Regulations for the Government University Scholarships.

WITH reference to the regulations, dated March 15, 1922, which were published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd idem, and which govern the award of the Government University Scholarships, notice is hereby given that students of the University College who have completed a full course of study for a degree and have discontinued attendance at lectures after appearing for the Final Examination for a degree, may compete a second time for these scholarships, if still under age, provided that they register themselves as members of the College at the beginning of the Academic Year in which the examination falls, the fee for such registration being Rs. 10.

RULES AND REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. No animal shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house, except between the hours of 6 and 7 A.M.
2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle for 24 hours before slaughter shall be the premises known as the "Cattle Pound," and situated in the town of Rambukkana.
3. Every licensed butcher shall produce for inspection before the Sanitary Inspector at 8 A.M. any head of cattle, sheep, or goats he desires to slaughter. The Sanitary Inspector shall in the case of cattle note on the voucher produced his opinion as to whether the said head of cattle is healthy and fit for human consumption or unfit for slaughter for human consumption, and in the case of sheep or goats shall in his discretion issue a written permit to slaughter.
4. If on any animal being slaughtered the carcass shall appear to the Sanitary Inspector to be diseased or unfit for human food, he shall forthwith notify the District Medical Officer, Kegalla, who shall without delay personally inspect or delegate the District Medical Assistant to inspect the carcass. If in the opinion of District Medical Officer or District Medical Assistant the whole carcass or any portion of the carcass is unfit for human food, he shall cause the same to be buried, and report the matter to the Assistant Government Agent of the District of Kegalla.
5. The carcasses of animals slaughtered shall be hung up after being flayed and cleaned the same day in the place provided for the purpose, and no meat shall be removed for sale, except on permission until 8 A.M.
6. Every butcher or person using the slaughter-house shall pay the following fees:—

7. All fees shall be paid in advance to the Sanitary Inspector.
8. It shall be the duty of each butcher to cause the slaughter-house and premises to be thoroughly cleaned immediately after use, and to bury or cause to be buried all blood, refuse, and offal. These duties shall be performed according to the directions of the Sanitary Inspector.
9. It shall not be lawful for any person to slaughter any animal in the public slaughter-house in the presence of other animals or until the carcass of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.

RULES.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama Esala festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to sixteen days, namely, July 2 to July 17, 1924. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

3. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices;
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

4. The police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

5. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be deemed guilty of an offence. The issue of such permit shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp.

6. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

OIL INSTALLATIONS SCHEME AT COLOMBO.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the following charges will be levied from May 9, 1924, in connection with the Oil Installations Scheme at Colombo:—

Rs. 12 per 1,000 gallons on all petroleum, whether fuel, oil, kerosine, or petrol imported in bulk or transhipped at Colombo.

Rs. 3 per 1,000 gallons working and maintenance charge.

$\frac{1}{2}$ cent per ton on the gross tonnage of the vessel for every six hours or part thereof during which a vessel is berthed alongside the Oil Jetties for purposes other than discharging or bunkering petroleum in bulk. Vessels discharging or bunkering petroleum in bulk at the Oil Jetties, and at the same time unloading or loading any other cargo on, to, or from the jetties, will also be charged at the same rate for the time occupied in the unloading or loading of such other cargo.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 31, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 133 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 18 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1924, viz., 251,824) was 27·6, as against 23·5 in the preceding week, 30·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 104 (3 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 11 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21·6, as against 25·3 in the previous week, 33·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 104 total deaths, 21 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, and 1 each in Maradana East and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week, and 24 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Maradana South, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 11 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospital and Wellawatta North, as against 5 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in Maradana South and Wellawatta North, same as in the previous week, and against 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 42 from *Other Causes*.

6. Thirteen cases of *Enteric Fever*, 11 of *Measles*, 4 of *Chickenpox*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 11, 17, 6 and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·3°, against 81·8° in the preceding week, and 82·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·836 in., against 29·788 in. in the preceding week, and 29·784 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·76 in., against 9·55 in. in the preceding week and 1·79 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 26, 1924, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 23, 1924.

Present :—Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Hon. Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Mr. M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. S. A. Wijetilleke; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. P. M. Bingham; and Dr. R. F. La Brooy.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 22, 1924, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1923 to March 31, 1924, on account of the Municipal Fund; (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date; (c) Health Officer's report for March, 1924; (d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March, 1924; (e) The reservoir readings for March, 1924.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during March, 1924.

4. *Petitions* :—(1) Mr. de Silva presented a petition from Mr. S. P. Abdulla of No. 29, Galagedera road, Katugastota, praying for compensation in respect of the alterations effected by him to the old toll house, Katugastota, which he had leased from the Council.—Resolved that the petition be referred to the Secretary for report.

(2) Mr. Pieris presented a petition from Mr. J. A. Chas. Silva of 100A, Brownrigg street, Kandy, praying for a license to manufacture soap at premises No. 100A, Brownrigg street, until he secures another place.—Resolved that the petition be referred to the Sanitation Committee.

(3) Mr. Wijetilleke presented a letter from Mr. M. I. Amir Deen, dated April 25, 1924, complaining of the drain adjoining his premises No. 785 in Peradeniya road, Kandy, and the delay in issuing a permit to build a kitchen.—Resolved that the petition be referred to the Works Committee.

(4) Mr. Pieris presented a petition from overseers, kanganyies, coolies, &c., employed on scavenging section No. 1 of Kandy town, praying that the proposed contract for scavenging be set aside, or in the alternative, they be paid a month's wages in lieu of notice.—Resolved that the petition be considered with the item 11 on the agenda.

(5) Mr. Wijetileke presented a petition from Mr. T. K. Salideen, praying for a gratuity in consideration of his father's services as a kangany in the Scavenging Department of the Council.—Resolved that the petition be referred to the Finance Committee.

5. Correspondence.—Endorsement No. 6 of March 28, 1924, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding a copy of a minute by the Attorney-General on the subject of the grant to Palle Mahaiyawa Girls' School.—Resolved that the Chairman's report to Government dated April 3, 1924, on the subject be approved, and that the annual grant of Rs. 240 be made under section 45 (d) of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910."

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva asked—(1) During the last three years, how many contracts were given out? (2) How many of them were entrusted to Vaithelingam? (3) How long has Mr. Vaithelingam been employed as contractor under the Council?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) 8 contracts, and 26 agreements for jobworks; (2) 4 contracts, and 9 agreements for jobworks; (3) For about 17 years.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Usoof Ismail asked—

(1) With a view to converting into rat-proof rice stores all those premises bearing assessment Nos. 165 and 189, and No. 14 to forming one block between back lane, Colombo street, and Browning street, will the Chairman be pleased to call for a report from the Medical Officer of Health with suggestions for necessary improvements and alteration to convert all the above premises with rice stores?

(2) Are the grounds of the Empire Theatre public grounds? Does the management of the Empire Theatre pay anything for the weekly Band performance on their grounds by St. Cecilia Band? Authorized by the Council, is there any justification to further continuing the concession? If not, will the Chairman be pleased to cancel the concession and order the Band to play in one of the public parks?

(3) Will the Chairman please ask the officer responsible to explain why he is neglecting to look into the disfiguring of walls in the town by sticking placards, bills on walls, trees, and on the bund, instead of on the notice boards provided for such purpose?

(4) What action does the Council propose to take in regard to the old dredger and barges which lie in the lake near the spill?

(5) In view of the disclosure made during the trial of the Storekeeper at the Supreme Court, which appears to be very damaging to the Superintendent of Works, will the Chairman be pleased to obtain an official record of the proceedings to see what action, if necessary, this Council should take against the Superintendent of Works?

(6) Who is the officer responsible for checking and verifying the receipts and issues of stores by the Storekeeper?

(7) How many such verifications were carried out during 1923?

(8) Will the Chairman please table the reports of all such verifications of stores for the last five years?

(9) From January to date why were no account's statements circulated among the Members?

(10) Up to what date have the accounts of the Council been published in the *Government Gazette*?

(11) Who is the officer responsible for the submission of accounts to the Council?

(12) Has the officer any reason to show why he is delaying these account's statements?

The Chairman replied as follows:—

(1) Report from the Medical Officer of Health is tabled.

(2) The grounds are leased to Madan Theatres, Ltd. I understand that for all practical purposes they are public grounds except for certain restrictions imposed to keep out undesirables after dark. The Band was asked to play on this green on three Wednesdays each month, in accordance with Council's resolution passed at the Meeting of March 17, 1923. There was no stipulation then made as to any payment. I have no power to interfere with the Council's decision.

(3) I had noticed this myself and have asked the Inspectors to warn and prosecute persons responsible for these notices.

(4) This can only be answered by the Council.

(5) I have obtained a fairly accurate newspaper report of the proceedings in this case. The officer in question was called upon to explain his conduct, and I have placed all papers before the Standing Committees on Law and Works to-day.

(6) It is not clear whether the question refers to the actual handling of the goods or the checking of the documents relating to purchases and issues. If the latter, the documents are checked by the Accountant and an annual verification is made by the Secretary and the Accountant.

(7) There was a verification at the close of 1923 by the Acting Secretary.

(8) Reports from 1919 are tabled with the exception of the one for 1922, which was with the late Storekeeper, and is not available in the office.

(9) Printed copy of the accounts for January has been furnished to Members. The Accountant states that he could not circulate the accounts as the detailed statements were not completed in due time. These have now been attended to and laid on the table, and will be circulated to Members next week.

(10) Up to January last.

(11) The Accountant.

(12) The Accountant explains that the delay is due to the lack of an intelligent accounts clerk to assist him during the period he is acting for the Secretary.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijetileke moved—As the owners of property, situate between the Meda-ela and the Railway line at Mulgampola and Wellata, receive but a few of the benefits that owners of property in other parts of the town enjoy, and as no taxes have been charged to them in the past, I move that the taxes they are now called upon to pay be reduced from 16 to 8 per cent., i.e., less water rate, till the locality is provided with proper roads, water, lighting, &c. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.

Mr. de Silva moved as an amendment that the motion be referred to the Law Committee for their consideration.

The amendment fell through for want of a seconder.

The Chairman explained that these properties were included in the Municipal limits in 1902, but for 22 years they have not been assessed by an oversight. In fixing their assessments the absence of conveniences has been taken into consideration.

The Council divided, and the voting resulted as follows :—

For.—Mr. Wijetileke, Mr. Pieris, and Mr. Ratwatte.

Against.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Mr. Bingham, Dr. Hay, Dr. La Brooy, and the Chairman.

The motion was declared lost.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—That in view of the serious disclosures made during the Supreme Court trial of the Kandy Municipal Storekeeper, that a Committee be appointed to investigate into the conduct of the Superintendent of Works. Mr. Usoof Ismail, seconded.

The Chairman and Mr. Bingham opposed the motion on the ground that the explanation tendered by the Superintendent of Works was satisfactory, and that definite charges should be brought up for inquiry.

The motion was put to the House and carried by five to four.

For.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Wijetileke, Mr. Usoof Ismail, Mr. Pieris, and Mr. Ratwatte.

Against.—Mr. Bingham, Dr. Hay, Dr. La Brooy, and the Chairman.

It was agreed that the Committee should consist of the elected Members, Mr. Bingham, and the Chairman.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—That an estimate be prepared for repairing the bathing spout at Ampitiya. Mr. Pieris seconded.—Carried.

11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva was to move—As the bridge at Katugastota is in a dangerous condition, it should be repaired forthwith.

With the leave of Council Mr. de Silva substituted the word "Wattarentenne" for "Katugastota."

The motion was withdrawn, the Chairman having agreed to look into the papers concerning a previous decision on the same subject.

12. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Usoof Ismail moved—That the Superintendent of Works be asked to furnish an estimate to renovate the road leading from Katugastota road to the Cemetery road.

With the leave of Council, the motion was amended by substituting the words "Old Mosque road" for "Cemetery road." Mr. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

13. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Usoof Ismail moved—That the Superintendent of Works be asked to furnish an estimate to cement concrete the bottom of the bathing pond below the spill of the lake. Mr. de Silva seconded.

It was decided to obtain the opinion of the Superintendent of Works, whether it would be safe for bathers if bottom is cemented, before voting on the motion.

14. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Usoof Ismail moved—That the carriage stand at Temple street be converted into a motor car stand for purposes of parking all licensed motor vehicles. Mr. Wijetileke seconded.—Carried.

It was agreed to consult the Police before taking action, and to inquire from the Colombo Municipal Council, what fees are levied by them for parking motor vehicles.

15. The following motion which stood in Mr. Ratwatte's name was withdrawn :—That the scavenging of the Peradeniya section (from the Getambe Police Station to the Municipal limits) be given on contract.

16. To obtain sanction for the acceptance of the tender of Mr. A. A. Fernando (Rs. 12,000) for scavenging No. 1 section of Kandy town for the eight months, May 1 to December 31, 1924.

Mr. de Silva moved that the tender be accepted. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.

The motion was carried by five to four.

For.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Ratwatte, Mr. Pieris, Mr. Usoof Ismail, and Mr. Wijetileke.

Against.—Dr. Hay, Dr. La Brooy, Mr. Bingham, and the Chairman.

17. To consider what should be done with the labour hitherto employed by the Council for scavenging the town.—Resolved that the labour be allowed to the contractor.

18. Tender of J. P. Alexander for opening up a further section of the Asgiriya road.—Resolved that the tender be accepted.

19. Recommendations of the Standing Committees :—

Standing Committee (A).

(1) That an additional assistant teacher be appointed to the Municipal Free School, Katukelle.

(2) That owing to the supply of water for domestic purposes being allowed free of charge as per Council's resolution of August 19, 1922, by-law 144 of Chapter XII. be amended by the deletion of the words "and to fix a meter on the pipe supplying such house or premises," and by-law 157 be repealed.

(3) That the leave taken by the under-mentioned officers during 1923 be sanctioned :—S. V. de Silva, 39 days ; A. B. C. Kulasekera, 61½ days ; T. B. de Alwis, 37 days ; H. Don Fredrick, 83½ days ; R. B. Stephen, 169 days ; A. Cassim, 54 days ; S. H. Hettiaratchy, 64 days ; D. E. P. Joseph, 38 days ; and A. S. V. Raja, 41 days.

Standing Committee (B).

(4) That the offer made by Geo. E. de Silva of a piece of land at Getambe for building an incinerator, free of rent, for a period of five years or until the pit is filled, whichever is the longer period, thereafter incinerator to be removed or rent paid at the option of the Council, be accepted, and that Mr. de Silva be thanked.

(5) That the application of P. S. Fernando & Bros. and Mathias and Peter Fernando & Co. for an extension of time to trade in dry fish at their boutiques in Brownrigg street until the end of the current year, be refused.

Standing Committee (C).

(6) That a vote of Rs. 166·66 be taken to meet one-third of the allowance given to Mr. C. Vanderwall as legal advisor to the Board of Improvement.

(7) That the rent of space occupied by Mr. W. A. B. Soysa in the Railway Approach road granary be reduced to Rs. 50 a month from January 1, 1924.

(8) That the employment of a cooly as caretaker and scavenger for the Mahaiyawa model dwellings at 75 cents per diem, be sanctioned.

(9) That a vote of Rs. 90 be taken to pay two coolies employed by the Police Department for destruction of dogs in Kandy for a period of two months.

(10) That the employment of a temporary clerk on Rs. 60 a month for the period that Mr. M. C. Abdul Jawad will be away on leave (May 5 to November 30, 1924), be sanctioned.

Standing Committee (D).

(11) That the estimate of Rs. 1,280 for fixing four waste detecting meters be passed.

(12) That the estimate of Rs. 370 for building a bathroom and laying water service to the Municipal Free School, Katukelle, be passed.

(13) That the further claim of the Director of Public Works, amounting to Rs. 81·41 for repairs to the steamroller effected in 1921, be paid.

(14) That the following applications for water service be allowed:—(i.) 102, Colombo street, K. Arunasalam; (ii.) 20, Cross street, K. B. Joseph Perera; (iii.) 65, Deiyannewela, B. W. Fernando; (iv.) 22A, Hill street, Alfred Brodie & Co.; (v.) 39A-L, Katukelle Lake road, P. K. Cader Meera Saibo; (vi.) 809-10, Peradeniya road, J. Piachaud; (vii.) 1037-38, Peradeniya road, C. D. Josephine; (viii.) 609, Peradeniya road Mosque.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exception of item (5).

As regards item (5),—resolved that Messrs. P. S. Fernando & Bros. and Mathias and Peter Fernando & Co. be allowed to trade in dry fish at their boutiques in Brownrigg street until the end of the current year, and that no further extension of time be allowed thereafter.

1. Memorandum from Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle on the subject of improvements to the Kandy water supply—Tabled. Resolved that the memorandum be acknowledged with thanks.

2. Papers relating to the improvements and extension of the Kandy water supply.

Mr. de Silva moved the Council into Committee.

The Chairman explained that the combined water and electricity scheme proposed by Mr. Bingham has not received the approval of the Director of Public Works.

Mr. Bingham has, therefore, considered the possibility of a minor scheme, and suggested that Gonapilikanu stream be diverted into the present reservoir.

Two alternative estimates are submitted by Mr. Bingham :—(1) Estimate for Rs. 134,000, providing for two Jewell filters without acquisition of land; and (2) estimate for Rs. 196,000, providing for acquisition of 68 acres of land, but not providing for Jewell filters.

Mr. Ratwatte moved that both schemes be referred to the Director of Public Works as approved by this Council, and he be asked to advise as to which the Council should adopt. Mr. Wijetileke seconded:—Carried.

Council resumed, and the above resolution was passed.

3. To consider whether the water supply should be shut during the day.—Resolved that water be shut between 12 noon and 3 P.M., if water gets 10 feet below spill.
