WHEREAS by the 5th section of “The Prisons Ordinance, No. 16 of 1877,” as amended by section 1 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1890, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to establish any prison for this Island or for any part thereof :

And whereas it is expedient to establish a prison at Kalutara :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation establish nine lock-ups at the Kalutara Police Station as a prison at Kalutara aforesaid, for the reception of prisoners of every description committed or remanded under the authority of the several courts of the Island for the period of the Kalutara Sessions of the Supreme Court of the Island of Ceylon, which begin on Tuesday, June 17, 1924.

RULES made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under section 3 of "The Ceylon Passport Ordinance, No. 20 of 1923," and laid before the Legislative Council on June 12, 1924, are published for general information.

PART I.—General.

1. No person shall depart from the Colony nor enter the Colony, unless such person is the bearer of a valid passport issued or renewed not more than two years previously by or on behalf of the country of which the person to whom it relates is a subject or citizen. Provided, however, that no passport shall be required of any British subject travelling between India and Ceylon nor of Asiatic residents of Ceylon or India travelling between the Federated Malay States or the Straits Settlements and Ceylon.

2. Every passport shall state the name and nationality of the person to whom it relates, and shall contain a description of the said person, together with such person's photograph permanently affixed to the passport. The photograph shall bear the seal or stamp of the office issuing the passport.

3. Whenever it may appear to a Passport Issuing Authority inadvisable that a passport should be granted, such Issuing Authority may at his discretion issue an Emergency Certificate in place of a passport. Such Emergency Certificate shall be valid only for a single specified journey to or from Ceylon, and shall be subject to any other conditions contained therein which the Issuing Authority may think fit to prescribe, and may, for the purpose of rule 1, be regarded as a passport for the specified journey.

4. A passport shall be available only for those countries for which it bears a sufficient visa.

PART II.—Issue and Renewal of British Passports in Ceylon.

5. The authority for the issue or renewal of passports in Ceylon shall be His Excellency the Governor or the Officer Administering the Government for the time being.

6. Applications for passports or for the renewal of passports already in possession shall be made on forms prescribed by the Issuing Authority. All applications shall be addressed to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, Colonial Secretary's Office, Colombo.

7. The Passport Issuing Authority may require such evidence as is necessary, either in the form of a declaration or otherwise, to satisfy himself of the national status of any applicant for a passport.

8. (a) Married women travelling with their husbands may be included on the husband's passport, if application is made to be so included at the time of the issue of the passport.

(b) Children under the age of sixteen years may be included on the passports of their parent or guardian.

9. Any Indian ordinarily resident in India leaving Ceylon for any destination other than India, and not exempted by the proviso to rule 1 shall possess a valid passport issued to him in India according to the regulations for the time being in force in India allowing him to leave India for the same destination, and no passport shall be issued to such person in Ceylon.

10. Passports shall not be available beyond two years from the date of issue. They may be renewed for four further periods of two years each, after which fresh passports must be obtained.

11. (a) The charge for a passport shall be Rs. 5:

(b) The charge for renewal of a passport shall be Rs. 2 in respect of each period of two years.

PART III.

12. Nothing contained in rule 1 shall apply to—

(a) Any members of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces entering or leaving the Colony on duty;

(b) Any member of the crew of any vessel who has been lawfully engaged in the Colony, or lawfully engaged in India and sent to the Colony, for an oversea voyage;

(c) Any person landing under a special permit in writing issued by the Colonial Secretary, the Principal Collector of Customs, or the Inspector-General of Police, and acting in accordance with the conditions of such permit.

13. Any person acting contrary to the above rules or attempting so to do, and any person aiding or abetting such person to act contrary to the above rules, shall be guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction before a Police Magistrate, with imprisonment, simple or rigorous, for a period not exceeding three months, or a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees, or both.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. Regulation (8) of Part I. of the rates and regulations published by Notification dated September 30, 1922, in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 7,285 of September 30, 1922, and appearing in the schedule to the said Notification, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted therefor :—

(8) The following goods shall be exempted from first rent :—Government cargo, coal, military baggage, dhobies' bundles, kerosine oil in bulk, and liquid fuel in bulk, and exports shut out and re-landed.

2. Regulation (3) of Part III. of the said rates and regulations is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor :—

(3) All goods laden for shipment and not shipped but re-landed shall be allowed to remain in the warehouse free of rent for three days from the day on which the goods were shut out, such three days being inclusive of the day on which the goods were shut out, the day of removal, and Sundays and Customs holidays. After this period of three days they shall be liable to payment of the above rates for each succeeding day or part thereof, including Sundays, Customs holidays, and the day of removal.

ORDER FOR REGULATING THE PROCEDURE FOR THE PAYMENT OF  
MONEY INTO COURT.

We, the Honourable Sir Anton Bertram, Knight, K.C., Chief Justice of the Island of Ceylon, and the Honourable George Francis MacDaniel Ennis, Senior Puisne Justice of the Supreme Court of the Island of Ceylon, and the Honourable Thomas Edward de Sampayo, K.C., Puisne Justice of the said Court, and the Honourable William Thomas Porter, Puisne Justice of the said Court, and the Honourable Gualterus Stewart Schneider, K.C., Puisne Justice of the said Court, do hereby, in pursuance and execution of the powers given by section 53 of "The Courts Ordinances, 1889 and 1901," and all other powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, order and direct in manner following :—

1. Where in any law or regulation for the time being in force in the Courts of this Island provision is made for the payment of money into Court, such payment shall be made in the manner following :—

- (a) Whenever any person has occasion to pay money into Court he shall signify the same to the Secretary or Chief Clerk of the Court, who shall give him a deposit note in the form prescribed in the Financial Orders, to be delivered together with the money to the Kachcheri or Treasury of the District.
- (b) The receipt shall then be acknowledged by the signature of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or person duly authorized on his behalf on that part of the note reserved for the purpose, which shall be cut off and delivered to the person who shall have made the payment, the remaining part being reserved as the authority for receiving the money.
- (c) The date of the Kachcheri receipt shall be deemed to be the date of payment into Court.
- (d) Where there is no Kachcheri or Treasury in the town in which the Court is situated, the Secretary or Chief Clerk shall issue to the person requiring to pay money into Court, in addition to the deposit note referred to in rule 1 (a) above, an application addressed to the nearest Post Office for an official money order in favour of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent of the District, to be delivered by him to the Postmaster. The receipt shall then be acknowledged by the signature of the Postmaster on that part of the note reserved for the purpose, which shall be cut off and delivered to the person who shall have made the payment. The remaining part together with the money order shall be sent by the Postmaster to the Court which shall forward them to the Kachcheri. The date of issue of such money order shall be deemed to be the date of payment into Court.

2. This order may be cited as 'The Payment into Court Order, 1924.'

Whenever a typewritten copy exceeds the prescribed standard of thirty pages or the number of typewritten copies applied for is in excess of two, the Registrar shall require payment for such copies as exceed the prescribed standard of thirty pages or the additional copies in excess of two, for which application is made, at a rate not exceeding 50 per cent. of the amount charged for the first thirty pages for every additional thirty pages or fraction thereof.

**Rule 1: Exception—**

In areas where the payment of poll tax has been abolished and there is no other provision or there is not sufficient time for preparing a list of voters, on which a poll can be held within the year, the Governor may authorize, for the purpose of holding a poll, that the list of tax-paying inhabitants, on which a recent poll was held, shall be adopted, provided that the said poll was held not more than twelve months prior to the proposed poll, and provided also that the Government Agent is satisfied that the number of persons objecting to the existence of taverns within the area represents not less than 25 per cent. of those enrolled on the said list.

**Rule 8: Add at end—**

The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall also have the power to appoint such officers as they may consider necessary to assist the Presiding Officer.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Supply of Best Kallundai and Best Country Rice to the Irrigation Department," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, August 5, 1924.

5. ## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 7, 1924.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 138 (3 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 16 Moors, 5 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1924, viz., 251,824) was 28·7, as against 27·6 in the preceding week, 25·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·3 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 105 (3 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 15 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21·8, as against 21·6 in the previous week, 29·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 105 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 15 in the previous week, and 24 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar, same as in the previous week, and against 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 each in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and Maradana North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

3. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident) and Slave Island, as against 3 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Debility*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Tetanus*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Worms*, 1 each from *Measles* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 34 from *Other Causes*.

5. Ten cases of *Enteric Fever*, 9 of *Measles*, and 6 of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 13, 11 and 4, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported during the week, but one was reported in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·7°, against 82·3° in the preceding week and 81·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·845 in., against 29·836 in. in the preceding week and 29·805 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4·29 in., against 3·76 in. in the preceding week and 5·16 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

2. Candidates wishing to take up the examination at Anuradhapura, Kurunegala, Tangalla, or Batticaloa, should apply to the Divisional Irrigation Engineers in the respective centres. Those wishing to take up the examination at Badulla should apply to the Divisional Irrigation Engineer, Haldummulla. Applications for admission to the examination will be received not later than July 2, 1924, by the Divisional Irrigation Engineers mentioned.

3. Applications must be on the prescribed form, which can be obtained from a Divisional Irrigation Engineer.

4. Candidates must be between the ages of 18 and 25, and must furnish, together with their applications, the following:—

- (a) Birth certificate.
- (b) Certificates of respectability from at least two persons, whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability and who are not the candidates' schoolmasters, and also conduct certificates from the candidates' schoolmasters.
- (c) Educational certificate of a standard not lower than the Cambridge Junior School Certificate (with pass in Mathematics).

5. Candidates who are approved will be examined in—

- (1) Mathematics.
  - (a) Arithmetic.
  - (b) Algebra (up to and including quadratic equations).
  - (c) Geometry (theorems and problems on the following: angles at a point; parallel straight lines; side and angle properties of triangles and parallelograms; areas of triangles and quadrilaterals; the chord, angle, and tangent properties of the circle; the properties of the right-angled triangle).
  - (d) Mensuration, elementary (of areas and solids).
- (2) English Composition (Essay).
- (3) *Viva voce* in English.

6. Successful candidates will be required, before final selection as Learners, to fill up a form (General 169), which may be obtained from a Divisional Irrigation Engineer, and handed to a Government Medical Officer, from whom a health certificate, testifying to the candidates' sound constitution, good vision and hearing, and physical fitness for service in the jungle districts of the Island, must be obtained and produced to the Divisional Irrigation Engineer for examination.

7. Security for the sum of Rs. 100 in two satisfactory sureties must be furnished to cover the cost of loss of stores or damage to instruments through neglect or carelessness. Candidates must also sign an agreement to the effect that they will serve, if so required by the Director of Irrigation, for a period of three years in this Department, failing which they will refund the cost of their training if called upon to do so. After selection, they will be taken into a Divisional Office or sent on to works of construction or survey for about 9 months, and granted subsistence allowance of Rs. 30 a month during this period.

8. Four and a half months of the period may be spent at the Training Classes of the Irrigation Department at Trincomalee, where free unfurnished camp quarters will be provided. Travelling expenses to and from a Learner's station and Trincomalee will be allowed, but will be limited to fare by public conveyance and daily allowance at the rate paid to Sub-Inspectors.

9. At the end of the training period a Learner will be examined as to his fitness for appointment as an Irrigation Sub-Inspector, but a Learner, who does not attend to his work, or shows no promise of becoming a satisfactory officer, may be discontinued at any time.

10. A Sub-Inspector will be eligible, on passing a further examination, for promotion to Irrigation Inspector (on vacancies occurring), and ultimately, after satisfactory service and approved ability, to Assistant Irrigation

Engineer. The pay and prospects of these officers have been greatly improved lately, and at present are as follows:—

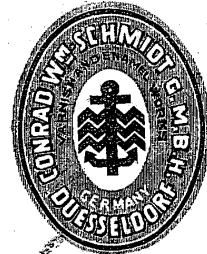

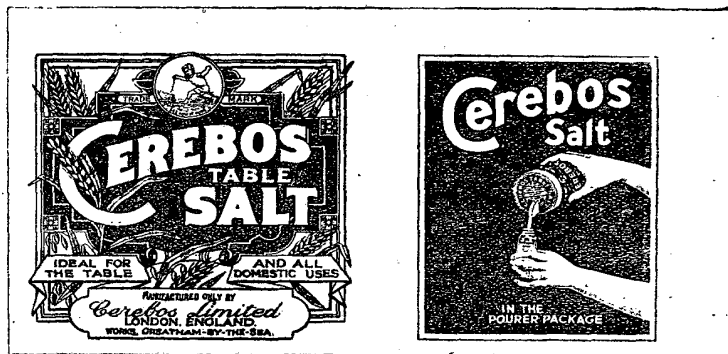
