Resolution as to Collection of New Toll.

WHEREAS by section 3 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1885 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by resolution to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to determine at what places tolls shall be collected, and to alter such places and other places to appoint for the collection thereof, anything which may be contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by a resolution of the 5th day of December, 1894, the Legislative Council established a toll in respect of the *Talawatugoda-Hokandara* minor road:

And whereas it is expedient to determine at what place the toll in respect of the said road shall be collected:

It is hereby notified that the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, has by a resolution of the 31st day of December, 1894, determined that such toll shall be collected at *Hokandara* (a point about eleven miles from Colombo), at or near the junction of the road from *Talawatugoda* to *Hokandara* with the road from *Arangala* to *Moraketiya*, from and after the 1st day of March, 1895.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the several schedules to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor from time to time shall, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates hereinafter specified:

And whereas by section 1 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1885, intituled "An Ordinance authorizing the Legislative Council by resolution to establish tolls, and the Governor in Executive Council by resolution to abolish tolls, and to alter the places where tolls shall be collected," it is enacted that from and after the passing thereof it shall be lawful for the Legislative Council of the Island of Ceylon, by means of any resolution duly passed at any public session thereof, to establish tolls in respect of any public road, bridge, ferry, or canal in this Island, anything contained in "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," to the contrary notwithstanding; and by section 2 of the same Ordinance it is further enacted that when tolls shall be so by any such resolution established, the provisions of "The Tolls Ordinance, 1867," and of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1871 shall, in so far as they are not repugnant to the said Ordinance, apply thereto:

And whereas the Legislative Council at a public session thereof held on the 5th day of December, 1894, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the *Talawatugoda-Hokandara* minor road as from and after the 1st January, 1895:

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect of the said road shall be levied :

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the *Talawatugoda-Hokandara minor road, at or near the junction of the road from Talawatugoda to Hokandara with the road from Arangala to Moraketiya*, shall be in accordance with those set out in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, the Thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred Ninety-four.

Examinations for Eastern Cadetships, viz., for Cadetships in the Civil Services of Hongkong, Ceylon, and the Straits Settlements.

The next Examination for Eastern Cadetships will be held under these Regulations. Alterations may be made for any subsequent Examination.

1. The Cadets, who must be natural-born British subjects, are selected by open competitive examination held by the Civil Service Commissioners, to whom all inquiries on the subject should be addressed.

The examinations for these appointments will, as a rule, be held in the Autumn* of those years in which vacancies have occurred in the Civil Services of Hongkong, Ceylon, and the Straits Settlements; and the successful candidates will be allowed, in their order, to choose amongst the vacancies in the three Colonies.

2. Candidates must be between the ages of 21 and 24 on the first day of August in the year in which the examination is held, and must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. They must be of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and physically qualified for service in tropical climates, and they will be called upon to undergo a medical examination to test these points.

3. No candidate will be admitted to the competition who has not previously passed to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners a preliminary examination in handwriting, orthography, and arithmetic (including vulgar and decimal fractions).

4. The fees required from candidates are £1 for the preliminary and £5 for the competitive examinations.

5. The heads of the competitive examination are as follows:—

A.—Obligatory.

- (a) Latin.
- (b) One of the following languages:—Greek, French, German, Italian. The qualifying test for (a) and (b) will be translation from the language, but marks will be given for translation into it, and, in the case of the modern languages, for colloquial proficiency.
- (c) English composition, including Précis writing.

B.—Optional.

- (d) Pure mathematics, viz., Euclid I.—IV. and VI.; Algebra, including the binomial theorem; Trigonometry, including the solution of triangles; Analytical Geometry (elementary) and mixed Mathematics, including statics and dynamics treated without the differential calculus.
- (e) (1) Modern Geography and (2) Ancient and Modern History. The examination in history will be confined to certain periods, to be prescribed for each examination.†
- (f) The elements of constitutional and international law, and political economy.
- (g) Geology, civil engineering, and surveying.
- (h) Any two languages included under head (b) which have not been taken up as obligatory.

Every Candidate must show a competent knowledge of the obligatory subjects, and may select any two of the optional subjects.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH ENDED JANUARY 31, 1895.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy : maha paddy is generally in a satisfactory condition, as is the small intermediate cultivation of bala-wi in Alutkuru korale south and Hewagam korale mentioned in my last report. In some villages fields are being prepared for yala.

Dry grain : in the Hewagam korale a small extent of land has been sown with amu and kurakkan.

Other products : fruit and vegetables are scarce and dear.

Prices of staple products : rice, from Rs. 3.50 to Rs. 4 a bushel ; coconuts, from Rs. 35 to Rs. 45 per 1,000.

Rainfall : a few good showers of rain fell during the month.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally : paddy here and there is in blossom, and is generally well forward owing to favourable weather.

NEGOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy : yala harvest has been reaped, threshed, and removed. Maha harvest is from five to six months old. Growth not good owing to drought.

Dry grain : a few chenas in Hapitigam korale have been sown with amu, meneri, kollu, and kurakkan, the growth of which is not good owing to drought.

Other products : fruits and vegetables scarce.

Price of staple products : rice, from Rs. 3.50 to Rs. 4 per bushel ; coconuts, from Rs. 35 to Rs. 40 per 1,000 ; paddy, Re. 1.75 per bushel.

Rainfall : light.

Harvest prospects : not very good.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the maha crop is about four months old in the Rayigam and Pasdun korales, and in the Totamunas two months old. The condition of the crop is good in the Pasdun korale and the Totamunas, but poor in the Rayigam korale.

Dry grain : amu and meneri are cultivated in the Pasdun korale. No dry grain is cultivated in the Totamunas, and there is very little dry grain cultivation in the Rayigam korale.

Other products : fruit and vegetables are abundant in the Rayigam korale, but scarce in the Pasdun korale and the Totamunas.

Prices of staple products : rice, Rs. 3.50 to Rs. 4.75 a bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 30 to Rs. 45 a thousand.

Rainfall : heavier than usual for this season in the Rayigam korale. Normal in the Pasdun korale and the Totamunas.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally : the prospects of the maha harvest are fair in the Pasdun korale and the Totamunas, but unfavourable in the Rayigam korale. The fields are now being prepared for the yala harvest.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

MATALE DISTRICT.

Mátalé south : the rainfall has registered 6.51, and crop prospects of paddy lands are fine. The kurakkan chenas are good.

Mátalé north : the rainfall was satisfactory except in Wagapanaha Pallesiya pattu, where mudland cultivation is poor. The hill paddy and kurakkan chenas are being reaped, and crops are satisfactory, although in some villages kurakkan was damaged by grasshoppers. Several of the tanks in Inamalawa and Kandapalla are full, and the cultivation under them is satisfactory. In Udugoda korale a plague of godawellu are doing harm to the late-sown fields. Some of the villages had plenty of mun, aba, and chillies from their kurakkan chenas.

Mátalé east : chenas are being reaped with good returns. Paddy fields are doing very well.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Kotmale : maha harvest being reaped ; crops good ; price per bushel Re. 1.50. No work on chenas.

Walapane and Uda Hewaheta : ploughing for maha cultivation, is in progress. Kurakkan in ear, price Re. 1.50 per bushel, and paddy Re. 1.50 per bushel. Fruits and vegetables deficient owing to dry weather.

Rainfall generally insufficient.

NORTHERN PROVINCE.

JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Weather : there was no rain throughout the district, except a few slight showers in some of the divisions during the early part of the month and some heavy rain in the Jaffna division on the 7th. The rainfall registered at the Public Works Department Office, Jaffna, was 1.37 in.

Paddy, kalapokam, of 1895 : the paddy plants are mostly in ear, and reaping has just commenced in some parts. The crops of Punakari, Karatchchi, Islands, Valikamam East and West, and Tenmaradchi are reported good. In the other divisions the crops on high lands are reported indifferent owing to want of rain : those on low lands and lands watered from ponds and wells are said to be fair.

Dry grain crops : reaping of varaku crop is almost completed and the outturn is reported to be very good. Other dry grains, kollu and ellu, are in plants and ears and the prospects are generally good.

Tobacco : transplanting is nearly completed except in one or two divisions where the lands are being prepared. The plants already transplanted look fair and promise a good crop.

Prices of staple articles : paddy Re. 1.87 per bushel, rice Rs. 3.50 per bushel, kurakkan Re. 1.50 per bushel, varaku Re. 1.37 per bushel, pinaddu Rs. 3 per kudai.

MULLAITIVU DISTRICT.

Paddy crops generally good except in higher manavari fields, where want of water is felt. Crops in various stages, from blossom to ripe. Gardens are being manured, and tobacco planted and watered.

Prices : rice, Rs. 3.50 per bushel ; paddy, Re. 1.50 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1 per bushel ; varaku, Re. 1 per bushel ; manioca, Rs. 5.60 per cwt.

Rainfall return not registered. Little or no rain fell during the month.

VAVUNIYA DISTRICT.

In Kilakkumulai north paddy is in blade, blossom, and ear. A fair crop expected.

Very little paddy cultivation in Kilakkumulai south. A heavy crop of kurakkan is being reaped.

There will not be more than a half crop of paddy in Panankamam, and many kurakkan chenas have been destroyed by worms.

There will be a fair paddy crop in Cheddikulam; kurakkan is being reaped.

Paddy ripening in Melpattu and Udaiyaur, crop middling. Kurakkan is poor.

In Sinhalese divisions 260 bushels sown under Mammadu. Little elsewhere. Ploughing is going on for meda harvest. Heavy crop of 1,000 bushels expected in Periyakaddu tank bed. Kurakkan crop very fair.

Prices: paddy, Re. 1.50 to Rs. 2 a bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1 to Re. 1.60 a bushel; rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 4.66 a bushel.

Rainfall during month: 4.04 in.; 2.90 in. on 7th instant. More rain very badly wanted.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy, maha: the crop in the Four Gravets and Akmimana is being harvested, and the return is favourable. In Wellaboda pattu and Bentota-Walallawita korale it is in blossom, in Hinidum pattu and Gangaboda pattu ripe and ready for reaping, while in Talpe pattu being reaped. In all these pattus, except Bentota-Walallawiti korale, where owing to drought at the time of sowing and heavy rain subsequently, the crop is generally poor, a medium harvest is secure.

Dry grain, maha: sowings are small, and the crop prospects middling.

Miscellaneous: jak, breadfruit, and potatoes are in a fair supply in all but Hinidum pattu, where they are scarce, particularly the last named (potatoes), which are partially destroyed by wild pig. Vegetables are abundant in Talpe pattu, and scarce and dear in all other pattus, they having been injuriously affected by rain and consequent floods. In Gangaboda pattu a considerable extent is under sugarcane, and the outturn good. The coconut crop now on the trees is poor. Prices vary from Rs. 30 to Rs. 35 per thousand nuts.

Prices of staple products: a bushel of rice is from Rs. 2.87½ to Rs. 3.12, paddy Re. 1.25, mederi Rs. 2, amu Re. 1.25, kurakkan Re. 1.50, breadfruit Re. 1.50 to Rs. 2 per hundred, jakfruit Rs. 15 per hundred, sweet potatoes Re. 1.50 per cwt., plantain bunches Rs. 30 per hundred, cucumber Rs. 2 per hundred.

Rainfall has been sufficient and favourable to crops.

Health unsatisfactory: influenza and dysentery have prevailed in some parts of the district, and considerable mortality; cattle free from disease.

MÁTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: maha, generally good with the exception of a few divisions of Morawak korale, which have suffered from too much water. Excellent crops in parts of Gangaboda pattu. Failure of crops in Talalla of Wellaboda pattu. Weligam korale generally good.

Dry grain: small extents cultivated, but the crops are good.

Prices have gone down as the harvest is commencing, and the supply of paddy is large.

HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

West Giruwa pattu: paddy, 10,307 amunams of young crops, middling; 301 amunams blossoming, middling; 16 amunams ripe and being harvested.

Fine grain: the fine grain crop is being harvested.

Magam pattu: the sowing for maha at Tissa nearly completed, some fields are ripe, and some just earing. The harvest is expected to be a successful one.

East Giruwa pattu: prospect of crop is good. New lands at Bemnianwela under Walawe scheme ready for sowing. Mouth of Walawe river opened on 27th instant, as main road was under water. The mouth is again blocked now to fill tanks.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy: early munmari is in excellent condition, and is ripe in several places. Sowing of later munmari not over yet.

Dry grain: Indian corn is harvested; kurakkan is nearly ripe. Both crops are good.

Price of paddy has gone down from Re. 1.33 per bushel in December last to Re. 1.13 now, as all paddy traders sell the old paddy of 1894 before new paddy of 1895 comes into the market.

Rainfall: 5.41 inches. There has been no rain in any quantity since the 6th instant. The crops sown later and not dependent on any tank are very much in need of rain.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Rainfall during the month, 6.94 in.

Koddiyar pattu: about 200 acres at Topur and 150 acres at Mallikaitivu are being sown for the early pinmari crop; 60 acres at Ilakantai are in plants.

Harvest: about 100 acres at Sampur, 125 acres at Kunitivu, 50 acres at Mutur, and 25 acres at Topur are being reaped and stacked.

Tamblegampattu: out of 8 acres of land cultivated at Kantalai, the crop on 3 acres is ripe and 5 acres are in ear. Out of about 46 acres of land cultivated at Tamblegam the crop on about 20 acres is ripe, and in 16 acres the crops are in ear.

Out of about 1,727 acres of land cultivated at Kinniai the crop on about 800 acres is ripe and in 927 acres the crop is in ear.

Out of about 23 acres of land cultivated at Nachikudah, on about 20 acres the crop is ripe and 4 acres in ear.

In Kaddukulam east and west the crops are in ear, and their condition is good.

Price of paddy Re. 1.62; of dry grain Re. 1.37.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Wet cultivation: all crops surviving at the end of last month are doing well, light showers having sustained them. A large area in Dewameddi, Dambadeni, and Katugampola is giving no crop at all. Matters had become hopeless before the December rains fell. More rain has fallen in the Wannai than elsewhere, with consequent improvement in grain prospects. In further Hiriya rain very short, and tanks still empty.

Chena crops are everywhere tolerably successful.

Health of people and cattle was fairly good during the month.

Rainfall registered in Kurunegala, .88 in.

CHILAW DISTRICT.

Paddy : blossoming and in ears, prospects good, damaged to some extent by floods in the central division. Standing crops promise a good harvest.

Fine grain : ripe, prospects very good.

Tobacco : the crop in southern division was good and fetched high prices. Planting operations going on in northern division.

Prices of staple products : cocoanut crops short, but prices high. Price of rice high ; vegetables scarce.

Rainfall : 78 in., generally insufficient.

NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

There was heavy rainfall during the early part of the month ; it was not however very general throughout the Province. In Anuradhapura it amounted to 3.21 inches.

Tavalu and paddy chenas are good and are ripening.

Fields cultivated are of different stages, from tender growth to the age of flowering, and are fair.

Kurakkan crops of navadili hén are about to flower, and of kanattas they are being reaped.

It is not yet the season for gingelly ; meneri has been cultivated in some villages, and is sprouting.

Tanks are half and quarter full.

PROVINCE OF UVA.

BADULLA DISTRICT.

Preparations for the maha sowing are being made generally throughout the Province.

The yala harvest in Yatikinda and Wiyaluwa has given moderate yields. In Udukinda the crop is yet standing.

The chena crops show good promise in every district, and Indian corn and kurakkan are now ripening.

Prices of staple commodities : paddy, Rs. 2 per bushel ; kurakkan, Re. 1.75 per bushel ; Indian corn, Re. 1.75 per bushel ; kollu, Rs. 3.50 per bushel.

Rainfall : heavy in hill districts. Deficiency of water reported in Hambegamuwa tank and generally throughout low-country.

PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy : in Kuruwiti, Nawadun, and Atakalan korales, maha crop is ripe and is being harvested. Weather favourable and prospects good. In Kukulukorale maha crop is blossoming, and in Kolonna, Kadawatu, and Meda korales fields for yala are being prepared for sowing.

Dry grain : in Kuruwiti, Nawadun, Atakalan, and Kolonna korales crops on maha chenas and owitas are ripening, and some are being harvested, weather favourable, and outturn good. In Kadawatu and Meda korales kurakkan crops are in blossom ; prospects unfavourable owing to drought.

In Kukulukorale amu chenas are blossoming, and clearing for yala chenas has begun.

KÉGALLA DISTRICT.

Paddy : maha prospects are generally good. Reaping of the early maha crop has just commenced in parts of Beligal korale and Paranakuru korale.

Dry grain : hill paddy, iringu, and amu are being harvested ; crops are generally good, except the iringu crop in Galboda and Kinigoda korales, which has been affected by bambupidima. Kurakkan sown in parts of Beligal korale and Three Korales and Lower Bulatgama are thriving well. In Beligal korale mun has been harvested, and has yielded a good crop ; meneri is being reaped, and the crop is middling.

Rainfall registered at Ruwanwella is 7.39 inches, Ambanpitiya 4.90 inches.

Price of paddy Re. 1.25 to Re. 1.50 a bushel, hill paddy Re. 1 to Re. 1.12, kurakkan 75 cents to Re. 1.

Cattle disease : foot-and-mouth disease is prevailing in a few villages in Dehigampal korale, Atulugam korale and in Uduwapalata of Lower Bulatgama. It is on the decrease.

2. The tenders are to be made on forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Director of Public Works, or Provincial Engineer, Jaffna, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form.

3. A deposit of Rs. 40 will be required before any form of tender is issued; and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish security in cash to value of 10 per cent. of amount of tender, or 20 per cent. in the case of certified title deeds, such deposits will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

4. The deposit should be made at the Treasury or the Kachcheri, and the receipt of the Treasurer or the Government Agent produced when applying for forms.
