**Rules regulating Meetings of the Board of Improvement Commissioners
for Kandy.**

1. The ordinary meetings of the Board shall be held monthly on the third Friday of each month at 4.30 P.M. at the Town Hall, subject to adjournment to any other day and hour as may be agreed upon.
2. The Chairman of the Board shall preside at every meeting; but, in his absence, any other member of the Board, who is chosen by a majority of the members present, shall preside.
3. The Chairman of the Board, or in his absence, the member so chosen shall preserve order and decide on all points or order.
4. It shall be competent for the Chairman to call a special meeting either on his own motion, or, at the request of any two members of the Board.
5. Four members of the Board shall form a quorum at all meetings. But, should a quorum not be present within half an hour of the time appointed for any meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned, if an ordinary meeting, to the day appointed for the next ordinary meeting, or if a special meeting, *sine die*.
6. Any member desirous of asking a question, or, making a motion shall give notice of such question or motion, in writing, at some previous meeting of the Board, or in writing, at least three clear days before the day on which he intends to ask such question, or, make such motion, and deliver to the Secretary a copy thereof.
7. All questions asked and motions made shall be taken up in the order of notice given, unless the Chairman shall decide otherwise. But no motion shall be considered or discussed unless it is seconded.
8. A motion negatived at any meeting shall not be again made except with the consent of the Chairman, and no motion contrary to one passed by the Board, at a previous meeting, shall be entertained except with the consent of the Chairman.
9. Any member presenting a petition or other communication will be held responsible for its contents being throughout respectful, and no document shall be laid before the Board unless the name and address of the drawer be legibly recorded on it.
10. When a petition or other communication is presented, the purport thereof shall be concisely stated, and on the motion of any member, duly seconded, the question shall be put whether or not the document shall be read.
11. The business of the ordinary meetings of the Board shall be conducted in the following order:—
 - (a) The minutes of the former meeting shall be read and confirmed after being, if necessary, corrected;
 - (b) Memorials, petitions, or other communications addressed to the Board shall be laid before the meeting and orders made thereon;
 - (c) The other business shall be considered in the order set down in the order book hereinafter mentioned.
12. All acts of the Board and all questions coming or arising before the Board may be done and decided by the majority of such members of the Board as are present and voting at the meeting. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
13. It shall be the duty of every member present at any meeting to give his vote on any matter on which a poll is demanded.
14. At any meeting, unless a poll is demanded by a member, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried and an entry to that effect in the minute book and order book shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.
15. If a poll is demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Board.
16. The Secretary shall keep an order book in which shall be entered and numbered in succession the subjects to be brought under discussion at each meeting, and he shall serve on each member or leave at his residence, two days at least before each meeting, a notice containing the order of the day copied from the order book.
17. The Secretary shall keep a book to be called the minute book, in which shall be recorded the proceedings of the Board, during each meeting.
18. The Secretary shall at each meeting of the Board lay on the table all reports made to the Chairman, and notes of any action taken thereon by the Chairman since the last previous meeting of the Board.
19. The proceedings of the Board shall not be open to the public.

Order of His Excellency the Governor regarding the Disposal of the Surplus Proceeds of the Liquidation of Enemy Firms, under Section 7 of Ordinance No. 20 of 1916.

WHEREAS by section 7 of "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916," it is provided that on completion of any liquidation the liquidator shall pay all the surplus proceeds realized thereby to the Custodian of Enemy Property, and that all sums so paid to such Custodian shall be held by him at the disposal of the Governor :

Now, therefore, We, Sir William Henry Manning, Governor, hereby order and direct as follows :—

1. The expression "enemy assets" in this order means all money paid or to be paid over as surplus proceeds of a liquidation to the Custodian of Enemy Property by a liquidator appointed under "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916," on completion of such liquidation or on completion subject to any pending matter or matters as provided for by sections 29 and 30 of "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916."

2. Except so far as may have been otherwise directed by the Governor, enemy assets shall be and shall become subject as from the date of coming into force of this order, to the provisions of the Order in Council made or to be made under the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, or the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, and to the charges created thereunder in the same way and to the same extent as they would be so subject if they had been held at the dates of the coming into force of the respective Treaties of Peace with Germany, Austria, Bulgaria, and Hungary, on behalf of the persons who were or would but for the same having been vested in liquidators and paid over to the Custodian have been then entitled thereto :

Provided that nothing in these orders or herein shall operate to require any enemy assets which have been or shall be released from the charges thereby respectively established to be credited or accounted for to an *ex-enemy* Government.

3. All enemy assets shall be subject to deduction of the costs, charges, and expenses of the said Custodian, including any fee fixed by an order of the Governor in Executive Council, under section 37 of the said Ordinance.

4. Nothing herein contained shall prejudice or affect any claim on behalf of His Majesty or the Ceylon Government in respect of death duties or other revenue, charge, or impost against enemy assets or the owners or former owners thereof, and the said Custodian shall have power to settle, agree, and out of the appropriate enemy assets pay or provide for, any such claim.

5. This order shall take effect from the date hereof.

Description of Work, &c.

(b) Any tree pointed out by a Forest Officer as one to be felled for posts, &c., shall without question be felled, and any tree pointed out or marked by a Forest Officer as not to be felled shall not be felled or injured.

(c) The contractor will be responsible for the safety of posts, &c., stacked in the forest and in transit.

(d) The contractor may be required at times to increase supplies should the depôt requirements necessitate, and at times also to decrease supplies, but the average output will be as described in the schedule.

Schedule.

1. To fell with saw or saw and axe combined 900 posts, 2,400 poles (parala or pachchus), 24,000 poles (warichchies), in Kandapola fuel blocks.

(i.) Size of posts: length 10½ ft. to 15 ft., girth 1 ft. 3 in. to 1 ft. 6 in.

(ii.) Size of poles: (parala or pachchus), length 10 ft. 6 in. to 12 ft., girth 8 in. to 10 in.

(iii.) Warichchies.

Species: Damba, Mihiriya, Galweralu, Kududawala, Kurundu, Matawara, Aridda, Labu, and Madol.

2. The distance to depôt, 4½ miles.

3. The posts, poles (parala), poles (warichchies), to be brought and delivered to the Nuwara Eliya Depôt-keeper and stacked in such a manner as he directs.

4. The work shall commence from October 1, 1922, and the minimum monthly supply shall be 75 posts, 200 poles (parala or pachchus) and 2,000 poles (warichchies) delivered to the Depôt-keeper at Nuwara Eliya Depôt. Final delivery to be made on or before September 15, 1923, when the balance remaining out of the total quantity shall be delivered.

5. Failure to deliver the specified monthly supply will entail a penalty of Rs. 10, plus Re. 1 for every 50 posts, poles (parala or pachchus), and poles (warichchies) short delivery.

6. Rejected posts, poles (parala or pachchus), poles (warichchies) will not be paid for and they will lapse to Government. The contractor will have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

7. Payments may be made by the Assistant Conservator of Forests on production of a receipt from the Depôt-keeper showing the number of posts, poles (parala or pachchus), poles (warichchies) accepted by him.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 9, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 117 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 13 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 24·6, as against 24·8 in the preceding week, 59·4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32·8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 113 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 19 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·8, as against 25·9 in the previous week, 30·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 113 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 22 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana North, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 5.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in New Bazaar, same as in the previous week.

2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in St. Paul's and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in Pettah and Kotahena North, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Nine deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Debility*, 5 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Enteritis*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 39 from *Other Causes*.

6. Nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric fever*, 3 of *Measles*, 2 of *Plague*, and 1 of *Smallpox* were reported during the week, as against 4, 8, 2, 3, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·4°, as against 80·8° in the preceding week and 82·4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·879 in., against 29·862 in. in the preceding week and 29·950 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·71 in., against 0·07 in. in the preceding week and 0·05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

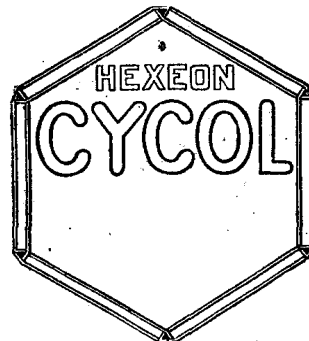
