By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 32 of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1893, intituled "An Ordinance relating to Pawnbrokers," it is amongst other things enacted that the said Ordinance shall have effect only within such limits as the Governor shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint:

And whereas it seems expedient to Us, the said Governor, to bring the said Ordinance into effect within the Municipal limits of Galle, and within the Police limits of Mátara, in the Southern Province, as in the schedule A hereto respectively defined:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation appoint that the said Ordinance shall be brought into effect within the Municipal limits of Galle, and within the Police limits of Mátara, in the Southern Province, as in the said schedule A hereto respectively defined, as from and after the First day of February, 1895.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-sixth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of the Galle Municipality.

North by the Koppe-ela from its northern mouth where it falls into the Gin-ganga to the bridge over that stream on the Gintota-Welipitimodara road; along the eastern side of that road to its junction with the Bope road; along

the eastern and thence along the northern side of the Bope road, the northern side of the Kalegana road, and the northern side of the Hirimbure road to its junction with Morris road at Labuduwa.

East by Morris road from its junction with the road to Akmimana to the point where it meets the road to Haliwella, also called Hayley road; thence along the southern side of the Haliwella road to the point where the Dik-ela crosses that road; thence along the Dik-ela to the point where it joins the Lunuwila-ela; thence along the Lunuwila-ela to its fall into the Wakgalmodara.

South by the Wakgalmodara and the Galle Harbour:

South-east by the sea.

West by the Gin-ganga.

Police Limits of Mátara.

On the north from the termination of the western boundary along the new entrance to the town to the junction of the Nupe street, from thence along the Akuressa road to the junction with the Weliwariya minor road, and along the Weliwariya minor road to the Weragampita tract of fields.

On the south by the sea.

On the east, south of the river from Galtota ferry along the base of Brown's hill to the sea, and north of the river along the Peladuwa-ela to Waragampita tract of fields.

On the west by the Paramulla minor road from the sea to the main road, and along the main road to the new entrance to the town.

Notification Establishing New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 1 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session of the said Council, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding:

It is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers in that behalf by the said 1st section of the said Ordinance conferred, the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the 5th day of December, 1894, did by resolution establish a toll in respect of the Talawatugoda-Hokandara minor road.

Resolution as to Collection of New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint for the collection thereof, anything which may be contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by a resolution of the 5th day of December, 1894, the Legislative Council established a toll in respect of the Talawatugoda-Hokandara minor road:

And whereas it is expedient to determine at what place the toll in respect of the said road shall be collected:

It is hereby notified that the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, has by a resolution of the 31st day of December, 1894, determined that such toll shall be collected at Hokandara (a point about ten miles from Colombo) at the junction of the roads from Arangala to Moraketiya and Talawatugoda to Hokandara, from and after the 1st day of January, 1895.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates hereinafter specified:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance authorizing the Legislative Council, by Resolution, to establish Tolls, and to alter the places where Tolls shall be collected," it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding; and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall be so by any such resolution established, the provisions of the said "Tolls Ordinance, 1867," and of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1871 shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said Ordinance, apply thereto:

And whereas the Legislative Council, at a public session thereof held on the 5th day of December, 1894, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the Talawatugoda-Hokandara minor road, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1895, and whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect of the said ferry shall be levied:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the Talawatugoda-Hokandara minor road shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule here to.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-four.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following amended Special Regulations published in the *Gazette* of 14th October, 1892, made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the 79th clause of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, relating to the entry inwards and outwards, to the landing, shipping, and transhipping of goods, and to business generally connected with steamers, are hereby republished for general information and observance.

Amended Special Regulations referred to.

1. The agents of all Steamer Companies may, in order that their steamers be permitted increased facilities in landing, shipping, and transhipping cargo, &c., by certain relaxations of clauses 20, 21, 22, 26, 27, 28, 30, 47, 48, 51, and 52 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, give a guarantee by a special bond for Rs. 10,000 holding themselves responsible or liable for any fines or penalties which may be incurred by the masters or servants of the steamers for any discrepancies or deficiencies of cargo, or for the infringement of any of the sections of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, which may in any way be prejudicial to the interests of the revenue.

2. The masters of vessels for which the agents have given the general bond as above required may, immediately on their arrival in port, be allowed to proceed with the work of coaling, landing, shipping, or transhipping cargo, without reference to the Customs authorities.

3. The said agents or any person or persons employed by them (whose name or names they shall, for that purpose, submit for registration to the Principal Collector of Customs) shall, during official hours, or as soon as the Custom-house is open, at once enter the vessel, giving full particulars of cargo, &c., to be landed, as required by the Ordinance, together with a manifest for the same, as well as the total number of packages to be transhipped, and shall at the time, or within seven days at latest after departure of the steamer, deliver a correct content outwards of the cargo which has been shipped, the agents being held responsible for the due landing, shipment, or transhipment of all cargo, and for any deficiencies or discrepancies thereof.

4. Steamers of Companies for which the general bond as above required has been given shall, on timely notice being given by the agents to the Collector of the Port, be permitted to work after hours and during the night, and on Sundays, and the said notice shall give a guarantee for the payment of the several officers whom the Collector may think necessary to appoint for the required service.

5. All amendments of reports, all applications to land, ship, or tranship stores or articles not on the ship's papers, should be made by the agents of the steamer, or other person or persons employed by them as aforesaid, who will, for all the purposes of the Ordinance, be considered the legal representatives of the master of the steamer to which such transaction applies.

6. Any exporter or his authorized agent may, in the discretion of the Principal Collector, be allowed to ship cargo before entry has been passed and all dues paid, on depositing with the Collector of the Port a sum of Rs. 500 as guarantee for the due fulfilment of all requirements of the Ordinance and of the regulations issued thereunder in connection with the shipping of cargo.

7. Persons or their agents who have made this deposit must pass entries and pay all dues within seven days at latest after shipment of goods.

8. The Collector of the Port may impose a penalty not exceeding Rs. 100 for each and every failure to comply with the last-named regulation; and may recover the same from the deposit if the exporter fails to pay on demand; and in case of repeated breaches may cancel the privilege and return the balance of deposit, after deducting the amount unpaid for dues and penalties incurred as above or under sections of the Ordinance dealing with the shipment of cargo.
