SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

By-laws for Cattle Markets.

1. No market for the sale of cattle, buffaloes, sheep, or goats shall be held within the Municipal limits of Colombo without the sanction of the Chairman, except at licensed markets, or at markets established by the Municipal Council, and in such manner as may be directed by the Chairman.
2. All animals detained at the cattle market shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of such animals.
3. Owners shall pay the following scale of fees for animals admitted to the cattle market:—
For cattle and buffaloes for each month or part of a month Rs. 3. each.
For sheep and goats for each month or part of a month, cents 50 each.
4. The market for the sale and purchase of animals will be open for a period not exceeding 8 hours every day, except on Sundays and public holidays, and on such other day or days as the Chairman may determine.
5. The hours of the commencement and close of sales shall be fixed by the Chairman from time to time, and notice thereof shall be posted up in the market.
6. The gates of the market will be open for the reception, penning, and tying up of animals at such hours as the Chairman may from time to time determine.
7. No person shall make any unnecessary noise or create any disturbance in the market, and no gambling, swearing, profane, obscene, abusive, or disgusting language or behaviour shall be allowed in the market.
8. Every person taking any animal or animals into the market shall, on entering, give the officer in charge of the market a correct account of the number and description of such animal or animals, and the name of the owner thereof.
9. Every animal shall, on entering the market, be tied up by a chain or rope of sufficient strength, or penned by the owner or person in charge of such animal as and where directed by the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, or other duly authorized person. No person shall be allowed to occupy more space than, in the opinion of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, is necessary. The owner or person in charge of any animal or animals shall not permit such animal or animals to stray or run loose in the market.
10. Every person who shall purchase any animal or animals in the market, and shall re-sell or offer the same for re-sale within the market, shall pay to the officer in charge of the market the amount of dues to which he would have been liable if he had himself brought such animal or animals into the market.
11. No person shall injure the buildings, erections, or fittings of or in the market.
12. No person shall climb over, through, under, or upon any gate, fence, wall, building, pen, or erection within the market.
13. No person shall throw stones or any other thing into or within the market, or in any manner or way foul or improperly use or waste the water in the troughs in the market.
14. Any person contravening or failing to observe any of the foregoing by-laws, shall for each offence and, in addition to any other legal liability, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 20. or, in default of payment, to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding 14 days.

Order of His Excellency the Governor regarding the Disposal of the Surplus Proceeds of the Liquidation of Enemy Firms, under Section 7 of Ordinance No. 20 of 1916.

WHEREAS by section 7 of "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916," it is provided that on completion of any liquidation the liquidator shall pay all the surplus proceeds realized thereby to the Custodian of Enemy Property, and that all sums so paid to such Custodian shall be held by him at the disposal of the Governor :

Now, therefore, We, Sir William Henry Manning, Governor, hereby order and direct as follows :—

1. The expression "enemy assets" in this order means all money paid or to be paid over as surplus proceeds of a liquidation to the Custodian of Enemy Property by a liquidator appointed under "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916," on completion of such liquidation or on completion subject to any pending matter or matters as provided for by sections 29 and 30 of "The Enemy Firms Liquidation Ordinance, No. 20 of 1916."

2. Except so far as may have been otherwise directed by the Governor, enemy assets shall be and shall become subject as from the date of coming into force of this order, to the provisions of the Order in Council made or to be made under the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, or the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, and to the charges created thereunder in the same way and to the same extent as they would be so subject if they had been held at the dates of the coming into force of the respective Treaties of Peace with Germany, Austria, Bulgaria, and Hungary, on behalf of the persons who were or would but for the same having been vested in liquidators and paid over to the Custodian have been then entitled thereto :

Provided that nothing in these orders or herein shall operate to require any enemy assets which have been or shall be released from the charges thereby respectively established to be credited or accounted for to an *ex-enemy* Government.

3. All enemy assets shall be subject to deduction of the costs, charges, and expenses of the said Custodian, including any fee fixed by an order of the Governor in Executive Council, under section 37 of the said Ordinance.

4. Nothing herein contained shall prejudice or affect any claim on behalf of His Majesty or the Ceylon Government in respect of death duties or other revenue, charge, or impost against enemy assets or the owners or former owners thereof, and the said Custodian shall have power to settle, agree, and out of the appropriate enemy assets pay or provide for, any such claim.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 16, 1922.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 126 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 14 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 26.5, as against 24.6 in the preceding week, 65.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 32.8 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 106 (4 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 16 Moors, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.3, as against 23.8 in the previous week, 32.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 106 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals, (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Kollapitiya, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 14.

(b) Two deaths (1 each in Ragama and Kandana) of residents of Colombo town occurred from *Phthisis* during the week.

2. (a) Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 14 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Kollupitiya and 1 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 5.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, as against 1 in the previous week.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospital and Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Ten deaths were registered from *Debility*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea*, *Worms*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 47 from *Other Causes*.

5. Six cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Smallpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, 4 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague*, were reported during the week, as against 9, 1, 5, 3, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.9°, against 81.4° in the preceding week, and 82.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.851 in., against 29.879 in. in the preceding week, and 29.991 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.50 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Paddy: reaping of later pinmari cultivation is over. In some places idapokam cultivation is thriving well. Thrashing of pinmari proper is over.

Dry grain: no crops. Clearing of garden allotments in Bintenna has mostly been completed.

Coconuts: trees are in good condition, except where caterpillar pest prevails. Measures to combat this are in progress, both north and south of Batticaloa. No accurate information is available as to the number of nuts.

Other products: plantain and vegetables are available, but their prices are exorbitant. Market gardening near Kalmunai and elsewhere is on the increase.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 4.80 to Rs. 7.80 per bushel; paddy, Re. 1.80 to Re. 2.40 per bushel; imported

rice, not available; kurakkan, Re. 1.60 to Rs. 3.50 per bushel; maize, Re. 1.50 to Rs. 3 per bushel; coconuts Rs. 6 to Rs. 18 per 100 nuts; salt, 2½ to 5 cents per lb. salt per measure, 25 cents; dried chillies (country), 40 cents

Health of inhabitants: not satisfactory throughout. There were cases of measles, fever, &c. A smallpox epidemic is in progress south of Kalmunai, but shows signs of declining. The mortality has been small owing to vaccination.

Health of cattle: satisfactory.

Conditions of tanks and fisheries: tanks in some places are in good order, but in others some improvements are necessary. Fishing in the sea and lake is progressing, in spite of a scare that worms were found in some of the fish.

Harvest prospects: good.

Weather: hot and dry with occasional showers here and there.

General: nil.

(19) To consider : (a) A report of the Acting City Sanitation Engineer, dated June 27, 1922, with regard to upkeep of sewers; (b) an estimate of Rs. 52,000 under vote M 10, "Upkeep of sewers." (Provision under the vote is Rs. 31,000.) (a) considered; (b) recommended.

Where one land-owner, out of several others in a private street, pays a large amount towards the cost of laying down a water main, the Council should invest the balance sum due on the total cost and undertake the work of laying the main and recover the balance when and if property owners concerned obtained a water service. The Council agreed to this principle being adopted in all similar cases.
