**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE  
MONTH OF MARCH, 1924.**

**REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.**

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

**Marriages.**

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 378 (328 General, 1 Kandyān, and 49 Muhammadan), as against 365 in the preceding month and 291 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 137 (109 General and 28 Muhammadan), as against 153 in the preceding month and 123 in the corresponding month of last year.

**Births.**

3. The births registered numbered 1,584 (806 males and 778 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·31 per 1,000 of the population, as against 32·14 in the preceding month, 33·04 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·58 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate ranged from 9·40 in Anuradhapura to 59·39 in Nawalapitiya.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 566 (301 males and 265 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 26·39 per 1,000, as against 29·90 in the preceding month, 31·03 in the corresponding month of last year, and 24·75 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and Pettah Wards, ranged from 10·06 in Kollupitiya to 28·07 in Wellawatta North.

**Deaths.**

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,769 (934 males and 835 females). There were 1,427 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 29·53 per 1,000, as against 32·64 in the preceding month, 32·48 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·48 the average for the month of March in each year since 1914. The rate ranged from 126·56 in Vavuniya to 3·60 in Kegalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 640 (343 males and 297 females). There were 546 deaths of town residents, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 29·31 per 1,000, as against 32·94 in the preceding month, 32·59 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·03 the average for the month of March in each year since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and Pettah Wards, ranged from 26·75 in San Sebastian to 11·02 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 117 (53 males and 64 females), as against 100 in the preceding month.

**Infant Mortality.**

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 358 and corresponded to a rate of 220 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 226, as against 246 in the previous month, 229 in the corresponding month of last year, and 223 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 140 and corresponded to a rate of 240 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 244, as against 246 in the previous month, 226 in the corresponding month of last year, and 230 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

**Causes of Death.**

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 15 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year) caused 8 per cent. of the deaths, *Convulsions* 7 per cent., *Phthisis* 5 per cent., *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, each 4 per cent., *Enteritis*, *Anchylostomiasis*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 3 per cent., *Prematurity*, *Enteric Fever*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, each 2 per cent., *Tetanus*, *Bronchitis*, *Influenza*, and *Cancer*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 14 per cent. of the total deaths. *Phthisis* caused 9 per cent. of the deaths, *Convulsions* 7 per cent., *Debility* (of children under 1 year) 6 per cent., *Enteric Fever* and *Enteritis*, each 4 per cent., *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, each 3 per cent., *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Prematurity* and *Influenza*, each 2 per cent., *Plague*, *Cancer*, *Tetanus*, *Bronchitis*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and *Anchylostomiasis*, each 1 per cent.

12. Nine deaths from *Plague* (7 males and 2 females) were registered in Colombo, as against 22 in the preceding month and 13 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 128 cases were reported (102 in Colombo, 7 in Tangalle, 6 in Kandy, 5 in Galle), *Phthisis* followed with 106 cases (101 in Colombo, 5 in Galle), *Enteric Fever* 60 (34 in Colombo, 14 in Galle), *Measles* 38 (31 in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 32 (21 in Colombo, 8 in Galle), *Plague* 7 (in Colombo), *Mumps* 7 (5 in Colombo), *Whooping Cough* 6 (5 in Badulla), and *Smallpox* 2 (1 each in Colombo and Ratnapura). There were also reported 1 case of *Dysentery* in Moratuwa and 1 of *Diphtheria* in Colombo.

**Meteorology.**

14. *Rainfall*.—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (20·82 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 14·24 in. in Nawalapitiya to 2·80 in. in Jaffna and Vavuniya. Colombo recorded 11·29 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 82·6° in Mannar to 60·6° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 81·4° in Colombo.
