WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated November 29, 1854, issued under the Ordinance No. 17 of 1844, a Police Force was established in the town of Gampola, in the Central Province, for the effectual protection of person and property within the limits in the said Proclamation mentioned and described :

And whereas by section 3 of the Ordinance No. 16 of 1865, the said Ordinance No. 17 of 1844 was repealed, and by section 7 of the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 it was enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time as occasion may require, to establish, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, a Police Force for the effectual protection of person and property within such towns as to him shall appear to require the same, and that whenever such force shall be so established within any town, the said Ordinance shall come into operation therein ; provided that no Proclamation shall be necessary to establish the force in places where the same shall have been already established under the Ordinance No. 17 of 1844, in which said places the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 shall come into operation on the day in section 2 mentioned, which said day was the 1st day of January, 1866, on which day the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 came into operation in the said town of Gampola :

And whereas by section 13 of the said Police Ordinance, 1865, it is further enacted that the Proclamation establishing a Police Force in any town shall also specify and define the limits of such town, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time as occasion may require, by Proclamation, to alter or vary such limits :

And whereas the limits of the said town of Gampola were altered by a Proclamation dated January 8, 1874 :

And whereas it is expedient further to alter such limits of the said town of Gampola for the purposes aforesaid :

Now know Ye, that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the limits of the said town of Gampola as defined in the schedule to the said Proclamation dated January 8, 1874, and do hereby define the limits of the said town to be those specified and defined in the schedule hereto, as from and after the 1st day of January next ensuing.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Third day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-two.

SCHEDULE.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

“ THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, 1902.”

RULE made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 5 of “ The Railways Ordinance, 1902,” in substitution for clause 32 c of the rules relating to the conveyance of traffic by goods train, dated January 22, 1914, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,604 of January 30, 1914 :—

32 c. *Petroleum in packages.*—Petroleum in wooden cases containing two tins or in substantial drums or barrels will be conveyed at the special rates sanctioned for the conveyance of kerosine oil in bulk, namely, 8 cents per ton per mile over all sections of the line below Nawalapitiya, and 10 cents per ton per mile above Nawalapitiya (exclusive of the Uda Pussellawa Line), but the minimum charge will be as for the following loads per wagon from one consignor to one consignee, provided that where tank wagons have been specially provided for any consignor for the conveyance of petroleum in bulk, the special rates will only be applied to the conveyance of petroleum in packages, subject to satisfactory loading being guaranteed for such tank wagons :—

Broad gauge 12-ton wagons, minimum charge as for 10 tons (7 tons north of Madawachchi).

Kelani Valley 14-ton wagons, minimum charge as for 12 tons.

Petroleum in tins unprotected by cases.—Until further notice, consignments of petroleum in tins unprotected by cases tendered in wagon loads from one consignor to one consignee will be conveyed under the following conditions and charged for at the above special rates and subject to the same minima :—

(1) Such consignments will only be conveyed in iron or steel covered wagons.

(2) A layer of wet loose coconut fibre must be placed on the floor of the vehicle and between each tier of tins.

Where goods are transferred from one wagon to another, the fibre used at the place of loading must also be transferred and utilized in packing the tins as specified above.

(3) Tins must be so loaded that the lower tins cover the whole of the floor space in order to obviate tins on the top tier falling and being damaged in transit.

Small consignments of petroleum in tins unprotected by cases will be conveyed in explosive van goods wagons, subject to the conditions specified in clause 46 of the regulations and charged for at 2nd class rates.

Empty receptacles will be returned in truck loads at 12 cents per wagon mile.

Demurrage will be charged if wagons are detained under load for more than 24 hours after arrival.

Any provision contained in any rule made under the said Ordinance in any way contrary to the provision of this rule shall, as from the coming into operation of this rule, be repealed.

"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Anuradhapura, under and in pursuance of section 56 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, as amended by Ordinance No. 27 of 1916, have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and are hereby published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall, within the limits of the Local Board, keep any bakery, eating-house, tea or coffee boutique, dairy, laundry, or common lodging house without an annual license from the Chairman, Local Board, which license the Chairman is hereby empowered to refuse to any person failing to comply with any of the following rules or any existing Local Board rule, providing for the regulation and control of the places aforesaid. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued, or until such license is cancelled.

Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Local Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.

2. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of any of the following rules or any existing Local Board rules providing for the control of the places aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Local Board. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered in his discretion to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person. Provided that these rules shall not apply to stalls in markets established by or vested in any public body.

B.—Bakeries.

3. Bakery shall mean any premises on which bread, biscuits, or confectionary are baked for sale as food for man, and also includes any premises on which such food is prepared for baking, or on which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored.

4. The room in which kneading takes place shall have a minimum superficial area of 12 feet by 15 feet. There shall be a free external air space on at least two sides not less than 7 feet wide to permit of through ventilation. The door of the oven shall not open directly into the kneading room; every kneading room shall be provided with a ceiling.

5. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls in every part shall not be less than 7 feet in height, and be built of brick, stone, cabook, the inside thereof to be lime plastered and whitewashed every six months. The roof shall be of some permanent material. The ceiling shall be plastered and lime-washed four times yearly, or may be made of closely fitting board varnished or painted. The floor shall be cemented throughout and adequate drainage provided. Every room shall be provided with windows capable of being opened and having a superficial area of not less than one-sixteenth of the superficial floor space.

6. The troughs and all utensils used in the making of bread and pastry shall be kept scrupulously clean, and must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor.

7. The floor shall be carefully scraped and swept at least once every twenty-four hours, and the sweeping shall be immediately placed in an impervious, covered receptacle, and removed from the bakery daily.

8. Every bakery shall be kept in a cleanly state and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, cesspit, or other nuisance.

9. No bakery shall be within 50 feet of any cesspit, manure heap, open sewer, or privy.

10. No furniture or other articles are to be stored in the bakery other than those used in the manufacture of bread and pastry.

11. The tops of the tables are to be made of well seasoned closely fitting planks, or some non-harmful impervious material, and are to be scraped and cleaned daily.

12. No animal shall be kept in the bakery on any pretence whatever.

13. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of a bakery has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the bakery to enter the bakery or take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, biscuits, or confectionary.

14. All persons employed in the preparation and making of bread shall wash their hands before engaging in the process of bread making, and shall wear clean white aprons covering the chest and body, and also a white cap or turban.

15. Clean water and soap shall be provided for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits, and confectionary.

16. All bread, biscuits, and confectionary and sweetmeats exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. The cases shall be kept scrupulously clean.

17. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome, and the flour shall be kept on platform raised 3 feet above the ground.

18. All refuse around the premises of a bakery shall be removed daily, and drains well flushed.

19. No place on the same level with the bakery and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the bakery by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling; no water-closet, earth-closet, privy, or catchpit shall be within or communicate directly with the bakery.

20. It shall be lawful for the Local Board Secretary, Inspector, or other person authorized in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times and at any time when the process of baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect any bakery or place used for the sale of bread.

21. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every bakery.

C.—Eating-houses and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

22. All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

23. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to any eating-house or tea or coffee boutique shall always be kept clean.

24. The walls of all eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be plastered and at least twice a year limewashed, and the rooms shall be well ventilated and lighted.

25. All refuse and dirt in or about the premises of any eating-house, tea or coffee boutique shall be removed twice daily.

26. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of an eating-house or tea or coffee boutique has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of an eating-house, tea or coffee boutique, or to be employed in or about any such eating-house, tea or coffee boutique.

27. The sugar used in such place shall be kept in glass-stoppered wide-mouthed bottles.

28. All cakes, sweetmeats, &c., exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. No food stuffs shall be exposed to the contamination of flies. The glass cases used shall be kept scrupulously clean.

29. No waste tea, coffee, milk, or remnants of food or cooking waste shall be thrown on the ground, but shall be collected in a proper receptacle and removed daily.

30. No adulterated milk shall be sold or offered or exposed for sale or kept on the premises of any eating-house, tea or coffee boutique. For the purposes of this rule adulterated milk shall mean milk to which water or any other foreign liquid or substance has been added for the purpose of augmenting its quantity or enhancing its apparent quality and not for the purpose of preparing tea or coffee or any other beverage for the immediate consumption of customers.

31. These by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every such eating-house or tea or coffee boutique:

D.—Dairies.

32. For the purpose of these rules under section 56, sub-section (5), a "dairy" shall mean and include any farm, farm house, cow shed, milk store, milk shop, or other place from which milk is supplied or in which milk is stored or kept for the purposes of sale. "Dairyman" shall include any cow-keeper, purveyor of milk, or occupier of a dairy, and in the cases where a dairy is owned by more than one person, the manager or other person actually managing such dairy.

33. No dairy shall be located in any compound within 100 feet of an open cesspit or surface latrine or on a position where bad odours will reach it, and no open cesspit or surface latrine shall be erected within 100 feet from any such dairy.

34. Every dairy compound shall be sufficiently provided with proper drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be kept flushed. No foul water shall be allowed to stagnate in any dairy compound.

35. All refuse and dirt in and around the dairy premises shall be removed without delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily.

36. A pure and protected supply of water must be provided at convenient distance for the use of every dairy. No bathing or washing of clothes shall take place at or near this water supply.

37. The milch cows and buffaloes shall be free from disease, and no person suffering from, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of a dairy has recently suffered from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the dairy to be employed in such dairy.

38. All dairymen shall see that their cattle are washed as to udders and teats before milking, and the milker is to wash his hands thoroughly with soap and water before milking. Every precaution shall be taken to prevent contamination of milk by dung or urine.

39. No dairyman or owner of a dairy shall render milk unwholesome by the addition of any water or any other foreign liquid or substance thereto, nor shall he sell or offer or expose for sale such milk.

40. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean.

41. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be scrupulously clean and shall be properly covered, stoppered, or corked with clean materials, and shall not be carried under the armpit, nor shall the mouths of the bottles be fingered.

42. The sheds and yards where cattle are kept shall be subject to and satisfy the requirements of the Local Board regulations regarding galas.

43. Every licensee of a dairy shall have a milk room erected in such a position and at such a distance from the cow sheds as the Chairman of the Local Board shall approve, for the storing and preparation of milk, and in which all vessels used in his trade are to be stored after cleansing. The floor shall be cemented with round corners at its junction with the walls, the walls shall be of plastered masonry, smooth boards, or iron work to be limewashed or painted periodically as directed by the Chairman or the Senior Sanitary Officer. At least two opposite walls of the milk room shall abut on the open air. The roof shall be ceiled with grooved boards to prevent the ingress of dust. There shall be at least one window and one door. The window shall be 3 feet by 2 feet without glass or shutters, and be fitted with fly-proof netting. The door shall be opposite the window, be close fitting, and fitted with fly-proof netting, and shall be kept close. A table with a covering of marble, slate, or zinc or other approved impermeable substance shall be placed in the milk room. This room shall be used for no other purpose than that storing and preparing milk, and the storing after cleansing of all vessels used in the trade.

44. Every licensee of a dairy shall keep a list of his customers, which shall be opened at all reasonable times for inspection by the Chairman of the Local Board, the Senior Sanitary Officer or his assistants.

45. The number of cows for each dairy is licensed shall be stated in such license.

46. No licensee of a dairy shall change the location of his dairy without having first obtained the permission of the Chairman, nor shall milking take place at any place other than at the licensed premises.

47. Every licensee of a dairy shall keep a report book in his milk room, in which inspecting officers may make their reports each time they visit the dairy.

48. Every dairy situated within the limits of the Local Board shall be registered by the Chairman, who shall issue to such applicant a card of registration bearing his name and number. These cards are to be shown to authorized officers of the Board when required by them to do so.

49. The Chairman of the Local Board, the Senior Sanitary Officer or his assistants, the Chief Headman of the District, or any Sanitary Inspector appointed by the Chairman of the Local Board, or the Senior Sanitary Officer to do sanitary inspection in the Local Board town, shall be at all times empowered to take a sample of milk for analysis from any licensed dairy or from any person selling milk or exposing milk for sale within the Local Board limits.

50. A copy of these by-laws shall be hung in the milk room of every dairy.

E.—*Laundry.*

51. For the purpose of rules under section 56 (5) "laundry" means any building, shed, land, place, well, or other source from which water is obtained, used for the purpose of carrying on the business or trade of washing or drying of clothes for any person or persons for hire, or any building, shed, or place used by any laundryman for the purpose of ironing, depositing, or storing clothes, and "laundryman" means the occupier of any laundry premises as hereinbefore defined, or any person engaged in the washing, drying, ironing, depositing, or storing of clothes for hire.

52. Every laundryman shall, when so required by the Chairman, provide a separate room for soiled linen, which must be well ventilated and clean at all times and whitewashed twice annually.

53. A laundryman shall not store soiled linen in any room used as a living apartment.

54. The Chairman shall, when he considers it necessary in the interest and for the good of the public health, allocate special sites for the washing of clothes; such sites will be indicated by a notice board.

55. When any laundryman or any member of his family or household shall contract any infectious or contagious disease, he shall within twenty-four hours report the same to the Chairman of the Local Board, either through the Inspector or the Police Headman.

56. When any laundryman or any member of his family or household shall contract any infectious or contagious disease, all work in the laundry shall immediately cease, nor shall any clothes be taken into the laundry or sent out of it after the outbreak and during the prevalence of such disease, save by special permission of the Chairman.

57. No laundryman shall, without the permission of the Chairman of the Local Board or the Senior Sanitary Officer, receive soiled linen from any house in which there is reason to believe that a member thereof is suffering from any infectious disease.

58. Every laundryman shall, when called upon by the Chairman of the Local Board or the Senior Sanitary Officer or his assistants, give a list of the persons for whom he washes.

F.—*Common Lodging Houses.*

59. For the purpose of rules under section 56 (5) "common lodging house" shall mean any house or any part of a house in which four or more persons not being members of the same family are housed for hire.

60. A common lodging house shall be substantially built and kept in a good state of repair, and the sleeping room shall be well ventilated and lighted to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the walls thereof whitewashed thrice annually.

61. The keeper of a common lodging house shall at all times keep the place clean and in sanitary condition. He shall cause all filth and offensive matter to be removed from the premises.

62. When any person in a common lodging house becomes ill with any infectious or contagious disease, the keeper shall immediately inform the proper authority either through the Local Board Inspector or the Police Headman, and shall obey

the directions of the proper authority with regard to the vacation of the common lodging house, disinfection or destruction of bedding, clothing, and other articles, and fumigation, disinfection, and limewashing of the house.

63. The keeper of a common lodging house shall be responsible for the provision of sufficient latrine accommodation for the inmates and for the keeping of the same in a sanitary condition.

64. The Chairman of the Local Board is hereby empowered to decide the maximum number of persons that may be accommodated in any common lodging house, and such number shall be endorsed upon the license. Any common lodging house keeper allowing the number to be exceeded shall be guilty of an offence. For the purpose of this rule two children under twelve years of age shall count as one person.

65. The premises of any common lodging house shall at all reasonable times be open for inspection by the Chairman of the Local Board, the Senior Sanitary Officer or his assistants, the Chief Headman of the district, and any Inspector appointed by the Chairman of the Local Board or the Senior Sanitary Officer to do sanitary inspection in the Local Board town in which such common lodging house is situated.

H.—Washing Places.

66. It shall be lawful for the Board, by resolution from time to time to set apart for washing of horses and cattle, clothes or mats, such places as it may deem proper, and the hours during which they may be used.

67. A list of the places so set apart shall be published in the *Government Gazette* in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, and proclaimed within the limits of the Local Board by beat of tom-tom, and copies of the list in the said three languages shall be kept affixed at the office.

68. No person shall wash horses, cattle, clothes, or mats at any public bathing place within the town, except at such places so set apart by the Board.

69. Every laundryman who washes clothes in the dhobies' pokuna shall get his name registered by the Chairman of the Local Board.

70. No person shall wash horses and cattle suffering from infectious or contagious diseases at washing places, and no person suffering, or who (to the knowledge of any person in charge of a washing place set apart as hereinbefore provided) has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the washing place to wash clothes or any other article in such washing places.

I.—Public Bathing Places.

71. For the purposes of these rules a public bathing place shall mean any place where the public or any particular class of persons bathe, whether on payment of money or not, or any place thereto specially set apart by order of the Local Board under rule 72.

72. The Local Board may by resolution set apart any public place over which it has control or any portion thereof for the purpose of being used as a public bathing place, and may define the meets and bounds of such public bathing place.

73. Whenever a public bathing place is served by a well, no person shall use such well for washing cattle or any other animals or mats or any other things or any clothes, except those he is wearing, and if such clothes be slabbed upon a stone or otherwise beaten, this shall be done at such distance from the well that the splash therefrom cannot fall into the well. The provision of rule 73 shall also (*mutatis mutandis*) applied to tanks or baths, water of which is artificially changed at intervals, and to public bathing places specially set apart by order of the Local Board or the Chairman.

74. No person shall commit a nuisance by obeying a call of nature at or near any public bathing place.

J.—Dangerous and Offensive Trades.

75. Dangerous and offensive trades shall for the purpose of these rules mean and include any of the following. Storage or manufacture of artificial manure, boiling of blood or offal, drying blood or offal, tanning, fat melting, fat extracting, soap making, soaking of coconut husks, fibre dyeing, coconut oil manufacture (where machinery is employed), manufacture or storing of fibre, storing of hides, bones, artificial manure, storing of Maldiver fish in quantity over 5 cwt. in weight, quarrying for metal, cabook, or gravel, the manufacture of aerated waters, storing or curing of plumbago.

76. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the limits of the Local Board or other person shall carry on or suffer to be carried on upon such lands or premises any offensive or dangerous trades or manufacture without a license from the Chairman of the Local Board, who is further empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with any of these or other already existing Local Board rule.

Such license shall be subject to such fees as the Local Board from time to time may determine with the sanction of the Governor in the Council.

77. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court for the breach of any of these rules, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Local Board, upon such cancellation of a license by a court the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered in his discretion to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person.

78. All materials required for the purpose of carrying on any of the aforesaid trades, businesses, or manufactures shall be stored so as to prevent affluvia or nuisance, and all such materials which have to be brought along any public thoroughfare, and which are likely to be offensive and give off effluvia, shall be transported in non-absorbent covered receptacles or in such other manner as the Chairman shall direct so as to obviate the creation of any nuisance.

79. Effective means shall be adopted for rendering innocuous any offensive vapours or gases emitted during any process or manufacture. Such vapours or gases shall either be discharged into the external air in such manner and at such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effects, or they shall be passed directly through a fire or into a condensing apparatus. All premises shall be adequately drained, and the drains kept in efficient order and washed daily.

80. Floors shall be maintained in a proper state of repair and cleansed daily, and when so ordered by the Chairman shall be constructed of such impermeable materials as he may direct.

81. Walls shall be kept in good order so as to prevent the absorption of filth, and whitewashed twice annually or oftener if so ordered by the Chairman of the Local Board or the Senior Sanitary Officer.

82. All apparatus, including implements and vessels, shall be kept clean, and where possible they shall be kept cleaned daily. All refuse, sweepings, scrapings, together with waste or dye products, shall be removed daily from the premises in covered receptacles, unless intended to be forthwith subjected to further trade purposes on the premises.

83. Tanks used for washing or soaking skins or any other material must be emptied and cleansed as often as may be necessary to prevent effluvia.

84. No person carrying on any offensive trades or manufacture, nor any owner or occupier of any land or premises upon which such offensive trade or manufacture is carried on, shall pollute any river, stream, canal, channel, well, tank, or open piece of water by discharging thereinto or suffering to flow thereinto foul, ill-smelling, or offensive water or other fluid, or by throwing thereinto or suffering to be washed thereinto any offensive substance, nor shall he in any other way pollute or contaminate such river, stream, canal, channel, well, tank, or open piece of water.

85. The premises of all the afore-mentioned trades shall be open for inspection at all reasonable hours by the Chairman of the Local Board or by any person duly authorized by the Chairman.

86. The owner or occupier of any land from which clay, earth, stone, gravel, cabook, or other materials is cut for the manufacture of bricks or tiles, or for building, or for any other purposes shall be responsible for seeing that proper drainage is provided, and that the pit or trenches cut are afterwards filled so that water cannot stagnate therein.

K.—*Manufacture of Aerated Water.*

87. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated water within the limits of the Local Board for the purposes of sale without giving one month's notice in writing to the Chairman of the Local Board.

88. No aerated water factory shall be situated within less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.

89. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted and ventilated, must have cemented floors, must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material, and must be kept clean and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate fly-proof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be kept scrupulously clean.

90. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Local Board. It shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory on properly constructed tanks or reservoirs connecting with the aerating apparatus.

91. All water used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman of the Local Board and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have power to exempt from the operation of this rule, water derived from an approved public supply.

92. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water and shall be kept scrupulously clean.

93. Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water, and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Local Board.

94. No person under twelve years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.

95. All employers engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine meshed wire face and neck shields and leather gloves.

96. Wells from which water for the manufacture of aerated water is drawn shall be set apart solely for this purpose, and shall not use for bathing.

The Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1922.

(Dated May 31, 1922.)

(D.I.P. 532.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

Commencement.

1. This Order shall come into operation on the First day of July, Nineteen hundred and Twenty-two.

Definitions.

2. In this Order—"The Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries; "Inspector" means an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; and the expression "plant" shall, where the context permits, include tree and shrub and the fruit, seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers, cuttings, or other parts of a plant.

Restriction on Importation of Plants.

3. (1) The landing in England and Wales from any country other than Scotland, Ireland, and the Channel Islands of any of the plants mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order is prohibited, except in accordance with the regulations set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

(2) The importer of any plant, the landing of which is regulated by this Article, shall comply with the regulations set out in the Third Schedule hereto.

(3) This Article shall not apply to any plant, the landing of which is authorized by a general license issued by the Minister or by a special license issued by an Inspector, or to a consignment of a plant to the Minister for experimental or scientific purposes.

Powers of Entry.

4. An Inspector may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises and examine any plant on such premises which has been landed in England or Wales from any country except as aforesaid or on which he has reason to believe that an insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order exists or has recently existed.

Precautions to be Adopted in case of Disease.

5. (1) An Inspector may at any time and from time to time by a notice served on the occupier of premises on which he has reason to believe that there is any plant attacked with any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the notice.

(2) A notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

Power to deal with Living Specimens of Insects or Pests.

6. No person shall land, sell, or offer for sale, a living specimen of any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, except with the written permission of the Minister, and an Inspector may, by a notice served on any person having in his possession or under his charge any such living specimen, require him to adopt such measures or the prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the notice.

Service of Notices, &c.

7. For the purpose of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be *prima facie* evidence that it was signed by him.

Information to be given as to Diseased Plants or parts thereof.

8. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge any plant which is attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, and every person who, as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise, has sold or offered for sale any such plant shall, if so required in writing by the Minister or an Inspector, give to the Minister or Inspector all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge the plant is or has been; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Offences.

9. (1) Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who does any act in contravention of this Order or the regulations in the Third Schedule to this Order or any notice served on him under this Order, or fails to do any act which he is required to do by this Order or the said regulations or any such notice.

(2) This Article does not apply to the landing or attempted landing of anything in contravention of this Order the penalty for which is provided by section one of the Destructive Insects Act, 1877, as amended by the Destructive Insects and Pests Act, 1907.

Revocation of Order.

10. The Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1921 is hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not—

- (i.) Affect the previous operation of such Order or any thing duly done or suffered under such Order; or
- (ii.) Affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under such Order; or
- (iii.) Affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against such Order; or
- (iv.) Affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed as if this Order had not been made.

Application of the Order.

11. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1922.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

Regulations Governing the Importation of Plants into England and Wales.

1. The restrictions on landing imposed by the Order and these regulations do not apply to plants, the landing of which is authorized by a general license issued by the Minister or by a special license issued by an Inspector, or to consignments of plants to the Minister for experimental or scientific purposes.

2. *Inspection and Certification as a Condition of Entry.*—(a) In the case of an importation of plants, otherwise than through the post, from a country whose service of plant inspection is recognized for the time being, each consignment must be accompanied by two copies of a certificate issued after inspection, and not more than 14 days prior to the date of shipment, by a duly authorized official of the country whence the plants are exported, in the form prescribed below. One copy of the certificate must be produced to the Customs Officer at the port of entry, and the other copy must be forwarded by the importer to the consignee. In the case of consignments imported through the post, a copy of the prescribed certificate need not be produced to the Customs Officer, but a copy must be affixed to each package.

The original of the certificate must be forwarded by post, before the plants are despatched, by the Exporter to the Horticulture Division of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

An Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries may open and examine the contents of any consignment or package imported or believed to have been imported into England or Wales, notwithstanding the fact that the consignment may be accompanied by, or the package may have attached thereto, the duly authorized copy certificate.

(b) In the case of an importation of plants from a country where no recognized service of plant inspection is maintained, and in the case of a consignment of plants which is not accompanied by copy certificates as above mentioned, or of a package of plants imported through the post to which a copy certificate is not attached, the plants shall be retained by the importer or consignee until they have been examined by an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries at a suitable place designated by the Inspector or by the Ministry and certified in writing to be healthy and free from the insects and pests mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, or until their removal has been authorized in writing by the Ministry or by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) Any imported plants which on inspection are found to be unhealthy or attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, and which, in the judgment of the Inspector, cannot be cleaned by disinfection or other treatment, shall, with the packing and package, either be destroyed or returned to the country of exportation by the importer thereof.

(d) When disinfection or other treatment of the plants is allowed, it shall be carried out by the importer, and under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries at a suitable place designated by the Inspector or the Ministry, and no part of the consignment shall be moved from the place designated without the written consent of the Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(e) The Ministry's charge for the services of the Inspector and all charges for storage, cartage, and labour incident to inspection and disinfection, shall be paid by the importer.

3. Plants will not be deemed to be healthy which are attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule and the Note to the Sale of Diseased Plants Order of 1922.

"THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897."

WHEREAS smallpox has broken out in the village of Kalmunaikudi, in the Batticaloa District of the Eastern Province, it is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to declare the locality described in the schedule hereto to be a "diseased locality" for a period of one month from the date hereof, in terms of the regulations made under the above-mentioned Ordinance, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,636 of July 31, 1914.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

Prohibition of Cesspits and Establishment of Closets on the Dry-earth System.

1. *The Board may order cesspits to be closed when, in the opinion of the proper authority, they are likely to be a danger to the public health, &c.*—The Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, when specially empowered thereto by resolution of the Board, may, by notice in writing, require the owner or occupier of any house or building or land having a cesspit in his premises to close such cesspit and substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

2. *Permission to bury in private premises.*—Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, to any householder to have night soil from his own premises buried, or otherwise disposed of on his own premises. Such permission may be revoked by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, at any time.

3. *Removal of night soil to the depôt.*—Every person (unless especially exempted in writing thereto by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, under regulation 2), on whose premises the dry-earth system is in operation, is hereby required to cause the daily removal of night soil to a depôt appointed by the Board for the disposal of the night soil.

4. *Name of person removing night soil to be registered at the Board Office.*—Any householder not having received written permission under regulation 2 may employ any person for the purpose of the removal and disposal of night soil. Provided that in the case of such private arrangements being entered into, the name of such person so employed shall be registered at the office of the Board, and the place to which the night soil shall be removed and the method in which it is to be disposed of shall be submitted to the Board for approval. Permission may be refused by the Chairman, Sanitary Board, Kandy District, to authorize the use of any place for the disposal of night soil.

5. *Fee for removal of night soil.*—Every person employing a Sanitary Board Officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the Board such sum as shall be determined by the Chairman, not exceeding Rs. 2 per mensem, for each bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer. Such sum shall be paid to the Chairman of the Sanitary Board on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following that for which the same is due.

"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, 1889."

British Claims against Bulgaria.

THE Administrator of Bulgarian Property has, under the power conferred upon him by section 1 (iv.) of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920-1922 and with the approval of the President of the Board of Trade, prescribed September 30, 1922, as the final date at which proofs of debts by British nationals against Bulgarian nationals and other claims by British nationals against the Bulgarian Government must be made in order to rank for payment of the first dividend to be declared by him out of the Bulgarian assets within His Majesty's Dominions or Protectorates which are subject to the charge created by section 1 (iv.) of these Orders.

British nationals who have claims against Bulgarian nationals or the Bulgarian Government under Part IX. (Economic Clauses) of the Treaty of Neuilly-sur-Seine with the payment of which the Bulgarian assets above referred to are charged, and who have not yet lodged their claims upon the prescribed forms with the Controller, Clearing Office, Enemy Debts, Controller of Revenue's Office, Colombo, should do so immediately, as any such claims lodged after September 30, 1922, will only be permitted to rank against any surplus of the above-mentioned Bulgarian assets which may remain over after payment of the said first dividend.

Notification by the Controller, Clearing Office (German) Enemy Debts.

WITH reference to the Notification appearing in the *Government Gazette* of August 19, 1921, it is hereby notified that the time limit for lodging claims against German nationals or firms in respect of pre-war contracts or debts has been extended to September 30, 1922.

If any person has any such claim against any German national or firm which he has not yet notified to this office, he should notify same as soon as possible, and in any case before the date mentioned above.

The following special cases should be noted:—

- (a) A British national or firm having a claim on account of a pre-war debt against a German firm liquidated in Ceylon can claim through the Clearing Office against the partners of the firm for so much of the claim as has not been met by the Liquidators of the firm, provided the German partners of the said firm were resident in Germany on January 10, 1920.
- (b) A British consignor of goods by a German owned vessel which left Ceylon before the outbreak of war can claim against the German Master and owners of the vessel in any case where the Master has burnt or destroyed the goods, or disposed of them at a port of internment, provided property in the goods was still in the British consignor. No such claim would, however, lie when the goods were dealt with by the authorities at the port of internment.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 5, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 125 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 74 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 12 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 26·3, as against 24·0 in the preceding week, 32·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 145 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30·5, as against 34·1 in the previous week, 27·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 145 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-seven from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals, 4 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Maradana North, Kollupitiya, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 23 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 in Maradana North, as against 7 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Maradana South, as against 7 in the previous week.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 7 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta North, as against 1 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana hospitals, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eleven deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 10 from *Debility*, 6 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Enteritis*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 56 from *Other* causes.

6. Eight cases of *Enteric Fever*, 7 of *Measles*, 4 of *Chickenpox*, and 3 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 4, 1, 3, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·1°, against 81·1° in the preceding week, and 79·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·856 in., against 29·885 in. in the preceding week, and 29·966 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·06 in., against 0·31 in. in the preceding week, and 3·81 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Training School for Surveyors.

AN examination for admission to the Departmental Training School for Surveyors will be held at the following centres :—Colombo, Kandy, Jaffna, Galle, Kurunegala, Badulla, Anuradhapura, Ratnapura, and Batticaloa on September 4, 1922.

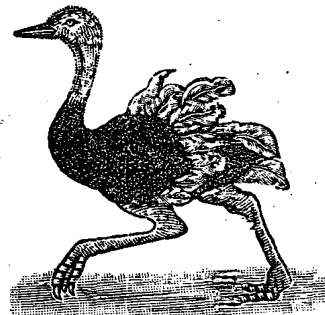
