"THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 of 1917."

OULES made by the proprietors within the Giant's tank irrigation district of the District of Mannar, Northern Province, under section 11 of "The Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917," as amended by Ordinance No. 18 of 1919, and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

IRRIGATION RULES FOR THE MANNAR DISTRICT.

1. No person shall encroach upon any bund, spill, or channel, or upon the reservation therefor or, without the express permission of the Assistant Government Agent, or the Cultivation Officer, or Irrigation Superintendent, cut or cause to be cut the bund of any tank or channel, or block up or obstruct or cause to be in any way blocked up or obstructed any spill or channel, nor shall any person carry out any work upon any bund, spill, or channel, except in accordance with the instructions of these officers. Provided that in cases in which such action is necessary to prevent otherwise inevitable damage and it is impossible to communicate with either of the above mentioned officers in time the said permission may be dispensed with, and the burden of proving the necessity of such action shall lie upon the persons concerned.

Each proprietor shall be allowed water for the paddy cultivation in proportion to his share, provided that in the case of any land sown after the dates fixed under rule 15, the Assistant Government Agent may, if he considers it necessary, order

that no water be supplied to the land so sown.

Prior to the commencement of the sowing for each cultivation it shall be decided by a majority of the proprietors assembled at a meeting summoned by the Kama Vidhan of each cultivation area, subject to the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, for what purposes other than paddy cultivation water shall be issued from their village tank or direct supply channel. The issue and distribution of all water shall be under the direction and supervision of the Kama Vidhan, and in the rotation of the issue of water the high level lands shall have priority of claim over the low level lands.

4. Should any channel, dam, or other work be required for the irrigation of any particular field or tract of fields, it shall be constructed by the proprietors interested in proportion to their holdings. All applications for permission to construct such works must be made in writing to the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent. Such works shall be constructed in such manner within such period and in accordance with such alignment, as the Assistant Government Agent shall direct after consulting the Irrigation Officer in charge of Giant's tank.

5. All proprietors must grant way leave for such channels, dams, or other works even though their land may not be benefited thereby. But those proprietors whose lands are benefited by any such work shall be liable under this rule to pay to the owners of lands which suffer damage by the construction of such work, compensation for any land taken or damage done in proportion to the area of the holdings benefited. The amount of such compensation shall be determined after due inquiry by the Assistant Government Agent. Unless the Assistant Government Agent otherwise directs no compensation shall ordinarily be payable in respect of lands lying within the field or tract of fields benefited.

6. Proprietors or lessees of new lands which have been surveyed and demarcated by land marks, with reservations for field channels, shall construct their proportion of the field channel which is shown on the plan to irrigate the group of lots in which their holding is situated, if any proprietor of such land is unable to obtain water for irrigation owing to the neglect of any other proprietors to cut their shares of the field channel, such other proprietors shall be called upon by the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent to do the necessary work. In case of default the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent may order the defaulter's share of the work to be performed by paid labour, and the cost of such labour may be

recovered as provided for by section 23 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917.

7. Before the date fixed under rule 15 each proprietor shall clear and put in order his share of all field or drainage channels for such cultivation, and shall so maintain his share throughout the cultivation whether his land be cultivated or not, The Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent may order the Kama Vidhan to have the share of work of a defaulter under this rule performed by paid labour, and the cost of such labour may be recovered as provided for by section 23 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917.

The Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent shall be the officer appointed to supervise the work of all Irrigation Headmen and exercise control under the Assistant Government Agent of all matters of cultivation and irrigation in

accordance with these rules.

9. There shall be elected or appointed under the provisions of section 21 of Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, for each tract of fields or other area as defined by the Assistant Government Agent an Irrigation Headman known as Kama Vidhan.

Each Kama Vidhan shall be in charge of all matters of irrigation and cultivation within his area, subject to the supervision and control of the Cultivation Officer

or Irrigation Superintendent.

11. It shall be the duty of such Kama Vidhan to enforce all irrigation rules and to bring all breaches thereof to the notice of the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent.

12. Every Kama Vidhan shall within fifteen days after the date fixed for the completion of sowing of any crop furnish the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent with a list of the proprietors cultivating that crop, showing the extent and the date of completion of sowing of the land cultivated by each.

13. Every proprietor cultivating land for any crop shall pay as remuneration

to the Kama Vidhan, within whose area such land lies, 2 per cent. of the crop reaped

from such land.

14. For the kalapokam cultivation no paddy taking more than 5 months to mature, for the idaipokam cultivation no paddy taking more than 4 months to mature, and for the sirupokam cultivation no paddy taking more than 3 months to mature shall be sown.

15. In due time before the kalapokam and sirupokam cultivation each year the Assistant Government Agent shall convene a meeting of the Advisory Committee, and after consulting such Committee shall fix date for the completion of clearing of field channels, the dates for completion of sowing of each kind of paddy, the date for the completion of construction or repair of field fences, and the date before which all watch huts shall be erected. Notice in writing of the dates so fixed shall be given by the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent to each Kama Vidhan.

16. No person shall sow any kind of paddy after the date fixed under rule 15

for the completion of sowing of that kind of paddy.

17. Idaipokam cultivation shall only be allowed in exceptional circumstances, and shall not be carried on except on a permit in that behalf from the Assistant Government Agent and in accordance with the condition stated on such permit.

No person shall cultivate any land for sirupokam, except under a permit in

that behalf from the Assistant Government Agent.

No proprietor shall be bound to cultivate for the idaipokam or sirupokam, and all the duties regarding the watching and fencing of the idaipokam and sirupokam shall be performed by those proprietors alone who have undertaken to cultivate for these harvests, and any shareholder sowing for the idaipokam or sirupokam shall perform all such duties until the whole of the idaipokam or sirupakam is

reaped, whether his share succeed or not.

20. The Assistant Government Agent shall each year, with the advice of the Advisory Committee and the Irrigation Officer in charge of Giant's tank, decide the total extent which may be cultivated for sirupokam. Each proprietor shall be entitled to a permit for a share of the total extent allowed for sirupokam cultivation in proportion to the extent of land owned by him on which water-rate is payable.

The Assistant Government Agent shall decide each year in consultation with the Advisory Committee and the Irrigation Officer in charge of Giant's tank

in what fields or tanks sirupokam cultivation may be carried on.

22. No person shall cultivate any portion of a tank bed unless he shall have obtained a permit in that behalf from the Assistant Government Agent.

No permit shall be issued for the cultivation of any portion of the bed of a vilage tank to any person other than a proprietor of land on which water-rate under Gant's tank is payable, and in the case of kalapokam cultivation to any person other than a proprietor of lands irrigated under such village tank.

24. Subject to the provisions of rules 22 and 23, at the commencement of each kalapokam season the majority of the proprietors of fields under any village tank shall decide whether or not the tank bed or any portion of it shall be cultivated for kalapokam, and if it be decided to cultivate any portion of it, each proprietor shall be entitled to a share of the extent, it is proposed to cultivate in proportion to his share of the field, and no proprietor shall be allowed to cultivate any portion of the tank if it be decided by a majority of the proprietors not to carry on any cultivation in the bed of the tank. An appeal from the decision in this case may be made to the Assistant Government Agent, whose decision shall be final.

25. Every proprietor shall perform all the duties required of a proprietor, bether he cultivates or not. The cases of proprietors unable to cultivate their whether he cultivates or not. shares for any year from ill health or some unavoidable cause will be specially considered by the Assistant Government Agent, who may, if he thinks fit to do so,

remit the commutation for services due for that year under rule 34.

26. A proprietor who is unable to attend personally, may provide for the cultivation of his share by substitute or "Varakudi" in the performance of the duties required. No proprietor shall employ any substitute or "Varakudi" of any other proprietor without the consent of such other proprietor.

27. Before the date fixed under rule 15 each proprietor shall erect a proper watch hut in the place indicated to him by the Kama Vidhan, and each proprietor shall continue to watch until all the paddy in the field is reaped whether his own paddy has been reaped or not. The Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent may order the Kama Vidhan to have the watch hut of a defaulting propreitor under this rule erected and maintained by paid labour, and the cost of such labour may be recovered from the defaulting proprietor as provided for by section 23 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917.

28. A share of the field fence shall be apportioned to the cultivators of each proprietor by the Kama Vidhan in proportion to the extent of the proprietor's field, without regard to whether the fence adjoins his field or not. Each proprietor shall construct or repair his share of the field fence before the date fixed under rule 15. All fences must be made sufficiently strong to keep out cattle, and each proprietor shall see that his portion of the fence is kept in proper order throughout the cultivation until the crop is finally reaped, whether he cultivates his share or not. Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent may order the Kama Vidhan to have the share of the fence of a defaulting proprietor under this rule constructed or maintained by paid labour, and the cost of such labour may be recovered from the defaulting proprietor as provided for by section 23 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917.

29. The shareholders of each threshing-floor shall put up a strong stake fence round it and keep up the fence till all the paddy is threshed. Each shareholder shall watch the threshing-floor though his own paddy shall have been threshed for at

least fourteen days after the paddy has been threshed.

30. All buffaloes shall be driven to a distance from the field during the cultivation season, and shall have wooden bells attached to their necks, and all known fencebreakers or dangerous animals shall be yoked with others. All black cattle, goats, and sheep shall be herded during the day and folded during the night outside the fields, and when in any village a place has been fixed on, after due inquiry by the Assistant Government Agent, as the place in which buffaloes, black cattle, goats, and sheep shall be folded during the cultivation season, no proprietor shall fold his buffaloes, cattle, goats, or sheep in any place near to the tank, field, or village than the one fixed on. Proprietors of buffaloes, black cattle, goats and sheep shall not suffer their buffaloes, black cattle, goats, or sheep to trespass on any cultivation, nor shall they fold their cattle or drive them to pasture near the cultivation of or within the limits of any neighbouring village.

31. All proprietors are hereby required to keep the tank bund, spill, and channels connected with their fields clear of vegetation or obstruction. A share of this work shall be assigned-by the Kama Vidhan to each proprietor in accordance with his

holding.

32. Whenever the Assistant Government Agent or any person acting under his orders shall find it necessary to call out the labour of a village to perform an urgent work of repair or for the prevention of otherwise inevitable damage, uncommutable labour either in person or by substitute shall at once be furnished by every proprietor

in such village and continue daily until the completion of the work.

33. Every proprietor of land irrigated by a village tank shall contribute annually either in labour or money in the following proportion towards any work of construction, repair, restoration, improvement, or maintenance of the tank or channel or water-course connected with it in such manner as the Assistant Government Agent, after due inquiry, shall consider necessary and shall order to be carried out, viz., six days' labour or its equivalent in money at the rate of 50 cents per day for one bushel sowing extent of land or any less extent owned by him, and one days' labour or its equivalent in money for each additional bushel sowing extent.

34. Notice in writing shall be given by the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent to each Kama Vidhan not less than twenty days beforehand of the intention to call out the labour of a village provided for in rule 33 and of the propor-

tion of labour required.

35. Proprietors intending to commute shall pay in before the day fixed for the completion of the work the full sum of commutation due by them. Each proprietor electing to work shall attend at the appointed place for work at 6 A.M. continue to work till 11 A.M., and again from 1 P.M. to 5 P.M., and shall carefully carry out the work assigned to him by the officer in charge of the work. One cube of earthwork shall be considered to be equivalent to two full days' labour.

Proprietors shall be held liable for waste of water occuring in their fields. The Assistant Government Agent may, on the advice of the Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Superintendent, prevent, alter, or otherwise deal with, as he thinks fit, supplies of water to lands which owing to the default of the proprietors to carry out

any work required by these rules, demand an undue supply of water.

No paddy shall be sown in any irrigation or other channel. Any neglect to comply with the above rules or any act committed in breach of them will subject the offender to the penalties provided for in Chapter 5 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917. The person referred to as "Cultivation Officer" or "Irrigation Superintendent" in the foregoing rules shall be the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent, under the provisions of section 20 (A) of the "Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917," as amended by Ordinance No. 22 of 1922.

(a) Trees are to be felled within 6 inches from the ground by saw or axe and saw combined.

(b) Only such trues as are stamped and marked by a

Forest Officer Fre to be felled.

(c) All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood of satin and palu within the forests such as are marked by a Forest Officer though below the specification given below should in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him be utilized for conversion into sleepers or scantlings as may be directed.

(d) Parts of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers or scantlings.

sleepers and scantlings should be sawn from sound matured wood free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose

(e) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in., and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. Scantlings 6 in. by 4 in. and in lengths of 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 171 feet. The maximum number required in each class is as follows:

> 50 planks 12 ft. by 6 in. by 4 in. 13 ft. by 6 in. by 4 in. Do. 10 Do. 14 ft. by 6 in. by 4 in. 25 Do. : 15 ft. by 6 in. by 4 in. 75 Do. 16 ft. by 6 in. by 4 in. Do. 17 ft. by 6 in. by 4 in. 150 Do. 17½ ft. by 6 in. by 4 in.

(f) Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs or sleepers or scantlings with an adze

or axe will be allowed.

(g) Sleepers and scantlings should be covered with saw dust or immersed in water and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by a Forest Officer.

(h) Rejected sleepers or scantlings will not be paid for and they will lapse to Government as well as refuse wood in the areas under operation. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

(i) All trees after felling should be logged to the longest available lengths and transported to a way side depôt, which will be selected by the Divisional Forest Officer, or an officer of the Department deputed for the purpose, where they will be inspected by a Forest Officer and finally passed for transport to the delivery depôt. Sleepers and scantlings will also be required to be brought to the way-side depôt for inspection. Logs which are rejected as unsuitable for delivery in the log will be marked at the inspection depôt for conversion into sleepers or scantlings as may be directed by the inspecting officer.

(j) The contractor will be paid a proportionate rate for timber in the log, sleepers and scantlings transported to the way-side depôt but not removed to the delivery depôt in cases when it shall be deemed expedient to do so by the

Divisional Forest Officer.

(k) The contractor will receive full payment for all logs and scantlings accepted by the Divisional Forest Officer at the delivery depôt and for sleepers accepted by the Railway Department.

(l) All logs should be straight and sound throughout free from shakes and large or loose knots. They should have

both their ends neatly trimmed with saw alone.

(m) The logs supplied should be of the following specification:

50 per cent. of the supply should be 20 feet and upwards in length 5 feet and upwards in mid girth; 30 per cent. of the supply should be logs of 15 feet and upwards in length and 4 feet and upwards in mid girth and the balance 20 per cent. of the supply should be logs yielding a minimum cubic volume of 15 feet, not less than 10 feet long and not under 4 feet girth.

(n) The work should commence as soon the tenders are settled and should be completed before December 31, 1924. All material extracted on the contract is required to be brought to a main transport depôt not later than September

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 9, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 164 (2 Europeans, 11 Burghers, 99 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 24 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1924, viz., 251,824) was 34·1, as against 30·7 in the preceding week, 33·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 148 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30·7, as against 35·3 in the previous week, 37·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 148 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-two deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, 2 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Maradana South, as against 21 in the previous week, and 24 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Seven deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, same as in the previous week and against 6 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Eight deaths from *Plague* were registered, 6 in Wellawatta North, and 2 in St. Paul's, as against 12 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
 - 4. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospital, Slave Island, and watta North, same as in the previous week, and against 5 the weekly average for last year.
 - 5. Fourteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 13 from Debility, 4 each from Enteritis and Worms, rom Diarrhaa, 2 from Puerperal Septicamia, 1 from Tetanus, and 53 from Other Carses.
- 6. Twenty-two cases of *Chickenpox*, 10 of *Measles*, 8 of *Enteric Fever*, and 4 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 18, 3, 11, and 8, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $81 \cdot 8$,° against $82 \cdot 1$ ° in the preceding week and $78 \cdot 0$ ° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 894$ in., against $29 \cdot 904$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 887$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0 \cdot 62$ in, against $0 \cdot 02$ in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
