The following draft of the rules which it is proposed to issue in exercise of the powers conferred by section 24 of the Indian Emigration Act, 1922 (VII. of 1922), is published, as required by sub-section (1) of the said section, for the information of all persons likely to be effected thereby, and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration by the Governor-General in Council on or after October 31, 1922

Any objection or suggestion which may be received from any person with respect to the draft before the date

fixed aforesaid will be considered by the Governor-General in Council.

DRAFT RULES.

The following words in the rules shall bear the meaning specified against them:-

Definitions.

"The Act" means the Indian Emigration Act, 1922 (No. VII. of 1922). "Protector" means the Protector of Emigrants.

Medical Inspector" means the Medical Inspector of Emigrants.

(d)

"Schedule" means the schedule appended to these rules.

"Labourer" means any person performing unskilled work.

"Magistrate" means any magistrate exercising jurisdiction over the area from which emigration takes place.

PART I.

Rules Regarding Emigration of Unskilled Labour.

I.—Emigration Staff.

(1) The Government of every country to which emigration is lawful shall, unless expressly exempted by the Government of India, appoint a person to be called the Emigration Commissioner for one or more of the ports from which labourers for the country are embarked.

(2) The appointment of an Emigration Commissioner shall not take effect until the Government

of India, by notification in the official gazette, has declared its approval of the appointment.

(3) The remuneration to be given to the Emigration Commissioner shall not depend on, or be regulated by the number of labourers sent by him, but shall be in the nature of fixed salary.

The Emigration Commissioner shall-

(a) Be responsible for the diffusion of correct information regarding the country represented by him and for all arrangements for securing emigrants and assisting them to emigrate to that country; and

(b) Control and be responsible for the operations of all persons engaged by him or under his orders for propaganda work connected with emigration to the country by which he is appointed or for assisting labourers to emigrate to such country.

(1) The Emigration Commissioner shall, with the approval of the Local Governments concerned, divide into circles the area from which he wishes to secure emigrants for unskilled work. For each circle he shall appoint an Inspector of Emigration whose duty it shall be to supervise the work of all persons engaged in assisting or inducing labourers to emigrate to the country which he represents.

(2) The salary of an Inspector of Emigration shall be fixed and shall not depend on the number of emigrants obtained from his circle.

(1) The Emigration Commissioner may appoint as many persons as he may consider necessary for propaganda work and for assisting labourers to emigrate. Such persons shall be called Emigration

(2) Emigration Agents must be men of good character and respectability and should whenever possible be men who have actually worked in the country for which they are employed. They shall be paid a fixed salary which shall not depend on the number of emigrants recruited by them.

(3) No Inspector of Emigration appointed under rule 4 may be appointed an Emigration Agent. (1) Every Emigration Agent must be in possession of a valid license in Form No. 1 in the

schedule issued to him by the Emigration Commissioner.

(2) License shall be valid for a period of one year only, but may be renewed, if necessary, by the Emigration Commissioner for periods of three months at a time.

(3) The number of persons whom such license will authorize an Emigration Agent to assist to emigrate shall be specified therein.

(4) Copies of all licenses issued by him shall be sent by the Emigration Commissioner to the District Magistrate of every district in which the agent is authorized to carry on his work.

7. No person, except under and in accordance with a license granted under rule 6, shall induce or attempt to induce, any person to emigrate or to attempt to emigrate or to leave any place for the purpose of emigrating.

No person shall enter into, or attempt to enter into, any agreement with any person purporting to bind him to emigrate.

- An Emigration Agent shall not recruit in a district for which he holds a license unless the license has been countersigned by the District Magistrate.
- If a District Magistrate has satisfied himself, after such inquiry as he thinks necessary, that an Emigration Agent desiring to recruit in his District is by character or from any other cause, unfitted to be a recruiter under the Act, he may after giving such agent an opportunity of being heard, and after recording his reasons in writing refuse to countersign an Emigration Agent's license under rule 9.
- If the District Magistrate, having countersigned an Emigration Agent's license under rule 9, afterwards finds reason to think that such Agent is, by character or for any other cause, unfitted to be an Emigration Agent under this Act, he may require him to produce his license, and may after giving such agent an opportunity of being heard, if satisfied in this respect cancel the counter signature on it, or may impound the license and send it for cancellation to the Protector of Emigrants.
- 12. When a District Magistrate countersigns or refuses to countersign a license under rule 9 or 10, as the case may be, or cancels the counter signature on it under rule 11, he shall at once report such counter signature, or such refusal or cancellation, to the Emigration Commissioner who granted the
- 13. Where a license is limited to a subdivision or any part thereof the powers and duties imposed by rules 9 to 12 shall be exercised and performed by the Subdivisional Magistrate.
- (1) If any instance of misconduct, or disregard of these rules, or of the conditions of his license on the part of an Emigration Agent comes to the notice of a magistrate, he shall at once report it to the Protector of Emigrants who may on this ground after giving such agent an opportunity of being heard cancel or suspend any license granted under rule 6.

(2) The Protector may, after giving such agent an opportunity of being heard, cancel or suspend a license granted under rule 6 on the ground of misconduct or disregard of the rules or of the conditions of the license, that comes directly under his own notice.

(3) Whenever a license is cancelled by the Protector under sub-rule (1) or (2), notice thereof shall be sent at once to the Emigration Commissioner who issued it.

15. Every Emigration Agent shall produce the license granted him under rule 6 when called upon to do so by any magistrate or officer in charge of a police station. Should such magistrate desire to endorse on the license any remark concerning such agent he shall be entitled to do so, and such remark shall be reproduced on all subsequent licenses issued to him until expunged by order of the Local Government, or of the District Magistrate to whom such magistrate or officer is subordinate.

II.—Statement of Information to be supplied to Emigrants.

16. (1) An Emigration Agent shall furnish to every person whom he attempts to induce to emigrate a copy of the statement specified in sub-rule (2). A formal receipt therefor shall be obtained by the Emigration Agent from each intending emigrant.

(2) The statement shall be printed both in English and in the vernacular language or languages of the local area in which the Emigration Agent operates in a form prescribed by the Emigration Com-

missioner and shall inter alia contain information on the following points:-

(i.) Climate of the country.

(ii.) Kind of work open to emigrant.

(iii.) Hours of work. Rest days allowed.

(iv.) Wages offered and the deductions (if any) made from them.

(v.) Arrangements for housing and treatment during sickness.

- (vi.) Cost of living in the country for a labourer, whether rations cooked or uncooked are supplied, and, if so, whether free or at a price.
- (vii.) Duration of the journey from India to the country. Arrangements made for journey.

(viii.) Conditions of repatriation.

(ix.) Facilities afforded in the matter of education, grants of land for cultivation, and the observance of religious rites.

(x.) Special punishment, if any, for labour offences.

(3) No statement shall be brought into use by the Emigration Commissioner until he has through the Local Government obtained the approval thereof by the Governor-General in Council.

III.—Places of Accommodation in Areas in which Emigrants are obtained.

- In every district where the Local Government considers it necessary, the Emigration Commissioner shall provide sufficient and proper accommodation in a suitable place for such intending emigrants as he may collect, pending their production before a magistrate and removal to the port of
- 18. (1) The accommodation provided under rule 17 shall be considered sufficient if the intending emigrants are kept in such a manner as would be regarded as comfortable by persons of their condition in the district in which they are obtained. The following points shall however invariably he observed:—

(a) Cleanliness, both of premises, and of inmates.

(b) Sufficiency of accommodation for the largest number of persons likely to be located in the place at one time. The number that the premises are capable of holding will be determined by the District Magistrate or the Protector and inscribed on a board conspicuously hung up for the information of visiting officers.

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(c) A plentiful supply of good water within a reasonable distance.(d) Proper conveniences for purposes of nature and bathing.

- (e) The exclusion of all women who are not emigrants or intending emigrants without special permission of the Emigration Commissioner.
- (f) The provision of separate accommodation for women when desired by them or local or racial custom requires it.
- (g) Arrangements for the prevention of the outbreak of infectious diseases and of reporting outbreaks to the district medical officer.
- (h) The keeping by the person in charge of an inspection book in which any persons inspecting the place may write their remarks.
- (2) The Local Government may prohibit the use of any premises which it considers unsuitable and may require any improvements or alterations specified by it to be carried out as a condition of their continued use.

19. (1) The District Magistrate shall arrange that a magistrate shall at least once a month visit and inspect every place of accommodation provided under rule 17.

(2) The Local Government in a presidency town and the District Magistrate elsewhere shall appoint a visiting committee composed of non-officials for the purpose of inspecting places of accommodation provided under rule 17, and it shall be the duty of every member thereof to visit such places at such intervals as the Local Government or District Magistrate, as the case may be, may determine.

(3) Any authorized person inspecting a place of accommodation may record his remarks in an inspection book to be provided by the Emigration Commissioner. A copy of such remarks shall be forwarded at once by the Emigration Agent to the Emigration Commissioner and to the District Magistrate.

(4) The places of accommodation shall be opened to inspection by any district and subdivisional officers and by any non-officials appointed under sub-rule (2), and all members of district, taluk, or local boards within whose jurisdiction such places are situated, and Emigration Agents or other persons in charge of these places shall afford every authorized visitor every facility for visiting and inspecting them.

(5) Friends and relatives of the intending emigrants shall be permitted to visit places of accommodation and be allowed to converse with them and to induce any of them not to emigrate.

IV.—Restrictions on Recruiting by Emigration Agents.

- 20. Emigration Agents shall not carry on their operations in pilgrim centres during times of pilgrimage or festivals.
- 21. No person below the age of eighteen years not accompanying one of his parents or his guardian and no woman unaccompanied by a relative over eighteen years of age shall be assisted to emigrate.
- 22. The number of unmarried men or men unaccompanied by their wives who may be assisted to emigrate to any one country in any one year shall not exceed one to every five persons over eighteen years of age so emigrating:

Provided that the Governor-General in Council may exempt any specified country from this rule or may at his discretion modify the ratio fixed thereby.

V.—Production before a Magistrate.

23. (1) Prior to despatch to the port of embarkation every intending emigrant shall be produced before a Magistrate appointed in this behalf by the Local Government, and such Magistrate may examine such emigrant regarding his reasons for emigrating and his knowledge of the conditions on which he is going. The Emigration Agent shall not be present at any such examination. Emigrants originating from the port of departure itself shall be produced before a presidency or other Magistrate appointed in this behalf at the port.

(2) The Emigration Agent shall submit in triplicate to the Magistrate a nominal roll in form No. 2 in the schedule of the persons whom he proposes to assist to emigrate.

- 24. (1) On production of intending emigrants before a Magistrate under rule 23 (1), the Magistrate shall check the persons so produced with the nominal roll forwarded to him under rule 23 (2) and shall examine them in order to satisfy himself that the Act and these rules have been complied with.
 - (2) If on examination of any intending emigrant he finds-
 - (a) That (where such person is below the age of eighteen or is a woman) he bears to one of the other intending emigrants not so disqualified the relationship stated in the roll;

(b) That in all other cases—

- (i.) He has been recruited by a licensed Emigration Agent.
- (ii.) He is willing to emigrate and understands the statement of information supplied to him under rule 16.
- (iii.) He has not been induced to emigrate by any coercion, undue influence, fraud, misrepresentation, or mistake.

such Magistrate shall record in the three copies of the roll that such person is permitted to emigrate.

- (3) If the Magistrate is of opinion that any intending emigrant or any of his dependents should not be permitted to emigrate, he shall record on the copies of the roll a remark to this effect, stating his reasons.
- (4) If the Magistrate feels any doubt as to the alleged relationship of any dependent, he may make further inquiry and call for further evidence before recording his orders on the roll.
- (5) One copy of the roll shall after check under sub-rule (1) and after such amendments as are necessary be filed in the office of the Magistrate, and the remaining two copies handed to the Emigration Agent for submission to the Protector at the port of embarkation and the Emigration Commissioner.
- 25. No person rejected under rule 24 (3) shall be permitted to emigrate, and every person so rejected shall, with his dependents, if any, be returned to his home, at the expense of the Emigration Agent.
- 26. (1) Any person desiring to emigrate and claiming to be exempted from the provisions of the Act and these rules relating to emigrants may appear before a Magistrate with evidence, oral or documentary, that he is not an "emigrant" within the meaning of section 2 (b) (i.) or 2 (b) (ii.) of the Act

Inspection of and visits to places of accommodation

Operations not to be extended to pilgrim centres. Persons below the age of eighteen years and women unaccompanied by a relative not to emigrate.

Restriction on emigration of single men.

Production of emigrants before Magistrates.

Magistrate to check nominal roll.

Rejected emigrants.

(as the case may be) together with (in the case of a person claiming to be so exempted on the ground that he has already resided in the country to which he is desirous of emigrating) documentary evidence of his identity purporting to be attested by a Magistrate in such country.

(2) The Magistrate, after such inquiry as he thinks necessary, shall, if satisfied that the applicant is not an "emigrant" to such country within the meaning of section 2 (b) (i.) or (ii.), as the case may be, grant him a certificate to that effect and shall endorse the documentary evidence of identity (where such

is produced).

(3) A certificate granted by a Magistrate and the documentary evidence of identity endorsed by the Magistrate under sub-rule (2) shall, if produced before any Magistrate, authority, or officer acting under this Act, not later than six months after the granting thereof, be conclusive proof that the person named therein is not an "emigrant" to the country specified therein within the meaning of the Act.

VI.—Conveyance of Emigrants to the Port of Embarkation.

Despatch of persons permitted to emigrate.

Competent person to accompany emigrants to port of embarkation.

- 27. Every person permitted to emigrate under the Act or these rules must be conveyed with all convenient despatch, by or under the orders of the Emigration Agent to the place of accommodation established under rule 30.
- 28. (1) When an emigrant has been examined under rule 24 at a place beyond the limits of the port of embarkation, he must while proceeding to the port be accompanied throughout the journey either by the Emigration Agent himself or by a competent person appointed in that behalf by the Emigration
- (2) The Emigration Agent or the person so appointed shall, throughout the journey, provide the emigrant with proper and sufficient food and lodging, if necessary.

VII.—Non-recruited Emigrants.

Non-recruited emigrants.

- 29. (1) Persons who desire to obtain assisted passages, but do not desire the assistance of Emigration Agents, may apply direct to the Emigration Commissioner of the country to which they wish to proceed. The application shall be accompanied by a certificate in form No. 3 in the schedule from a local Magistrate.
- (2) If the Emigration Commissioner agrees to grant assisted passages to any persons applying to him under sub-rule (1), they may be assisted to proceed to the place of accommodation established under rule 17, and shall be dealt with thereafter in the same manner as persons assisted to emigrate by Emigration Agents.

VIII.—Places of Accommodation at the Port of Embarkation.

Places of accommodation at port of

embarkation.

Place to be licensed.

Cancellation of

Report of arrival of emigrants.

Inspection by Protector and Medical Inspector.

Appointment of resident medical officer.

Site, &c., should be subject to the approval of the Medical Inspector. Inspections of and visits to places of accommodation.

30. Every Emigration Commissioner shall establish at every port for which he is appointed or any other convenient locality approved by the Local Government a suitable place of accommodation for the reception and lodging of emigrants before embarkation for the country for which he is Emigration Commissioner, and shall provide all necessary food and clothing for all emigrants during their stay at the place.

31. A place of accommodation established under the preceding rule shall not be used for the reception and lodging of emigrants until it has been inspected and approved by the Protector and the Medical Inspector, and a license for its use has been granted by the Protector in the form No. 4 in the schedule.

The Protector may at any time cancel a license granted under rule 31-

(a) If he considers that the place licensed has become unhealthy, or has in any respect become unsuitable for the accommodation of emigrants; or

If the Emigration Commissioner failed, after reasonable notice, to comply with any of the requirements of these rules in respect of such place.

- 33. The arrival at the place established under rule 30 of each emigrant shall immediately be reported by the person in charge to the Emigration Commissioner who shall submit a weekly return of such arrivals to the Protector.
- (1) The Protector and the Medical Inspector shall, from time to time, and at least once in every week during which any emigrants may be kept in any place, inspect the emigrants and examine the state of such place, and the manner in which the emigrants therein are lodged, fed, clothed, and otherwise provided for and attended to.

(2) The Protector and the Medical Inspector shall, in their inspection and supervision of the places, comply with the directions framed for their guidance by the Local Government.

- 35. A resident medical officer, approved by the Medical Inspector, shall be appointed for each place of accommodation established under rule 30 by the Emigration Commissioner, and his name shall be registered in the Protector's office. He shall keep a hospital register in form No. 5 in the schedule and shall place it before that officer when he visits the place. The Emigration Commissioner may appoint any additional medical officer with the approval of the Protector.
- 36. The site of every place of accommodation established under rule 30, and the disposition and construction of the sheds appertaining thereto shall, from a sanitary point of view, be subject to the approval of the Medical Inspector who shall, if he approves the same, furnish the Protector with a certificate of such approval.

(1) Every place of accommodation established under rule 30 shall be open to inspection by any non-official persons whom the Local Government may appoint for the purpose.

(2) A visitors' book shall be kept in each place of accommodation in which the Protector and Medical Inspector and any non-official visitors visiting the place under sub-rule (1) shall enter the dates

of their visits, and may make any such suggestions or remarks as they deem advisable.

(3) Friends and relations of emi-rants shall also be permitted to visit the place of accommodation and shall be free to converted. and shall be free to converse with and induce any emigrants to return to their homes.

The Emigration Commissioner shall reside or shall depute a restablished under reside within or in some place immediately adjoining every place of accommodation, established under rule 30, with a view to the exercise of immediate and efficient control over subordinates, and to the prevention of irregularities.

Residence of Emigration Commissioner in or near place of accommodation.

The Emigration Commissioner shall cause registers for every place of accommodation 39. established under rule 30 to be kept in forms Nos. 6 and 7 in the schedule, and the entries therein to be punctually, legibly and accurately made. An annual return of accommodation and a monthly-return of sickness in such place shall likewise be prepared respectively in forms Nos. 8 and 9 in the scheelule, and shall be forwa ded by the Emirration Commissioner to the office of the Protector. A weekly hospital report in form No. 10 in the chedule shall also be furnished by the Emigration Commissioner to the Medical Inspector.

Registers to be maintained and returns to be submitted.

40. (1) In the event of cholera, smallpox or other communicable disease appearing in a place of accommodation established under rule 30, every emigrant or dependent attacked shall be sent to an outside hospital for treatment; and the relatives of the affected person, if any, not accompanying the patient and all contacts shall at the same time be placed in a segregation shed situated in an isolated part of the premises; and shall not be permitted to move or be removed thence without the written permission of the resident Medical Officer appointed under rule 35.

Procedure on occurrence of contagious diseases.

(2) Relatives accompanying an affected person to an outside hospital shall be provided with

Report of casualties.

either food or a subsistence allowance.

The removal of any emigrant from the register kept in form No. 6 for any cause other than embarkation, or any death or other casualty shall be reported in form No. 11 in the schedule to the Protector on the following day; and any death from whatsoever cause shall be reported to the Medical Inspector before noon on the following day.

Deaths.

42. (1) In the case of the death of an emigrant before embarkation, the Emig ation Commissioner shall make a correct invento y of the property of each emigrant in a register to be kept in form No. 6 in the schedule and shall forward such property, with the exception of foul clothing which shall be burnt, together with a descriptive list of them to the office of the Protector for disposal.

(2) The Emi ration Commissioner shall also notify the death to each of the successors designated in column 14 of form No. 6.

(3) Caims made by relatives shall also be communicated to the Protector who shall, after making inquiry as to heirs, dispose of the estate as circumstances may render necessary,

IX. - Examination before Embarkation.

A nominal roll in duplicate of all emigrants who are about to embark shall be prepared in form No. 12 in the schedule and s ecial care shall be taken by or under the direction of the Emigration Commissioner that the ent ies therein are correctly and legibly written.

Nominal roll of emigrants about to embark.

(1) Emigrants before leaving the place of accommodation established under rule 30 shall be carefully identified with the entries in the nominal roll prescribed by rule 43 and examined as to their fitness to undertake the voyage by the Medical Inspector, who shall make over the nominal roll with the re ort of his inspection to the Protector.

before embarka

(2) The Protector shall examine the emigrants and shall refuse permission to an emigrant to leave the country on any of the following grounds:-

- (i.) If the Medical Inspector reports that he is unfit to undertake the journey to the country to which he or the person on whom he is dependent, as the case may be, has agreed to emigrate;
- (ii.) If the provisions of the Act or of these rules have not been strictly observed or have been in any way contravened; or
- (iii.) If he appears not to have understood the conditions on which he is proceeding, and such conditions being adequately explained to him is unwilling to embark.
- 45. (1) The Protector shall state on each copy of the nominal roll prescribed by rule 43 whether each emigrant is permitted to embark or is refused permission, recording briefly his reasons in the case of refusal.

(2) One copy of the nominal roll shall be recorded in the office of the Protector and the other

copy made over to the Emigration Commissioner for record in his office.

- No emigrant shall be allowed to embark until three days have elapsed from the date of his arrival at the place of accommodation established under rule 30.
- 47. Emigrants who are refused permission to embark by the Protector under rule 44 (2) (i.) on account of temporary physical unfitness to undertake the voyage, shall, if the Medical Inspector so recommends, be maintained in the place of accommodation until permitted by the Protector to proceed. Any relative of the detained emigrant who wishes to remain with him in the place of accommodation shall also be maintained in it and, if an emigrant, not forced to embark.
- 48. Emigrants who are not permitted by the Protector to embark on account of permanent unfitness to undertake the voyage and other persons rejected on the grounds specified in rule 44 (2) (ii.) and (iii.) shall, togethe with their dependents, if any, be returned through the Protector's office to the villages from which they came at the expense of the Emigration Commissioner.
- All emigrants rejected shall be examined by the Medical Inspector on the day on which they are to be returned to their districts, and only those that are certified by him to be able to travel shall be allowed to return at the expense of the Emigration Commissioner. The rest shall be supported in the place of accommodation and be there treated until the Medical Inspector certifies to their being in a fit state of health to undertake the journey to the place from which they were brought.
- A fee shall be levied for each emigrant permitted by the Protector to embark at such rate as may from time to time be fixed by the Governor-General in Council. This fee shall not in any case be payable by or recoverable from the emigrant, but shall be paid by the Emigration Agent or the Emigration Commissioner.

Examination tion.

Recording of Protector's orders.

Emigrant not to embark for three days, Detention of emigrant regarding whom any question has been raised.

Disposal of rejected emigrants.

Fee to be charged for emigrants permitted to embark.

X .- Returned Emigrants.

51. (1) Returned emigrants shall on their arrival at the port of disembarkation be accommodated in the place of accommodation appointed by the Emigration Commissioner on that behalf, where they shall be properly lodged and provided for until the Emigration Commissioner is in a position to arrange for their departure to their homes.

Lodging of returned. emigrants.

(2) The Emigration Commissioner shall prepare in the form No. 13 in the schedule a list of the sick and helpless returned emigrants, and after the Medical Inspector has endorsed his remarks thereon shall forward it to the Protector.

Treatment of sick returned emigrants.

52. Sick returned emigrants, unless unwilling, shall be treated in the hospital in the place of accommodation appointed under rule 51 (1) or in any other hospital according to circumstances; and on their discharge from hospital, shall be dealt with like other returned emigrants who need no medical treatment.

Despatch of returned emigrants to their homes.

53. Returned emigrants shall, if they desire it, and if the terms on which they emigrated entitle them to be so returned, be returned to their native districts at the expense of the country concerned. Such returned emigrants as are considered by the Medical Inspector to be physically or mentally helpless, shall be so returned by the Emigration Commissioner under proper escort.

Payment of deposits made in the Colony by returned emigrants.

- 54. (1) If any returned emigrants are known to have deposited money for transmission to India through the Government of the country from which they have returned, the Emigration Commissioner shall without delay make payment to them in Indian money, at the correct prevailing rate of exchange at the port of disembarkation of the equivalents of the amounts so deposited. Should any such emigrants so desire, the Emigration Commissioner shall assist them to obtain postal money orders payable to themselves at any post office they may name, in place of notes or silver, which they should be discouraged from carrying about with them,
- (2) The amounts payable in the cases of emigrants who may have died on the voyage, together with any unclaimed property left by such emigrants, shall be forwarded by the Emigration Commissioner to the Protector for disposal in such manner as may be prescribed by the Local Government.

Report to Protector of deaths during the voyage.

55. The Emigration Commissioner shall report to the Protector of Emigrants, with reference to each batch of returning emigrants, the number of such emigrants which embarked from the country and the number, if any, which died during the voyage to the port of disembarkation.

XI.—Agents appointed under Section 7 of the Act.

Agents
appointed under section. 7.

- 56. (1) The Agents appointed under section 7 of the Act shall be generally responsible for the welfare of the emigrants and for carrying out the purposes of the Act.
- (2) They shall obtain information on any matters affecting the welfare and status of Indians in the countries in which such agents are employed and communicate it to the Government of India.
- (3) They shall prepare and submit annual reports, in such form as may be prescribed, regarding the condition of Indians in the country in which they are located.
- (4) They shall protect and advice, as far as possible, all classes of Indian emigrants within their charge and bring their requirements to the notice of the proper authorities in India or in the country to which they are accredited.
- (5) They shall, in the case of countries to which the emigration of unskilled labourers is permitted under section 10 of the Act, inspect on arrival every ship specially chartered for conveying emigrants, maintain registers of the Indians arriving in and departing from the country, visit places where the Indians work and reside, and satisfy themselves that the conditions on which emigration is permitted are being strictly observed.
 - (6) They shall be directly subordinate to the Government of India.
- (7) In carrying out the above duties an agent shall act in co-operation with the Immigration Department of the Government of the country in which he is employed.

PART II.

RULES FOR SKILLED LABOUR.

Application for permission to engage or assist persons to emigrate under section 16.

Certificate to be granted by Protector to the applicant

- 57. Every application under section 16 of the Act for permission to engage, or to assist any person or persons to emigrate for the purpose of skilled work shall, besides furnishing information required on the various points referred to therein, show clearly and fully the name of the applicant, his father's name, the place of his residence, and his occupation or profession.
- 58. Where the permission applied for is granted by the Local Government, it shall forward to the Protector at the port from which the intending emigrants are to embark, a copy of the application and the order of permission passed thereon under section 17 of the Act.
- 59. The Protector shall, if the Local Government so directs, give to every person permitted to engage, or assist, any person to emigrate under the provisions of Chapter IV. of the Act a certificate in form No. 14 in the schedule.

Before giving such certificate the Protector shall satisfy himself that every emigrant has been supplied by the recruiting agency with a written statement explaining the terms of his employment and the general conditions of life obtaining in the country to which the emigrant intends to proceed.

Register of complaints to be maintained by Protector 60. The Protector shall maintain a register of complaints received by him from emigrants registered by him under section 18 of the Act, whether made during their absence from India or after their return, and shall record briefly the results of any investigation made by him and the action taken. The register shall be maintained in form No. 15 in the schedule.

SCHEDULE A.

- 23. If the majority of cattle owners decides that any grazing ground should be cleared and fenced or a ditch cut and ponds constructed, the Government Agent shall direct the same to be done by the joint labour of all the proprietors of cattle ordinarily grazing on such ground, the liability being in proprtion to the number of animals over one year old belonging to each owner. If the land is not fenced, cattle owners using the communal pasture should be required to tend or to tether their cattle.
- 23 A. All details as to gateways, time of repairing fences, herding and enclosing cattle, &c., are to be arranged by the Village Committee and published in the village or villages by beat of tom-tom.
- 26. No person shall do any wilful injury to waste or other land set apart for the common pasturage of cattle or for any other common purpose, or obstruct any gateway, or befoul or poison any pond.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 26, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 130 (1 European, 19 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 16 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 27 · 4, as against 25 · 1 in the preceding week, 29 · 0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32 · 8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 152 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 37 Tamils, 20 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32·0, as against 27·8 in the previous week, 30·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 152 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the prevoius year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—I. (a) Twenty-three from Pneumonia were registered, 10 in Maradana Hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's, and Maradana North, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 20 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Five deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 4 in the previous week.
- (c) Two deaths from Influenza were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana North, as against 4 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana Hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Maradana South, as against 11 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.
 - (b) Five deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama Hospital from Phthisis during the week.
- 3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 each in Maradana Hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident and Wellawatta North, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Kotahena South, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 5. Eleven deaths were registered from Debility, 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 6 from Enteritis, 4 each from Diarrhæa and Worms, 2 from Dysentery, 1 each from Tetanus and Puerperal Septicæmia, and 65 from Other Causes.
- 6. Ten cases of Enteric Fever, 7 of Chickenpox, 4 of Measles, 1 of Smallpox, and 1 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 9, 7, 3, nil and nil respectively of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 50·5°, against 81·5° in the preceding week and 82·1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·829 in. against 29·849 in. in the preceding week and 29·878in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·54 in., against 0·47 in. in the preceding week and 1·04 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Improvements in the process of manufacturing tea and apparatus therefor. -The applicants state that the usual process of manufacturing tea consists in subjecting the leaves to the following treatment in the order given, namely, withering, rolling, fermenting, drying, cutting, and sorting: during the rolling the leaf cells are broken and their contents distributed over the surface of the leaf, where they ultimately form a dark, hard and brittle layer: during the subsequent cutting and sorting, much of this valuable material is lost in the form of dust. To obviate this loss they propose to partially roll the withered leaves and then pass them into a ball breaker and sifting machine in order to separate the larger leaves from the small. The former are then cut while still moist and returned together with the samll leaves to the roller for further treatment and are afterwards fermented and dried. In order to cut the still moist leaves a cutting machine is described comprising a vibrating hopper feed together with a comb and cutting teeth.

The claims are:

- In improvement in the process of manufacturing tea which consists in cutting or breaking the leaf at a stage in the manufacture at which the juices expressed from the leaf have not yet had time to dry or harden on the outside of the
- An improvement in the process of manufacturing tea according to claim 1, which consists in withering the leaf. placing the same in a rolling machine but before the rolling process is complete passing the leaf through a cutting or breaking machine and then returning the same to the rolling machine.
- An improvement in the process of manufacturing tea according to claim 2 in which the leaf when first removed from the rolling machine is placed into a ball breaking and/or sifting machine for the purpose of breaking up the balls and/ or sifting the larger leaf from the smaller, the small leaf which does not require cutting being returned to the rolling machine and the larger leaf being passed through a cutting or breaking machine and then likewise returned to the rolling machine.
- An improvement in the process of manufacturing tea according to any of the preceding claims the tea being cut while still in a moist condition or in a soft state.
- 5. An improvement in the process of manufacturing tea which consists in the tea being cut to size when the rolling process is only partially complete.
- An improvement in the process of manufacturing tea according to any of the preceding claims, which consists in the tea being cut in a cutting machine of the kind herein described having a vibrating hopper feed.
- A process of manufacturing tea in which the tea is withered, partially rolled, sifted and the balls broken up and 7. A process of manufacturing to a manufacturing to the rolling machine and after rolling being then cut while in a soft condition, the leaf being subsequently returned to the rolling machine and after rolling being fermented and dried and sorted as may be found desirable.

- 8. A process of manufacturing tea in which the tea having been either sorted or cut in a soft state does not require cutting; breaking, or excessive handling when in the hard dry state whereby the chipping and breaking of the leaf and the loss or dried juice therefrom is avoided.
- 9. In apparatus for cutting undried tea the combination of a comb and cutting teeth with a feed hopper having a vibrating side or sides.
- 10. An apparatus for cutting undried tea comprising a comb, cutting teeth co-acting with said comb and a hopper with a vibrating side, the latter being driven by cams eccentrics or the equivalent mounted on a shaft driven preferably by gearing from the shaft upon which the drum or the like carrying the cutting teeth is mounted.

Improvements in internal combustion engines relating to means for adjusting the instant of explosion in the cycle.

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is described in the claims as follows:—

- 1. In internal combustion engines, means for adjusting the instant of explosion in the cycle, consisting in an adjustable flanged coupling joining two lengths of the shaft or spindle that transmits rotary or oscillatory motion from a principal rotating or oscillating member of the prime mover to its ignition apparatus, in which the periphery of one flange of the said coupling is prepared as a worm wheel and the periphery of the other flange is prepared with bearings which carry a worm pinion engaging with the said worm wheel.
 - 2. In internal combustion engines, means for adjusting the instant of explosion in the cycle, consisting in a flanged coupling through which is transmitted rotary or oscillatory motion to the ignition apparatus, characterized in that the motion is transmitted through the teeth of a worm wheel and pinion.
 - 3. In internal combustion engines, means for adjusting the instant of explosion in the cycle, consisting in a flanged coupling through which is transmitted rotary or oscillatory motion to the ignition apparatus, characterized in that a worm pinion is rotatably mounted in the periphery of one flange and engages teeth cut in the periphery of the other flange, so that relative rotation of the flanges can be made when required.
