By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### A. E. HAVELOCK.

HEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which the Island is by the said Ordinance divided for the purposes of the administration of justice-

For the Midland Circuit three times at least at Kandy and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, on August 1, and on December 1 in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should, on the days hereinafter mentioned, be holden at Kurunégala and Badulla, places within the said. Midland Circuit in the said Ordinance mentioned:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that Sessions of the Supreme Court in its criminal

jurisdiction shall be holden at Kurunégala on Thursday, the Twenty-first day of March, and at Badulla on Thursday, the Twenty-eighth day of March, 1895.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which the Island is by the said Ordinance divided for the purposes of the administration of justice—

For the Western Circuit four times at least at Colombo; such Sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, on March 20, on July 10, and on October 10 in every year:

And whereas by the said Ordinance it is also provided that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, to alter the dates fixed by the said Ordinance for holding Criminal Sessions of the said Court at any of the places therein mentioned, and to fix any other date for the commencement thereof:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter the date fixed by the said Ordinance for the commencement of the Second Criminal Session of the Supreme Court at Colombo, and to fix

another date instead thereof:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint as follows:

That the Second Criminal Session of the Supreme Court for the Western Circuit to be holden this year at Colombo, shall commence on Monday, the 1st day of April, instead of Wednesday, the 20th day of March.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this First day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.

HEREAS the place at which the Talátu-oya bridge toll established under "The Tolls Ordinance. 1867," should be collected was by Proclamation dated the 6th February, 1871, determined to be at or near the bridge:
