PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight-Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS it is directed by Article LXIII. of "The Ceylon (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1923," that the first general election of members of the Legislative Council to be constituted under the said Order in Council should be held at such time not more than six months after the publication of such Order in Council in the *Government Gazette* as the Governor shall, by Proclamation, appoint, but subject to the proviso that the Governor may, by Proclamation, postpone the holding of such first general election for a further period not exceeding four months if, in his opinion, it is not practicable to hold the same within such first-mentioned period:

And whereas the said Order in Council was duly published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* on February 16, 1924, and the said period of six months expires on August 15, 1924:

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is not practicable, by reason of the work entailed in the preparation and revision of the electoral registers, to hold such first general election as aforesaid within the said period of six months, and it has become necessary to postpone the holding of the said first general election:

Now, therefore, We, William Henry Manning, Governor as aforesaid, do hereby postpone the period within which the said first general election may be held for a further period of four months from the said August 15, 1924.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-four.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO PRIVIES, CESSPITS, LATRINES, CATCHPITS,
AND SOAKAGEPITS.

1. No occupier or owner shall build or cause to be built on his land or premises any privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit without having first obtained the permission of the Chairman in writing.

2. (a) Upon any application for such permission under by-law 1 it shall be competent to the Chairman to require that any particular type of privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit approved by him, and no other shall be constructed.

(b) The Chairman may further prescribe the position in which such privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit shall be constructed, and refuse permission to construct any privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit in any other position.

(c) It shall further be competent to the Chairman to refuse permission to construct any privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit at all upon any premises should the Chairman be of opinion that such construction should not be permitted on sanitary grounds.

3. It shall be competent to the Chairman to order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises in which a privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit has been constructed without permission, or in any way contrary to the terms of any permission issued by the Chairman, to demolish and fill up the said privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit within such reasonable time as may be prescribed by the Chairman.

4. The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of any premises to construct within the time prescribed by such order a privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit of such a type and size and in such a position and with such connecting drains as the Chairman may prescribe.

5. The Chairman may order in writing the owner or occupier of the premises upon which any privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit exists either to repair, alter, or reconstruct the same in such manner and within such time as the Chairman, may prescribe, or to demolish and fill up the same within such prescribed time, if in the opinion of the Chairman or the Council such privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit is structurally defective or is unsuitable for the purpose to which it is put, or is liable to give rise to a nuisance, or if it does not abut upon and cannot be conveniently conserved from a conservancy lane.

6. Any person failing to comply with an order made by the Chairman under the preceding by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

7. It shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any premises upon which any privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit stands to keep the said privy, cesspit, latrine, catchpit, or soakagepit in good repair and in a clean and sanitary state, and to see that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any owner or occupier failing so to do shall be guilty of an offence and punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

8. In order to secure the efficient removal of night soil it shall be lawful for the Council by resolution to require the owners or occupiers of any houses, buildings, or lands to provide and maintain at their own expense a conservancy lane not exceeding 10 feet wide at the back of or running through their premises in such position as may be determined by the Chairman.

9. All conservancy shall be carried out by the Council, and it shall not be lawful for any person either to carry out such work himself, or by means of an agent or servant, or to employ any person to do such work for him, without the written permission of the Chairman, which permission the Chairman is empowered at his discretion to refuse, if he is of opinion that all such services can be adequately carried out by the Council.

10. All owners or occupiers of premises furnished with closets or latrines shall pay monthly to the Council a conservancy fee of Re. 1 per bucket for the removal of their night soil. All such fees shall be paid before the 10th day of the month following that during which the service was rendered. Any owner or occupier failing to do so shall be guilty of an offence and punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

11. Any person requiring the service of day coolies may apply to the Chairman therefor in writing, and such coolies will be supplied upon such terms as the Chairman shall decide. A fee of Rs. 2.50 per month for the services of each such cooly shall be paid.

12. Whenever the Chairman shall consider the construction of a new catchpit or the alteration, repair, or reconstruction or filling up of an existing catchpit to be necessary, he may require any owner or occupier of any land or premises by notice in writing signed by him either to construct a new catchpit or to alter, repair, or reconstruct or fill up any existing catchpit, and may further give directions as to the position, level, and size of such catchpit, the materials to be used, the manner in which the work is to be carried out, and any other details in connection with such work. Any such owner or occupier who shall after receipt of such notice fail

within such time as the Chairman shall determine to carry out such requirements of the Chairman shall be guilty of an offence and punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

13. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to notify the owner or occupier of any land or premises upon which there is any catchpit into which dirty water flows and collects that the Council will henceforth undertake the daily removal of such water, and thereafter such owner or occupier shall be bound to pay such reasonable expenses for the removal of such dirty water as the Council shall have incurred.

14. The owner or occupier of any land or premises upon which there is any catchpit into which dirty water flows and collects, and who shall not have been notified by the Chairman under by-law 13, shall be responsible for the daily removal of such water to such place as the Chairman shall approve, so that no nuisance is caused thereby. Any such owner or occupier failing to carry out such removal as above required shall be guilty of an offence and punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

ORDINANCE NO. 17 OF 1869.

BY-LAWS.

1. For the purpose of these by-laws the expression "proper authority" shall mean the Sanitary Board of the Kegalla District.
2. All burial grounds within the administrative limits of the Sanitary Board of the Kegalla District shall be subject to the following by-laws and shall be registered in the manner indicated therein.
3. The proper authority may give notice requiring that all burial grounds in any defined area or group of areas shall be registered in his office on or before a certain date.
4. The trustees, managers, or proprietors of any burial ground, or the person having sole or principal charge thereof, shall, within three months after the publication of this notice, nominate a person, hereinafter referred to as the "responsible officer," who shall be responsible to the proper authority for the proper regulation of the burial and cremation of corpses in such burial ground and for ensuring that graves shall be of proper depth; if no responsible officer is nominated as aforesaid, the proper authority shall nominate such an officer.
5. In the case of burial grounds in charge of the proper authority, the Town Arachchi exercising authority over the area in which the burial ground is situated shall, in the absence of a special written nomination of some other person by the proper authority, be the responsible officer, who shall be responsible to the proper authority for the proper regulation of the burial and cremation of corpses and for ensuring that graves shall be of proper depth.
6. It shall be the duty of the responsible officer to furnish such information as the proper authority may from time to time require in order to prepare a register of burial grounds within such area or areas defined as aforesaid. The information shall, *inter alia*, contain the following particulars:—
 - (a) Name of the district, korale, pattuwa or palata, wasama, and village or town in which the burial ground is situated;
 - (b) Name of the burial ground;
 - (c) A plan of the land by a surveyor, or, in its absence, a sketch giving the measurements in yards along the various boundaries;
 - (d) The names and residences of the trustees, managers, or proprietors;
 - (e) The name, occupation, and address of the responsible officer;
 - (f) The community or communities to which the burial ground is open.
7. The responsible officer shall forthwith report any burial grounds opened under section 34 or closed under section 35 of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899."
8. It shall be the duty of the responsible officer to see that all burial grounds in his charge are kept clear of all weeds and undergrowth, and that no rubbish is deposited thereon.
9. All graves shall be dug in order, so as not to waste space, and shall not be less than six feet deep.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 26, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 115 (3 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 9 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1924, viz., 253,224) was 23·7, as against 27·3 in the preceding week, 20·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 144 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 86 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 17 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·7, as against 22·7 in the previous week, 36·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 144 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 40 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta North, same as in the previous week, and against 24 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana hospital, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, same as in the previous week, and against 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, same as in the previous week, and against 15 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Wellawatta North and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 4 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana hospital, and Wellawatta North, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 13 from *Enteritis*, 10 from *Debility*, 4 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, 3 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 44 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eight cases of *Measles*, 7 of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 8, 4, 6, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·6°, against 79·3° in the preceding week and 78·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·851 in., against 29·837 in. in the preceding week, and 29·857 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·52 in., against 6·97 in. in the preceding week, and 6·50 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

12. The lessee shall at the expiration or sooner determination of the said term deliver up the said plantation and leased premises and all fixtures and additions thereto in such good and husbandlike condition as aforesaid, and in all respects in such state and condition as shall be consistent with the due performance of the agreements and stipulations herein contained.

13. The lessee shall, for more perfectly securing to the Crown the due performance of the conditions above set forth, execute with one or more sureties, immediately after the execution of these presents, a bond of even date herewith in favour of our Sovereign Lord the King for the sum of Rupees _____, and hypothecating to the Crown the properties therein mentioned.

14. If any other quarterly instalments of rent hereby secured shall be in arrear for more than thirty days, or if the lessee commit a breach of any of the foregoing covenants, it shall be lawful for the lessor for and on behalf of the Crown to re-enter upon the said plantation and leased premises without making any compensation to the lessee, and thereupon it shall be optional to the lessor on behalf of the Crown either to sell the remainder of the term at the risk of the lessee or to forthwith determine the tenancy of the said plantations and leased premises.

15. The lessee will pay all taxes due on account of this land and be subject to Municipal regulations.

Improvements in the production of catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia.

Abstract.—A catalyst consisting of an oxide of iron with an irreducible metallic oxide such as that of one of the alkali earth metals uniformly distributed through it is formed by heating a mixture of these substances or bodies which will produce them on heating to a high temperature together with highly combustible substances, such as coal, magnesium, aluminium, and the like, in a current of oxygen so that the point of ebullition is reached.

The claims are :—

1. The production of catalysts for use in the synthesis of ammonia from its constituent elements by heating artificial or natural iron oxides admixed with substances possessing a high combustion heat and with or without heat irreducible metallic oxides in the presence of a strong current of pure oxygen until the temperature of the whole mass becomes near or equal to that of ebullition.

2. For producing catalysts by the process of claim 1, the use of artificial or natural iron compounds capable of furnishing iron oxides.

3. For producing catalysts by the process of claim 1, the modification whereby oxides of metals of the iron group other than iron with or without artificial or natural iron oxides are used.

4. For producing catalysts by the process of claim 1, the modification whereby compounds of metals of the iron group other than iron with or without iron compounds capable of furnishing iron oxides are used.

5. The production of catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia, substantially as described.

6. Catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia when produced by the process of claim 1, with the materials claimed in any of the preceding claims.

An improved process for the synthetic production of ammonia.

Abstract.—Ammonia is synthesized from nitrogen and hydrogen at a temperature of 400° C and a pressure below 500 atmospheres with the aid of a catalyst. The reaction gas is mixed with a predetermined amount of the reaction product to prevent overheating of the catalyst.

The claims are :—

1. A process for the catalytic production of ammonia from its constituent elements involving the use of pressures below 500 atmospheres and catalysts capable of acting at such pressures and temperatures approximating to 400° C characterized by causing the reacting gases to pass over the catalytic mass along with a predetermined quantity of the reaction product, such as will be sufficient to regulate the thermic effect of the reaction.

Improvements in catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia.

Abstract.—In the production of catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia a layer of previously prepared catalyst is placed on the bottom of the crucible, an iron cylinder is placed on this layer and the space between the cylinder and the walls of the crucible are packed with previously prepared catalyst. The reaction mixture is placed inside the iron cylinders. This reaction mixture is so adjusted that the final product will contain more than ten per cent. of such irreducible oxide: as those of calcium, magnesium, or aluminium.

The claims are :—

1. The production of catalysts according to the method of application No. 2,061 characterized by dissolving during the oxidation over ten per cent. of an oxide or mixture of oxides irreducible by hydrogen, or substances producing such oxide or oxides, the crucible wherein the oxidation is effected, being lined with material of the same composition as the catalyst to be obtained.

2. The production of catalysts according to the method of application No. 2,061 characterized by dissolving during the oxidation over ten per cent. of oxide of calcium, magnesium or aluminium separately or admixed, the crucible wherein the oxidation is effected, being lined with material of the same composition as the catalyst to be obtained.

3. The production of catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia, substantially as described.

4. Catalysts for the synthesis of ammonia whenever produced according to the preceding claims.

Improvements in apparatus for the catalytic production of synthetic ammonia.

Abstract.—In an apparatus for the synthesis of ammonia by the circulation of the uncombined and enriched gases in a closed cycle, the use of pumps is avoided by using the energy of the fresh mixture from the compression chamber which is at a high pressure to force the gases from the refrigerator round the cycle: this is done by the use of a device somewhat resembling a water exhaustion pump.

The claims are:—

1. Apparatus for use in circulatory processes for the catalytic synthesis of ammonia in which the freshly introduced reacting gases are admitted into the cycle under a greater compression than the gaseous mixture which has already circulated over the catalyst so as to cause the said gaseous mixture to re-circulate in the system.
2. Apparatus for use in circulatory processes for the catalytic synthesis of ammonia as claimed in claim 1, in which the circulation of the mixture is caused by an injector, the fresh mixture flowing from a compressor constituting the driving fluid at a pressure of from 10 to 100 or more atmospheres higher than the pressure of the mixture to be circulated.
3. Apparatus for use in circulatory processes for the catalytic synthesis of ammonia as claimed in claim 1, comprising a diffuser cone leading to the catalytic tube, arranged in a thick-walled tube behind a nozzle regulated by a needle; a duct with a filter, for introducing the fresh mixture of reacting gases and leading to the nozzle; and a duct for leading the mixture after complete or partial separation of the ammonia, to the nozzle.
4. Apparatus for use in circulatory processes for the catalytic synthesis of ammonia, substantially as described or illustrated in the annexed drawings.

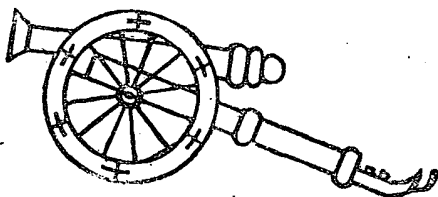
