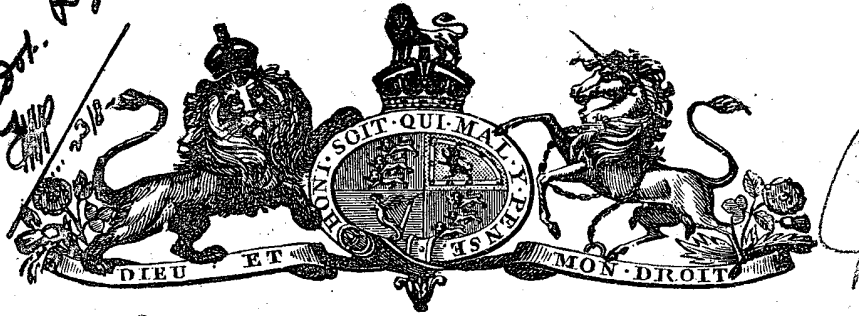

WHEREAS by section 12 of "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1921," as amended by "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 11 of 1922," it is enacted that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any British Possession or any territory under His Majesty's protection, for the enforcement within such possession or territory, of maintenance orders made by courts in Ceylon, the Governor may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* extend this Ordinance to maintenance orders made by courts within such possession or territory and that thereupon the Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or Ireland:

And whereas We are satisfied that reciprocal provisions as aforesaid have been made by the Legislature of the British Possession appearing in the schedule hereto, for the enforcement within the said possession, of maintenance orders made by courts in Ceylon:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid do hereby extend "The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1921," to maintenance orders made by courts within the said possession.

Physiology of the Human Body—

- (1) The digestive system.
Digestion and absorption, the structure of the teeth.
- (2) Excretion.
The kidneys, the structure of the skin.

Air and Ventilation.—The composition of air; simple methods of detecting oxygen, carbon dioxide, and water vapour in air; quantity of fresh air required for each person; impurities in air; sewer gas; effect of occupants on air of rooms; overcrowding; fresh air as food, impure air as poison, special importance of fresh air in connection with tuberculosis.

Water.—Quantity of water required for each person; sources of water supply, e.g., rain water, springs, wells, rivers, and upland surface waters; sources of impurities; filters; water as a carrier of disease.

Foods.—Classification of foods; nature, relative values, and importance of the chief constituents of foods; various foods, e.g., meat, milk, bread, cheese, vegetables, fruits, cereals, fats, sugar, tea, coffee, cacao, tinned foods; excretion and the precautions necessary for the maintenance of the functions of the excretory organs; overfeeding and underfeeding; unwholesome and unpunctual feeding; drinks and narcotics.

Drainage.—Removal of dry refuse; dry-earth closets, flush systems; traps; influence on health of defective drains; dangers of soil pollution.

Personal Hygiene.—Breathing; rest and exercise; washing and bathing; use and action of soap; care of teeth; care of the eye sight; relative hygienic values of cotton, linen, wool, and silk clothing; change of clothing and bedding. Simple facts concerning common infectious diseases; mosquitoes, flies, and fleas as carriers of disease; elementary notions on bacteria, their mode of life and infection; value and use of common disinfectants, e.g., Condy's fluid, bleaching powder, carbolic powders and solutions, sulphur dioxide. Burns and scalds; cuts; sprains and fractures.

(f) *Elementary Science.*

The examination will test whether the subjects mentioned in the syllabus have been studied experimentally. Questions may be set on the following :—

Measurement of length, area, and volume : British and Metric units : the use of measuring instruments and their degrees of accuracy. The spring balance, common balances. Mass weight and density. Differences between solids, liquids, and gases. Liquid pressure. The pressure of the air. Flotation. Common hydrometers. Principle of Archimedes and its applications. Air pump and water pump. Principle of the lever, pulleys, inclined plane, wheel and axle, and their uses in ordinary life.

The effects of heat on solids, liquids, and gases. Thermometers. Melting points of common solids and boiling points of common liquids.

Evaporation. Amount of moisture in the air.

Dew point. Clouds and rain.

Radiation. Effect on formation of dew.

Conduction and convection of heat : Thermos flasks and other devices for preventing loss of heat ; convection currents in the atmosphere, and ocean : the trade winds. Land and sea breezes. Principles of ventilation.

Experiments to illustrate the simple laws of light. The use of common optical instruments. Colour.

Properties of a magnet. The compass. Common voltaic cells. The uses of the electric current.

B.*

Elementary experiments to illustrate suspension, solution, filtration, evaporation, crystallization, and distillation.

Compounds and mixtures. Experiments to illustrate chemical combination and decomposition. Chemical and Physical change.

Experimental study of the composition of air.

Combustion and oxygen.

The study of a candle flame, oil lamps with chimneys, gas burners, and incandescent burners. Smokeless flames.

Natural waters ; composition of water and hydrogen. Elements and compounds. Chlorine and hydrochloric acid from a study of common salt. Chalk lime, carbon dioxide, and the part it plays in plant and animal life. Nitrogen and nitric acid. Sulphur and sulphuric acid. Different forms of carbon and their use. Acids, bases, and salts. Neutralization.

The properties of the common metallic compounds which have been used in experiments illustrating the above syllabus.

Note.—It is recommended that the following books be read in conjunction with the above syllabus :—

Wonders of Physical Science—Fournier. (Macmillan & Co.)

Common Science—C. W. Washburne. (Bell & Sons, Ltd.)

Alter the last four paragraphs of this section to read as follows :—

Candidates must enter for the first three sections, for one subject from section (iv.) and for one other subject from either section (iv.) or section (v.). They may also take two more subjects from sections (iv.) and (v.).

To pass in section (iii.) a candidate must obtain a satisfactory aggregate on the two papers.

Certificates (graded in two divisions) will be awarded to candidates who pass in the first three sections and in two other subjects, one of which must be from section (iv.).

The subjects in which a candidate passes will be stated in the certificate.

Clause 74 (5) : Alter to read as follows :—

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 9, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 108 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 11 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1924, viz., 253,224) was 22·3, as against 21·5 in the preceding week, 19·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 163 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 25 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·7, as against 28·7 in the previous week, 39·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35·6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 163 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 48 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 13 in the previous week and 24 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospital (including 1 death of a non-resident), 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) One death from *Influenza* was registered in St. Paul's, as against 3 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana South, as against 18 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

3. Eight deaths from *Plague* were registered, 3 at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Maradana South, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 9 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 10 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 5 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 63 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eleven cases of *Enteric Fever*, 8 of *Measles*, 7 of *Chickenpox*, and 3 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 10, 21, 5, and 7, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·5°, against 81·7° in the preceding week and 80·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·822 in., against 29·861 in., in the preceding week and 29·871 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·76 in., against 0·41 in. in the preceding week and 3·05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's license in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909), will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 20, and the practical examination on November 24, 1924.

2. The examination will be held in Colombo only.

- (d) Plane Trigonometry (including the solution of triangles and the use of logarithmic and trigonometrical tables);
- (e) Mensuration (of areas and solids);
- (f) Surveying; and
- (g) Levelling.

In order to pass candidates must score not less than 40 marks per cent. in each of subject (a) to (e) and not less than 50 marks per cent. in aggregate; and in subjects (f) and (g) not less than 60 marks per cent.

6. Candidates in surveying only will be required to take only subjects (a) to (f) inclusive; and candidates in levelling only, subject (g) only.

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depot within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid, and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed.

6. Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, July 19, 1924, at 2 p. m., pursuant to Notice dated July 10, 1924.

Present :—Mr. T. B. Russell, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene ; Mr. H. M. Macan Markar ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. W. W. Morgan ; Dr. F. R. Alles ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting and of the Special Meeting of June 14, 1924, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.
2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene asked the Chairman :—(1) Have standpipes on streets ever been closed for misuse of water therefrom ? (2) If so, who has closed them, and under what authority ?
The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) Yes. (2) They have been closed by the Superintendent of Works, under the Council's Waterworks by-laws, section 23 (3).
3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe asked the Chairman :—(1) Were any warrants issued on the 1st day of this month for the recovery of arrears of rates and taxes due for the last quarter ? (2) If so, how many warrants were issued ?
The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) Yes. (2) 425 warrants were issued for Ward 2.
4. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene had given notice of the following motion :—(1) That no standpipe be closed in future, except for repairs, without the sanction of the Council.
With the permission of Council, Mr. Goonewardene amended his motion as follows :—“That no standpipe be closed in future, except for repairs, without the special sanction of the Chairman.” Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried.
5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved :—(2) That a special committee comprised of all elected Members and the Chairman may be appointed to report—(a) As to whether motor buses and lorries should be prohibited on any roads within the Municipal limits, and if so, on what roads ; (b) As to whether motor vehicles and bicycles should be prohibited on the paths in the Victoria Park ; (c) If not, whether their speed should be restricted.
With the permission of Council, Mr. Goonewardene amended his motion by the insertion of the words “and the Provincial Engineer,” after the word Chairman and the addition of the words “(d) as to whether Council has sufficient powers already under the by-laws,” at the end of the motion. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried.
6. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene had given notice of the following motion :—(3) That the attention of the responsible officer may be called to the neglected state of the paths in the Victoria Park with a view to immediate steps being taken to their being put in order.
Mr. Goonewardene moved for permission of Council to withdraw the motion. The permission having been granted, Mr. Goonewardene withdrew the motion.
7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved :—That the Galle Municipal Council desires to express its appreciation of the good work done by Mr. W. W. Morgan to improve the Public Works Department roads within the Municipality of Galle.
With the permission of Council, Mr. Perera amended his motion by the insertion of the words “Provincial Engineer” after the word Morgan. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried. Mr. Morgan thanked the Council for its appreciation of his work.
8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved :—That tax-payers be granted thirty days' grace to pay arrears of rates and taxes. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.
The Chairman and Mr. D. G. Goonewardene spoke against the motion. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried. Six voted for the motion and three against it.
9. Election by ballot to fill up vacancies on the Standing Committees :—The following were elected—(a) Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe ; (b) Standing Committee on Law, Mr. D. I. Durham and Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe ; (c) Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation, Mr. D. I. Durham.
10. The Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1923 :—Tabled.
Resolved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1923 be submitted, in due course to His Excellency the Governor.
11. Electric Lighting Scheme :—Letter No. 9/8265 dated July 2, 1924, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that in the circumstances Government will not insist on the payment of the 20 per cent. additional charges ; but that the Council should pay the salaries of the Engineers for the time they are engaged in the work. This is estimated to amount to Rs. 7,500.
The Chairman moved that the Council do agree to pay Rs. 7,500 in addition to the sum of Rs. 175,000. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar seconded. The motion was carried.
12. Nomination of an Unofficial Member of the Council to serve on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Galle Municipal area for three years commencing October 1, 1924.
Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved that Mr. D. M. Subasinghe be nominated. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.
13. Papers *re* improvement of Hume's road :—Resolved that the consideration of the matter be deferred, and that the papers be referred to the member for the ward.
The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the meeting.
14. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 19, 1924.*
 - (2) Supply of road metal :—Recommended that—(i.) The present arrangements do continue till the end of the year, viz., (a) The Superintendent of Works is authorized to pay Rs. 9.50 per cube of 2 feet road metal ; (b) C. S. Abdul Cader's quotation for rubble at Rs. 5.49 per cube, with transport charges at Rs. 2 up to the first mile, Rs. 2.40 for 2 miles. Rs. 2.85 for 3 miles, Rs. 3 beyond 3 miles, and Rs. 4.50 to Elliott road, is accepted.
 - (ii.) Tenders be invited for supply of rubble during 1925.
 - (3) Letter from A. P. S. Abey Suriya *re* cancellation of his contract.—Recommended that the refund of the sum of Rs. 500 deposited as security, be refused.
 - (4) Tarring of the Public Works Department road within Municipal limits.—Recommended that the portion of the Galle-Matara road, from the Junction of Sea street with High street up to the Matara end of the Motor bus stand, be tarred as an experiment at a cost not exceeding Rs. 1,000.
 - (6) Estimate of Rs. 200 for re-thatching sheds in the Infectious Diseases Hospital.—Recommended.
 - (7) Estimate of Rs. 240 for repairing the roads in Victoria Park.—Recommended.

A device for protecting the tap surface of rubber and other trees against rain.

Abstract.—The applicant describes a device for protecting the tap surface of a tree from rain. The device consists of a belt of rubber or the like formed with two surfaces at an angle, the inner surface of the belt presenting at the intersection of the two said surfaces, two sharp edges directed towards the tree. A wire presses these two edges against the tree and forms a water-tight joint, above which is a channel to lead off the water and below which is a shield to give protection from rain.

The claim is:—

1. A device for protecting the tap surface of rubber and other trees against rain-water, comprising a belt of rubber or like material placed above the tap surface and formed with two surfaces at an angle, presenting each at their junction place a sharp edge directed towards the tree, the belt being placed around the tree and pressed against it in such a manner, that a water-tight joint is obtained.

Improved latrines for estates or other purposes.

Abstract.—The walls of a latrine compartment are formed of curved metal sheets bent to a circular arc but leaving an opening so that the circle is not quite closed. The opening is screened with a bent metal sheet. The roof is also of bent metal sheets fixed to the walls without rafters. The floor is of flat metal plates or concrete.

The claims are:—

1. In latrines for estates or other purposes, sheets of steel or other metal, preferably corrugated galvanized steel sheets, bent into circular shape to form the wall of a compartment and having a suitable opening for ingress and egress screened by sheets of steel or other metal, preferably by corrugated galvanized steel sheets.

2. In latrines for estates or other purposes, sheets of steel or other metal, preferably corrugated galvanized steel sheets, bent to a circular arc to form the roof of a compartment and fixed to the aforescribed wall or walls, without roof trusses or principals or rafters.

In latrines for estates or other purposes, circularly shaped walls to form a compartment, and a screen for the opening, as claimed in Claim 1, and an arched roof without principals or trusses or rafters as claimed in Claim 2, in combination, constructed and assembled as and for the purposes described.

Improvements in and relating to the manufacture of nitrogenous fertilizers.

Abstract.—An organic nitrogenous fertilizer is manufactured by bringing together a fermentable carbonaceous substance such as straw and an insoluble, or difficultly soluble, hydrolysable compound of nitrogen such as calcium cyanamide and maintaining these materials in contact in a hydrated state under conditions permitting free aerobic fermentation until new insoluble compounds of organically combined nitrogen are formed in the mass in substantial quantity, i.e., say 50 per cent. Mineral phosphate may be added and a basic substance such as calcium carbonate for the purpose of inhibiting acid fermentation.

The claims are:—

1. The process of manufacture of an organic nitrogenous fertilizer which consists in bringing together a fermentable carbonaceous substance (for example, straw, plant, stalks, leaves, or the like), and an insoluble or difficultly soluble hydrolysable compound of nitrogen and maintaining these materials in contact in a hydrated state under aerobic conditions permitting free development of the ammonia assimilator organisms in the carbonaceous substance until new insoluble compounds of organically combined nitrogen are formed by the action of said organisms in the fermented mass in substantial quantity, and preferably to the degree of "loading" of the mass with such re-combined nitrogen.

2. A process of manufacture of an organic nitrogenous fertilizer according to Claim 1 which consists in bringing together a fermentable carbonaceous substance and calcium cyanamide and maintaining these materials in contact in an

hydrated state under aerobic conditions permitting free development of the ammonia assimilator organisms in the carbonaceous substance until new insoluble compounds of nitrogen are formed by the action of said organisms in the fermented mass in substantial quantity, and preferably to the degree of "loading" of the mass with such re-combined nitrogen.

3. A process according to the preceding Claim No. 2, characterized in this that the cyanamide nitrogen is supplied and combined in the proportion from substantially one part of elemental nitrogen to twenty to sixty parts of pentosan and/or starch in the raw carbonaceous material.

4. A process according to any of the preceding Claims, wherein the hydrated mass is fermented in presence of a normally unavailable phosphate (for example, ground mineral phosphate) preferably of high phosphate content, for the purpose described.

5. A process according to any of the preceding Claims, wherein a neutralizing agent of basic nature, such as calcium carbonate (for instance, in the form of chalk) is added to the fermentation mass as and when required to maintain an appropriate reaction for the desired nitrogen transformation and to inhibit counter-acid fermentations.

6. In a process according to any of the preceding Claims, the method of hydrating the fermentation mass consisting in effecting the hydration progressively by addition of the requisite total quantity of water in successive quantities (for example, three, or preferably six, successive quantities) at such intervals of time as to allow for the absorption by the mass of the quantity of water previously added thereto.

7. A method of operation as claimed in the preceding Claim No. 6 consisting in interspersing the initial nitrogen compound (with or without a phosphate) between beds of the already wetted carbonaceous substance, and then completing hydration of the stack so produced by successive additions of the balance of the water requisite to bring the stack to its optimum degree of hydration.

8. The method of operation as claimed in either of the preceding Claims No. 6 or No. 7, characterized by making the addition of the water subsequent to the first wetting at or about the time that the fermentation mass attains a substantial temperature rise, for example, at the time of maximum temperature rise following the preliminary wetting.

9. A process according to any of the preceding Claims, wherein the fermentable carbonaceous substance is straw, characterized by bringing the fermentation mass to a final degree of hydration represented by a water content of from 75 to 85 per cent. by weight and preferably maintaining the mass substantially this degree of hydration to the completion of the fermentation.

10. The process for the manufacture of an organic nitrogenous fertilizer substantially as hereinbefore described.

11. An organic nitrogenous fertilizer whenever produced according to the process hereinbefore described and claimed and in the hydrated or desiccated condition.

12. For the conduct of a process as claimed in any of the preceding Claims Nos. 1 to 10, a mixture comprising an insoluble hydrolysable nitrogenous compound and a subdivided solid diluent therefor, preferably a phosphate, with or without a basic neutralizing agent, such, for instance, as calcium carbonate.

13. A mixture according to the preceding Claim No. 11, wherein the insoluble hydrolysable nitrogenous compound is calcium cyanamide, and preferably of a content of not substantially less than 9 per cent. of elemental nitrogen in the form of said cyanamide derivative.

14. For the conduct of a process as claimed in any of the preceding Claims Nos. 1 to 10, the special nitrogen bearing mixture comprising calcium cyanamide hereinbefore described.

Improvements in or relating to apparatus for the electrolysis of water.

Abstract.—In apparatus used for the electrolysis of water parallel electrodes are commonly used, the current being led in and out at their tops. The potential difference at the tops is therefore greater than that at the bottom owing to the resistance of the electrodes themselves; in addition the resistance of the solution is not uniform because of the accumulation of gas bubbles in the upper part of the solution. The applicant attempts to overcome these faults by using as electrodes a series of inclined horizontally disposed louvre-like segments, separated by porous diaphragms and arranged so closely together that the gases generated on the surfaces of the electrodes are immediately conducted to the interior of the same. Current is led in at one end of one electrode and out at the opposite end of the other.

The claims are:—

1. Apparatus for the electrolysis of water comprising electrodes, formed by a series of inclined horizontally disposed louvre-like segments, separated by porous diaphragms and arranged so closely one to another that the gases generated on the surfaces of the electrodes are immediately conducted to the interior of the same.

2. Apparatus as claimed in Claim 1, in which the electrical conductors of the electrodes are connected to opposite ends of adjacent electrodes, for the purpose set forth.

3. Apparatus as claimed in Claim 1, in which one of the conductors is attached also to the tank containing the electrodes so that the said tank also serves as an electrode.

4. Apparatus for the electrolysis of water substantially as described or as illustrated in the accompanying drawings. Five sheets of drawings.
