In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir William Henry Manning, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare a certain portion of a road which the railway crosses to be a "minor crossing" for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and that such "minor crossing" be not closed by gates:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby declare that the portion of the road which the Ceylon Government Railway crosses between the stations of Murunkan and Mannar, in the Northern Province, which is set out in the schedule hereto, shall from December 20, 1923, be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance, and that such "minor crossing" be not closed by gates.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-four.

"THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

Y-LAWS made by the Sanitary Board of the District of Batticaloa, under section 9 E of Ordinance No. 18 of 1892, as amended by Ordinances No. 30 of 1914 and No. 30 of 1909, confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and published for general information.

By-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Butchers' Stalls.

1. Every butcher's stall shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof shall be plastered and whitewashed at least four times a year, and the floor cemented and sufficient drainage provided.

2. Every room in which meat is kept shall be scrupulously clean.

3. Every table used in a butcher's stall shall be covered with zinc or other impermeable substance approved by the Chairman. Such tables and the chopping block and all implements shall be kept scrupulously clean. They shall be washed with water and scrubbed with a hard clean brush immediately after use. All hooks for hanging meat shall be polished and free from rust.

4. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a butcher's stall shall be removed at least once a day, and the drains well flushed.

5. No person suffering, or who to the knowledge of any person in charge of a butcher's stall has recently suffered, from any contagious or infectious disease, or has been recently in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any such person in charge of the butcher's stall to be employed in such butcher's stall.

6. Every butcher shall provide himself with a movable bin or receptacle of metal for waste material.

7. Every butcher's stall and the management and conduct of the business shall be at all times open and subject to inspection by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board or by any person duly authorized by the Chairman.

8. These by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every butcher's stall.

Supervision of Private Markets.

1. All private markets, boutiques, shops, or places where any articles used for food are exposed for sale shall at all times be kept clean, as also the vessels, mats, &c., on which such articles are exposed.

2. The owners or occupiers of such markets, boutiques, or shops shall be bound to whitewash the walls of such buildings as often as the Board shall direct. Any Officer of the Board shall have power to inspect markets, boutiques, shops, or places used for sale of things at any time that it shall be reasonably necessary to do so on matters connected with sanitation.

"THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, No. 11 of 1920."

PY-LAWS made by the Ratnapura Urban District Council, under sections 164 and 168 (8) (c) of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920, approved by the Local Government Board, confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, and published for general information under section 166 (1).

By-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The use of the roads named in the schedule hereto by motor buses and lorries is prohibited.

STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 26, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 161 (5 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 15 Moors, 7 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1924, viz., 251,824) was 33·4, as against 27·6 in the preceding week, 34·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 143 (3 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 30 Moors, 1 Malay, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29 · 7, as against 39 · 2 in the previous week, 43 · 5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 143 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-four deaths from Pneumonia were registered: 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, and I each in Kotahena North, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 13 in the previous week, and 24 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Nine deaths from Influenza were registered: 5 in San Sebastian, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Maradana Hospital and Maradana East, as against 10 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered: 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered: 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 16 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.
- Seven deaths from Plague were registered: 5 in Wellawatta North, and I each in Pettah and Maradana North, as against 12 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Four deaths from Enteric fever were registered: 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and I each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, as against 6 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- Twelve deaths were registered from Debility, 9 from Enteritis, 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Diarrhaea, 4 from Dysentery, 1 from Puerperal Septicæmia, and 43 from Other Causes.
- 6. Twenty-three cases of Chickenpox, 14 of Plague, 11 of Enteric fever, and 2 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 20, 10, 18, and 4 respectively of the preceding week.

- 1. The name of the Company is "The Troup Tea Company, Limited."
- 2. The registered office of the Company is to be established in Colombo.
- 3. The objects for which the Company is to be established are—
- (a) To purchase from the proprietors thereof the Troup estate, situate in the Talawakele District of Ceylon.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE TROUP TEA COMPANY, LIMITED.

THE regulations contained in the Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance. 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regula-

ions of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context, viz.:-

The word "Company" means "The Troup Tea Company, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The "Ordinance" means and includes "Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company. "Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

"Shareholder" means any person whose name is entered in the Register of Shareholders as owner or joint-owner

of any share in the Company.

"Presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney.

"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled

at a Board.

"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board.

meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

"Month" means a calendar month.

"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and vice versa. Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and vice versa. "Holder" means a Shareholder.

"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy or attorney (in cases where by these Articles proxies or powers of attorney are allowed) at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

BUSINESS.

2. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors,

and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents.

CAPITAL.

The nominal capital of the Company is One million Rupees (Rs. 1,000,000), divided into 10,000 shares of One

hundred Rupees (Rs. 100) each.

- 5. The Directors may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, increase the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares of such amounts per share, and in the aggregate and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.
- 6. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects with reference to the payments of allotment money, calls, and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise, as if it had formed part of the original capital.

The Directors may also with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company reduce the capital or subdivide

or consolidate the shares of the Company.

SHARES.

8. The Company may issue the balance capital whenever the Directors shall think fit, and may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid and the time of payment of such calls.

9. If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by

instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the *Holder* of the shares.

10. The shares, except when otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they consider proper. Provided that such unissued shares, except when otherwise provided, shall first be offered by the Directors to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may ditermine. Provided that the Directors may at their discretion allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, or as remuneration for work done for or services rendered to the Company, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

11. In case of the increase of the capital of the Company by the creation of new shares, such new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights and privileges annexed thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct, and, if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends, and in the distribution of the assets of the Company, and with a

special or without any right of voting.

Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them, and such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may, at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them to the vendor or vendors of any estates or lands being acquired by the Company in payment of the whole or any part of the purchase price of any such estates or lands, and that without offering the shares so allotted to the Shareholders.

12. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company may from time to time direct.

13. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm or partnership, and any one partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies in respect of shares registered in the name of the firm.

Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons jointly.

Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

16. In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be

the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except an absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 36 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

18. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and

calls due in respect of such share.

19. Every Shareholder shall be entitled to a certificate or certificates under the common seal of the Company, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid thereon.

20. If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors, they may order the same to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof may be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

21. The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the

person first named on the register.

22. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, provided that three months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the time and place appointed by the Directors.

23. If any Shareholder fail to pay the amount of any call due by him on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of nine per centum per annum from the day appointed

for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

24. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such

call was passed.

25. The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine.

But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

The Directors may at their discretion receive from any of the Shareholders willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the moneys uncalled upon their respective shares beyond the sums actually called up; and upon the moneys so paid in advance, or upon so much thereof as from time to time and at any time thereafter exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon and due in respect of the shares in respect of which such advances have been made, the Board may pay or allow interest at such rate as the Shareholders paying such sums in advance, and the Directors may agree upon, not exceeding, however, eight per centum per annum.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-clauses (5), (7), or (8) of this Article, no share shall be transferred to a person who is not a Shareholder so long as any Shareholder is willing to purchase the same as hereinafter provided.

(2) (a) Except where the transfer is made pursuant to sub-clauses (5), (7), or (8) of this Article, the person proposing to transfer any share (hereinafter called "the proposing transferor") shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called "the transfer notice") to the Company that he desires to transfer such share. The transfer notice shall specify the sum he fixes as the price of the share (hereinafter called "the proposing transferor's price"), which price must be approved by the Directors as not being prohibitive or excessive, and shall constitute the Company his agent for the sale of the share to any Shareholder of the Company at such price. The transfer notice may include several shares, and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate notice in respect of each, and shall specify the denoting number of each share which proposing transferor desires to sell. A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the sanction of the Directors.

(b) If the Directors do not approve of the proposing transferor's price and consider the same prohibitive or excessive.

(b) If the Directors do not approve of the proposing transferor's price and consider the same prohibitive or excessive, the question shall be referred to the Company's auditors for their decision, and the valuation of the shares as fixed by the auditors shall be binding on all parties, and such valuation shall be immediately inserted in the transfer notice as the

proposing transferor's price.

(3) If the Company shall, within the space of ninety days after being served with such notice, find a Shareholder willing to purchase the share at the proposing transferor's price (hereinafter called "the purchasing Shareholder") and give notice thereof to the proposing transferor, the latter shall be bound, upon payment of the said price, to transfer the

share to the purchasing Shareholder.

(4) If in any case the proposing transferor, after having become bound as aforesaid, makes default in transferring any share, the Company may receive the purchase money, and shall thereupon cause the name of the purchasing Shareholder to be entered in the register as the holder of that share, and shall hold the purchase money in trust for the proposing transferor. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing Shareholder, and after his name has been entered in the register in purported exercise of the aforesaid power, the validity of the proceedings shall not be questioned by any person.

(5) If the Company shall not, within the space of ninety days after being served with the transfer notice, find a Shareholder willing to purchase all or any of the shares comprised therein, and give notice in manner aforesaid, the proposing transferor shall at any time within three calendar months after the expiration of the said period of ninety days be at liberty, subject to Article 30, to sell and transfer the said shares or such of them as have not been sold to a purchasing Shareholder to any person, but at a price not less than that specified by him in his transfer notice, or the price fixed by

the Company's auditors, as the case may be.

• (6) The Company in General Meeting may make, and from time to time vary, rules as to the mode in which any shares specified in any transfer notice shall be offered to the Shareholders, and as to their rights in regard to the purchase thereof, and in particular may give any Shareholder, or class of Shareholders, a preferential right to purchase the same. Until otherwise determined, every such share or shares will be offered to the Shareholders as far as practicable in proportion to the shares held by them, and in case where this is not possible, such share or shares will be offered to the

Shareholders by lots drawn in regard thereto as the Directors shall think fit,

(7) Any share may be transferred by a shareholder to any child or other issue, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father, mother, brother, sister, nephew, niece, wife, or husband of a Shareholder, and any share of a deceased Shareholder may be transferred by his executors or administrators to any trustees under the will of any such deceased Shareholder, or to any child or other issue, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father, mother, brother, sister, nephew, niece, widow or widower of such deceased Shareholder, to whom such deceased Shareholder may have specifically bequeathed the same, or who may be entitled to the residuary estate of such deceased Shareholder, or any part or share of such residuary estate and shares standing in the name of the trustees of the will of any deceased Shareholder may be transferred to any beneficiary as aforesaid under the will, or, upon any change of trustees, to the trustees for the time being of such will, and the restrictions in sub-clause (1) of this Article contained shall not apply to any transfer authorized by this sub-clause.

(8) A Shareholder may with the consent of the Directors transfer any shares, the total nominal value of which shall not exceed One thousand Rupees (Rs. 1,000) to a person who is not a Shareholder for the purpose of enabling such person to qualify as a Director or for any purpose connected with the conduct and management of the Company's business, or for such other purposes as the Directors may in their absolute discretion think proper. Any transfer to a person who is not a Shareholder made under this Article otherwise than for the purposes herein specifically mentioned shall be absolutely

null and void.

28. No transfer of shares shall be made to an infant or person of unsound mind.
29. The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

30. The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien, or otherwise, or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved by them, but the latter restriction shall not apply where the proposed transferee is already a Shareholder nor to a transfer made pursuant to Article 27 (7) hereof. In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by the certificate for the shares to be transferred and by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Two Rupees and Fifty Cents, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid to the Company for the registration of every such transfer; upon payment thereof the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Article 30, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder and retain the

instrument of transfer.

32. The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders, without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

33. In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only, if at all, upon the transferee.

The Register of Transfers may be closed at such times and for such periods as the Directors may from time to

time determine, provided always that it shall not be closed for more than twenty-one days in any year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder (other than one of several joint Shareholders) shall be the only person recognized by the Company, as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Directors think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers

hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 36 shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such shares, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same, and the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company provided such acceptance is properly legalized.

If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder requiring him to pay the same together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on, and a place or places at, which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid; the notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which the

call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

40. Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay, and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, premia, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at nine per centum per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

41. Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may

be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

42. The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share,

except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

43. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture, and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company, and thereupon such purchaser shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase; and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

44. The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit as they shall think fit, not being less than nine per centum per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share bona fide sold or re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under

Article 41 hereof, shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

45. The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or in respect of any other debt, liability, or engagement whatsoever, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls which the Directors shall have resolved to make, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one, the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. And the Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

46. Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists

be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

47. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or

engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

48. A certificate in writing under the hands of one of the Directors and of the Secretary or Secretaries that the power of sale given by Article 46 has arisen and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such share.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

50. Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of repayment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or at such a premium, or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and

generally on such terms as the Company may from time to time by special resolution determine.

51. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different 51. If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes, then the holders of any class of shares may by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or to the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares; and such resolution shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolutions could have been effected without it.

52. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects.

52. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no member not being a Director shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any member personally present and entitled to vote at

such meeting.

Borrowing Powers.

53. The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, plantations, or otherwise. Also from time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, provided that the money so borrowed or raised and owing at any one time shall not, without the sanction of a General

Meeting, exceed Rupees One hundred thousand (Rs. 100,000).

With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Board shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. A certificate under the hands of one Director and the Secretary or Secretaries, or of two Directors, to the effect that in taking any loan the Directors are not exceeding their borrowing powers, shall be sufficient and binding on the Company and all concerned, and shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors.

55. For the purpose of securing the repayment of any such money so borrowed or raised, or for any other purposes, the Directors may grant, create, execute, and issue any mortgages, cash credits, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, lands, property, rights, and assets of the Company, both present and future, including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or may make, accept, or endorse

on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange.

56. Any such securities may be issued, either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise.

Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

58. The First General Meeting shall be held at such time not being more than twelve months after the incorporation

of the Company and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year, at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is so prescribed, then at such place and at such time as soon after the first day in each year as may be determined by the Directors.

60. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings;

all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

61. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed

to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company.

Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

63. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same

to a meeting.

64. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

65. Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given by advertisement in the Ceylon Government Gazette, or in such other manner (if any), as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice, and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the 2nd meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the 1st meeting.

66. Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors in place of those retiring by rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors

and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

67. With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present or represented at the commencement

of the business two or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present at the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the Chair 71.

is vacant.

72. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice thereof shall be given.

73. Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by a show of hands, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may

be entitled as a Shareholder; and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some Shareholder, or in the case of a special resolution by five Shareholders present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution. The power of demanding a poll conferred by this clause may be exercised by the proxy or attorney of any Shareholder duly appointed in that behalf.

75. If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder present, his proxy or attorney, or in case of a special resolution by five Shareholders, their proxies or attorneys at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and place and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder or proxy or attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such

The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than

the question on which a poll has been demanded.

No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

78. On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote. Where a Shareholder is present by an attorney who is not a Shareholder, such attorney shall be entitled to vote for such Shareholder on a show of hands.

In case of a poll every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

79. The parent or guardian or curator of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian or curator of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

80. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.81. No Shareholder shall be entitled to be present or to vote either personally or by proxy or attorney at any meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares have been paid, and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote at least three months previous to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote.

82. No person shall be entitled to hold a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but this rule shall not

apply to a power of attorney.

83. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written and shall be signed by the appointor (whether a Shareholder or his attorney) or if such appointor be a company or corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such

company or corporation.

84. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than the meeting at which the person named in such instrument forty-eight hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument

The instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form:—

85. No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such votes shall be tendered, and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

86. No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of

the voting.

DIRECTORS.

87. The number of Directors shall never be less than two or more than five; but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors or Director may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies.

88. The qualification of a Director shall be his holding in his own right at least ten fully or partly paid shares in the Company upon which all calls for the time being have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors.

As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding One thousand five hundred Rupees annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration granted for special or extra services hereinafter referred to, nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company. The Directors may repay to any Director all reasonable travelling and hotel expenses incurred by him in or about the bona fide performance of his duties as a Director including

all reasonable travelling expenses to and (or) from Board meetings.

90. The first Directors shall be Arthur Murray Cooper of Talawakele, Willoughby Greaves Beauchamp, and Thomas Lister Villiers, both of Colombo. The first Directors shall hold office till the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents of the Company, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or may fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office, and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents.

The Directors may confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might

be conferred on any Manager of the Company.

If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of

money, as they shall think fit.

92. At the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company all the Directors shall retire from office, and at the first Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 93.

- 93. The Director to retire from office at the second Ordinary General Meeting shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.
- In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire. the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

The Ordinary General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent Ordinary General Meeting.

97. Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of Directors or provisional Directors arising from death, resignation, or otherwise may be filled up by the Directors, but any person appointed to fill such vacancy shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the vacancy had occurred.

A General Meeting may from time to time increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also determine

in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

99. If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place, the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary or Secretaries, or by leaving the same at the registered office of the Company, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors, and on the acceptance of his resignation by the Directors, but not before, his office

101. The Company may, by a special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

- 102. Every Director or officer of the Company, and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him in or about the discharge of his duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer shall nor shall, the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, be liable for the acts or defaults of any other Director or officer, or for any loss or expenses happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.
- 103. No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

The office of Director shall be vacated-

- (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, or Secretary of the Company.
- (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.

If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.

(d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.

(e) If he resigns his office under the provisions of clause 100.

(f) If he ceases to ordinarily reside in Ceylon or is absent from Ceylon for a period of three consecutive months.

No Director shall be disqualified from holding office by reason of entering into any contract with or doing any work for the Company, or by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for, the Company, or by reason of his being agent, or ecretary, or solicitor, or being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries, or solicitors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall disclose to the Directors his interest in any contract, work, or business in which he may be personally interested, and shall not vote in respect of any matters connected with any such contract, work, or business.

Powers of Directors.

105. The Directors shall have power to carry into effect the acquisition of the said Troup estate and the lease,

purchase, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property they may think fit, or any share or shares thereof.

106. The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director, or with the assistance of an agent or agents and secretary or secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors subject to the provisions of Article No. 124 for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors shall pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, or acquisition of the said estates and lands, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and otherwise

in or about the working and business of the Company.

The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and, in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, artizans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, treasurers, accountants, officers, clerks, or servants of the company for such reasons as they may think

proper and advisable and without assigning any cause for so doing.

108. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting, and shall generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinances and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been

valid if such regulation had not been made.

The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be

limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

109. The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

110. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts. with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

111. The seal of the Company shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, or of one Director and the secretary or secretaries, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the ecretaries, in the event of a firm or registered company being the secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, attorney, or agent of the said firm or company signing for and on behalf

of the said firm or company as such Secretaries.

112. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders of the Company in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, and effects of the Company, or any panies, or individual or individuals, of for the sale of disposal of the business, estates, and enects of the company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or a special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

113. In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice, to the general powers conferred or implied in any of the preceding clauses and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that

the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say):-

(a) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, settle, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company, and any claims or demands made by or against the Company.

(b) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or enforce

the awards.

(c) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands by the Company.

(d) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents, with power to accept the

office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.

(e) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not to be immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or realize such investments.

(f) To delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being, or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon, or elsewhere, all or any of the powers or functions given to or exercisable by the Directors, and to confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions and with such restrictions as the Directors may think expedient, and to confer such powers either collaterally with or to the exclusion of, and in the substitution for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and from time to time to revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers. The Directors may allow to any person or company to whom any powers may be so delegated such remuneration as they in their absolute discretion shall think fit.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

114. The Directors may meet for the dispatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings at such places and times and in such manner as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

116. The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman

117. Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

119. The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

120. The acts of the Board or of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment or qualification of any Director or of any member of the Committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if such person had been duly appointed or qualified, provided the same be done before the discovery of the vacancy or defect.

A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual

as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books to be provided for the purpose-(1) Of all appointments of (a) officers and (b) committees made by the Directors.

Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors.

(3) Of the names of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.

(4) Of all orders made by the Directors.

(5) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings of the Company.

(6) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors.

(7) Of all resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of committees appointed by the Board.

All such minutes shall be signed by the person who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, as the case may be; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be prima facie evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

AGENTS AND SECRETARIES.

124. The firm of George Steuart & Company shall be the first agents and secretaries of the Company.

ACCOUNTS.

The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries, for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary 125. or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such sums were received and expended, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company. The accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in

General Meeting.

127. At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the previous financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary

of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the same period.

128. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other heads of expenditure. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of profit and loss may be laid before the meeting, and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the income of the year.

129. The balance sheet shall contain a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company, arranged under the heads appearing in the form annexed to the table referred to in Schedule C to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance,

1861," or as near thereto as circumstances admit.

130. Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount which the Directors recommend should be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

131. A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at.

or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

132. The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

AUDIT.

133. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during the continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the second General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such meeting shall hold office only until the first Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

135. The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting,

and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

136. Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

137. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.

Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers

relating thereto, and to report thereon to the meeting, generally or specially, as he may think fit.

139. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the day-time have access to all accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of audit.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

140. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

141. The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, or pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.

The Directors may, before recommending any dividend or bonus, set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they may select, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investment and apply such reserve fund or such portion thereof as they think fit to meet contingencies or for special dividends or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises of the Company, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purposes connected with the interest of the Company that they may from time to time deem expedient without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets.

Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend or bonus declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends or bonuses which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid-up shares, debentures or debenture stock of the Company or of any other company or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction, and when any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of all parties, and may vest any such specific assets in trustees upon such trusts for the persons entitled to the dividend or bonus as may seem expedient to the Directors.

144. No unpaid dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares 145. whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money

as may be due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding the fact that such sums or any of them are not payable until after the date when such dividend or bonus is payable.

147. Notice of any dividend that has been declared, or of any bonus to be paid, shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and any dividend or bonus unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual

receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

149. Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

NOTICES.

150. Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or persons appointed by the Board to authenticate the same.

151. Every Sharehelder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall

be registered as such in the books of the Company.

152. A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by being sent through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode, and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors, or to the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries

of the Company, their own or some other address in Ceylon to which notices may be sent.

153. All notices directed to be given to Shareholders shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled, other than a firm, be given to whichever of such person is named first in the Register of Shareholders, and notice

so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

154. Any notice, if served by post, shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in the ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post office or post box, and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

155. Any Shareholder who fails to give and register an address in Ceylon as provided in Article No. 151 shall

not be entitled to be given any notices.

156. All notices required to be given by advertisement shall be published in the Ceylon Government Gazette.

EVIDENCE.

157. On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the Register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

158. Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

159. If the Company shall be wound up, whether voluntarily or otherwise, the liquidator or liquidators may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may with the like sanction vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator or liquidators with the like sanction shall think fit, and if thought expedient any such division may be otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the members of the Company, and in particular any class may be given preferential or special rights or may be excluded altogether or in part, and the liquidator or liquidators shall be entitled to sell all or any of the assets of the Company in consideration of or in exchange for shares, ordinary, fully paid, part paid, or preference in the purchasing Company, but in case any division otherwise than in accordance with the legal rights of the contributories shall be determined on or any sale made of any or all of the assets of the Company in exchange for shares in the purchasing Company either ordinary, fully paid, or part paid, or preference, any contributory who would be prejudiced thereby shall have a right to dissent as if such determination were a special resolution passed pursuant to the section 192 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act of 1908 in England, but for the purposes of an arbitration as in the sub-section (6) of the said section provided, the provisions of the Ceylon Arbitration Ordinance, 1866, and of the Ceylon Ordinance, 2 of 1889, shall apply in place of the English and Scotch Acts referred to in the said sub-section (6) of section 192 of the aforewritten Companies (Consolidation) Act, and the said section 192, save as herein excepted, shall be deemed to be part and parcel of these present Articles.

THE name of the Company is "THE MAHARAJAH ESTATES COMPANY, LIMITED."

- The registered office of the Company will be situated in Colombo.
- The objects for which the Company is established are the following:---
- (a) To purchase, take on lease or exchange, or otherwise acquire estates, plantations, and lands of any kind in the Island of Ceylon, whether reclaimed or unreclaimed, and to pay for the same either wholly or partly in cash or in shares, bonds, debentures, or other securities of the Company, and to reclaim, fell, clear, plant, manage, improve, develop, or otherwise turn to account, or sell, lease, dispose of, or deal with all, or any part of these estates, plantations, and lands, and specially, but without prejudice to said generality, to acquire and take over the Maharajah and Conning Estates, situated in the North Matale District of the Island of Ceylon, and with a view thereto to adopt and carry into effect, either with or without modification, an agreement No. 142/452 dated January 11, 1923, and expressed to be made between Gordon Burton Denis Windus, Kate Marion Blurton Windus, and Edward Moore Windus of the one part and William Augustus Hartley of the other part.

(b) To plant, grow, and cultivate tea, cacao, india-rubber, camphor, timber, canes, fibres, nuts, fruits, grains, roots, and any other product of the soil of any kind or description, and to treat, render marketable, cure, refine, buy, sell, import, and export, and deal in, both wholesale and retail, and either in the prepared, manufactured, or raw states, any of these products, and all by-products of the same, and all commodities, liquids, articles, and things of all kinds which can conveniently be made or dealt in by the Company in connection therewith, and generally to carry on the business or businesses of planters, growers, cultivators, and manufacturers and

merchants of the above-mentioned products and others.

(c) To treat all the costs of and incidental to the bringing of the estates and lands acquired by the Company to the productive stage (including all local and home establishment and management charges, and Directors', Secretary's, and Auditors' fees, and interest on borrowed moneys), and also the expenses of obtaining reports on and titles to the said estates and lands, as part of the capital costs of the said estates and lands, and charge the same and the expenses of the formation of the Company against the capital of the Company or otherwise, as may be determined.

(d) To search for, get, win, work, raise, and render marketable, and use, sell, or otherwise dispose of any minerals, metals, precious or other stones, and other substances, liquids, or product on, in, or under any properties of the Company, and to acquire and grant prospecting and mining and other rights, licenses, or privileges for

such purposes or any of them.

(e) To purchase, take on lease or exchange, or otherwise acquire, either absolutely or conditionally, and either solely or jointly with others, any concessions, grants, claims, or rights, and any buildings, offices, warehouses, factories, machinery, works, easements, stores, provisions, furniture, live or dead stock, carts, wagons, effects, and any other property, real or personal, movable or immovable, of any kind whatsoever which may be deemed necessary or expedient for or in connection with any of the objects of the Company.

(f) To construct, erect, maintain, and improve, or aid in or subscribe towards the construction, erection, maintenance, and improvement of roads, tramways, railways, bridges, reservoirs, water-courses, drains, buildings, offices, warehouses, factories, machinery, and other works and appliances, and any means of communication, or of obtaining heat or power, or of carriage or transport, necessary or convenient for the Company's interests.

(g) To sell, dispose, of, exchange or transfer the undertaking and property of the Company or any part thereof

for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and that for payment in cash, or for shares (credited as fully or partly paid up), stock, debentures, securities, or property of any other company or persons, or for such other consideration as may be deemed proper, and to distribute the whole or any part of the price in cash or specie, howsoever paid or satisfied, among the members in or towards satisfaction of their interests in the assets of the Company.

(h) To purchase, or otherwise acquire, any inventions, patents, trade-marks, and the like calculated to benefit

the Company.

(i) To establish and maintain agencies and branches, and appoint managers, agents, and others to assist in the conduct or extension of the Company's businesses, and to remunerate the servants of the Company and others, out of or in proportion to the returns or profits of the Company, or otherwise as the Company may think fit.

(j) To borrow, raise, or secure the payment of money for the purposes of the Company on such terms and in such manner as may be deemed expedient, and to mortgage, charge, or pledge the undertaking, and all or any of the real and personal property, present and future, and all or any of the securities or uncalled capital for the time being of the Company in such manner as may be deemed expedient.

(k) To create, issue at par or at a premium, or at a discount debentures, mortgage debentures, debenture stock. and other securities payable to bearer or otherwise, and either permanent or redeemable with or without premium or repayable, and to secure any securities of the Company by means of a trust deed or otherwise.

(1) To draw, make, accept, endorse, and execute, and to discount, sell, deal in and issue cheques, promissory notes, bills of exchange, drafts, bills of lading, warrants, debentures, and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To lend or advance moneys, whether with or without security, to any person or company, and in particular to, or for, or in connection with the coolies, kanganies, customers, and others having dealings with the Company, and to make all payments or outlays that may be or may seem to be necessary or convenient for or in connection with the obtaining and maintaining of labour for working the estates of the Company.

(n) To amalgamate with any other company, whose objects are, or include objects similar, or allied to those of the Company or any of them, whether by sale or purchase (for shares or otherwise) of the undertaking, subject to the liabilities of this or any other such company as aforesaid with or without winding up, or by sale or purchase (for shares or otherwise) of all the shares or stock of this or any such other company as aforesaid, or by partnership or any arrangement of the nature of partnership or in any other manner.

(o) To be interested in, promote, and undertake the formation and establishment of any other company for the purpose of carrying on or for acquiring all or any of the property, rights, and liabilities of the Company, or for

(r) To support or subscribe to any public, local, charitable or useful object, and to give pensions, gratuities, donations, and emoluments to any persons, and support or subscribe to any person, institution, insurance companies, or trade societies, or associations or exhibitions which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to advance the interests of the Company or of the persons employed by or having dealings with the Company, and to effect insurances of any kind against risk or losses to the Company.

To procure the Company to be registered or recognized in Ceylon or elsewhere.

(t) To set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum or sums as a reserve or reserves for such purposes, and to be invested and dealt with in such manner as may from time to time be determined; and to place or invest any other of the moneys of the Company not immediately required for the purposes thereof upon such accounts, deposit receipts, securities, or investments as may from time to time be determined.

(u) To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world, and as principals, agents, brokers, contractors,

trustees, or otherwise, and by or through trustees, managers, agents, brokers, contractors, or others, and

either alone or in conjunction with any person or company.

(v) Generally to do all such things as are incidental, or, as the Company may think, conducive to the above objects

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE MAHARAJAH ESTATES COMPANY, LIMITED.

THE regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regula-

tions of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In these presents, unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith—

"The Company" means "The Maharajah Estates Company, Limited."
The "Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.
"These presents" means the Memorandum of Association of the Company and the Articles of Association of the

Company for the time being.

The Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

"Member" includes Shareholder.
"Paid up" shall include "credited as paid up."
"Month" means a calendar month.
"In Writing" means written or typewritten, or printed, partly written or typewritten, and partly printed.

"The Directors" means the Directors or Director for the time being.
"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy (in cases where by these Articles proxies are allowed), or by attorney at any meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution has been duly given.

Words importing the singular only include the plural number and vice versa.

Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine gender.

Words importing persons include corporations and firms.

2. No part of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of, or in loans upon, the security of the Company's shares.

3. The business of the Company may be commenced as soon after the incorporation of the Company as the Directors have been allotted.

shall think fit, and notwithstanding that part only of the shares may have been allotted.

4. The Company shall forthwith adopt the agreement referred to in sub-clause (a) of Clause III. of the Memorandum of Association, and shall carry the said agreement into effect with such modification (if any) as may be agreed upon. - 7,000 shares, numbered 1 to 7,000 inclusive, shall be preference shares, and shall confer the right for five years from and after the incorporation of the Company to a fixed non-cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of and after the incorporation of the company to a fixed hon-cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of 10 per cent. per annum, and from and after the expiry of said five years to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of 8 per cent. per annum on the amount for the time being paid up thereon, all before any payment or distribution is made on the ordinary shares, but which preference shares shall not be entitled to participate in any further distribution of profits or in any distribution of surplus assets; and 15,000 shares, numbered 7,001 to 22,000 inclusive, shall be ordinary shares, and shall confer the right to the whole

If the Company shall at any time offer any of its shares to the public for subscription, the Directors may pay a commission to the person subscribing or agreeing to subscribe or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions whether absolute or conditional for any shares so offered, but so that the commission shall not exceed 20 per cent. on the shares in each case offered.

CERTIFICATES.

Every member shall be entitled to a certificate under the common seal of the Company, and signed by at least one Director and the Secretary, specifying the share or shares held by him, and the amount paid up thereon, and if such certificate is worn out or lost, it may, on payment of Rs. 2.50 or such other sum as the Directors may prescribe, be renewed, provided that the Directors may require such evidence of such certificate being worn out or lost, and such indemnity as they may consider proper.

CALLS.

14. The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the members in respect of all moneys unpaid on the shares held by them respectively, and not by the conditions of allotment thereof made payable at fixed times, and each member shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors. A call may be made payable by instalments.

15. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call

was passed.

16. Fourteen days' notice of any call shall be given, specifying the time and place of payment and to whom such call shall be paid.

If the sum payable in respect of any call, or instalment, be not paid on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, the holder for the time being of the share in respect of which the call shall have been made or the instalment shall be due shall be liable to pay interest on the same at the rate of 8 per centum per annum from the date appointed for the payment thereof or the time of the actual payment, or at such rate as the Directors may determine.

18. The Directors may, if they think fit, receive from any member willing to advance the same all or any part of the money due upon the shares held by him beyond the sums actually called for, and upon the money so paid in advance, or so much thereof as from time to time exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon the shares, in respect of which such advance has been made, the Company may pay interest at such rate as the member paying such sum in advance and the Directors agree upon.

FORFEITURE AND LIEN.

19. If any member fail to pay any call, or instalment, on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call, or instalment, remains unpaid, serve a notice on such member requiring him to pay the same within twenty-one days from the date thereof, together with any interest that may have accrued, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment. Such notice shall contain a copy of the next following clause.

20. If the requisitions of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of all calls, or instalments, interest, and expenses due in respect thereof, be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect. Such forfeiture shall include all dividends declared in respect of the forfeited shares not actually paid before the forfeiture.

21. When any share shall have been so forfeited, notice of the resolution shall be given to the member in whose name it stood immediately prior to the forfeiture, and an entry of the forfeiture, with the date thereof, shall forthwith be made in the Register.

22. Any share so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and the Directors may sell, re-allot, or otherwise dispose of the same in such manner as they think fit.

disposed of, annul the forfeiture thereof upon such conditions as they think fit.

The Company shall have a first and paramount lien upon all the shares (other than fully paid-up shares) registered in the name of each member (whether solely or jointly with others) for his debts, liabilities, and engagements, solely or jointly with any other person, to or with the Company, whether the period for the payment, fulfilment, or discharge thereof shall have actually arrived or not. And such lien shall extend to all dividends from time to time declared in respect of such shares. Unless otherwise agreed the registration of a transfer of shares shall operate as a waiver of the Company's lien, if any, on such share.

25. For the purpose of enforcing such lien, the Directors may sell the shares subject thereto in such manner as they think fit, but no sale shall be made until such period as aforesaid shall have arrived, and until notice in writing of the intention to sell shall have been served on such member or his executors or administrators, and default shall have been made by him or them in the payment, fulfilment, or discharge of such debts, liabilities, or engagements for seven days

after such notice.

26. The nett proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of the debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such member or his executors, administrators, or assigns.

27. Upon any sale after forfeiture, or for enforcing a lien in purported exercise of the powers hereinbefore given, the Directors may cause the purchaser's name to be entered in the Register in respect of the shares sold, and the purchaser shall not be bound to see to the regularity of the proceedings or to the application of the purchase money; and after his name has been entered in the Register in respect of such shares, the validity of the sale shall not be impeached by any person, and the remedy of any person aggrieved by the sale shall be in damages only and against the Company exclusively.

TRANSFER AND TRANSMISSION.

The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed, both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the Register in respect thereof.

The instrument of transfer of any share shall be in writing in the usual form, or as near thereto as the circum-

stances will admit.

30. The Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares (or stock) upon which the Company have a lien;

transfer to a transfere of whom they do not approve. and in the case of shares not fully paid up may refuse to register a transfer to a transferee of whom they do not approve.

Every instrument of transfer shall be left at the office for registration, accompanied by the certificate of the shares to be transferred, and such other evidence as the Company may require to prove the title of the transferor or his right to transfer the shares, but the Directors may on receipt of approved indemnity waive the production of any certificate, upon being satisfied of the loss or destruction thereof.

All instruments of transfer which shall be registered shall be retained by the Company, but any instrument

of transfer which the Directors may decline to register shall be returned to the person depositing the same.

A fee not exceeding Rs. 2 50 may be charged for each transfer, and shall, if required by the Directors, be paid before the registration thereof.

The Transfer Books and Register of Members may be closed during such time as the Directors think fit, not

exceeding twenty-one days in each year.

The executors or administrators of a deceased member (not being one of several joint-holders) shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to the shares registered in the name of such member, and in case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any registered shares, the survivors shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to or interest in such shares.

36. Any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of any member upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, as the Directors think sufficient, may, with the consent of the Directors (which they shall not be under any obligation to give), be registered as a member in respect of such shares, or may, subject to the regulations as to transfer hereinbefore contained, transfer such shares. This clause is hereinafter referred to as the "Transmission Clause."

MODIFICATION OF RIGHTS.

If the capital of the Company, by reason of the issue of preference shares or otherwise, be divided into different classes of shares, all or any of the rights and privileges attached to each class may be modified by agreement between the Company and any person purporting to contract on behalf of that class, provided such agreement is ratified in writing by the holders of at least three-fourths of the issued shares of the class, or is confirmed by an extraordinary resolution passed at a separate General Meeting of the holders of shares of that class, and all the provisions hereinafter contained as to General Meetings of holders of the ordinary shares shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to every such separate meeting, but so that the quorum thereof shall be members holding or representing by proxy two-thirds of the nominal amount of the issued shares of the class. This clause is not to derogate from any power the Company would have had if the clause were omitted.

INCREASE AND REDUCTION OF CAPITAL.

38. The Company in General Meeting may from time to time increase the capital by the creation of new shares

of such amount as may be deemed expedient.

The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions, and with such rights and privileges annexed thereto as the General Meetings resolving upon the creation thereof shall direct, and if no direction be given, as the Directors shall determine, and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting, provided that no new shares shall be issued with any preferential right over or pari passu ranking with the preference shares in the original capital, except with the sanction of the holders of such preference shares given pursuant to Article 37.

40. The Company in General Meeting may, before the issue of any new shares, determine that the same or any of them shall be offered in the first instance, and either at par or at a premium, to all the then members or to any class thereof in proportion to the amount of the capital held by them, or make any other provisions as to the issue and allotment of the new shares, but in default of any such determination or so far as the same shall not extend, the new shares may be dealt with as if they formed part of the shares in the original ordinary capital.

41. Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue, or by these presents, any capital raised by the

creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original ordinary capital, and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payment of calls and instalments, transfer and transmission, forfeiture, lien, and otherwise.

42. The Company may from time to time by special resolution reduce its capital by paying off capital, or cancelling capital which has been lost or is unrepresented by available assets, or reducing the liability on the shares, or otherwise as may seem expedient, and capital may be paid off upon the footing that it may be called up again or otherwise.

43. The Company may from time to time by special resolution subdivide, or by ordinary resolution consolidate

its shares or any of them.

44. The special resolution whereby any share is subdivided may determine that, as between the holders of the shares resulting from such subdivision, one or more of such shares shall have any and what preference over the others or other, and that the profits applicable to the payment of dividends thereon shall be appropriated accordingly.

Borrowing Powers.

45. The Directors may from time to time at their discretion raise or borrow or secure the payment of any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company from any Shareholder or Director of the Company, or from any other person or persons or from any corporate body, but so that the amount at any one time owing in respect of moneys so raised or borrowed shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed one-half of the amount of the issued shares for the time being. Nevertheless, no lender or other person dealing with the Company shall be concerned to see or inquire whether the limit is observed.

46. The Directors may raise or secure the re-payment of such moneys in such manner and upon such terms and

conditions in all respects as they think fit, and in particular by the granting of mortgages, bonds, and dispositions in security containing power of sale, and by the issue of debentures or debenture stock of the Company charged upon all or any part of the property of the Company (both present and future), including its uncalled capital for the time being, or

without any such charge, or by the deposit of securities.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

The First General or Statutory Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time (not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company), and at such place as the Directors may determine.

48. Subsequent General Meeting shall be held once in every year, at such time and place as may be determined

by the Directors and shall be called Ordinary Meetings, and all other General Meetings of the Company shall be called

Extraordinary Meetings.

The Directors may, whenever they think fit, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, and Extraordinary 49. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, and Extraordinary General Meetings shall also be convened on a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-eighth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for or in default, may be convened by such requisitionists. If at any time there shall not be within the Island of Ceylon sufficient Directors capable of acting to form a quorum, any Director, or any two members of the Company, may convene an Extraordinary General Meeting in the same manner as nearly as possible as that in which meetings may be convened by the Directors.

50. Seven days' notice at the least (exclusive of the day on which the notice is served or deemed to be served, but inclusive of the day for which notice is given), specifying the place, the day, and the hour of meeting, and in case

but inclusive of the day for which notice is given), specifying the place, the day, and the hour of meeting, and in case of special business, the general nature of such business shall be given, either by an advertisement or by a notice sent by post or otherwise given as hereinafter provided; and with the consent in writing of all the members, a meeting may be convened by a shorter notice, and in any manner they think fit. The non-receipt of such notice by any members shall not invalidate

any resolution passed at any such meeting.

51. Where it is proposed to pass a special resolution the two meetings may be convened by one and the same notice, and it is to be no objection to such notice that it only convenes the second meeting contingently upon the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS.

52. The business of an Crdinary Meeting other than the first one shall be to receive and consider the accounts and balance sheets and to read the ordinary report of the Directors and Auditors, to declare a dividend, and elect Directors and other officers in the place of those retiring by rotation or otherwise, and to transact any other business which under these presents ought to be transacted at an Ordinary Meeting. All other business transacted at an Ordinary Meeting and all business transacted at an Extraordinary Meeting shall be deemed special.

53. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business. Save as herein otherwise provided, three members present personally or by

attorney shall be a quorum.

The Chairman (if any) of the Board of Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or is unwilling to act as Chairman, the members present shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Director be present, or if all the Directors present be unwilling to take the chair, then the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

55. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of members, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day next week, at the same time and place, and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those members who are present

shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

56. The Chairman of a General Meeting may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the same from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. When a meeting is adjourned for fourteen days or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of the original meeting. Save as aforesaid, it shall not be necessary to give any notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.

57. Every question submitted to a meeting shall, unless unanimously decided, be decided in the first instance on a show of hands by a majority of the members present in person and entitled to vote, and in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall, both on a show of hands and at a poll, have a casting vote in addition to the vote or votes to which he may be entitled as a member, on a show of hands a member present only by proxy shall have no vote, but they shall

not apply to an attorney who is not a Shareholder.

58. At any General Meeting (unless as regards a special resolution or an extraordinary resolution, a poll is demanded by at least five members, and as regards an ordinary resolution a poll is demanded by the Chairman or by a member or members holding or representing by proxy or entitled to vote in respect of at least one-tenth part of the issued capital represented at the meeting), a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, or carried by a particular majority, or lost, or not carried by a particular majority, and an entry to that effect in the books of proceedings of the Company shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

59. If a poll is demanded as aforesaid, it shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman of the meeting directs, and either at once or after an interval or adjournment or otherwise, and the result of the poll shall

be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.

No poll shall be demanded upon any question of adjournment or as to the election of a Chairman.

Votes of Members.

61. On a show of hands, every member present in person shall have one vote; and upon a poll, every member present in person or by proxy or by attorney shall have one vote for every twenty shares held by him.

Any person entitled under the transmission clause to transfer any share may vote at any General Meeting in respect thereof in the same manner as if he were the registered holder of such shares, provided that forty-eight hours at least before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposed to vote he shall satisfy the Directors of his right to transfer such shares, unless the Directors shall have previously admitted his right to vote at such meeting in respect thereof.

Where there are joint registered holders of any share, any one of such persons may vote at any meeting either personally or by proxy in respect of such share, as if he were solely entitled thereto; and if more than one of such jointholders be present at any meeting personally or by proxy, that one of the said persons so present, whose name stands first on the register in respect of such share, shall alone be entitled to vote in respect thereof. Several executors or administrators

of a deceased member in whose name any share stands shall, for the purpose of this clause, be deemed joint-holders thereof.

64. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney.

65. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of the appointer or of his attorney, or if such appointer is a corporation under its common seal. No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a member of the Company and qualified to vote, but a corporation being a member of the Company may appoint any one of its officers to be its proxy.

The instrument appointing a proxy and a power of attorney, if any, under which it is signed shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than forty-eight hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting, as the case may be, at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote, but no instrument appointing

a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve months from the date of its execution.

67. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid, notwithstanding the previous death of the principal, or revocation of the proxy, or transfer of the share in respect of which the vote is given, provided no intimation in writing of the death, revocation, or transfer shall have been received at the registered office

of the Company before the meeting.

68. No member shall be entitled to be present, or to vote on any question either personally or by proxy or as proxy for another member, at any General Meeting or upon a poll, or be reckoned in a quorum, whilst any call or other sum

shall be due and not paid to the Company in respect of any of the shares of such member.

69. An instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form, or in any other form which the Directors shall approve:-

"I--being a member of the--Company, Limited, hereby appointa member of the Company, whom failing--another member of the Company as my proxy to vote ---offor me and on my behalf at the Ordinary (or Extraordinary) General Meeting of the Company to be held on the day of— -and at any adjournment thereof. Signed by me on thisday of--192

Any resolution passed by the Directors, notice whereof shall be given to the members in the manner in which notices are hereinafter directed to be given, and which shall within one month after it shall have been so passed be ratified and confirmed in writing by members entitled at a poll to three-fifths of the votes, shall be as valid and effectual as a resolution of a General Meeting, but this clause shall not apply to a resolution for winding up the Company, or to a resolution passed in respect of any matter which by the Ordinance or these presents requires to be dealt with by special or extraordinary

DIRECTORS.

71. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting of the Company, the number of the Directors shall be two,

three, or four.

72. The persons hereinafter named shall be the first Directors of the Company, that is to say, Edward Moore Windus, Gordon Burton Denis Windus, and Peter Rolland Shand, but the said Edward Moore Windus shall not act as Director until after execution of the agreement referred to in Article 3 and the allotment of shares in terms thereof, until after which allotment the said Gordon Burton Denis Windus and Peter Rolland Shand shall act as sole Directors. The said Gordon Burton Denis Windus, Kate Marion Blurton Windus, wife of the said Gordon Burton Denis Windus, and Edward Moore Windus so long as they or any of them or their or any of their executors shall hold shares in the Company to the number of not less than 2,000 ordinary shares in the aggregate shall be entitled to appoint a Shareholder in the Company to be a Director whenever and for such period as they shall think fit, and the said William Augustus Hartley or his executors so long as he or they shall hold shares in the Company to the number of not less than 2,000 ordinary shares shall also be entitled to appoint a Shareholder to be a Director whenever and for such period as he or they shall think fit, and the provisions of Articles 82 and 86 shall not apply to such Directors, respectively, so long as the said Gordon Burton Denis Windus, Kate Marion Blurton Windus, and Edward Moore Windus or their or any of their executors shall hold shares in the Company to the number of not less than 2,000 ordinary shares in the aggregate, and the said William Augustus Hartley and his executors shall hold shares in the Company to the number of not less than 2,000 ordinary shares

73. The Directors shall have power from time to time to appoint any other person to be a Director, but so that the total number of the Directors shall not at any time exceed the maximum number fixed as above.

74. The qualification of every Director shall be the holding of 50 ordinary shares of the Company. Director may act before acquiring his qualification, but shall in any case acquire the same within three months from his appointment, and he shall be deemed to have agreed to take the said shares from the Company, and the same shall be forthwith allotted to him accordingly.

75. A Director may retire from his office upon giving one month's notice in writing to the Company of his intention

so to do, and such resignation shall take effect upon the expiration of such notice, or its earlier acceptance

76. The remuneration of the Directors shall from time to time be determined by the Company in Ordinary General

- Meeting, and, until otherwise determined, shall be Rs. 300 per annum to each Director, payable yearly.

 77. The continuing Directors may act, notwithstanding any vacancy in their body, but so that if the number falls below the minimum above fixed, the Directors shall not, except for the purpose of filling vacancies, act so long as the number is below the minimum.
- A Director may hold any other office or place of profit in the Company in conjunction with the office of Director, 78. and on such terms as to remuneration, tenure of office, and otherwise as the Directors may arrange.

79. The office of a Director shall ipso facto be vacated-

(1) If he become bankrupt or lunatic.

If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns his office.

(3) If he cease to hold his qualification.

Any Director may contract with the Company, and shall not be disqualified by reason of his being interested either individually or as a member of a partnership, company, or corporation in any contract or business which may be undertaken or proposed to be undertaken by or for this Company, or in which this Company may be interested, and such Director shall not be bound to account to this Company for any profit which he may derive from his being so interested, but he shall disclose to the Directors the fact of his being so interested, and shall not be entitled to vote in respect of any contract or business in which he is interested. A Director of this Company may be or become a Director of any Company promoted by this Company, or in which it may be interested as vendor, purchaser, shareholder, or otherwise, and no such Director shall be accountable for any benefits received as Director of member of such Company.

ROTATION OF DIRECTORS.

81. 'At the Ordinary General Meeting to be held in the year 1924, and at every succeeding Ordinary General Meeting, one Director shall retire from office, but a retiring Director shall retain office until the dissolution or adjournment of the meeting at which his successor is elected.

82. The Director to retire at the Ordinary General Meeting to be held in the year 1924 shall, unless the Directors agree among themselves, be determined by lot; in every subsequent year the Director who has been longest in office shall retire. As between two or more who have been in office an equal length of time, the Director to retire shall, in default of agreement between them, be determined by lot. The length of time a Director has been in office shall be computed from last election or appointment where he has previously vacated office. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-

The Company at any GeneralMeeting at which any Directors retire, in manner aforesaid, shall fill up the

vacated offices by electing a like number of persons to be Directors.

84. If at any General Meeting, at which an election of Directors ought to take place, the places of the retiring Directors are not filled up, the retiring Directors, or such of them as have not had their places filled up, shall, if willing, continue in office until the ordinary meeting in the next year, and so on from year to year until their places are filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

Any casual vacancy among the Directors may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall

not retain his office longer than the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy has occurred.

86. The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and appoint another qualified person in his stead. The person so appointed shall hold office during such time only as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

87. No person not being a Director shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any General Meeting, unless he, or some other member intending to propose him, has at least seven clear days before the meeting left at the office of the Company a notice in writing, duly signed, signifying his candidature for the office, or the intention of such member, to propose him.

MANAGING DIRECTOR AND MANAGER.

88. The Directors may, from time to time, appoint one or more of their body to be Managing Director or Managing Directors, or they may appoint any one or more of their body or any other person to be manager or managers of the Company, in either case for a fixed time or without any limitation as to the period for which he, or they, is, or are, to hold such office, and may from time to time, subject to any contract or agreement between him or them and the Company, remove or dismiss him or them from office, and appoint another (or other) in his or their place or places. The said Edward Moore Windus shall be the first Managing Director, and shall hold office for a period of five years, and shall be paid a salary of Rs. 1,000 per annum and shall also be paid his reasonable travelling expenses.

A Managing Director shall not, while he continues to hold that office, be subject to retirement by rotation, and he shall not be taken into account in determining the rotation of retirement of Directors, but he shall, subject to the provisions of any contract between him and the Company, be subject to the same provisions as to resignation and removal as the other Directors of the Company, and if he ceases to hold the office of Director from any cause he shall, ipso facto,

and immediately cease to be a Managing Director.

90. The remuneration of a Managing Director or manager shall from time to time be fixed by the Directors, and

may be by salary, or commission, or participation in profits, or by any or all of these modes.

91. The Directors may from time to time by writing signed by them all entrust to, and confer upon, the Managing Directors or Managing Director or managers or manager for the time being, such of the powers exercisable under these presents by the Directors as they may think fit, and may confer such powers for such time and to be exercised for such objects and purposes, and upon such terms and conditions, and with such restrictions as they think expedient; and they may confer such powers, either collaterally with, or to the exclusion of, and in substitution for, all or any of the powers of the Directors in that behalf, and may from time to time revoke, withdraw, alter, or vary all or any of such powers.

LOCAL MANAGEMENT.

92. The Directors may, from time to time, provide for the management and transaction of the affairs of the estates or affairs of the Company in the District of Matale in Ceylon or in any other specified locality, whether at home or abroad,

in such manner as they think fit.

Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by these presents, the Directors may from time to time and at any time appoint any person or persons, firm, or company as local manager or agent for managing the estates of the Company or any part of them, or any of the local affairs of the Company in Ceylon, or in any other specified locality, and they may by power of attorney under the seal of the Company appoint any person or persons to be the attorney or attorneys of the Company in such locality for such purposes and with such powers (including a power to sub-delegate), authorities, and directions (not exceeding those vested in or exercisable by the Directors under these presents), and for such period and subject to such conditions as the Directors may from time to time think fit, and any such attorneys may be authorized by the Directors to sub-delegate all or any of the powers, authorities, and discretions for the time being vested in them.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

94. The Directors may meet together for the dispatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings and proceedings as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two of the Directors shall be a quorum. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of the Directors to a Director who is not in the Island of Ceylon.

95. A Director who is not in the Island of Ceylon.

95. A Director may, at any time, and the Secretary upon the request of a Director, shall convene a meeting of the Directors. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

96. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office; but if no such Chairman is elected, or if at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the Directors present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

97. A meeting of the Directors for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers, and discretions by or under the regulations of the Company for the time being

vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally.

98. The Directors may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they think fit. Any committee so formed shall, in the exercise of the powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed on it by the Directors.

99. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two or more members shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not superseded by any regulations made by the Directors under the last preceding clause.

100. All acts done by any meeting of the Directors or by a committee of Directors, or by any person acting as a Director, shall notwithstanding that it shall afterwards be discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of such Directors or persons or person acting as aforesaid, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director.

101. A resolution in writing, signed by all the Directors resident in the Island of Ceylon, shall be as valid as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly convened and constituted.

SEAL OF THE COMPANY AND EXECUTION OF DEEDS BY THE COMPANY.

The Directors shall provide for the making and safe custody of the Company's common seal, and may make regulations for its use. Every deed requiring to be executed by the Company shall be sealed with the Company's seal, and subscribed, on behalf of the Company, by one of the Directors and by the secretary or secretaries of the Company who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the secretaries, in the event of a firm or registered. Company being the secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, director, secretary, or agent of the said firm or Company signing for or on behalf of the said firm or Company as such secretaries.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

103. The management of the business of the Company shall be vested in the Directors, who, in addition to the powers and authorities by these presents, or otherwise expressly conferred upon them, may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as are within the scope of the Memorandum of Association of the Company, and are not hereby or by Ordinance expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, but subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Ordinance and of these presents and to any regulations from time to time made by the Company in General Meeting, provided that no regulation so made shall invalidate any prior act of the Directors which would have been valid if such regulations had not been made.

104. Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by the last preceding Articles, and the other powers-

conferred by these presents, the Directors shall have the following powers, that is to say :-

(1) To pay the costs, charges, and expenses of, and incidental to, the formation of the Company, and charge the

same against the capital of the Company.

(2) To purchase or otherwise acquire for the Company by public sale or private bargain any estate, lands, property, rights, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire, and to sell or lease the same at such price or consideration, and generally on such terms and conditions as they may think fit.

(3) At their discretion to pay for any estate, lands, property, rights, or privileges acquired by, or services rendered to, the Company either wholly or partially in cash or in shares, bonds, debentures, or other securities of the Company, and so that any such amount may be issued as fully paid up, or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon, and any such bonds, debentures, or other securities may be either specially or otherwise charged upon all or any part of the property of the Company and its uncalled capital or not so charged; and to treat, either in whole or in part and temporarily or permanently, the costs of and incidental to the bringing of the estates and lands acquired by the Company to the productive stage (including all local and home establishment and management charges, and Director's, Secretary's, and Auditors' fees and interest on borrowed moneys), and also the expense of obtaining reports on, and titles to, the said estates and lands, as part of the capital costs of the said estates and lands, and charge the same against the capital of the Company or otherwise as the Directors may think fit.

(4) To secure the fulfilment of any contracts or engagements entered into by the Company by mortgage or charge of all or any part of the property of the Company and its uncalled capital, or in such other manner as they

may think fit.

(5) To appoint, and, at their discretion, remove, or suspend such managers, secretaries, officers, clerks, agents, and servants for permanent, temporary, or special services, as they from time to time think fit, and to determine their duties and powers and fix their salaries or emoluments, and to require security in such instance and to such amounts as they think fit.

(6) To appoint agents and attorneys for the Company in Great Britain or Ceylon or in any other specified locality with such powers (including a power to sub-delegate) as may be thought fit, and to provide if necessary for the management of the affairs of the Company, or all or any part of its estates or property in such locality, by any

other Company or firm or person.

(7) To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, or abandon any legal proceedings by or against the Company or its officers, or otherwise concerning the business affairs or estates of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to the Company, and to compromise any claims or demands by or against the Company.

(8) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and to observe and perform the

awards.

(9) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company, and for claimsand demands of the Company. (10) From time to time to authorize any person or persons to sign bills, notes, receipts, acceptances, endorsements,

cheques, releases, contracts, and other documents on behalf of the Company.

(11) To invest and deal with any of the moneys of the Company not immediately required for the purposes thereof in such securities or investments, real or personal, and in such manner as they may think fit, and from time to time vary or realize such investments; or to place such moneys on open account, or deposit receipt (for fixed period or at call) with any bank, municipality, or company having an office or branch in Great Britain or Ceylon or elsewhere abroad as the Directors may deem expedient.

(12) To give to any officer or other person employed by the Company a commission on the profits of any particular business or transaction or a share in the general profits of the Company, and so that such commission or share of the profits shall be treated as part of the working expenses of the Company.

(13) From time to time to make, vary, and repeal by laws for the regulation of the business of the Company. Provided that no by-law or regulation shall be made under this power which would amount to such an addition or to alteration of these Articles as could only be legally made by a special resolution passed and confirmed in accordance with the Ordinance.

(14) To give, award, or allow any pension, gratuity, or compensation to any employee of the Company, or his widow or children that may appear to them just or proper, whether such employee, his widow, or children have or

have not a legal claim upon the Company.

(15) To enter into all such negotiations and contracts, and rescind and vary all such contracts, and execute and do all such acts, deeds, and things in the name and on behalf of the Company as they may consider expedient for or in relation to any of the matters aforesaid or otherwise for the purposes of the Company.

SECRETARY.

105. The Directors shall appoint a Secretary to the Company either of their own number or any other person, and they may appoint an interim Secretary, who shall for the purposes of these presents be deemed to be the Secretary in either case at such salary and on such terms and conditions as the Directors shall think fit.

DIVIDENDS AND RESERVE.

- 106. The Company in General Meeting may declare a dividend; but no dividend shall exceed the amount recommended by the Directors.
- 107. The Directors may from time to time pay to the members such interim dividends as appear to the Directors to be justified by the profits of the Company.
- 108. No dividend shall be payable otherwise than out of profits, and no such dividend shall bear interest against the Company.
- 109. Subject to the rights of person entitled to shares with special rights as to dividend, all dividends shall be declared and paid according to the amounts paid on the shares. No amount paid on a share in advance of calls shall while carrying interest be treated for the purposes of this clause as paid on the share.
- 110. The Directors may before recommending any dividend set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum or sums as they think proper as a reserve or reserves, which shall at the absolute discretion of the Directors be applicable for meeting contingencies or for equalizing dividends, or for planting, developing, cultivating, or improving or maintaining any of the estates or other property of the Company, or for any other purposes which the Directors may think conducive to the interests of the Company, and the Directors may invest the several sums so set aside in such securities or investments or property, real or personal (other than shares of the Company), as they may think fit, and may from time to time deal with and vary such investments and dispose of all or any part thereof for the benefit of the Company, and may divide the reserves into such special funds as they may think fit with full power to employ the assets constituting the reserves in the business of the Company, and that without being bound to keep the same separate from the other assets of the Company.
- 111. The Directors may retain any dividend on which the Company has a lien, and may apply the same in or towards satisfaction of the debts, liabilities, or engagements in respect of which the lien exists.
- 112. The Directors may retain the dividends payable upon shares or stock in respect of which any person is under the transmission clause entitled to become a member or which any person under that clause is entitled to transfer until such person shall become a member in respect thereof shall duly transfer the same.
- 113. In case several persons are registered as the joint-holders of any share or stock, any of su h persons may give effectual receipts for all dividends and payments on account of dividends in respect of such share or stock.
- 114. Unless otherwise directed, any dividend may be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post to the registered address of the member entitled, or in the case of joint-holders to that one whose name stands first on the register in respect of the joint-holding, and every cheque so sent shall be made payable to the order of the person to whom it is sent.

ACCOUNTS.

- 115. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Company and the matter in respect of which such receipt and expenditure takes place and of the assets and liabilities of the Company.
- 116. The books of account shall be kept at the registered office of the Company, or at such other place or places as the Directors think fit, and shall always be open to the inspection of the Directors.
- 117. The Directors shall, from time to time, determine whether if at all, and to what extent, and at what time and places, and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of the members, and no member (not being a Director) shall have any right of inspecting any account or books or document of the Company, except as conferred by Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.
- 118. Any extraordinary expenditure may be spread over any series of years, and for the purpose of calculating sprofits such expenditure or any part thereof for the time being not written off may be reckoned as an asset.
- 119. Once at least in every year after the year 1924 the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a profit and loss account for the period since the preceding account, or (in the case of the first account) since the date of the last balance sheet made up to a date not more than six months before such meeting.
- 120. A balance sheet shall be made out in every year and laid before the Company in General Meeting made up to a date not more than six months before such meeting. The balance sheet shall be accompanied by a report of the Directors as to the state of the Company's affairs, and the amount (if any) which they recommend to be paid by way of dividend or bonus, and the amount (if any) which they propose to carry to a reserve fund.
- 121. In every year after the year 1924 a copy of such profit and loss account, balance sheet, and report shall be sent to every member holding at least 200 ordinary shares of the Company, or in the case of joint-holders to the first named in the register seven days at least before the meeting at which the same is to be submitted. Till the end of said year the Directors shall from time to time by circular to such members report as to general progress of affairs.

AUDIT.

- 122. No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during his continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.
- 123. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration. He or they shall hold office till the First General Meeting of the Company. All subsequent appointments shall, except as is hereinafter mentioned, be made at the Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and the Auditor or Auditors appointed at such meeting shall hold office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment, or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.
- 124. The remuneration of the Auditors, other than the first, shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.
 - 125. Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

- 126. If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor is not supplied at the Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur in the office of Auditor, the Directors shall fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person or persons who shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting after his or their appointment.
- 127. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting after his appointment, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto, and to report thereon to the meeting generally or specially, as he may think fit.
- 128. The Auditor or Auditors for the time being shall have a list delivered to him or them of all books kept by the Company, and he or they shall at all reasonable hours in the daytime have access to all accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company for the purpose of audit.
- 129. Every account of the Directors when audited and approved by a General Meeting shall be conclusive, except as regards any error discovered within three months next after the approval thereof. Whenever any such error is discovered within that period, the accounts shall forthwith be corrected and thenceforth shall be conclusive.

NOTICES.

- 130. A notice may be given by the Company to any member either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid envelope addressed to such member at his registered place of address.
- 131. Each holder of registered shares whose registered place of address is not in the Island of Ceylon may from time to time notify in writing to the Company an address in the said Island of Ceylon, which shall be deemed his registered place of address within the meaning of the last preceding clause.
- 132. As regards those members who have no registered place of address in Great Britain or Ceylon, a notice posted up in the office shall be deemed to be well served on them at the expiration of twenty-four hours after it is so posted up.
- 133. All notices shall, with respect to any registered shares to which persons are jointly entitled, be given to which ever of such persons is named first in the register, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all holders of such shares
- 134. Any notice if given by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter containing the same is put into the Post Office, and in proving the giving of the notice it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into the Post Office.

WINDING UP.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, December 5, 1923, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated November 28, 1923.

Present:—Mr. T. Reid, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; the Hon, Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E., M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, M.L.C.; Mr. W. Philps; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee; Mr. A. D. Prouse; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. H. F. Clarke; and the Hon. Mr. L. Macrae, M.L.C.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 8, 1923, having been previously printed and copies thereof

having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

When the Chairman put the question whether the Minutes of the previous meeting be confirmed, Dr. E. V. Ratnam inquired why the question of the month's grace for the payment of rates which he had raised at the last meeting and which was submitted to the Standing Committees for further consideration on the resolution of Council was not included in the agenda of this Meeting of Council.

The Chairman explained that the Committees had considered the matter, and as they had decided that no further

action was to be taken the question had not been submitted to the Council.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo then intimated that he would, later in the proceedings, move that the matter be considered.

It was then resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of November 8, 1923, be confirmed.

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 2 to 7 (inclusive) on the agenda.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

ANNEXURE A.

(1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Municipal Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the aggregate amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided, however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under this Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from this Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the

Provided further that in no case shall a pension calculated in accordance with the above proviso exceed by more than Rs. 3,750 per annum the pension to which the officer in question would be otherwise entitled under these regulations. (2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any

Local Government, public body, or bodies.

The term "aggregate" salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive posts held by an officer in the course of his career, disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, December 12, 1923, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 5, 1923, to consider finally the Budget for the year 1924, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

Present:—Mr. T. Reid, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E., M.L.C.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford, M.L.C.; Mr. W. Philps; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. E. W. Jayewardene, K.C.; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; Mr. J. S. Collett; Mr. A. D. Prouse; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. H. F. Clarke; and the Hon. Mr. L. Macrae, M.L.C.

(Mr. E. H. Joseph, Secretary, and Mr. G. H. N. Saunders, Financial Assistant, were also present.)

With the permission of the Council, the Chairman moved that this Council place on record its appreciation of the services of Dr. W. P. Rodrigo who has been the Member for the Wellawatta Ward from January, 1912, to December, 1923. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded. Carried unanimously.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo expressed his thanks for the kind references made in appreciation of his services in the Council.

2. To consider a memorandum of the Chairman dated December 6, 1923, with regard to the nomination of two members by the Municipal Council to the Education District Committee of the Colombo Municipality, under Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

A discussion arose as to the powers conferred by the Ordinance on the Governor to appoint more than two members of the Municipal Council to the Education District Committee.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that Mr. C. P. Dias, the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, and Dr. E. A. Coeray be appointed, and that the Chairman be authorized to request the Governor to appoint a third member under the provisions of section 18 (3) of the Ordinance, it being understood that if it is found that only two members can be appointed, Mr. C. P. Dias and the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, be the nominees of the Council for appointment to the Committee. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider the Budget for 1924. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

A Budget containing:—(a) An estimate for the available Municipal income; (b) Details of proposed expenditure, as printed and published in the Government Gazette and circulated among the members, and submitted to Council on December 5, 1923, according to the provisions of sections 97 and 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, was laid before the Council in Committee.

The Chairman next pointed out the following amendments which had to be made in the Budget, giving the reasons for each amendment:—

The amendments were agreed to, and the Council in Committee then proceeded to consider *seriatim* the items under the different headings.

The estimated revenue was then considered and passed subject to the amendments detailed above.

The Council next considered the estimated expenditure.

I.—Works Department.—Item 65. Asphalting road surfaces, Colpetty, Galle Face Centre road, Main street, Pettah, Symond's and Dean's roads, and Dematagoda road, Rs. 100,000.

After a discussion, it was resolved that the item be passed.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the sum of Rs. 89,000 be sanctioned for the widening of Bambalapitiya road from its junction with Buller's road up to its junction with Brownrigg road, if and when the Government refunds the Customs duties paid by the Council since October 1, 1922. Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that a sum of Rs. 2,000 be included as item No. I. (k) to 69 for the addition of the names in Sinhalese and Tamil to the street signs of the city. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

L.—Assessing Department.—With regard to the application of Mr. E. G. Eastman, the Municipal Assessor, for the post of Government Assessor, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, with the permission of the Council, moved that the Council requests the Chairman to point out to His Excellency the Governor and the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the very great inconvenience and loss this Council will be put to if the Council has to lose the services of this officer at this time, and further to appeal to them not to entertain his application for the post. Mr. E. W. Jayewardene seconded.

Mr. A. E. de Silva, Mr. R. L. Pereira, and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion.

Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy spoke to the motion.

Mr. J. S. Collett and Mr. A. D. Prouse opposed the motion.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo rose to a point of order as Mr. Prouse was reading his speech. After some discussion, the Chairman held that Mr. Prouse could continue to read his speech, if the speech had been written out by himself. Mr. Prouse continued to read his speech.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene suggested that the motion be amended as follows:

- (1) The conduct of Mr. Eastman, the Municipal Assessor, in applying for the post of Government Assessor before the expiration of the term of his agreement with this Council, and at a time when he is assessing Government property for this Council does not meet with the approval of this Council.
- (2) The Council further requests the Chairman to point out to His Excellency the Governor and the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the very great inconvenience and loss this Council will be put to if the Council has to lose the services of this officer at this time, and further to appeal to them not to entertain his application for the post favourably.

This amendment was accepted by the mover, and was submitted as the original motion.

Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy moved, as an amendment, that the Chairman should communicate to Mr. Eastman, the views expressed by the Members of this Council with regard to his intention to leave the services of this Council, and request him to withdraw his application to Government. Mr. T. H. Tatham seconded.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene suggested an amalgamation of the motion and the amendment with the addition of the following words to the motion:

(3) And that in the event of Mr. Eastman withdrawing his application to Government no further action be taken.

Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy accepted this amendment, and the motion, as amended, was put to the Meeting and carried. The Chairman moved that the taxes proposed to be levied for 1924 under the Municipal Council's Ordinance, 1910,

and enumerated on page 16 of the Budget be imposed and enforced. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.-Carried.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume, and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the Budget, as amended, and the resolutions of Council in Committee with regard thereto be adopted. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, as required by section 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, December 15, 1923, at 10.15 a.m., in accordance with the Notice dated December 11, 1923.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. È. de Silva; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. P. M. Bingham; and Dr. R. F. La Brooy.

- 1. The Chairman laid before the Meeting the Budget for the year 1924, with the schedule of rates and taxes proposed to be levied in 1924, as approved by the four Standing Committees at their Meeting held on November 7, 1923, and duly published in the Government Gazette and circulated among the Councillors, and as amended at the Meeting of Council held on November 28, 1923.
- (1) Resolved that the Budget be adopted with the following amendments:—Include estimates for septic tank latrine in Katukele Lake road, Rs. 6,500; retaining wall near Lake spill, Rs. 1,200; repairs to Dharma lines, Deiyannewela, Rs. 250.

Delete from the Budget, estimates for drains round the Esplanade, Rs. 5,350.

Reduce the estimates for barrel drains in King street, from Rs. 6,000 to Rs. 4,950; cement concrete drains along Victoria Drive, from Rs. 2,400 to Rs. 1,200; Asgiriya road, from Rs. 4,632 to Rs. 4,282.

Mr. De Silva dissents from the decision to provide for a septic tank latrine to the exclusion of the drains round the

Esplanade.

- (2) Resolved further that from January 1, 1924, a property rate of 16 per cent. be levied in the water served area, this area to include Katugastota, which will be served by the proposed extension of water supply, and 8 per cent. in the remaining area. Other taxes to be levied as in 1923.
- 2. Resolved that the following unexpended balances on votes for 1923 be revoted in the Budget for 1924:—Estimate 21/1923, treating Victoria Drive with tar, Rs. 2,360 · 22; estimate 25/1923, rebuilding barrel drains in King street, Rs. 3,540 · 53; estimate 29/1923, extending Municipal free school, Rs. 2,714 · 40; estimate 33/1923, fixing mirrors at dangerous turns, Katugastota road, Rs. 150; estimate 39/1923, repairing culvert, Lewella road, Rs. 500.
- 3. Resolved that tenders be invited for the following works:—Building drains along Victoria Drive, building drains along Peradeniya road (Peradeniya end), building drains along Peradeniya road (town end), building a set of meat stalls in Trincomalee street, Asgiriya road (opening of further section), converting Katugastota toll house into a market, building barrel drains in King street.
- 4. At the conclusion of the business the Chairman referred to the valuable services rendered by the outgoing Members' Messrs. Vallipuram and Perera, and moved "that this Council do place on record their sense of appreciation of the services rendered to the Council by Messrs. Vallipuram and Perera." Mr Ratwatte seconded, and Mr. De Silva spoke in support of the motion, which was carried unanimously.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, December 8, 1923, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated December 3, 1923.

Present:—Mr. F. Bartlett, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene; Mr. H. M. Macan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. W. W. Morgan; and Dr. F. R. Alles.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 10, 1923, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

With the permission of Council, the Chairman introduced the Director of Education, whom he had invited to be present, to consider the provisions of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920, relating to education in the Municipal area. The Director explained what was intended by the formation of Education District Committees, and replied to questions asked by the Members.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene asked-

(1) Will the Town Hall offered to be built by Mudaliyar B. P. de Silva Warnakulasuriya Goonewardene on the site of the present tennis court in Victoria park, as a gift to the town, ever be an accomplished fact?

(2) If he has changed his mind, does he give any good reason for so doing after the matter had been so often referred to in the newspapers?

The Chairman replied:—I have referred the questions to Mudaliyar B. P. de Silva, and I am not at present able to give a reply as I have not heard from him.

3. Letter from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, referring to the training of horses on the esplanade—After some discussion the further consideration of the matter was deferred.

4. Report of the Inspector-General of Police referring to the removal of obstructions on roads:—Considered. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council.

- 5.—Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 8, 1923.
- (3) List of demolished buildings in Wards 2, 3, 5, 4 east and 4 west.—Recommended that the rates be struck off. (4) Rating of sites of demolished and vacated buildings in the Bazaar area.—Recommended that the minimum rate of Re. 1 per annum be levied from 1st quarter, 1924.

(5) Renting of the esplanade pavilion.—Recommended that preference be given to the Galle Cricket Club on the occasion of cricket matches played by that club.

(6) Papers referring to the lease of the trees in the Segregation Camp and Infectious Diseases Hospital.—Recommended that the lessee's application be refused, and that payment of rent for the 4th quarter, 1923, be demanded forthwith. (7) Repairs to the Bazaar sewer.—Recommended that tenders be invited.

"Improvements in manufacture in the drying of black tea and produce and in apparatus for the same."

Abstract.—The applicant describes a process in which air is cooled and its moisture content reduced by means of a dehydrating agent. The air is then heated and used to dehydrate tea or other substance. The same air is then cooled and sent round the same cycle as before. An apparatus is described in which the process can be carried out.

The claims are :-

1. In the manufacture of black tea or the like, steps in a process of drying the produce by air prepared for the purpose comprising, cooling the air in a chamber such as a chamber provided with water-cooled pipes or the like to condense wholly or partially its moisture content, delivering that cooled air into a chamber provided with frames or the like carrying a heated moisture-absorbing substance or substances where the said cooled air is heated and more completely dried, delivering that dried and heated air to a chamber containing the tea or other produce to be dried, and delivering it along with some additional air admitted to compensate for leakage to the chamber where it is cooled to condense partially or wholly its moisture content as aforesaid, and repeating the cycle as aforedescribed; and apparatus in combination for carrying out the aforesaid cycle of steps:

Apparatus for heating air and absorbing partially or wholly the moisture content of it, comprising a chamber provided with movable and interchangeable frames or grids or the like arranged in series, the said frames being covered or wound or interlaced with asbestos yarn or the like impregnated with a moisture-absorbing substance such as calcium chloride, the said frames or the like wound or interlaced with impregnated asbestos yarn or the like as aforedescribed, having been previously heated, and through which said chamber so provided air to be heated and dried is made to pass

by means of a fan or impeller or the like.

3. Apparatus for heating and drying the frames or the like covered or wound or interlaced with impregnated asbestos yarn or the like claimed in claim 2, comprising a chamber communicating with the chamber claimed in claim 2 by means of two or more valved ports or air locks through which the said covered frames or the like can be withdrawn from or introduced into the aforesaid chamber claimed in claim 2, and provided with furnaces supplying hot gases to the said covered frames for heating them and for driving off the moisture from the said moisture-absorbing substance after they have been withdrawn in succession from and prior to introducing them again into the chamber claimed in claim 2 through the valved ports as aforesaid.

4. Apparatus for subjecting the leaf or other produce to be dried to the action of the heated and dried air delivered from the chamber claimed in claim 2, comprising a chamber provided with movable trays or the like in which is spread the tea leaf or other produce to be dried and over and between which the heated and dried air prepared as claimed in the

foregoing claims 1, 2, and 3 is made to pass by means of the fan or impeller or the like described in claim 2.

5. Apparatus for cooling the air and condensing partially or wholly its moisture content after having been made to pass through the drying chamber claimed in claim 4, comprising a chamber provided with water-cooled pipes or the like through which the said moisture laden air is made to pass, as well as between and around the said water-cooled pipes, by means of the fan or impeller or the like described in claim 2 and from which it is conducted to the heating and drying chamber claim 2, by a duct in which the stream of cooled air is regulated by the aforesaid fan or impeller.

6. Apparatus for carrying out the cycle of steps in the process of drying the produce by air described in claim 1 comprising: -(1st) the heating and moisture-absorbing chamber provided and fitted as claimed in claim 2; (2nd) the chamber provided and fitted as claimed in claim 3; (3rd) the produce drying chamber as claimed in claim 4; (4th) the cooling and condensing chamber together with the regulating fan or impeller in the duct leading therefrom as claimed in claim 5 in combination.

"Apparatus and method for drying coffee, &c."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a process and apparatus for heating the air in a drying room in which super-heated water (i.e., water above 100°C) is passed through a horizontal pipe system below the floor, the inlet air passes up through this pipe system and so becomes heated. The furnace is at a lower level so that the water in the closed pipe system circulates on the thermo-syphon principle.

The claims are :-

1. A process of drying coffee, rubber, or copra and the like products, by passing dry heated air between the products, characterized by employing super-heated water as the heat-transmitting medium.

2. Apparatus for use in carrying out the process claimed in claim 1, characterized by a tube-system for circulating

the super-heated water.

3. Apparatus for use in carrying out the process claimed in claim 1 characterized by a drying floor, system under

the floor, a furnace and a tube system located in the furnace and connected to the first mentioned tube-system.

4. Apparatus as claimed in claim 3, in which the tube-system is formed by a series of tubes arranged spirally or in a ziz-zag line and placed in staggered relation to each other nearly horizontally under the drying floor and the tubes in the furnace are similarly arranged in a spiral or zig-zag line.

"Improvements in Long Telegraph Cables."

Abstract.—A telegraph conductor is provided with a layer of magnetic material of substantially higher permeability than iron at low magnetizing-forces. The conductor, which preferably consists of a central wire surrounded by a number of helically-wound copper tapes, is wrapped in a helix of nickel-iron tape the composition of which is preferably 781 per cent. nickel and 211 per cent. iron, but may be varied to include other constituents, such as chromium. The conductor is drawn through a muffle-furnace which is maintained by heating elements at about 875°C., and is led away straight from the furnace until cool, when it is coiled on a large radius, not less than 2 feet, to avoid strains and stresses. conductor may then be insulated with Chatterton's compound and gutta-percha in the usual way. It is claimed that such a conductor will transmit telegraphic signals with less attenuation than a non-loaded conductor of equal external diameter, and has a one-way traffic capacity of a single conductor. A circuit-system to reduce the distortion due to unequal attenuation and phase-shift of the different frequency-components is illustrated. The cable 6 is connected to earth through the transmitting apparatus and the condenser, and at the receiving end is connected to earth through two parrallel branches, one of which comprises a large inductance in series with an adjustable resistance, and the other comprises the condenser in parallel with the adjustable resistance and in series with the inductance coil and the adjustable resistance. are shunted by a potentiometer resistance, the taps from which complete the input grid-circuit of which comprises the recording instrument 17, preferably a string oscillograph recording photographically on sensitized paper.

The claims are:

1. A long telegraph conductor adapted to transmit signals of high telegraphic frequency and loaded with a magnetic material having higher permeability than iron at low magnetizing forces, characterized in this, that said material has such a permeability that the conductor is adapted to transmit the signals with less attenuation than a non-loaded conductor of the same dimensions as the combined conductor and loading material.

2. A long telegraph conductor in accordance with claim 1, characterized in this, that said material possesses such specific resistance and is so dimensioned that said conductor is adapted to transmit telegraphic signals at a given speed

with less attenuation than a non-loaded conductor of the same outside diameter at one-half of said given speed.

3. A long telegraph conductor in accordance with claims 1 or 2, characterized in this, that said material consists of approximately $78\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. nickel and $21\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. iron.

4. A long telegraph conductor in accordance with claim 1, characterized in this, that the cross section of said conductor and said loading layer combined is of such a value and said layer is of such a thickness that said conductor is

adapted to transmit telegraphic signals with minimum attenuation.

5. A long telegraph conductor in accordance with claim 1, characterized in this, that said conductor is so loaded that it is adapted to transmit currents of a given frequency with less attenuation than that experienced by currents of onehalf said given frequency when transmitted over a non-loaded conductor having an outside diameter equal to that of said loaded conductor.

6. A long telegraph conductor in accordance with claim 1, characterized in the provision of material of such high permeability at low magnetizing forces that said conductor has a one way traffic capacity for telegraphic purposes greater

- than the duplex traffic capacity of an unloaded conductor having an outside diameter equal to that of the loaded conductor.

 7. The method of constructing a long telegraph conductor according to any one or all of the preceding claims which consists in surrounding an unloaded conductor with magnetic material subjecting said conductor so loaded to a predetermined heat treatment and then cooling, the loaded conductor being maintained in a substantial straight condition
- 8. A method in accordance with claim 7, in which said loaded telegraph conductor is drawn through a suitable furnace and then out into the air at a certain predetermined rate.

"Improved process and apparatus for drying coagulable liquids."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a process and apparatus in which latex is kept at the desired level in a supply pan by a float valve. A rotating drum heated by steam or otherwise dips into the latex and removes a thin film which is dried and collected on another drum and wound into a roll. Arrangements are also provided for the addition of compounding ingredients to the latex before drying.

The claims are :-

1. A process of drying latex by heating a film of the latex on a surface, characterized by the fact that the dried film is removed as formed by the adhesion of its exposed surface to a stripping element.

2. A process of drying latex in accordance with claim 1, characterized by the fact that the dried film is bodily

removed and simultaneously compacted at the point of removal.

3. A process of drying latex in accordance with claim 1, or claim 2, characterized by the fact that the dried film is continuously superposed in layers.

4. A process of drying latex in accordance with any of claims 1, 2, or 3, characterized by the fact that the dried

film is rolled up on itself.

5. A process of drying latex in accordance with claim 1, characterized by the fact that a thin film of latex is supplied to the outer curved surface of a heated rotating cylinder by causing the cylinder to continuously rotate through a small supply of latex, which is replenished at a rate equal to its removal by the cylinder, the dried latex film being continuously removed from the cylinder.

6. A process of drying latex in accordance with claim 5, characterized by the fact that any coagulated latex is

removed from the latex supply by the rotation of the cylinder.

7. Apparatus for drying latex by applying heat thereto while on a supporting surface characterized by the provision of means acting by adhesion for removing the dried film from the said surface as formed.

8. Apparatus for drying latex as a film by applying heat thereto while on a supporting surface, characterized by the provision of moving means for removing the dried film from said surface as formed.

9. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 7 or claim 8, characterized by means for stripping the film from the surface and superposing it upon itself under pressure.

10. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with any of claims 7-9, characterized by a roll adapted to contact

with and remove the dried film from the surface.

11. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 10, characterized by the fact that the said roll is adapted to adhesively press against the film, remove the same and roll it up in superposed layers.

12. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 10, characterized by the fact that the said roll may be

- yieldingly urged under variable pressure against the film.

 13. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 10, characterized by the fact that the said roll comprises a roll body, a resilient covering therefor and a detachable outer covering adapted to adhere to the freshly dried latex.

 14. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 10, characterized by the fact that the said roll comprises roll body, a felt covering therefor, a further outer covering and means for detachably retaining said outer covering in position and under tension. in position and under tension.
- 15. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 10, comprising a drying drum, characterized by a shallow latex pan for supplying a thin film of latex to the drum and means for automatically removing coagulum from the said pan.
- 16. Apparatus for drying latex in accordance with claim 15, characterized by the fact that the said pan conforms closely to the periphery of the drum and by means for adjusting the pan.

17. A process for drying latex, substantially as hereinbefore described.

18. Apparatus for drying latex having its parts constructed, arranged, and adapted to operate, substantially as hereinbefore described with reference to any of the accompanying drawings.

"Improved cultivating and soil pan breaking implement."

Abstract.—The applicant describes an implement having an arm resembling one arm of a pick but having the end broadened and provided with a chisel edge. At the point where the arm is attached to the haft, a flat surface is provided to act as a fulcrum. Modifications are described in which two arms are provided or in which a fulcrum attachment is provided to convert an ordinary pick into a tool for the purpose described.

1. A pan-breaking or cultivating implement comprising a relatively slender blade adapted to be fixed approximately perpendicularly to the haft which is used therewith, which blade in use is adapted to be driven into the ground, and a relatively broad, flat or enlarged leverage or fulcrum surface in the neighbourhood of the junction of the blade with the said haft, about which surface the implement, after being driven into the ground, is adapted to be turned.

A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to claim 1, the blade having a chisel-shaped point the edge of which is preferably perpendicular to the direction of the haft, the chisel point preferably being relatively wide in comparision with the width of the blade.

3. A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to either of the preceding claims, the leverage or fulcrum

surface comprising a flat surface surrounding or covering the end of the haft.

4. A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to claim 1, 2, or 3, comprising as a single unit a leverage or fulcrum surface and a blade, in which said surface is attached to the head of the implement and projects therefrom preferably, chiefly, or completely on the side away from that from which the blade projects.

A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to claim 4, the projecting parts of said surface being stayed

or strengthened by one or more ribs connecting it to the head of the implement.

A pan-breaking or cultivating implement as claimed in claim 1, 2, or 3, having two blades, preferably of different sizes, and a leverage or fulcrum surface around the head which is adapted to fit on to the haft.

7. An attachment whereby an ordinary single or double-ended pickaxe may be converted into an implement,

substantially as claimed in claim 6.

8. A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to any of the preceding claims substantially as described.

9. A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to any of the preceding claims complete with a haft, constructed, arranged and adapted to be used in the manner and for the purpose, substantially as described.

10. A pan-breaking or cultivating implement according to any of the preceding claims, substantially as described with reference to Figures 1 and 2, or Figures 3 and 4, or Figures 5 to 7 of the accompanyiny drawings.

Dry grains: nil.

Coconuts: the prospects of the coming crop are good. The probable yield is about 521,311,055, and the estimated crop just harvested is about 510,000,000.

Other products: are scarce at present. Prospects, fair. Price of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6 50 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 8 per bushel; kurakkan (available only in

Siyane korale), Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per bushel; maize, nil; coconut, Rs. 5 to Rs. 7.50 per 100 nuts; salt, 12 to 14 cents

per measure; any other prices of interest, nil.

Health of the people: generally good. There have been, however, a few cases of dysentery, chickenpox, and measles. A case of suspected smallpox was reported from Alutkuru korale north.

Health of cattle: unsatisfactory. Rinderpest has been prevalent in all the korales, except Siyane korale east. The disease is, however, under control.

Weather: the rainfall for December was 9.02 in. for 17 days.

Harvest prospects: not satisfactory.

Conditions of tanks: the tanks are full. Fish is abundant in Alutkuru korale north.

General remarks: nil.

"THE CEYLON TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1908."

ULES made by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 7 of "The Ceylon Telegraph Ordinance, 1908," as amended by Ordinance No. 10 of 1923.

WIRELESS TELEGRAPH RULES.

Installation, &c., of Wireless Telegraphs.

1. (1) No person shall import for private use, instal, establish, maintain, or work any wireless telegraph station or apparatus in any place in the Island or on board any British ship registered in the Island, or shall instal, establish, or work any wireless telegraph station or apparatus on board any aircraft in the Island, unless such person has applied for and obtained a license in that behalf from the Postmaster-General.

(2) Any person desirous of obtaining a license for any of the purposes mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall apply to the Postmaster-General in the Form A in the Schedule hereto, and every such

application shall have affixed to it a stamp of the value of ten rupees.

(3) Every such license shall be in the Form B in the Schedule hereto and shall be subject to the conditions mentioned in the said license.

Importation for Trade Purposes and Sale of Apparatus for Wireless Telegraphy.

2. (1) No person shall import for trade purposes or sell any apparatus for wireless telegraphy, unless such person has applied for and obtained a license in that behalf from the Postmaster-General.

(2) Any person desirous of obtaining a license for such importation or sale shall apply to the Postmaster-General in the Form C in the Schedule hereto, and every such application shall have affixed to it a stamp of the value of ten rupees.

(3) Every such license shall be in the Form D in the Schedule hereto and shall be subject to the

conditions mentioned in the said license.

Period of all Licenses issued under these Rules and their Renewal.

3. (1) All licenses issued under these rules shall be for one year, commencing from January 1 in each year and expiring on December 31 of such year. All licenses issued during the year shall expire automatically on December 31 of such year. Applications for renewals shall be forwarded on Form E so as to reach the Postmaster-General before December 31 in each year.

(2) The fee for and in respect of all licenses shall be ten rupees per annum in respect of each station

license, and shall be paid by postage stamps affixed to the application form.

Licenses for Importation, Installation, &e., of Wireless Telegraphs for Experimental Purposes.

- 4. (1) Licenses for the importation, installation, establishment, maintenance, and working of wireless telegraph stations or apparatus for experimental purposes shall be granted subject to the following conditions:—
 - (a) The applicant shall be not less than twenty-one years of age and shall be a British subject, and he shall furnish satisfactory evidence as to character and the objects for which he requires the license.
 - (b) The applicant shall satisfy the Postmaster-General that he has in view some definite object of scientific value or of public utility. If scientific research is intended, he must be certified as a competent investigator by a Government Department or some recognized scientific body.
 - (c) The applicant shall satisfy the Postmaster-General that he is competent to work the apparatus according to the terms of his license, or that he is a bona fide student of wireless telegraphy under a person holding a license to work a wireless telegraph under these rules; and shall undertake not to allow any person other than a person holding a license under these rules to work the said apparatus.
 - (d) The maximum height and dimension of aerial wire permitted shall be as follows:—

The extreme height of aerial above ground shall be one hundred feet.

- The total length of wire, including leading in wire, shall be one hundred and fifty feet of single wire or total length of two hundred feet of wire where two or more wires are used.
- (e) For the purpose of reception of signals, not more than one thermionic valve shall be permitted on each station, unless the Postmaster-General at his discretion shall allow more than one such valve.

- (2) Licenses for transmitting stations shall be subject to the following further conditions:-

 - (i.) The power used shall not exceed twenty watts.(ii.) Transmission shall be sanctioned only to duly authorized wireless stations, within a radius of 75 miles from the transmitting station.

(iii.) The wave length shall be limited to a range of 180-220 or 400-450 metres. Applicants shall specify the range they desire to use.

(iv.) Transmission shall be restricted to a period not exceeding an aggregate two hours per day. The actual times desired shall be specified in the application.

(3) Any person to whom a license to instal, establish, maintain, or work any wireless telegraph station or apparatus is granted shall not divulge the purport of any message, other than those intended

for him, which may be received on the apparatus.

4) Every person who has obtained any such license shall, on application to the Postmaster-General, be permitted to import any portion of a wireless telegraph apparatus, without any further license, provided that it shall be shown to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, or any officer authorized by him, that such portion is bona fide required to replace a damaged portion of the wireless telegraph apparatus used by such person, or for the purpose of making extensions to such existing apparatus, or to obtain the benefit of later and more up-to-date appliances within the limitations of his license.

Licenses for Importation for Trade Purposes and Sale of Apparatus for Wireless Telegraphy.

5. (1) Licenses for the importation for trade purposes or sale of apparatus for wireless telegraphic purposes shall be granted subject to the following conditions:-

(a) The applicant shall be a recognized and established dealer in electric apparatus.

- (b) The license shall in all respects be subject to all the provisions of the Telegraph Ordinance and to the rules made thereunder which may be in force during the period of the
- (c) No wireless telegraphic apparatus for transmitting purposes shall be imported or sold of greater power than is laid down in Rule 4 (2).
- (2) The licensee shall keep a book record of all licensed apparatus which he imports and of all disposals of the same in such form as the Postmaster-General may direct, and shall produce his stock and book record on demand of the Postmaster-General or of any officer authorized in that behalf in writing by him.

Wireless Telegraphs on Board Ships.

- 6. Except with the general or special permission in writing of the Postmaster-General no person shall work or use a wireless telegraph in any merchant ship, whether British or foreign, whilst such ship is in any harbour in Ceylon.
- 7. No person shall send any message by means of the wireless telegraph in any merchant ship, whether British or foreign, whilst such ship is within the territorial waters of Ceylon, when and where such messages can be forwarded by a Government telegraph.
- 8. No person shall work or use the wireless telegraph in any ship, whilst such ship is within the territorial waters of Ceylon, in such a way as to interrupt or interfere with service signalling or the transmission of messages between other wireless stations.
- When communications are made by wireless telegraph between any ship within the territorial waters of Ceylon and a land station, the regulations made from time to time by the International Radio Telegraph Convention shall be observed.
- 10. Nothing in these rules shall apply to the use of wireless telegraphs within the territorial waters of Ceylon for the purpose of making or answering signals of distress.

Wireless Telegraphs on Board Aircraft.

- 11. No person shall, without the general or special permission in writing of the Postmaster-General, work or use a wireless telegraph in any aircraft (other than an aircraft belonging to the Royal Air Force) whilst such aircraft is over Ceylon or the territorial waters thereof, except in accordance with the following restrictions:-
 - (1) The wireless apparatus shall not be used except during actual flight or in case of forced
 - (2) The wireless apparatus may be used for receiving messages on any subject, but shall be used for sending messages only on the following subjects:-

(a) Distress signals.

- (b) Meteorological information.
- (c) Forced landings and landing instructions.
- (d) Ascertaining or indicating position.(e) Supply of fuel and spare parts:
- (f) Origin, destination, or course of flight.
- (3) The aircraft normal wave (900 metres continuous wave), and no other wave, shall be employed for the sending and receipt of messages to and from-
 - (a) Other aircraft.
 - (b) Aviation stations.

CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE Feb. 1, 1924 (4) The aircraft ship wave (600 metres interrupted continuous wave), and no other wave, shall be employed for the sending and receipt of— (a) Messages to and from all merchant ships. (b) Such messages as are rendered necessary by reason of exceptional emergency, and which do not come within the scope of the above-mentioned provisions for the use of the aircraft normal wave. (5) The rules made from time to time by the International Radio Telegraph Convention shall be observed. (6) Service signalling or the transmission of messages between other wireless telegraph stations shall not be interfered with: Provided that nothing in these restrictions shall apply to the use of wireless telegraphs for the purpose of making or answering signals of distress. Certificates of Competency. 12. (1) No person shall work the transmitting apparatus of a wireless telegraph in Ceylon or in any ship or aircraft registered in Ceylon, unless such person is a British subject and holds a certificate of competency. (2) Such certificate of competency shall be issued by such officers as the Postmaster-General may depute, and after such examination as the Postmaster-General may prescribe. Miscellaneous. 13. For the purpose of any proceedings under these rules, the master or person being or appearing to be in command or charge of any ship or aircraft shall be deemed to have authorized and to be responsible for the use of working of any apparatus on board such ship or aircraft. 14. Any summons or other document in any proceedings under these rules shall be deemed to have been duly served on the person to whom the same is addressed by being left on board the ship or aircraft on which the offence is charged to have been committed with the person being or appearing to be in command or charge of the ship or aircraft. 15. The Postmaster-General may refer any matter relating to these rules, on which he requires advice, to a Committee composed of the President of the Radio Society of Ceylon and the Chief Engineer of the General Post Office, for their opinion. 16. Any person aggrieved by any order of the Postmaster-General shall have the right of appeal to His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, provided the appeal is lodged within one month of the receipt of notice of the order of the Postmaster-General.
