"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, NO. 24 OF 1889."

A MENDED rules set forth in Schedule A hereto made under the provisions of section 16 of the above-mentioned Ordinance by the Village Committees elected by the inhabitants of the subdivisions set forth in Schedule B hereto in the Chief Headman's divisions of Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Tumpane, Harispattu, Pata Dumbara, Uda Dumbara, Pata Hewaheta, Udapalata, and Uda Bulatgama in the District of Kandy; Matale North, Matale South, and Matale East in the District of Matale; and Uda Hewaheta, Walapane, and Kotmale in the District of Nuwara Eliya, Central Province, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in substitution for rules 23 and 26 of the rules made by the said Village Committees, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,713 of May 14, 1915.

SCHEDULE A.

23. If the majority of cattle owners decides that any grazing ground should be cleared and fenced or a ditch cut and ponds constructed, the Government Agent shall direct the same to be done by the joint labour of all the proprietors of cattle ordinarily grazing on such ground, the liability being in proportion to the number of animals over one year old belonging to each owner. If the land is not fenced, cattle owners using the communal pasture should be required to tend or to tether their cattle.

23 A. All details as to gateways, time of repairing fences, herding and enclosing cattle &c., are to be arranged by the Village Committee and published in the village or villages by beat of tom-tom.

26. No person shall do any wilful injury to waste or other land set apart for the common pasturage of cattle or for any other common purpose, or obstruct any gateway, or befoul or poison any pond.

"THE BUDDHIST TEMPORALITIES ORDINANCE, 1905."

RULES made by the Atamasthana Committee of Anuradhapura, under the provisions of section 12 of "The Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, 1905," and approved by His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council:

Rules referred to.

CHAPTER I.

For determining the Quorum necessary for the Transaction of Business.

1. Three members of the Atamasthana Committee shall form a quorum.

CHAPTER II.

For regulating the Time and Place of Meetings, and the Conduct and Record of Proceedings.

2. The Committee shall elect one of its members as Honorary Secretary.
3. The meetings of the Committee shall be held at Meda Pansala in Anuradhapura on the first day of every month, at 2 P.M., provided that in the event the first day of the month happening to fall on a Poya or a Government holiday the meeting shall be held on the next working day. The Committee shall, however, have the power to hold a special meeting at any other time or place in the town of Anuradhapura on three days' notice thereof being given to the members, as provided for in rule 4 herein below.
4. Such special meetings shall be convened at the instance of the President or of the Secretary or of two other members at any time, by giving the other members three days' notice thereof.
5. The Committee shall elect one of their members as Honorary Secretary for a particular meeting in the event of the Secretary happening to be absent.
6. It shall be the duty of the Honorary Secretary to convene meetings and record minutes under the orders of the President.
7. The President shall preserve order at meetings, and shall decide on all points of order.
8. The business of the Committee at its meetings shall be taken in the following order, viz.:—
 - (a) The minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and (if need be) corrected and confirmed. The President signing such confirmation.
 - (b) The accounts, and other returns, and all communications received from the trustee during the preceding month shall be submitted to the Committee.
 - (c) All communications, such as petitions, letters, complaints, &c., addressed to the Committee or to its President shall be laid before the Committee and orders made thereon.
 - (d) Questions of which previous notice have been given shall be asked.
 - (e) Notices of motions shall be given.
 - (f) Motions shall be made. All such shall be seconded.
 - (g) Reports of special sub-committees shall be brought up and fixed for their consideration, unless the Committee shall resolve to proceed to their consideration at once.
 - (h) Any other matter set down in the notice of meeting shall be proceeded with, provided that the Committee may, if it sees fit, deviate from the order herein prescribed.
9. Any member presenting a petition or other communication shall be responsible for its contents being throughout respectful.
10. When a petition or other communication is presented it shall be read, and if the examination of witnesses is found necessary, such witnesses as shall be named by the petitioner shall be summoned and their evidence shall be recorded by the Honorary Secretary in Committee, and read over to the witnesses, who may then desire any correction to be made, and in case no correction shall be made, the evidence shall stand as taken down and be signed by the witness, and shall not be altered afterwards.
11. The monthly meetings of the Committee shall be convened by the Honorary Secretary by notice issued at least six days before the date of the meeting, and to such notice shall be appended a copy of the agenda.
12. Every member while speaking shall address the Chair, and shall stand while so doing. The speaker may refer to notes, but shall not be allowed to read a written or a printed speech.
13. In discussing any motion no member shall be at liberty to speak more than once, except in explanation or when any matter is under discussion, but a reply shall be allowed to a member who has made a substantive motion, not being an amendment. Immediately after such reply the motion shall be put, and every member shall be bound to give his vote, the Honorary Secretary minuting each vote, after which the President shall declare the number of votes for and against the motion.

14. It shall be competent for any member who is in the minority to record the reasons of his dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent shall be sent to the Honorary Secretary within one week, and shall be registered and filed by the Honorary Secretary.

15. In the absence of the President, the members present shall elect their own President for the meeting.

16. The minutes of all meetings shall be recorded by the Honorary Secretary in a book to be called the Minute Book.

17. The President shall preside at all meetings convened under section 17 of the Ordinance. In his absence or in the event of his being a candidate for a trusteeship one of the members of the Committee shall be selected as President by the remaining members of the Committee.

CHAPTER III.

For regulating the form in which all Accounts, Statements, Returns incidental to the Business of the Atamasthana Committee and that of the Trustee shall be kept.

18. The trustee shall keep a receipt book in the form A hereto annexed in foil and counterfoil, consecutively numbered, and no temple money or paddy and any other kind of grain shall be received by the trustee without issuing a receipt from that book.

19. The trustee shall keep two account books in the forms B and E hereto annexed. In the book of B forms shall be entered all moneys and other income that come to his charge. In the book of E forms shall be entered all revenue and expenditure in paddy and other grains.

20. The trustee shall keep a Voucher Book in form C hereto annexed, consecutively numbered, and each voucher shall be signed by the person actually receiving payment for every payment made by him.

21. The trustee shall within a month of the expiration of every year submit a report to the Atamasthana Committee whether all paraven tenants have performed the services due from their respective pangus for the past year, and if there were defaulters, the report shall state the names of the defaulters, and the steps taken against such defaulters.

22. When a temple is given in charge of the trustee, the trustee shall sign a receipt of acceptance of the temple and all property appertaining thereto in the form D hereto annexed. The trustee shall sign a receipt in triplicate, one of which shall be kept with the trustee, one with the Nayaka Terunnanse and the other with the Committee.

23. The Atamasthana Committee shall forthwith ascertain from the Atamasthana Nayaka Terunnanse the property attached to each temple belonging to the Atamasthana.

24. On receipt of such information the same shall be entered in a book by the Committee.

CHAPTER IV.

For every purpose necessary to the due exercise of the powers of the Atamasthana Committee and the performance of the duties of the Atamasthana Committee under the Ordinance No. 8 of 1905.

25. A candidate for a trusteeship shall with his application submit a certificate signed by two members of the Committee and by the Atamasthana Nayaka Terunnanse as to the truth of his being possessed of the qualifications required by section 8 of the Ordinance. All applications unsupported by such a certificate shall be rejected.

26. If the trustee after being served with a notice accompanying a copy of the charge preferred against him under section 26 fail without showing sufficient cause to answer such charge, the inquiry shall be proceeded with in his absence. In the event the trustee feeling aggrieved by such *ex parte* decision, he shall be entitled to ask for a re-hearing, provided he shall show that his absence was due to unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances.

27. At the end of each pilgrimage season the trustee shall deposit in the National Bank of either Colombo or Kandy selected by the Atamasthana Committee all surplus funds he may have in his hands, and may under the directions of the Committee draw any sum actually required for expenditure upon cheques signed by the trustee, such cheques to be countersigned by the President and the Nayaka Terunnanse by way of witnesses to the chief signature.

28. The Atamasthana Committee shall, whenever they deem it necessary or expedient so to do, authorize one or more of their members or any person or persons to be deputed by them to inspect and report upon the condition and management of any temple and of the lands belonging thereto sought to be leased or otherwise, and the expenses of such inspection shall be paid by the trustee according to instructions of the Committee.

29. Copies of all deeds of leases executed by the trustee under section 27 of the Ordinance shall be furnished by him to the Atamasthana Committee, who shall file them of record in their office.

30. The Atamasthana Committee shall inspect and examine all the books and movable property and monies and the accounts and papers of the trustee by deputing one or more of their members for the purpose at any time, and as often as the Committee deem such inspection necessary.

31. The trustee shall have authority to incur an expenditure not exceeding Rs. 25 on incidental matters, provided the trustee reports the fact through the Secretary to the next Committee meeting, by the decision of which the trustee shall be bound.

32. Offerings of money made to each of the temples shall be verified monthly on the last day of the month by the trustee in presence of the officiating Bhikkhu of the respective temple and of the Nayaka Terunnanse of the Atamasthana, and the trustee shall on the first day of the following month report to the Atamasthana Committee the value of such offerings.

33. The trustee now in office and those who shall hereafter be elected shall, as required by the 17th section of the Ordinance, give security for the due discharge of their duties in a sum not exceeding Rs. 2,500. Such security shall be given to the Atamasthana Committee either in cash or in unencumbered landed property, and the trustee shall get the security bond drawn up at the cost of the Atamasthana. Such security bonds shall be deposited with the President of the Committee.

33 A. The trustee shall receive such remuneration as may be fixed by the Committee, and the Committee is hereby authorized to fix such remuneration.

33 B. Whenever it appears to the Committee that the Secretary or the trustee needs the assistance of clerks, or on the application of either or both of them, it shall be competent to the Committee to appoint one or more clerks, to fix their salary and to pay the same.

34. The Atamasthana Committee shall direct the trustee to repair the Atamasthana and upkeep the roads and buildings belonging thereto, when in the opinion of the Atamasthana Committee such repairs and upkeep are necessary, and the trustee on receiving such directions shall be bound to carry out such directions within the time allowed by the Atamasthana Committee for that purpose.

34 A. Any individual or any society desirous of carrying out a new work or of effecting repairs to an old work in view of improving any place belonging to the Atamasthana in consideration of charity, shall give information of such intention to the Atamasthana Committee, and shall carry out such work on permission obtained from the Committee. The Committee shall hereby have the absolute authority to allow or disallow the permission applied for as aforesaid. The receiver of such permission shall be bound to carry out such work under the directions and supervision of the Committee, and in the event of disobedience to such directions and supervision the Committee shall have the right to stop such work. In the case any work taken in hand by any individual or any society without a special permission from the Committee as aforesaid before these rules come into force, the Committee is authorized to order such person or persons to obtain permission therefor. In the event of disobedience to such orders the Committee shall order the trustee to stop such work. Thereafter the trustee is hereby authorized, if need be, to take legal steps for the purpose of ejecting the person or persons engaged in such work from the place.

35. It shall be competent for the Committee to make inquiries from the trustee with regard to the internal working, such as ceremonies, customs, &c., of any of the temples belonging to the Atamasthana, and the trustee shall, on such inquiries being made, forthwith supply the information sought for.

36. When the trustee's accounts are transmitted to the Atamasthana Committee by the District Court, it shall be competent for the Atamasthana Committee to scrutinize such accounts and find out whether the income of all lands and all monies have been accounted for, and whether any unauthorized expenditure has been made.

37. In the event of any member of the Atamasthana Committee appointed in terms of Ordinance No. 8 of 1905 neglecting his duties or of a vacancy occurring in terms of section 34 of the Ordinance or of receiving proof of an offence which in the eyes of the Committee disqualifies a member holding office, it shall be the duty of the remaining members to elect one instead, and also it shall be competent for the Committee whenever a Ratamahatmaya becomes disqualified to work in the Committee by reason of his being a non-Buddhist, to elect one in his place at a meeting convened in terms of sections 6, 7, and 8 of the main Ordinance, and whenever the head of the Nuwarawewa family, by law and by present usage authorized, becoming disqualified by reason of his being a non-Buddhist, to elect one suitable from the same family, and whenever the Nayaka Thero of Malwatta Vihare, Asgiriya Vihare, and Sripadasthanaya neglect the election of a special member, to elect one in his place. And in the event of Nayaka Terunnanse of the Atamasthana declining to hold office of member, it shall be competent for the Atamasthana Committee to elect one in his place from the sisyanusisya-paramparawa of Bomaluwa.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week end August 19, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 119 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese 15 Tamils, 19 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 25.1, as against 27.6 in the preceding week, 29.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 132 (4 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.8, as against 33.1 in the previous week, 28.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 132 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of still births registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 5 in Kotahena South, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 22 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, as against 7 in the previous week.

(c) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, same as in the previous week, the weekly average for last year was 14.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 in Pettah, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 6 each from *Dysentery* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Worms* 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Enteritis*, 1 from *Pæriperal Septicæmia*, and 53 from *Other Causes*.

5. Nine cases of *Enteric Fever*, 7 of *Chickenpox*, and 3 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 12, 5, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported during the week, but 1 was reported in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.5°, against 81.4° in the preceding week, and 82.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.849 in., against 29.870 in. in the preceding week, and 29.948 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.47 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.12 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy: thrashing of munmari crops is over, and a second crop is in progress in several places.

Dry grain: no crops.

Coconuts: trees are in good condition, except where caterpillar pest prevails. No accurate information as to the number of nuts plucked is available.

Other products: plantains and lime are available. Vegetables are scarce and dear.

Price of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 4.80 to Rs. 7.80 per bushel; paddy, Re. 1.60 to Rs. 2 per bushel; imported rice, not available; kurakkan, Re. 1.60 to Rs. 2 per bushel;

maize, Re. 1.44 to Re. 1.50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 5 to Rs. 15 per 100 nuts; salt, 2½ cents to 5 cents per lb.; salt, 25 cents per measure; dried chillies (country), 40 cents per lb.

Health of inhabitants: not very satisfactory. There was fever, cough, malaria, and influenza. Towards the end of the month, smallpox broke out in Kalmunaikuddy, but fortunately the number of deaths has been small.

Health of cattle: satisfactory.

Conditions of tanks and fisheries: tanks in some places are in good condition, while in others they require restoration. Worms have been found in a few of the fish caught, which has created a scare, and many people are now not eating fish.

Harvest prospects: good.

General: nil.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 13, 1922, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 11, 1922.

Present :—Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Dr. G. P. Hay; and Mr. A. de C. Carson.

Before the proceedings for the day commenced Mr. de Silva moved—“That the meeting be adjourned to Monday, to enable the Members of Council to attend the funeral of Mr. J. C. Ratwatte’s daughter.” Mr. Pieris seconded.

Dr. Attygalle moved as an amendment—“That this Council do convey their sense of sympathy to Mr. J. C. Ratwatte and family on their sad bereavement.” Dr. Hay seconded.

The Chairman supported the vote of condolence, which was passed in silence all standing.

The original motion was declared lost.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 17, 1922, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June.

4. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. 20 of June 13, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, stating that the motor vehicles belonging to the Ceylon Defence Force are not liable to taxation.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 21 of June 16, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 39 to the widow of late Sekken, market cooly.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 22 of June 17, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that in the opinion of Government, the effect of the supply of water to Peradeniya should be ascertained by experience before the sum of Rs. 17,364·50 promised by Government for increasing the sources of water supply is claimed.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 23 of July 4, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Director of Public Works has been requested to include the sum of Rs. 17,364·50 promised by Government for increasing the sources.—Resolved the letter be acknowledged with thanks.

(5) Letter of June 30, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to Rev. A. G. Fraser, granting permission for the burial of the remains of Muhandiram Jasinghe in the field belonging to Trinity College, for the information of the Chairman.

It was agreed to allow the Chairman to use his discretion in the case of such applications and to circulate the papers immediately after for the information of members.

(6) Letter No. 768 of June 26, 1922, from the Director of Statistics, forwarding a copy of the Statistics Ordinance for favour of remarks.—Resolved that the papers be circulated.

(7) Letter No. 168 of July 10, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Government Agent, Central Province, re acquisition of lots 1 to 25 in preliminary plan 7,346, required for the execution of a back lane scheme.—Read.

(8) Letter No. 818 S of July 10, 1922, from the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, re the loan of Mr. Thyne’s services for a report on the Kandy water supply.—Resolved that inquiry be made as to what date or dates would suit Mr. Thyne to visit Kandy. Interview to be then arranged between him and the Members.

(9) Letter No. 948 of July 10, 1922, from the Assessor, Municipal Council, Colombo, re the loan of his services for the assessment of Kandy properties.—Resolved that he be asked as to when he can visit Kandy for a preliminary discussion on the subject.

(10) Letter of July 7, 1922, from Colonel H. Gladstone Millner (Salvation Army), stating the terms on which he is prepared to take charge of the Municipal School at Mahaiyawa.—Resolved that inquiry be made as to whether in the event of a grant being given by Government it would come to the Council. The Council to retain the power to terminate the agreement on a year’s notice.

(11) Letter of June 28, 1922, from Mr. D. Wickramasinghe, suggesting that a few wells be sunk by the Council.—Resolved that the letter be acknowledged with thanks.

(12) Letter of July 10, 1922, from Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle, forwarding a copy of a brochure by him entitled “Kandy and its lighting.”—Resolved that this Council do convey to Dr. Attygalle their thanks for his interesting brochure.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva asked—Has the Sanitation Committee sent its report regarding the question of handing over the Scavenging and Night Soil Department to the Medical Officer of Health?

The Chairman replied—“The answer is in the negative.”

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva was to have moved—(1) In the opinion of this Council there is no necessity to employ two Engineers to carry on the work of the Board of Improvement and the decision of this Council be communicated to Government

(2) That a Committee of the Council be appointed to consider the advisability of disposing off the present model tenements, situated at Katukele, in Kandy, with a view to construct more suitable buildings for alley population.—Both resolutions were withdrawn by the mover to be brought up at the next Meeting.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved—That the by-laws relating to the storage of grain published in the *Government Gazette* of May 20, 1920, be enforced with the exception of by-laws 3 and 4 affecting the retail boutique-keeper. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The Secretary read a letter from the President of the Indian Association supporting the motion. The motion was put to the Meeting and declared lost by 4 to 3.

Ayes.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Pieris, Mr. Vallipuram. *Noes*.—Dr. Attygalle, Dr. Hay, Mr. Carson, the Chairman.

8. The following resolution which stood in Mr. de Silva’s name was withdrawn :—“That immediate steps be taken to deepen the present reservoir.”

9. The following motion which stood in the name of Dr. Attygalle was withdrawn :—“That in view of the decision made at the Special Meeting of Council to carry out Mr. Davies Scheme re water supply, the Government or the Colombo Municipal Council be asked to lend the services of a competent Engineer with a knowledge of waterworks construction, on reasonable terms for a certain period to carry out the scheme.”

10. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—That in terms of section 251 of the Council’s by-laws that the speed for all motor buses be limited to 12 miles an hour within the Municipal area. Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held in the Municipal Office on July 8, 1922, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated July 3, 1922.

Present :—Mr. F. Bartlett, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; Dr. C. B. Lourensz Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; and Mr. E. W. Cade.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 10, 1922, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Councillor, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe asked :—Is the Chairman prepared to recommend to Council that applications for water service may now be allowed, as there is reported to be ample water in the Hiyare reservoir for the purpose ?

The Chairman replied :—Although there is ample water in Hiyare reservoir, the main from the reservoir to the town is incapable of supplying more than the demands at present made on it, and it is thought inadvisable to increase the number of services.

3. Letter No. 2,854, dated June 23, 1922, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, intimating that instructions have been issued for the repair of the approach road to the Goods Shed, Galle, and that it will be attended to in due course.—Read.

4. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 8, 1922.

(2) Application for the transfer of a water tap from the garden of All Saints Church to All Saints school.—Recommended.

(4) Estimate of Rs. 1,400 for improvements to Victoria Park.—Recommended that the hollow behind the rubble barrier be filled, at the estimated cost of Rs. 456 ; the other improvements to be considered later.

(5) Estimate of Rs. 500 for gravelling the drive in Victoria Park.—Recommended that repairs be carried out where necessary, the cost not to exceed Rs. 200.

(7) Sale of the old incinerator at the night soil depôt.—Recommended that it be sold, if the Superintendent of Works cannot use the materials for his department.

(6) Demolished buildings in Wards 2, 3, 4 West, 4 East, and 5.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(7) To demolish house No. 175, Maitipe, which was purchased by the Council for arrears of rates, the same being in a ruinous condition.—Recommended.
