For all carriages hired to proceed beyond the Local Board limits of Jaffna or any line of road proclaimed in the *Gazette* No. 4,623 of November 21, 1884, the fare shall not exceed 40 cents per mile for a first class and 30 cents for a second class carriage. For a rubber-tyred carriage one-fourth more.

There shall be no charge for returning, unless the person hiring the carriage shall detain the same for 12 hours or more, when 25 cents per mile shall be charged if he returns within 24 hours from the hour of starting for a first class carriage, and 18 cents for a second class carriage. Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 22, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 106 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 61 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 13 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 22·3, as against 25·3 in the preceding week, 31·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 149 (8 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 28 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.4, as against 28.6 in the previous week, 34.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 149 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 34 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Deaths.—1. (a) Twenty-three deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena South, 2 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Maradana North, and Slave Island, and I each in Kotahena North and Wellawatta North, as against 21 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average

(b) Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, and I each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana

hospital, and Wellawatta North, as against 2 in the previous week.

- (c) Five deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana North, and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- Twelve deaths from Phthisis were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 2 each in Maradana North, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, and I each in Kotahena North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 14 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.
- Four deaths from Plague were registered, 2 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, as against 2 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 5. Fourteen deaths were registered from Debility, 10 from Enteritis, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Diarrhæa, 6 from Dysentery, 1 from Worms, and 49 from Other Causes.
- 6. Seven cases of Enteric Fever, 5 of Measles, 5 of Plague, 4 of Chickenpox, and 1 of Smallpox were reported during the week, as against 10, 3, 3, nil, and nil respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.3°, against 79.9° in the preceding week, and 82.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29 · 838 in., against 29 · 835 in. in the preceding week, and 29.947 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1.07 in. in the preceding week, and 0.25 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 17, 1922, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with Notice dated June 13, 1922.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. A. de C. Carson; and Dr. Allan de Saram.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 20, 1922, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
 - 2. The following documents were submitted:-
 - (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1921 to May 31, 1922, on account of the Municipal Fund;
 - (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date;
 - (c) Health Officer's report for May;
 - (d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May;
 - (e) The reservoir readings for May.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

The following papers were laid on the table :-

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during May.

Correspondence: (1) Letter No. 15 of May 15, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarding proposals submitted by the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, for the taxation of motor vehicles.—Resolved that the proposed scale of taxation be adopted.

It was also agreed to ask the Superintendent of Police to station a policeman on Kandy side of railway bridge on Katugastota road to prevent fast driving of motor vehicles and regulate traffic.

(2) Letter No. 16 of May 19, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary asking for a statement of the annual taxes levied in respect of mechanically propelled vehicles.—Tabled.

(3) Letter No. 17 of May 31, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve the proposal of the Municipal Council of Kandy to overdraw its current account at the Mercantile Bank to whatever extent may be necessary to finance the expenditure on the purchase and improvement of the electric lighting installation.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 18 of June 5, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary stating that the information asked for by letter No. 16 is not now required.—Tabled.

(5) Letter No. 19 of June 6, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary acknowledging receipt of letter bringing to notice the error in Colonial Secretary's letter No. 10 of April 3, 1922, in having quoted Rs. 1,500 as the yearly vote for the Central Town Free Library instead of Rs. 1,800.—Read.

(6) Application of June 7, 1922, from Saul Hamidu for a license for the sale of beef in Trincomalee street and Peradeniya road, and application from Segu Mohammadu for a license for sale of beef in Trincomalee street and Katukelle. Resolved that the matter be deferred pending the submission of report and plans for beef boutiques in Peradeniya road and Katugastota road by the Superintendent of Works.

(7) Petition of June 12, 1922, from road side permit holders praying that the Council may reconsider its decision to

withdraw their permits at the end of June.

Mr. Pieris moved that the decision be rescinded. There being no seconder, the motion fell through.

It was agreed that the resolution passed on February 18, 1922, be adhered to, Mr. Pieris dissenting.

- (8) Application from Saverimuttu, a cooly in the employ of the Works Department, praying for a gratuity of Rs. 20 to enable him to retire from work and go to his village in India.—Resolved that the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 20 be sanctioned.
- (9) Letter of June 13, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to Dr. A. de Saram, nominating him to be a Member of the Mnicipal Council, Kandy, in place of Dr. C. de Vos for the information of the Chairman.—Read.
- 5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle asked—(1) What is the total acreage taken over by the Council to be reafforested in order to keep up the water supply?

(2) How many perennial streams feed or supply water to the reservoir?

(3) Are all the perennial streams covered by forest lands from their sources to the reservoir, to keep up a continual supply of water during the drought?

(4) Will the Chairman direct the Superintendent of Municipal Works to table a plan or tracing of the land

reafforested showing the perennial streams feeding the reservoir?

(5) If the whole area above the reservoir is not properly re-afforested, will the Chairman direct that immediate steps be taken to re-afforest this area with quick growing trees.

The Chairman replied as follows:

(1) The total extent acquired for conserving the water supply is 722 acres 1 rood ·07 perches, out of which approximately 150 acres are outside the catchment area.

(2) There are three main streams feeding the reservoir.

(3) Two of the streams are covered by forest land from their source to the reservoir. One flows through a portion of Hantana estate, which does not belong to the Municipal Council, and is not in forest except the reserve bordering the

(4) This will be supplied at the next Meeting.

- (5) The whole area above the reservoir is not re-afforested, and those portions covered with mana grass are being gradually re-afforested. About 7 acres have been recently planted with albizzia, lunumidella, and mahogany plants, and it is meant to annually extend this area.
- 6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle asked—When will the school building at Mahaiyawa be completed and be ready to be handed over in terms of his resolution 8 of June 18, 1921.

 The Chairman replied as follows:—Will be completed at the end of the month.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. Ratwatte moved-That the scavenging of Katugastota be given out on contract. Mr. Silva seconded.

It was agreed first to obtain an estimate for scavenging this area and to enforce the regulation re placing of dust bins in Katugastota.

8. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—That owing to the dissatisfaction among the rate-payers as regards the revision of the annual value of properties in Kandy, the Colombo Municipal Council be kindly requested to lend us the services of their expert assessor occasionally to advise this Council on the subject, nad place and assessment on a proper Mr. Silva seconded.

On the Chairman's suggestion the motion was amended as follows:—That owing to the dissatisfaction among the rate-payers as regards the revision of the annual value of properties in Kandy, the Colombo Municipal Council be asked if they will lend us the services of their expert assessor occasionally to advise this Council on the subject, and place our assessment on a proper footing, and if so on what terms. The motion as amended was carried by 6 to 3.

Ayes.—The Chairman, Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle, Mr. G. E. de Silva, Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. A. de C. Carson, and

Dr. Allan de Saram.

Noes.—Mr. Ratwatte, Mr. Pieris, and Mr. Vallipuram.

9. Report dated May 18, 1922, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer on the taking over of the Electricity Works on May 1, 1922, from the Manager of the Colombo Gas & Water Co., Ltd.—Tabled.

Dr. Attygalle moved that the Municipal Electrical Engineer be asked to report on the "pros" and "cons" of getting an additional Diesel engine or storage battery. Mr. Carson seconded.—Carried.

- 10. To sanction payment of Rs. 13,413.55, value of stores taken over by the Council at the electric station on May 1, 1922.—Resolved that the necessary sanction be granted.
- 11. To fix the rent of the spaces at the granary on the Railway Approach road.—Resolved that the rent of the two end spaces be fixed at Rs. 70 a month, and that of the centre space be fixed at Rs. 75 a month.
 - 12. Recommendations of Standing, Committees:-

Markets and Sanitation.

(1) That a cooly be employed to attend to the common drains, latrines, &c. of model tenements at Katukele.
(2) That the by-laws drafted by the Council's lawyer, Mr. Vanderwall, for (i.) Prevention of feeding of cattle on streets; (ii.) The issue of special permits for the sale of surplus milk, be passed.

Finance and Assessment.

(3) That the sum of Rs. 4.80 paid for bamboos which were cut, but not removed, be refunded to the Secretary, United Service Library.

(4) That the Distraining Officer, W. D. C. Appuhamy, be paid Rs. 30 cart hire for seizing and removing movables.

(5) That payment of Rs. 52.71 for a writing table for Members of Council be sanctioned.

(6) That the slaughter-house watcher be paid Rs. 5 for being in charge of the Municipal school buildings and furniture during the Easter vacation.

(7) That the Market Cooly Kitnen be paid Rs. 9.60, the amount paid out of his wages during his illness to his substitute.

(8) That the pay of the "rat and snails" overseer be increased from Rs. 25 to Rs. 30 per mensem, with effect from June 1, 1922.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held on July 1, 1922, at 8.30 a.m., in the Town Hall, Kandy, in accordance with Notice dated June 27, 1922.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Dr. G. P. Hay; and Mr. A. de C. Carson.

1. To consider the undertaking of some scheme or schemes which would ensure a constant and regular supply of water to the reservoir.—Resolved that the scheme for diverting the Gonapilikanu stream, as recommended by Mr. Tomalin, in his report dated May 17, 1917, on the water supply of the town be undertaken, and that the Superintendent of Works be asked to furnish estimates for carrying out the same.

Is was also resolved that the Colombo Municipal Council be asked whether they would be willing to lend the services of Mr. Thyne, unless the Madras expert engaged by them is expected shortly to report on which of the other schemes he considers the best for supplying the entire Municipal area of Kandy with a permanent and sufficient supply of water.

Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved-"That this Council do get expert opinion as to the causes which led to the present water famine, specially as to whether it was due to any mismanagement and as to what steps should be taken to prevent the recurrence of a situation similar to the one the town is now experiencing."

On the Chairman's suggestion the following resolution was agreed to :- That Mr. Carson be asked to associate himself with the expert mentioned in the preceding motion, and that their joint report do include any recommendations

for improving or conserving the existing supply.

- Application from the Superintendent of Works for a further vote of Rs. 2,000 for the removal of silt from the bed of the reservoir.—Resolved that a further sum of Rs. 2,000 be voted for cutting away the left bank looking from the bund.
- Letter from the Superintendent of Works inquiring whether reservoir water may be supplied to the whole town as the reservoir has risen sufficiently for the purpose.

Resolved that water be supplied to the whole town from the reservoir during the following hours :-- 6 A.M. to 9 A.M.,

and 3 P.M. to 6 P.M.

Letter of June 29, 1922, from the Honorary Secretary, Kandy Rate-payers' Association, suggesting that water be brought from outside the town in motor lorries and distributed to the people.

Resolved that it be pointed out that it is not necessary to do so.

Letter of June 29, 1922, from the Director, Bacteriological Institute, submitting his report on the sample of lake water sent to him for examination.—Read.

An improved method of and apparatus for disintegrating, dividing, or similarly treating sugar cane and the like.

Abstract.—The applicant describes an improved machine for disintegrating sugar cane. In one form of the machine the stalk's are held in a holder which reciprocates transversely across a table; through the base of the table project two rotating drums with cutters attached: these drums rotate in opposite directions and subject the cane to a milling action, thereby disintegrating it in an even manner with the avoidance of jerks.

The claims are:

1. A method for disintegrating or dividing sugar cane, characterized by this, that the cane is exposed to the action

of a rotating cutting tool having one or more knife edges at its circumference.

2. In a machine for carrying into effect the method as claimed in claim 1, a rotary cutting tool projecting through a slot in the work table, a holder for the material to be cut and means for moving the tool and the holder with respect to one another in substantially parallel relation with the table.

In a machine as claimed in claim 1, a cylindrical table and a holder adapted for oscillatory motion about a

fixed axis.

- 4. In a machine as claimed in claim 2, a plurality of tools adapted for rotary motion either in the same or in opposite directions.

Improvements in and relating to filters and the like.

Abstract.—The applicant describes an improved filter suitable for use with sugar solutions. One form of the filter consists of a bag of filter cloth open at the bottom as well as the top and secured at each end to nozzles and with a valve at the lower end: when the filter becomes clogged with dirt, a reverse current of water or steam can be passed through the bag, and the dirt removed through the bottom valve, vacuum being applied if desired. In other forms, two filter bags are provided, one within the other, and connected or not connected at the lower end; the solution being fed between the bags can then pass out of the outer bag or into the inner one, thus giving a larger filtering area while retaining the feature of the ease of removement of dirt; the bags may be reinforced to make them rigid when necessary.

The claims are :-

Taylor or pocket filter having its pocket (s) at its (their) bottom end open and secured to a nozzle.

In a filter as claimed in claim 1, a valve member adapted to close the lower nozzle.

In a filter as claimed in claim 1, a second pocket inside the first named one, said second pocket having a smaller diameter, being closed at its top end and provided with a reinforcement for resisting the pressure of the liquid, to be filtered, both pockets having their bottom portions secured to a common nozzle. 4. Improvement in a filter as claimed in claim 3, consisting in that the outer and the inner pocket are secured to

individual nozzles. 5. In a filter as claimed in claim 3 or 4, the provision inside the inner pocket of a strengthening tube which at its bottom is secured to or integral with the lower nozzle.

6. In a filter as claimed in claim 3 or 4, the provision of a valve member for the closure of the lower nozzle of the inner pocket.

Blocks composed of caoutchouc and other materials.

Abstract.—The applicant describes a method of making blocks of rubber compounded with other materials, in which these materials, such as sand or woody matter to which are added rubber compounding ingredients such as zinc oxide and, the whole mixed with rubber latex. The blocks are shaped and can then be vulcanized. Rubber can be attached to the surface of the blocks.

The claims are :-

The manufacture of blocks or slabs of any shape or size substantially as hereinbefore described which can be used for building purposes, roofing tiles, &c.

The manufacture of a material substantially as described to which rubber can be vulcanized so as to be firmly united and thus used for paving of roads and general purposes in which a rubber surface firmly united to the basic material is required substantially as described.

3. As new articles of manufacture blocks composed of caoutchouc and other materials when prepared or produced

by the process hereinbefore described and claimed.

Improvements in or relating to the preservation and preparation for transportation of oil-bearing raw material, such as nuts, seeds, and copra.

Abstract.—The applicant describes a method of preparing oil-bearing raw material for transport, in which quantities of the material are compressed in bulk, the pressure applied being insufficient to express any oil. Air is excluded, decomposition and fire risk are decreased, and a material of greater density is obtained.

The claims are :-

1. A method of preparation for transport and/or preservation of oil-bearing raw material, such as nuts, seeds, or copra, which consists in compressing quantities of said material in bulk, under a pressure insufficient to express any appreciable quantity of the contained oil, but sufficient to form a package of greatly reduced bulk.

A method according to claim 1, wherein the pressure employed is insufficient to express any of the contained oil,

but sufficient to form the material into a coherent block.

3. A method according to claim 1 or claim 2, as applied to nuts or seeds, wherein the nuts or seeds are compressed while within their shells or castings, for the purpose described.

4. A method according to claim 1, claim 2, or claim 3, wherein the oil-bearing material is enclosed in jute or like

material, substantially as described.

5. A method of preparation for transport and/or preservation of cotton seeds which consists in compressing quantities of said seeds in bulk, under a pressure in the region of two tons per square inch on the block, whereby the seeds are formed into a coherent block without expression of any appreciable quantity of the contained oil.

The method of preparation for transport and/or preservation of oil-bearing raw material of the type specified,

substantially as herein described.

7. As a new product, a block or package of oil-bearing raw material of the type specified, prepared in the manner set for in any of the foregoing claims.


