WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) and various Orders amending the said Order, and it is expedient that the said Order should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

1. Paragraph (vi.) of Article one of the principal Order shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if at the end of the said paragraph there were inserted the words “ unless a sealed copy of an award of the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal constituted under Section VI. of Part IX. of the Treaty to the effect that such claim, debt, or compensation is due, has been lodged with the Administrator.”

2. After sub-paragraph (ee) of paragraph (ii.) of Article one of the principal Order as amended, there shall be inserted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(ee) Where the Administrator has seized any property, right, or interest which appeared to him to be subject to the charge, no proceedings for the recovery of such property, right, or interest or the proceeds thereof or for any loss or damage arising from the seizure or disposal thereof commenced after the expiration of four months from the date of the seizure of the property, right, or interest, shall be entertained by any Court other than proceedings against the Administrator for negligence in respect of such seizure or disposal.

3. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) (Amendment) Order, 1922, and the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1921, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1922.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon has either before or after passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coast of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislature of that Possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light Dues) to be paid in respect of that lighthouse, buoy, or beacon by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminish, or repeal such dues, and those dues shall from the time mentioned in the Order be leviable throughout His Majesty's Dominions, and further that Colonial Light Dues shall not be levied in any British Possession unless the Legislature of that Possession has, by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly passed signified its opinion that the dues ought to be levied:

And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are lighthouses which have been duly erected under and pursuant to the said section:

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883, the 9th day of May, 1892, the 29th day of June, 1896, the 10th day of August, 1903, and the 21st day of October, 1912, the dues leviable in respect of the said lighthouses for the classes of ships therein respectively mentioned were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 6th day of February, 1917, His Majesty directed that, as from the 1st day of April, 1917, or from the time of the receipt of notice of that Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect light dues, the dues thenceforth to be levied should be as follows: that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-eighths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-eighth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said lights respectively:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said dues should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers so vested in Him by the above recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth by this Order in Council order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the 1st day of October, 1922, or from the time of the receipt of this Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect light dues, the dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows: that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-eighths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-eighth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said lights respectively, subject in each case to a reduction of 25 per cent.

Where a pail latrine has been provided for the use of a building it shall be incumbent on the occupant to provide a suitable bucket or buckets therefor, to register his name at the Local Board Office, and to pay the Board the sum of Re. 1.50 per mensem as fee for the conservancy of the latrine, unless the owner has by written agreement with the occupant taken upon himself the duties mentioned above. Where latrines are built to serve a set of tenements in common the above duties shall fall on the owner.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 2, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 118 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 24·8, as against 27·4 in the preceding week, 27·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 123 (3 Europeans, 2 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·9, as against 32·0 in the previous week, 28·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 123 total deaths, 22 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents); 3 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 23 in the previous week, and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, as against 2 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week.

2. (a) Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 12 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Worms*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 each from *Dysentery*, and *Tetanus*, and 54 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eight cases of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Chickenpox*, 3 of *Plague*, and 2 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 10, 7, 1, and 4 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·8°, against 80·5° in the preceding week, and 81·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·862 in., against 29·829 in. in the preceding week, and 29·917 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·07 in., against 0·54 in. in the preceding week, and 0·67 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

No. 1,911 of March 31, 1922 (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance, December 7, 1921.)

Charles Edward Bradley and Joseph George Coffin.

"Improved process and apparatus for treating rubber latex and similar material."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a process and apparatus for treating latex in which the latex is fed on to the centre of a rapidly rotating disc, whereby it is thrown out radially in the form of small drops: this process takes place in a closed chamber in the upper part of which, above the disc is a perforated partition: hot drying gas enters above the partition and moving down with the finely comminuted latex serves to dry it. The small dry particles of rubber are then compressed.

The claims are :—

1. A process for treating rubber latex and the like by drying the same in the form of comminuted particles, thereby characterized that the latex is comminuted by feeding it on to a moving surface adapted to discharge the latex therefrom as a series of particles.
 2. A process as claimed in claim 1, in which the latex is discharged from the moving surface as a series of comparatively uniform size particles.
 3. A process as claimed in claim 1 or 2, in which the moving surface is provided by a disc rotating at high speed, the latex being fed centrally, and discharged from the edge of the disc.
 4. A process as claimed in claim 3, in which the disc is operated in such a manner that the latex particles are discharged as a curtain of spray and range in size from a unit diameter to approximately ten times the unit diameter.
 5. A process as claimed in any of claims 1–3, in which the particles are evenly distributed in a heated drying gas.
 6. A process as claimed in claim 5, in which the temperature of the drying gas is above 240° F.
 7. A process as claimed in claim 5 or 6, in which a slowly moving current of drying gas is employed.
 8. A process as claimed in claim 7, in which the drying medium flows in the same direction as the latex spray.
 9. A process as claimed in claim 7, in which the latex is discharged radially and horizontally into a downwardly moving current of the heated gas.
 10. Apparatus for carrying out the process claimed in claims 1–9, comprising a rotatable disc adapted to comminute the latex, combined with means for delivering a film of latex centrally on to said disc, and means co-operating with the disc for varying the thickness of said film.
 11. Apparatus as claimed in claim 10, in which the latex delivering means comprises a latex chamber with a circular wall terminating adjacent the disc, and an adjustable wall concentric therewith and coacting with the disc to form an outlet of adjustable delivery.
 12. Apparatus as claimed in claim 11, having heat insulation for the latex chamber.
 13. An apparatus for carrying out the process of claim 1, comprising a drying chamber, means at the top thereof for variably distributing a current of a heated gaseous medium downwardly in said chamber, means including a movable latex comminuting surface for evenly distributing finely divided particles of latex transversely of said current, and an exhaust opening adjacent the opposite end of the chamber.
 14. An apparatus as claimed in claim 10, 11, 12, or 13, in which the latex comminuting surface is a disc disposed below the top of the chamber centrally thereof.
 15. An apparatus as claimed in any of claims 10–14, comprising means for supplying water at will to the disc.
 16. An apparatus as claimed in claim 13, 14, or 15, in which the chamber is of gradually enlarged shape towards its bottom, and has a bottom wall spaced from the side wall to provide an outlet, an outer concentric wall spaced from said outlet and a wall partly covering the space enclosed by said outer wall to provide the exhaust opening.
 17. An apparatus as claimed in claim 16, comprising a perforated partition extending across the upper part of the chamber and below the top thereof, the heated gaseous medium being delivered to the space above the partition, and the latex delivery disc disposed below the partition.
 18. An apparatus as claimed in any of claims 10–17, comprising means for causing the deposition of substantially all of the dried particles on a predetermined collecting surface.
 19. An apparatus as claimed in claim 17, in which the partition includes a series of removable perforated plates.
 20. In apparatus for carrying out the process claimed in claims 1–9, a furnace for supplying the drying medium comprising a combustion chamber, a mixing chamber, a passage connecting the two, an inlet for a diluent to the mixing chamber, and means for exhausting mixed combustion products and diluent from the mixing chamber.
 21. A furnace as claimed in claim 20, in which the inlet for the diluent and the outlet for the mixture are at opposite ends for the mixing chamber, and the delivery from the combustion chamber located between said ends.
 22. A furnace as claimed in claim 21, comprising means for regulating the supply of air to the combustion chamber, and means for controlling the inlet and outlet of the mixing chamber.
 23. A furnace as claimed in claims 20–22, equipped for burning fluid fuel and having a screen disposed in the inlet passage of the mixing chamber.
 24. Rubber derived from latex discharged from a moving surface as a series of particles, dried and compressed to form crude rubber.
 25. Crude rubber when made by the process, substantially as herein described.
 26. The process for making crude rubber from latex, substantially as described.
 27. The complete apparatus for treating rubber latex substantially as described, or substantially as illustrated in the accompanying drawings.

No. 1,913 of April 11, 1922 (Date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance, April 22, 1921.)

Ernest Hopkinson.

“Improvements in processes for the production of fabrications of rubber and filamentary material, and products obtained therefrom.”

Abstract.—The applicant describes a process in which a number of parallel threads are passed through a bath of rubber latex and then over drying drums whereby water is evaporated, a roll of some material, such as sateen, is fed on to the drums at the same time to prevent the threads adhering to the drums. In the fabric so produced the parallel threads adhere to one another laterally and form a continuous surface. The material can be vulcanized. If desired the threads can be passed through the latex a second time, or can be subjected to vacuum during the treatment. A skim-coating of rubber can be applied to the fabrication.

The claims are :—

1. A process for producing fabrications of rubber and filamentary materials, which comprises applying a water emulsion of rubber or the like to the material, and drying the resulting product.
2. A process as claimed in claim 1, in which the emulsion used is a latex.
3. A process as claimed in claim 1 or 2, in which the material treated consists of one or more unwoven warp-like elements, for example, cords.
4. The process claimed in claim 3, applied to the manufacture of sheets of rubberized cords.
5. A process as claimed in claim 1 or 2, in which the material treated includes thread, fabric, or the like.
6. A process as claimed in claim 4, in which latex is applied to a series of unwoven parallel cords, each cord touching its adjacent cord.
7. A process as claimed in any of the preceding claims, in which the rubber or the like is applied by immersing the filamentary material in the emulsion.
8. A process as claimed in any of claims 1–7, in which the drying is effected by passing the treated material over a series of dry cans.

9. A process as claimed in any of claims 1-8, which comprises applying a vacuum to the filamentary material, the latex or the like being applied to the evacuated filaments.
10. A process as claimed in any of claims 1-9, in which the drying is effected while the latex-treated material is in contact with a liner serving as a carrier member for said material.
11. A process as claimed in any of claims 4-10, in which a number of cord elements after treatment are caused to adhere to form a sheet.
12. A process as claimed in any of claims 1-11, in which a coagulation preventing material is added to the latex employed.
13. A process as claimed in any of claims 1-12, in which a vulcanizing material is added to the emulsion or latex.
14. A process as claimed in any of claims 1-12, in which a vulcanizing agent is applied after treatment of the filamentary material.
15. A process as claimed in any of claims 1-14, in which the dried material is vulcanized.
16. A process as claimed in claim 15, in which an additional application of rubber is made to the material before vulcanization.
17. A process as claimed in claim 16, in which the additional layer is of crude rubber containing a vulcanizing agent.
18. A fabrication of rubberized material which comprises filamentary material (for example, one or more than one unwoven warp-like element), and dried rubber applied thereto as latex.
19. A fabrication as claimed in claims 18, which comprises a sheet of unwoven cords treated with latex and dried.
20. A fabrication as claimed in claim 18 or 19, in which the elements or cords are parallel, adjacent, and in contact with one another.
21. A fabrication as claimed in claim 19 or 20, attached to a liner sheet.
22. A fabrication as claimed in claim 18, 19, 20, or 21, provided with a skim-coating of rubber.

"Improvements in the manufacture of rubber-faced paving setts, flooring tiles, and the like."

Abstract.—The applicant states that a rubber face may be fixed to a backing of concrete or the like by moulding on the underside of the said rubber face an undercut tenon along all the edges of it and after vulcanizing filling in the backing of concrete or the like in a mould. The slab of rubber may, if desired, be moulded separately to the ring forming the undercut tenon, and the two then be cemented together.

The claims are:—

1. In the manufacture of rubber-faced paving setts, flooring tiles, and the like, means for fixing the rubber face to the concrete or the like backing of the sett or tile or the like, the said means consisting in an undercut tenon formed on the underside of the rubber face along all the edges of it.
2. In the manufacture of rubber-faced paving setts flooring tiles, and the like, a rubber face formed with the undercut tenon on the underside along all the edges of it as claimed in claim 1, and filling and backing it with Portland cement concrete, or Portland cement and sand, or neat Portland cement or plaster of Paris, or the like for the purpose described.
