The Ceylon Defence Force Medical Corps.

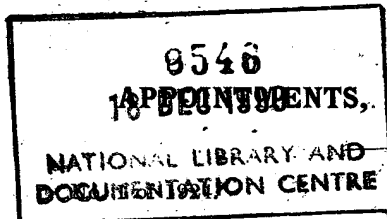

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are invited for the supply of rice to the contractors and coolies of the Railway Extensions Department, working on the Batticaloa and Trincomalee Light Railway, between Maho, Habarana, Gal-oya, Minneriya, Polonnaruwa, and such intermediate points as herein provided for.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

3. Tenders should be either deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue or be sent through the post. Sealed samples should be deposited in the Office of the Chief Construction Engineer, Colombo. These samples must have the quality of the rice and rate per bushel clearly marked upon them.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tenders for supplying Rice, Railway Extensions Department," in the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday, on Tuesday, January 15, 1924.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Chief Construction Engineer, Colombo, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. The supply will be for a period of two months commencing from February 1, 1924.

7. The price per bushel will include the bag as well as cost of transport for delivery at Maho. Separate prices must be quoted by tenderers (a) for delivery at Maho, (b) for delivery at any intermediate point between Maho, Gal-oya, and Polonnaruwa. Intermediate points of supply will be settled by the Executive Engineer at Habarana.

8. No railway facilities will be given regarding freight on transport of rice to Maho, and full freight rates must be allowed for in the tendered quotation, but the rice will be

conveyed free between Maho, Gal-oya, and Polonnaruwa by Extension Ballast Train, lorry, or any other means at the contractor's risk.

9. Temporary stores for storing the rice will be provided free by the Department at Maho, Habarana, Gal-oya, Minneriya, and Polonnaruwa, and such other places from which rice may have to be issued.

10. The contractor will provide all labour for the handling and issue of the rice at all points.

11. Issue to contractors or coolies will be made only on signed order of the Assistant Engineer of the section.

12. Payments will be made monthly on the certificate furnished by the Assistant Engineers through the Executive Engineer at Habarana during the month following that in which the rice has been supplied.

13. The approximate monthly requirements will be 3,000 bushels per month and upwards, and the contractor must hold sufficient stock to meet this requirement.

14. A cash deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made in the name of the Colonial Treasurer in the Colonial Treasury or at any Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into a contract, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature to the contract. No deposit for tender forms will be accepted at the Chief Construction Engineer's Office.

15. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the Chief Construction Engineer, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, object after giving notice of his objection in writing.

16. Ten per cent. of the total amount due will be retained by the Engineer as security, and within thirty days after the completion of the supply in all respects as provided for in the agreement the retention money will be paid to the contractor.

17. The contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board.

18. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

19. All tenders will be accepted only on the condition that the tenderer shall give the Government the benefit of any decrease in the Customs Duties made after the signing of the tender and up to the expiry of the contract entered into hereafter, and the Government likewise undertakes to pay over and above the tendered rate such sum as shall adequately compensate the tenderer for any increase in the Customs Duties during the period aforesaid.

20. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting the whole or any portion of a tender.

SEALD Tenders marked on the envelopes "Tender for transporting, weighing, and delivering salt, Puttalam," will be received by the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam, up to 1 P.M. on January 22, 1924, from persons willing to contract.

For the service of transporting salt collected at the Maha Manufacture, 1923, from the salt pans first at Tillayadi, then Western and then Eastern Salterns, and either (a) weighing and storing the same in the salt depôts of Puttalam or (b) conveying the same to the storage platform at the Eastern Saltern, Puttalam.

Tenderers will note the following requirements:—

(1) They should specify two rates per 1,000 cwt. for transporting the salt in sacks with mouths tied, one rate for (a) weighing and storing the same in the stores, and one for (b) delivering the same into trolleys at the platform gates.

(2) The tenderer must in case of (a) bring in, weigh, and deliver 1,450 cwt. per diem at the stores, or in case of (b) bring and deliver at the storage platform 1,600 cwt. per diem. The tenderer will be liable in case of failure to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10 for each day of failure to be imposed at the discretion of the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) Work to commence in case of (a) on February 1, 1924, and in case of (b) on March 1, 1924.

(4) Each tenderer must deposit a sum of Rs. 200, either at the Treasury or at any Kachcheri before tendering, and the receipt must be attached to his tender. No tender will receive any consideration where no such deposit has been made. This deposit will be forfeited to Government, if the tenderer is not prepared to enter into contract, or is unable to furnish certified security in Rs. 1,000 for the due fulfilment of the contract. Unforfeited deposits will be returned to the tenderers.

(5) Each tenderer must name an address in Puttalam, where all letters or notices may be served on or left for him.

(6) A letter signed by two responsible persons whose addresses must be given engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract should accompany the tender.

(7) Every alteration in the rates of tender should be initialled by the tenderer.

(8) A duplicate of the tender should be forwarded by the tenderer by post to the Hon. the Controller of Revenue, Colombo, at the same time that he forwards the original to the Assistant Government Agent of Puttalam.

(9) The tenderers should be present at the Kachcheri on the day of the opening of tenders.

(10) Crown Counsel's fees for settling bond and contract should be paid by the successful tenderer.

(11) The mouths of the salt bags should be tied up at the kottus before loading into carts.

(12) The tender of any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, will not be accepted. “The Nuisance Ordinance, No. 15 of 1862.”

THE following offences punishable under section 1 of Ordinance No. 15 of 1862, are published for general information as required by section 7 of the said Ordinance:—

1. Whosoever shall commit any of the following offences shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds:—

- (1) Whosoever, being the owner or occupier of any house, building, or land in or near any road, street, or public thoroughfare, whether tenantable or otherwise, shall keep or suffer the same to be in a filthy and unwholesome state, or overgrown with rank and noisome vegetation, so as to be a nuisance to or injurious to the health of any person.
- (2) Whosoever shall have in or upon any house, building, or land occupied by him any foul or offensive ditch, gutter, drain, privy, cesspool, or other receptacle.
- (3) Whosoever, being the occupier of a house, building, or land in or near any road, or street, or public thoroughfare, shall keep or allow to be kept for more than twenty-four hours, otherwise than in some proper receptacle, any accumulation of dung, offal, filth, refuse, or other noxious or offensive matter, or suffer such receptacle to be in a filthy or noxious state, or neglect to employ proper means to remove the filth therefrom and to cleanse and purify the same.
- (4) Whosoever shall keep in or upon any house, building, or land occupied by him any cattle, goat, swine, or other animal, so as to be a nuisance to or injurious to the health of any person.

- (5) Whosoever being the owner of a house, building, or wall shall allow the same to be in a ruinous state, or in any way dangerous to the inhabitants of such house or building, or to the neighbouring houses or buildings, or to the occupiers thereof, or to passengers.
- (6) Whosoever shall suffer any waste or stagnant water or other matter to remain in any place within the premises occupied by him, or shall allow the contents of any privy or cesspool to overflow or soak therefrom.
- (7) Whosoever shall throw, put, or cast, or cause to enter in any stream, tank, reservoir, well, cistern, conduit, or aqueduct, any dead animal, or any dirt, rubbish, filth, or other noisome, or offensive matter or thing, or shall cause or suffer to run drain, or be brought thereinto any unwholesome or offensive liquid matter or thing, or flowing from any house or building or from any ground occupied by him, or shall do anything whereby any such water shall be in any degree fouled or corrupted.
- (8) Whosoever shall keep in any market, shop, building, stall, or place used for the sale of butcher's meat, poultry, fish, fruit, vegetable, or expose or shall allow to be exposed for sale in any place or way any animal, carcass, meat, poultry, game, flesh, fish, fruit, or vegetable which is unfit for the food of man.
- (9) Whosoever shall sell or offer or expose for sale as food or drink for man any article which has been rendered or has become noxious or unfit for such use, knowing or having reason to believe the same to be noxious or unfit for such use.
- (10) Whosoever shall keep any manufactory or place of business from which offensive or unwholesome smells arise, without a license for that purpose as provided in the fourth section.
- (11) Whosoever shall keep or deposit any coconut husks, coir, or any other substance at or near such places, or in such a manner as to be a nuisance to, or injurious to the health of any person.
- (12) Whosoever shall throw or put, or permit his servants to throw or put, any earth, dirt, ashes, filth, refuse, from any garden, kitchen, or stable, or any broken glass, or earthenware, or other rubbish on any street, road, or public place, or passage, or into any sewer or drain.
