Bronchitis* and *Prematurity* 2 per cent. each, and *Puerperal Septicaemia* and *Enteric Fever* 1 per cent. each.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 21 per cent. of the deaths was due, *Debility* caused 8 per cent., *Phthisis* 7 per cent., *Convulsions* and *Influenza* 6 per cent. each, *Bronchitis* 4 per cent. *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* and *Enteritis* 3 per cent. each, *Anchylostomiasis* and *Dysentery* 2 per cent. each, and *Prematurity*, *Diarrhoea*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Puerperal Septicaemia*, *Enteric Fever*, *Cancer*, and *Plague* 1 per cent. each.

12. Seven deaths from *Plague* were registered (in Colombo), as against 9 in the previous month, and 27 in the corresponding month of last year. One death from *Measles* (in Moratuwa) was also registered.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 235 cases were reported (171 in Colombo, 18 in Kandy, 12 in Gampola, 12 in Nuwara Eliya, 6 in Kalutara, 5 in Badulla), *Phthisis* followed with 130 cases (115 in Colombo, 10 in Galle), *Enteric Fever* 47 (34 in Colombo, 6 in Galle), *Continued Fever* 17 (12 in Colombo), *Measles* 15 (10 in Colombo), *Smallpox* 7 (5 in Colombo), *Plague* 6 (in Colombo), *Mumps* 3 (in Colombo), and *Dysentery* 2 (1 in Moratuwa and 1 in Puttalam).

**Meteorology.**

14. Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (9·97 in.), followed by Kalutara (7·79 in.). In the other towns it ranged from 5·70 in. in Negombo to 0·10 of an inch in Puttalam. Colombo recorded 1·63 in.

15. The mean temperature varied from 56·7° in Nuwara Eliya to 83·2° in Kurunegala and was 81·6° in Colombo.
