#### BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

##### *Chapter II.*

11. The owner of every house or building abutting on any street, which term shall include pavements, shall, within twenty-one days after notice from the Board to the effect, put up and keep in good condition proper troughs, gutters, and pipes for receiving and carrying the water from the roof and other parts of such house or building, and discharging the same in such a manner as the Chairman, Sanitary Board, shall direct, so that it shall not damage the roadway nor fall upon persons passing along the street. Such gutters shall not be less than 6 inches in diameter, and the down piping not less than 4 inches in diameter, with proper holdfasts, brackets, &c., and as may be directed by the Chairman, and be constructed of such material as the Chairman may approve.

## "THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in him by sub-section (2) of section 44 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898," has been pleased to fix a water-rate of 4 per centum as the rate to be levied on the annual value of all houses, buildings, lands, and tenements within the limits of the town of Matale, in the Central Province, save and except such houses, buildings, lands, and tenements as described in the schedule hereto annexed, with effect from October 1, 1922.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 23, 1922.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 136 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 6 Moors, 8 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1922, viz., 247,642) was 28·6, as against 26·5 in the preceding week, 54·0 in the corresponding week of last year and 32·8 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 119 (6 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 16 Moors, and 6 Malays). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·1, as against 22·3 in the previous week, 32·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 119 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 40 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 7 in the previous week and 17 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, North, same as in the previous week, the weekly average for last year was 5.

2. (a) Eight deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Maradana East, as against 13 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Wellawatta South, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 4 each from *Enteritis* and *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Convulsions*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Worms*, and 59 from *Other Causes*.

6. Six cases of *Enteric Fever*, 5 of *Chickenvpox*, 5 of *Measles*, 3 of *Smallpox*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 5, 6, 4, 5, and 1 respectively of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·8°, against 80·9° in the preceding week and 82·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·882 in., against 29·851 in. in the preceding week and 29·986 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·14 in., against 0·50 in. in the preceding week and 0·09 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## Training Class for the Surveyor-General's License.

**A**N examination for admission to the Training Class for the Surveyor-General's License in Surveying and Levelling will be held at Colombo on Monday, November 27, 1922, and the following days, commencing at 9 A.M.

In order to qualify for admission to the class, candidates must obtain not less than 40 marks per cent. in each subject and 50 marks per cent. in aggregate.

Marks will be deducted for bad handwriting.

4. The number of students admitted to the class is limited to ten.

## Sale of Minor Forest Produce.

**T**HE right to collect the forest produce specified in the appended schedule during the period commencing on October 1, 1922, and ending on September 30, 1923, from the Crown lands situated in the districts specified will be sold by public auction by the Assistant Conservator of Forests of the respective divisions on the dates and at the places mentioned in the said schedule. 2. The right to collect the produce hereby offered for competition shall be exclusive of such privileges as villagers have acquired under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance or by usage for their domestic or village requirements.

3. The highest bidder will be declared the purchaser, subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests, and shall immediately on his being so declared deposit the necessary amounts as hereunder and sign his name in the Register of Sale in admission of such purchase:—

*Bids up to Rs. 100.*

The amount of the bid in full and security Rs. 20 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests.

*Bids over Rs. 100 and up to Rs. 500.*

50 per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 50 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid within 14 days of the approval of sale by the Conservator of Forests.

*Bids over Rs. 500 and up to Rs. 1,000.*

50 per cent. of the bid and security of Rs. 75 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in two monthly instalments within two months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

*Bids over Rs. 1,000.*

50 per cent. of the bid and security Rs. 150 to be deposited immediately on conclusion of the sale pending the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Balance to be paid regularly in three monthly instalments within three months of the date of approval of the sale by the Conservator of Forests.

4. Should the required deposit not be made immediately on conclusion of the sale, the right to collect the produce will be at once offered again to public competition, and the person who failed in the first instance to make the required deposit will not be allowed to bid, unless he deposits in advance a sum of Rs. 50, which will be forfeited if he again refuses to make the required deposit on acceptance of his bid.

5. The balance of the purchase amount, if any, shall be paid as specified in condition 3.

6. Should the person decline or fail to enter into an agreement within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Assistant Conservator of Forests of the respective Divisions to the effect that his bid has been accepted by the Conservator of Forests or to pay the balance of the purchase amount when due, the deposits already made on account of the purchase and the security shall be forfeited and the right to collect the produce in question re-sold at the risk of the original purchaser, who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such re-sale, but, on the other hand, he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by any re-sale.

7. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, re-sold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.

8. Should the purchaser or his employees cause any damage to trees in the forests or commit any forest offence, the purchaser shall be held liable to pay compensation for all such damage or loss, and on failure to pay he shall be liable to prosecution.

9. The collection of all minor forest produce should cease on August 31, 1923, to admit of the minor forest produce collected being transported to the Central Stores before September 30, 1923, after which date the purchasers will not be allowed to transport any produce to the Central Store, no matter when the minor forest produce might have been collected in forest.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting the purchaser's employees, and of rescinding the agreement if the above conditions are not adhered to.

11. For any further information, and for inspection of the draft agreements, application should be made at the Office of the Assistant Conservator of Forests of the respective divisions in which the forests are situated.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 19, 1922, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 15, 1922.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. A. de C. Carson; and Dr. A. de Saram.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 15, 1922, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1921 to July 31, 1922, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for July, 1922.
- Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July, 1922.
- The reservoir readings for July, 1922.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during July, 1922.

4. Correspondence:—(1) Endorsement No. 2 of July 21, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* payment of gratuity of Rs. 20 to Municipal Cooly Saverimuttu.—Read.

(2) Letter of July 11, 1922, from the High Priest of Asgiriya, declining to give the temple land required for the proposed Asgiriya road.

Dr. Attygalle proposed that the motion which stood in his name might be considered with this letter, and moved that a Special Committee consisting of Mr. Ratwatte and himself be appointed to submit a report on the matter. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.

Mr. De Silva moved as an amendment that the Special Committee consist of all the five Elected Members. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and lost by 7 to 2. *Ayes*—Mr. de Silva and Mr. Pieris. *Noes*—Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle, Mr. J. C. Ratwatte, Mr. A. Vallipuram, Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. A. de C. Carson, Dr. A. de Saram, and the Chairman.

The original motion was then put and carried by 7 to 2. *Ayes*—Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle, Mr. J. C. Ratwatte, Mr. A. Vallipuram, Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. A. de C. Carson, Dr. A. de Saram, and the Chairman. *Noes*—Mr. De Silva and Mr. Pieris.

(3) Letter of July 24, 1922, from Col. H. Gladstone Millner of the Salvation Army *re* terms on which he is prepared to take charge of the Municipal School at Mahaiyawa.

Resolved (i.) That a grant of Rs. 500 be made by the Council for equipment of the school (furniture, seats, &c.); (ii.) that a grant of Rs. 25 per mensem for one year be made towards the teacher's salary. Government grant-in-aid, if received, to go to the Salvation Army; (iii.) that the maintenance of the school and teacher's quarters be borne by the Council; (iv.) that the school be run by the Salvation Army as an open free school, primarily for children of the Municipal employees but others not to be excluded; (v.) that the Salvation Army be allowed the right to hold Sunday school and services for the people in the school buildings out of school hours.



(4) Letter of July 31, from the Honorary Secretary, Kandy Ratepayers' Association, forwarding copy of a resolution passed at a meeting of the association condemning the action of member for Ward No. 2 in voting for the enforcement of the regulations relating to the storage of grain.—Tabled.

(5) Letter of August 18, from Mr. J. C. Ratwatte thanking the Council for the vote of condolence passed on his recent bereavement.—Read.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle asked :—(1) What number of carts and bulls are employed during the day for scavenging of streets, and what is the total cost per month ?

(2) How many coolies are employed during the day for scavenging of streets, and what is the total cost of such employment ?

(3) How many carts and bulls are employed for conservancy purposes and what is the total cost per month ?

(4) How many coolies are employed for the same purpose and what is the cost ?

(5) Will the Chairman call upon the Municipal Electric Engineer to submit to this Council before the Budget Meeting, details and estimates for an electrically-propelled vehicle for scavenging, and the same for watering of streets ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) On an average 24 carts are employed a day for scavenging streets at a cost of Rs. 1,278·75 per month.

(2) 44 coolies are employed daily for the same purpose at a cost of Rs. 359·60 per month, an overseer and 7 kanganies are also employed costing Rs. 224·13 per month. For flushing drains 10 coolies are employed at a cost of Rs. 124 per month.

(3) On an average 23 carts are employed daily for conservancy purposes at a cost of Rs. 992 per month.

(4) 55 coolies are employed daily for the same purpose at a cost of Rs. 780·20 per month. In addition an overseer and 4 kanganies are employed at a cost of Rs. 139·50 per month.

(5) I will do so.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Vallipuram asked—Will the Chairman be pleased to direct the Superintendent of Works to make better provision for watering all principal streets where traffic is heavy with a view to allay dust and prevent inconvenience to the residents caused thereby ?

The Chairman undertook to do so.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva asked—(1) Is the Council aware of the insanitary condition of the catch-pit adjoining the late Municipal Inspector, Mr. Senanayake's dwelling-house, on the entrance of the Lady Torrington's road ? Have representations being made to the Council by the residents of the neighbourhood regarding the insanitary condition of this pit ? If so has the Council's Officers taken any steps to remedy or give immediate or temporary relief ?

(2) Who is responsible for the sanitation of the town ? Is it the Medical Officer of Health or the Superintendent of Works ?

(3) Will the Chairman be pleased to supply a list of all lands proposed to be acquired by the Municipal Council, Kandy, for model tenements, their locality, extent, and price demanded.

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) The complaints regarding the catch-pit have received attention, and the question of covering it up or moving it to another position is under consideration.

(2) The Medical Officer of Health is responsible for the sanitation of the town. Works connected with the sanitation of the town are carried out by the Superintendent of Works.

(3) (i.) Mr. Cassie Lebbe's land, situated at Mahaiyawa, opposite the railway station (extent about 8 acres). Owner wanted Rs. 50,000 for the land. The Board made an offer of Rs. 20,000, which was not accepted. The owner has since offered the land for Rs. 35,000 ; (ii.) part of Poorana estate in extent, 3 acres belonging to Mr. Carthigaser. The owner wants Rs. 10,000 for the 3 acres, which the Board considered reasonable. This land adjoins the Government land, in extent about 5 acres, which is likely to be vested in the Municipal Council, Kandy, for the purpose of erecting model tenements. Preliminary No. 7,001.

At this stage Dr. De Saram left the Meeting.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. De Silva moved—(1) That in the opinion of this Council there is no necessity to employ two engineers to carry on the work of the Board of Improvement, and the decision of this Council be communicated to Government. Mr. Pieris seconded *pro forma*.

After some discussion the mover agreed to bring the matter up at the end of three years, when the present Board will cease to hold office.

(2) That a Committee of the Council be appointed to consider the advisability of disposing of the present model tenements, situated at Katukele in Kandy, with a view to construct more suitable buildings for alley population. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The motion was put to the Meeting and lost by 6 to 2. *Ayes*—Mr. De Silva and Mr. Pieris. *Noes*—Mr. J. C. Ratwatte, Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle, Mr. A. Vallipuram, Dr. G. P. Hay, Mr. A. de C. Carson, and the Chairman.

9. (1) Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—That all water supplied to householders for domestic use be given free, and that the by-laws of the Council be amended to permit of this being done. Dr. Hay seconded.

Mr. De Silva pointed out that, as the object of the resolution was to remove meters affixed to services for domestic purposes, the wording might be amended so as to give clearer effect to this.

The mover agreed to the following amendment :—That all meters affixed to water service pipes laid for domestic purposes be removed, and that the by-laws of the Council be amended to permit of this being done.

The resolution as amended was put to the Meeting and carried, Mr. Carson dissenting.

9. (2) Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—That the following be added to the by-laws relating to conduct of business. "A motion which has been withdrawn may be made again at any time, but no motion shall be proposed which is the same in substance as any motion which shall have been resolved in the affirmative or negative within a period of six months. Mr. Vallipuram seconded. The motion was carried by 6 to 2, Messrs. Pieris and Silva dissenting.

9. (3) The following resolution, which stood in the name of Dr. Attygalle, was withdrawn with the leave of the Council :—This Council do respectfully request His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council to modify section 3 of the regulations relating to the storage of grain, dated October 26, 1916, and made applicable within the Municipal limits of Kandy, by Government Notification dated March 22, 1921, so as to permit retail grain sheds being built with a clear space of 7½ ft. from other buildings.

9. (4) The following resolution which stood in Dr. Attygalle's name, was considered with item 4 (2) of the agenda. —That steps be taken without further delay for the construction of the Asgiriya outlet, and that fresh tenders be called for, for the work to be carried out in sections.

9. (5) Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—That application be made to Government for an annual grant equal to 50 per cent. of the proceeds of sale of arrack and toddy taverns within the Municipal limits of Kandy. Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried unanimously.

10. (1) The following motion, which stood in Mr. Vallipuram's name, was with the leave of Council, withdrawn :—That the by-laws regarding the rice stores be so amended that in the case of retail stores 8 ft. by 8 ft. or 8 ft. by 6 ft., and in the case of whole sale stores 15 ft. by 18 ft. or 15 ft. by 12 ft. shall be the minimum dimensions of open space required.

(2) Pursuant to notice Mr. Vallipuram moved—That the quantity of food supplied to cattle, goats, and sheep brought into the slaughter-house be doubled, and that an extra levy be made from the butchers to cover the additional cost. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.

It was agreed to raise the fees for housing and feeding each head of cattle from 25 cents to 37 cents and to amend by-law 107 accordingly.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on August 12, 1922, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated August 7, 1922.

Present :—Mr. F. Bartlett, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene ; Dr. C. B. Lourensz ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; and Mr. O. T. Nettleton.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 8, 1922, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Councillor, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. G. E. Abeywardene asked the following questions, and the Chairman replied *seriatim* :—

Q.—(1) Has the Director of Public Works sent in his specification of the Electric Lighting Scheme ?

A.—(1) No.

Q.—(2) How many pipes in the water main have burst within the last three months ?

A.—(2) Two.

Q.—(3) Within what time were these pipes repaired ?

A.—(3) The first was repaired within 12 hours, and the second within 6 hours of the receipt of information.

Q.—(4) If the repairs exceeded three hours, what is the cause of the delay ?

A.—(4) As the first burst occurred after office hours the Waterworks, staff had to be summoned together ; they proceeded to the spot—a distance of 7 miles—taking the necessary materials with them ; the work was carried on at night, the position of the pipe was unfavourable for the speedy drainage of water from the trench.

Q.—(5) Are these repairs done under the direct supervision of the Superintendent of Works ?

A.—(5) Such repairs are carried out under the supervision of the Superintendent of Works. On the first occasion he was not actually present when the work was being carried out. On the second occasion he was.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene asked :—

Q.—(1) Is the Chairman in a position to inform this Council when a start is likely to be made with the work in connection with the proposed Electric Lighting Scheme for Galle ?

A.—(1) I am not in a position to do so.

Q.—(2) If not, will he be so good as to obtain this information from the Director of Public Works ?

A.—(2) The Director of Public Works has informed me that he is awaiting a report of the Consulting Engineers (Electrical) on certain points in the scheme which he thought it highly desirable should be referred to them.

Q.—(3) What is the present position of the matter of the proposed Public Hall ?

A.—(3) Mudaliyar de Silva has not yet submitted the plans of the building. He states that he hopes to do so next week.

Q.—(4) When is a beginning likely to be made with the erection of it ?

A.—(4) Mudaliyar de Silva states that he is prepared to start the work as soon as he receives the plans.

Q.—(5) Whether it is the fact that the water main from Hiyare burst at two spots not far from each other within the last fortnight ?

A.—(5) The reply is in the affirmative.

Q.—(6) If so, whether the Chairman is in a position to inform this Council the cause for this unusual occurrence ?

A.—(6) I am not in a position to attribute a cause for the bursting of the pipes. I have referred the matter to the Provincial Engineer for his opinion.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera asked :—

Q.—(1) Is the Chairman aware that a motor bus service has been started and is plying within the Municipal limits ? If so, was permission granted by him to the Company to carry on a service ?

A.—(1) The reply to the first part of the question is in the affirmative. To the second part a license was issued, in terms of section 6 of "The Vehicles Ordinance, 1916," to the owner of motor bus L 91 for the purpose of letting the same for hire. No permission was asked or given to carry on a service.

Q.—(2) Will the Chairman request the Medical Officer of Health to report whether the health of the residents on either side of the Galle-Matara road will be seriously affected by the clouds of dust raised frequently by the passing motor buses ?

A.—(2) I will do so.

Q.—(3) What is the size of the main that brings the water to town from Hiyare reservoir ? How many house connections can it serve under normal conditions ? How many connections are actually served by it at present ?

A.—(3) The service main from the Hiyare reservoir is 8 inches in diameter. I am unable to say how many house connections it can serve under normal conditions. I will inquire from the Provincial Engineer. There are at present 641 connections, including 126 street stand posts.

Q.—(4) What is the probable cost of laying an additional main ?

A.—(4) The probable cost is Rs. 250,000.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved (1) that a report of the gauging of the water supply to the town which has been going on for some time may be tabled, giving the following particulars :—

(1) The reading up to date.

(2) Who is responsible for the registering of the readings.

(3) As to the checking of the accuracy of the readings.

(4) As to whether the Superintendent of Works thinks the gauging apparatus is working correctly.

(5) Whether the gauging in any way interferes with the supply of water to the town.

(6) (1) As to whether the Superintendent of Works or any one else has in any way tested the accuracy of the working of the gauging apparatus. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.—Carried.

(2) That the Superintendent of Works may be asked to submit an estimate, with sketch, for six concrete garden seats for the Victoria Park. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved (1) that this Council do take immediate steps to have the law amended regarding its authority over the Municipal limits, empowering it to allow or refuse motor bus services on the roads, whether owned by Government or belonging to the Municipality. Mr. G. E. Abeywardene seconded.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved, as an amendment, that it be referred to the Law Committee. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

Mr. J. E. Perera, with the consent of the seconder, withdrew the motion. The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

(2) That the Superintendent of Works be given the discretion, ordinarily, to water the roads in the town. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

7. Letter No. 8/15329 of July 18, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, in reference to the Galle Drainage.—Read.

8. Letter No. 9/19774 of August 8, 1922, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to nominate Mr. Oscar T. Nettleton to be a Member of the Municipal Council in succession to Mr. E. W. Cade.—Read.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardene moved that the Council do place on record its appreciation of the services rendered to this Council by Mr. E. W. Cade during his term of membership. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. Letter No. 1,900 of July 28, 1922, from the Director of Public Works, in reference to the Electric Lighting Scheme.—Read.

10. Letter from Mr. R. B. Hellings in acknowledgment of the resolution of congratulation passed by the Council on February 11, 1922.—Read.

11. The Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1921.

Mr. G. E. Abeywardene moved that in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1921 be submitted in due course to His Excellency the Governor. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

12. Report of the Colonial Auditor on the accounts of the Municipality for the year 1921 submitted.—Resolved that an expression of the Council's appreciation be conveyed to the Colonial Auditor for his helpful report.

13. Election of a member of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works in succession to Mr. E. W. Cade :—

Mr. J. E. Perera moved that Mr. O. T. Nettleton be elected. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

14.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance (meeting together) of August 12, 1922.*

(2) Letter No. 1,781 of July 17, 1922, from the Director of Public Works, requesting a sum of Rs. 150 for field work remaining to be done in connection with the surface drainage of Galle.—Recommended that it be allowed, and that the supplementary vote for Rs. 150 be provided.

(3) Application from Mr. A. H. Nathanielsz, District Engineer, Galle Drainage Scheme, for a commuted travelling allowance from April 1, 1922.—Recommended that a commuted allowance of Rs. 100 per mensem from April 1, 1922, be given, and that the supplementary vote of Rs. 900 be provided.

(4) Estimate of Rs. 300 for rebuilding the shed in the compound of the Municipal Office.—Recommended.

(5) Tenders for 1923.—Recommended that tenders be invited for (1) the supply of metal, rubble, and gravel for periods of one year and three years; (2) the lease of the coconut trees in the Segregation Camp and the Infectious Diseases Hospital for a period of five years on the following conditions:—(a) The lessee shall keep the premises clear of scrub, (b) he shall supply all the vacancies for which he shall be paid Re. 1 per tree when it has grown above the reach of cattle, and (c) he shall not be entitled to any rebate nor claim compensation in the event of the grounds being closed by the Medical Officer of Health; (3) the supply of draught cattle for scavenging, night soil, and water carts for periods of one year and three years.

(6) Estimate of Rs. 1,500 (approximately) for removing the blind corner at the junction of Morris road with Circular road.—Recommended that the consideration of the matter be deferred.

(7) Estimate of Rs. 9,200 for the surface drainage of a portion of Richmond Hill road.—Recommended that the consideration of the matter be deferred.

15.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of August 12, 1922.*

(8) Recommendation for an increase of pay to lamp lighter Daniel.—Recommended an increase of Re. 1 per mensem.

(9) Application from the Manager of the Conservancy Department for a loan of Rs. 150 for the purchase of a bicycle.—Recommended.

(10) Application from the Inspector of Ward No. 2 for a bicycle allowance.—Recommended that the application be refused.

(11) Assessment of Government property.—Recommended that Messrs. Misso and Kariawassan be appointed assessors on the same terms as before.

16.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Finance and Markets and Sanitation (meeting together) of August 12, 1922.*

(12) To consider the expediency of constructing five stalls in the Kaluwella market at an estimated cost of Rs. 800.—Recommended the work to be carried out by the Superintendent of Works.

(13) To consider the appointment of a Relieving Inspector, *vice* Mr. Morais resigned.—Recommended.

17.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 12, 1922.*

(2) Proposed by-laws to restrict the use of motor lorries upon Municipal roads.—Recommended that the by-laws be adopted for the use of any road within the Municipality.

(4) To consider the levying of fees on bakeries, dairies, and billiard saloons.—Recommended.

"Improvements in methods for securing rubber surfaces to the foundation of roads and footways and the like."

*Abstract.*—The applicant states that a rubber surface may be secured to the foundation of a roadway by preparing sheets of rubber with a dovetail or undercut flange along the underside of two opposite edges and by preparing grooved blocks of concrete or other material which are fixed in the road foundation and in which the dovetailed flanges are fitted and if desired fixed by the aid of a rubber solvent.

The sheets are laid with the flanged edges at right angles to the direction of the traffic.

The claims are:—

1. For securing rubber surfaces to the foundations of roads, footways, and the like, the method comprising flanged rubber sheets and grooved blocks substantially as described.
2. For securing rubber surfaces to the foundations of roads, footways, and the like, rubber sheets provided with dovetail or undercut flanges on the underside of them and along the longest pair of opposite edges substantially as described.
3. For securing rubber surfaces to the foundations of roads, footways, and the like, blocks of concrete or the like provided with grooves having undercut sides, laid and fixed in the concrete foundation in rows, transversely to the centre line of the said road or footway or the like.
4. For securing rubber surfaces to the foundations of roads, footways, or the like, flanged rubber sheets and grooved blocks in combination.

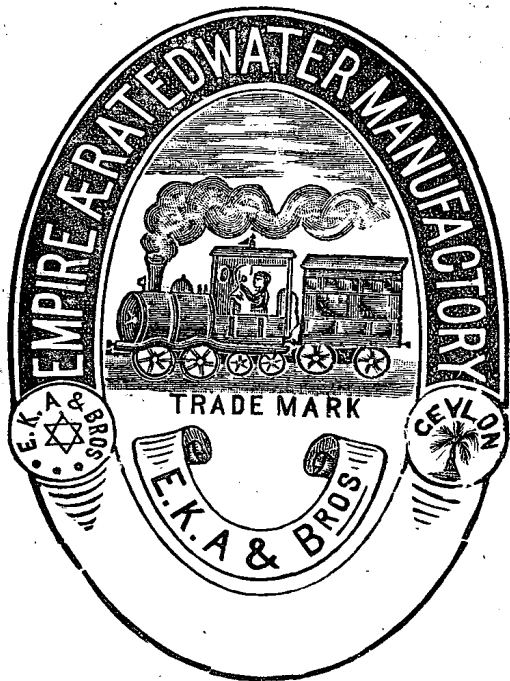
