WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," as amended by Ordinance No. 36 of 1921, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Eastern Circuit, twice at least in each year at Batticaloa; and such other places in such Circuit, as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such Sessions commencing at Batticaloa in the month of February and in the month of July in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Trincomalee, a place included within the said Eastern Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Trincomalee, in the said Eastern Circuit, on or about Monday, March 10, 1924.

Rule 1.—That rule No. 1 be re-numbered as (1) (i.), and the following be added as rule No. (1) (ii.):—For the purpose of these rules the word “person” and the word “member” shall be construed as including a female, and the rules shall be read accordingly with any necessary modifications.

Rule 2.—That the following be added at the end of rule No. 2:—The Committee of Management shall decide on all applications for membership in the Form A annexed, and if they decide to reject any application, they may do so without assigning any reason therefor.

Rule 4.—That in lines 2 and 5 of rule No. 4 after the word “salary” the words “or pension” be added.

Rule 5.—That in line 2 of rule No. 5 after the word “salary” in two places the words “or pension” be inserted.

Rule 16.—(a) That in lines 1 and 9 of rule No. 16 the words “and advances” and “or advances” be deleted;

(b) That in line 2 of rule No. 16 after the word “thereon” the words “if any” be inserted;

(c) That in line 4 of rule No. 16 the words “or pensions” be inserted after the word “salaries”; and

(d) That in line 2 of rule No. 16 (on page 5) before the words “The amount to his credit” the words “In case of cessation of membership as aforesaid” be inserted.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased, with the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to approve the following amendments of the Pension Minute dated December 9, 1908:—

(a) Add the following sub-section to section 9:—

(iii.) European Matrons, European Nursing Sisters, and locally appointed matrons and nurses of the Medical Department shall be entitled to reckon as pensionable—

(a) the diet allowances paid to them; and

(b) the annual value of the free Government quarters allowed to them, provided that no sum in excess of one-sixth of their annual salary shall be reckoned as such annual value.

(b) Substitute the following for the proviso to section 14:—

Provided that a pension may be granted without the medical certificate above referred to at the age of fifty years or after twenty years of service, whichever is earlier, in the case of European Matrons, European Nursing Sisters, and locally appointed matrons and nurses of the Medical Department, female teachers of the Education Department, and female employees in the Post and Telegraph Department who are in receipt of a salary of Rs. 400 per annum and upwards; and at the age of 45 in the case of Mounted Orderlies (now called the Governor's Escort).

(c) Add the following proviso to section 17:—

In the case of European Matrons, European Nursing Sisters, and locally appointed matrons and nurses of the Medical Department, retirement shall be compulsory on attaining the age of fifty years, unless the Governor in Executive Council desires that the officer's services shall be retained.

"CODE FOR ASSISTED ENGLISH SCHOOLS."

THE following amendments to the Code for Assisted English Schools, which have been passed by the Board of Education and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, are hereby published in accordance with section 10 (3) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 16 (4) (e).—Add a new paragraph as follows :—

(4) Pupils in the Commercial Class who have not qualified for grant under clause 53 (a).

Clause 36 (c).—Insert at the end of the first paragraph :—

"Special arrangements for grouping classes may be submitted to the inspector for approval."

Delete the last paragraph "As a rule for approval."

Clause 47 (f).—Alter to read as follows :—

"In order to qualify for promotion, pupils in Standards II. and III. must pass in at least two of the four subjects: English Language (including Reading), Writing, Arithmetic, and one other subject. Promotions into the Upper School must be made in the manner prescribed in clause 23 (1). In Standards V. and VI. a pupil must pass in all three subjects: English Language (including Reading), Writing, and Arithmetic, or in two of them and one other subject. No pupil may be promoted from Standard VII. to Standard VIII. unless he has passed in the four subjects: Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, and English language, or in three of them and one other subject.

"The rules in the foregoing paragraph do not apply to classes worked under the third syllabus of Schedule A. In the first-year class under that syllabus, pupils will not be eligible for promotion unless they pass in three of the four subjects: Conversation, Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic. For admission to the Upper School, pupils in the second-year class must pass in English Conversation, Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic.

"Pupils who fail in the examination for promotion may be promoted in special cases if the inspector is satisfied that their work in the terminal examination justifies their promotion."

Clauses 54 and 55.—Add a note at foot of page 18 as follows :—

"Where grant has already been paid for pupils for Vernacular Languages and Needlework in Vernacular or Anglo-vernacular schools, the attendance of pupils will not be counted in the assessment of grant under clauses 54 and 55 if such pupils are presented in the same classes in English schools."

Clauses 53 (A) and 53 (B).—On page 18 insert the following after clause 53 :—

(4) (a) GRANTS TO COMMERCIAL CLASSES.

Clause 53 (A).—In order to be recognized for grant and for purposes of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Examination, the following conditions must be complied with :—

(i.) A statement giving particulars of staff, equipment, and number of pupils (indicating the number eligible for grant in terms of (ii.) below) should be sent to the Director before January 31 of each year. This return is required whether a class has been previously recognized or not.

(ii.) Only such pupils in a Commercial Class who have passed at least either the English School-leaving Certificate Examination or the Cambridge Junior School Certificate Examination in Writing and Dictation, English Composition, and Arithmetic, or who have had special permission from the Director to join the class, will be eligible for grant, and such pupils if eligible under clause 77 (2) may be presented within two years for the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Examination.

(iii.) The class must contain at least eight pupils who are eligible for grant under (ii.) above.

(iv.) The teacher in charge of the class must be recognized by the Director as competent to teach Commercial subjects.

(v.) Suitable preparation must be provided in Standard V. to the E. S. L. C. class as follows :—

Standards V.—VII.—Special attention must be given to—

(a) Handwriting, Spelling, and General neatness in all written work ;

(b) Written composition on topics in which the pupils are interested, other than mere reproduction of stories.

(c) Mental Arithmetic and accuracy in computation ;

(d) Facility and accuracy of expression, both in writing and in speech.

Standard VII.—Shorthand and Elementary Bookkeeping may be introduced in place of Algebra and Geometry for those students who wish to join the Commercial Class later.

E. S. L. C. Class.—The E. S. L. C. syllabus including Shorthand and Bookkeeping.

English Composition should include practice in Précis Writing.

Arithmetic: More emphasis on Commercial Arithmetic. Use of tables for calculating interest, exchange, &c. Use of Post Office Guide, Railway Time Table, &c. Data for calculation to be obtained from these and similar tables.

Clause 63 (B).—In Commercial Classes recognized under clause 53 (A), the rate of attendance grant will be Rs. 40 per unit of average attendance.

Clause 59.—Add the following sentence:—"A grant of Rs. 30 may be paid for each pass in the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce Examination.

Clause 77.—

Sub-clause (3).—In lines 4 and 5 of paragraphs 3, alter "40 in (4) and (6) and 30 in (3) and (8)" to "40 in (3), (4), (6), and (8)."

Sub-clause (4) (i).—In line 1 alter "will" to "may"; in line 5 after "sentences" insert "(d) making a précis of a letter or of a series of letters."

Sub-clause (4) (iii).—In the second paragraph of the Note, in line 2 alter "card catalogues" to "card indexes"; in line 3 alter "tables of exchange" to "tables for calculating exchange and interest," delete "tea and rubber sale catalogues," alter "Chamber of Commerce publications, e.g., weekly price list" to "Chamber of Commerce weekly prices current"; in line 4 alter "Post Office and Railway Guide" to "Post Office Guide and Railway Time and Fare Tables."

Sub-clause (4) (iv).—In line 3 alter "may" to "are recommended to."

Sub-clause (4) (vi).—Include Stocks and shares.

Sub-clause (4) (vii).—Include joint adventure accounts in paragraphs 2.

Sub-clauses (6), (7), (8), (9), and (10).—Delete.

Regulation 15 of Part I. of the regulations relating to cattle disease, published by Notification dated July 19, 1910, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,395 of July 29, 1910, is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

15. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to establish quarantine, isolation, or inoculation stations in any part of the Province, and to cause any cattle to be removed thereto and detained for such period as may be necessary, and to cause inoculation to be carried out if advisable.

All cattle so detained shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of such cattle, and where any animal so detained is unclaimed, and remains unclaimed for fifteen days after the recovery of such animal has been notified by a notice posted up at the entrance to the building, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to authorize the sale by public auction of such animal to defray the cost of feeding and attention. The remainder of the proceeds of such sale, if any, shall be paid to the owner, if claimed within three months of sale, and, if not so claimed, shall be credited to the general revenue, or, if the sale is effected within the limits of a local authority, to the revenue of such local authority.

If, however, the owners of a tract who have their seed paddy ready to be sown on a given day find deficiency of water in their fields, they may, by consent of the owners of the tract which is by right entitled to the water, or by consent of the Vel-Vidane, be allowed some water on application, provided that all navats are blocked up as soon as sufficient quantity of water has been drawn or when the hours appointed for the drawing have terminated.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 16, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 138 (2 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1924, viz., 251,824) was 28.7, as against 34.1 in the preceding week, 35.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 168 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 26 Moors, 4 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34.9, as against 30.7 in the previous week, 40.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35.6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 168 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana North, and 1 each in Fort, St Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 22 in the previous week, and 24 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Wellawatta South, as against nil in the previous week.

(c) One death from *Influenza* was registered in San Sebastian, as against 7 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 13 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.

3. Eight deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, as against 8 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. One death from *Smallpox* of a resident of Dehiwala was registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North.

6. Twenty deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 12 from *Debility*, 1 from *Dysentery*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Worms*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, and *Rueperal Septicæmia*, and 60 from other causes.

7. Twenty cases of *Enteric Fever*, 16 of *Measles*, 12 of *Chickenpox*, and 5 of *Plague* were reported during the week as against 8, 10, 22, and 4 respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 81.8° in the preceding week, and 78.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.874 in., against 29.894 in. in the preceding week, and 29.877 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.74 in., against 0.62 in. in the preceding week, and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Examination for Appointment of Clerks and Draughtsmen, Survey Department.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter Class II. will commence on Monday, May 12, 1924.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Survey Department must be addressed to the Director of Education, bearing a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and in the prescribed form (Schedule A), which can be obtained either at the Education Office or at the Surveyor-General's Office on application. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to have been born on or after May 13, 1901, but not later than May 12, 1907, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. If a certificate of birth for a previous examination has already been sent in, and is filed in the Education Office, it will be sufficient to refer to the name and date of that examination. Affidavits will not be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition from the name by which the candidate is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900. Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Aided Schools will not be accepted for this examination. This examination is confined to British

subjects whose families are permanently resident in the Island.

3. A candidate who gives notice of withdrawal to the Education Office fifteen days before the date of commencement of the examination will have the value of stamps affixed to his entry form refunded to him. In cases where a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission, a refund of four-fifths the value of the stamps will be made. In no other case will a refund be made, but a candidate prevented by illness from taking up the examination for which he has entered will be permitted to re-enter for either of the two following examinations without further fee, provided notice of withdrawal accompanied by the entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified medical officer be sent to the Director of Education not later than the last day of the examination.

4. Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who have completed three years' service, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Surveyor-General.

5. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on March 20, 1924. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

6. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

7. The examination will be held at Colombo only, under the supervision of the Director of Education, in the places which will be notified to the candidates in due course.

8. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be nine and for Departmental competition nine.

9. Successful candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from the Government Medical Officer, testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island.

10. Candidates, on selection, will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve for a period of three years in the Department.

11. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting or half those allowed for Spelling or for Arithmetic will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred is that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 30 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

12. Clerks and Draughtsmen admitted under paragraph 4 will be allowed to compete amongst themselves, and will be eligible, if they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Writing and 33 per cent. in Spelling and Arithmetic and 30 per cent. in other subjects, for nine of the appointments.

RULES made by the Matara Urban District Council, under section 60 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920, and approved by the Local Government Board, are published for general information.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. The Resthouse is intended primarily for the use of travellers. Every person using any part of it as an office or place of business during his occupation of the Resthouse shall pay a special charge of 50 cents for such hour or part thereof for each such use of any part of the Resthouse. Every person so using the Resthouse shall desist from doing so upon being requested by the Resthouse-keeper, whose duty it is to consult the comfort and convenience of the occupants of the Resthouse. Resthouse fees are payable by all persons using the Resthouse and/or garage. Provided, however, that it shall be competent for the Chairman to permit the use of the Resthouse or any part thereof on special occasions at a charge of Rs. 10 for occupation only.
2. Every person other than infants using the Resthouse or garage is separately chargeable for accommodation, including every visitor's servant and/or chauffeur.
3. Each visitor must sign his or her name in the Resthouse book on entering the Resthouse, and the Resthouse-keeper is forbidden to allow the use of the Resthouse or to supply refreshments until this is done.
4. No person shall occupy any portion of the Resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.
5. Travellers shall note in the Resthouse book only those Resthouse charges which are payable to the Urban District Council.
6. The Resthouse fees and charges shall be in accordance with the following tariff, and shall be *paid in cash on demand*. In default further supplies will be refused. The attention of visitors is invited to Ordinance No. 33 of 1908, a copy of which shall be exhibited, together with these rules, in some conspicuous place in the Resthouse.
7. No room shall be reserved unless engaged at least one day in advance, but when so engaged shall be paid for whether occupied or not, provided that until the arrival of the person or persons engaging accommodation. The accommodation shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.
8. The Resthouse-keeper is authorized to take no notice of telegrams asking him to prepare meals, when the name and address of the sender are not given.
9. Beds, sofas, or couches in the Resthouse shall not be used for the purpose of sleeping without sheets. A breach of this rule will involve a charge of Rs. 5.
10. The value of all articles damaged or broken by visitors is to be paid in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the Resthouse notice board.
11. Every person using the telephone shall register his name and the number called up in the book kept for that purpose and shall pay in advance 10 cents for each occasion on which he uses the telephone, in addition to the fee for occupation. The said charge shall be in addition to all extra charges on account of trunk calls, which charges also shall be paid in advance.
12. A breach of any of the above rules shall be an offence and shall entail a penalty not exceeding Rs. 25 for any one offence.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, January 16, 1924, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated January 9, 1924.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of December 5, and of the Special Meeting of December 12, 1923, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.—Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of December 5, and of the Special Meeting of December 12, 1923, be confirmed.

Coorey moved that this Council do reduce the expenditure under Head I., Works Department, (k) Extraordinary 62—Laying out and making up quarry and cemetery at Kirillapone by Rs. 75,000, in order to enable the work of draining, lighting, and construction of some at least of the more congested private lanes in the Wellawatta Ward being taken up this year by the Council. Recovering calcium oxalate or other oxalates from trees.

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is described in the claims as follows :—

1. A process for obtaining calcium oxalate or other oxalates from the Terminalia Arjuna or like trees, consisting in taking the bark, crushing or grinding it, either wet or dry, so as to liberate crystals of calcium oxalate mixing with sufficient water and agitating the mixture with air, gas or steam to form a froth carrying the oxalate and recovering the desired product therefrom.
2. A process such as firstly claimed, wherein prior to the agitation the finely crushed or ground bark is thoroughly soaked or made sodden in water at any suitable temperature.
3. A process such as firstly or secondly claimed, wherein after crushing or grinding the bark the solubles therein contained are wholly or partially extracted.
4. A process such as firstly, secondly or thirdly claimed, wherein before or during the agitation, oils, chemicals or other froth producers or stabilizers are added.
5. A process for obtaining calcium oxalate or other oxalates from the Terminalia Arjuna or like trees, consisting in taking the bark, crushing or grinding it sufficiently fine to liberate crystals of calcium oxalate or other oxalate from the remainder of the bark, soaking the same in water, removing such water with the strong tannin and other solubles therein contained, mixing the remaining pulp with water and boiling the same and removing the froth to extract the calcium oxalate or other oxalates therefrom.
6. A process such as fifthly claimed wherein the dilution of the pulp, and the boiling and removing the froth is repeated, as often as may be desirable.
7. A process for obtaining calcium oxalate or other oxalates from the Terminalia Arjuna or like trees according to any of the preceding claims 1 to 4, wherein after crushing or grinding the bark the pulp is thickened and reground in a wet mill, water is added and the mixture agitated to form a froth.
8. A process for obtaining calcium oxalate or other oxalates from the Terminalia Arjuna or like trees, wherein after removal as far as advisable of the soluble matter the pulp is dried, ground in a dry mill or otherwise further reduced-wetted again and then subjected to a froth flotation process, substantially as described.

9. A process such as seventhly or eighthly claimed, wherein before or during agitation sufficient alkali is added to bring about an alkaline reaction.

10. A process such as seventhly, eighthly or ninthly claimed, wherein before or during agitation crude distillates from wood or charcoal, creosote, pine oil or other known flotation oils are added and/or small quantities of tannin solution allowed to remain in.

11. A process according to claim 3, wherein the froth is formed by intensive aeration in water or a bark constituent ground to pass wet through a mesh of 150° openings per linear inch, with or without the addition of a trace of petroleum or creosote or other frothing agents or stabilizers to assist in raising the froth.
