**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF JUNE, 1922.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 366 (310 general, 1 Kandyan, and 55 Muhammadan), as against 312 in the preceding month. In Colombo the marriages of residents numbered 146 (108 general and 38 Muhammadan), as against 113 in the preceding month.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,474 (741 males and 733 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·65 per 1,000, against 31·32 in the preceding month, 38·46 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·42 the average for the corresponding months since 1912. The rate ranged from 12·76 in Vavuniya to 69·20 in Lunugala.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 506 (262 males and 244 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 24·86 per 1,000, against 26·58 in the preceding month, 43·92 in the corresponding month of last year, and 22·32 the average for the corresponding months since 1912. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 10·77 in St. Paul's to 26·96 in Kotahena North.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,719 (893 males and 826 females). There were 1,356 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 29·73 per 1,000, against 28·92 in the preceding month, 28·74 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·33 the average for the month of June in each year since 1912. The rate ranged from 63·92 in Anuradhapura to 13·54 in Nuwara Eliya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 662 (350 males and 312 females). There were 555 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 31·63 per 1,000, against 28·30 in the preceding month, 23·44 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·91 the average for the month of June in each year since 1912. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 30·27 in San Sebastian to 8·87 in Wellawatta South.

7. The stillbirths registered numbered 100 (53 males and 47 females), as against 125 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 227 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June 30, 1922. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 265, against 228 in the preceding month, 191 in the corresponding month of last year, and 255 the average for the corresponding months since 1912.

9. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 243 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended June 30, 1922. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 316, against 247 in the preceding month, 151 in the corresponding month of last year, and 284 the average for the corresponding months since 1912.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia* to which 16 per cent. of the total deaths was due, *Debility* and *Convulsions* caused 8 per cent. each, *Diarrhoea* 6 per cent., *Enteritis*, *Phthisis*, and *Malaria and Malarial Cachexia* 5 per cent. each; *Dysentery*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Influenza*, and *Anchylostomiasis* 3 per cent. each, *Bronchitis* and *Enteric Fever* 2 per cent. each, and *Prematurity* and *Puerperal Septicaemia* 1 per cent. each.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 16 per cent. of the deaths, *Convulsions* caused 8 per cent., *Phthisis* 7 per cent., *Enteritis* 6 per cent., *Debility* 5 per cent., *Influenza* and *Diarrhoea* 4 per cent. each, *Bronchitis*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Dysentery* 3 per cent. each, and *Anchylostomiasis*, *Malaria and Malarial Cachexia*, *Prematurity*, *Plague*, and *Tetanus* 1 per cent. each.

12. Eight deaths from *Plague* were registered (in Colombo), as against 7 in the preceding month, and 1 in the corresponding month of last year. One death from *Chickenpox* (in Kandy), and 1 from *Measles* (in Moratuwa), were also registered.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 92 cases were reported (79 in Colombo, 6 in Kurunegala), *Chickenpox* followed with 63 cases (28 in Colombo, 14 in Kandy, 7 in Nuwara Eliya, 5 in Lunugala), *Enteric Fever* 60 (50 in Colombo), *Measles* 34 (25 in Kandy, 8 in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 24 (16 in Colombo), *Plague* 7 (in Colombo), *Acute Diarrhoea* 3 (2 in Colombo), *Dysentery* 3 (2 in Panadure), and *Mumps* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (36·67 inches) followed by Ratnapura (24·58 inches). In the other towns it ranged from 20·67 in Hatton to 0·08 of an inch in Batticaloa. Colombo recorded 9·86 inches.

15. The mean temperature varied from 61·0° in Nuwara Eliya to 86·2° in Trincomalee, and was 82·0° in Colombo.
