WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated November 27, 1863, issued under the provisions of Ordinance No. 17 of 1844, entitled "An Ordinance for establishing an efficient Police in certain Towns," a police force was duly established in the town of Matara, in the Southern Province, and the limits of the said town were specified and defined for the purpose of the said Ordinance in the said Proclamation:

And whereas by section 3 of the Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 the said Ordinance No. 17 of 1844 was repealed, and by section 7 of the Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 it was enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time as occasion may require, to establish, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, a police force for the effectual protection of person and property within such towns as to him shall appear to require the same, and that whenever such force shall be so established within any town, the said Ordinance shall come into operation therein; provided that no Proclamation shall be necessary to establish the force in places where the same shall have been already established under the Ordinance No. 17 of 1844, in which said places the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 shall come into operation on the day in section 2 mentioned, which said day was the 1st day of January, 1866, on which day the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 came into operation in the said town of Matara:

And whereas by section 13 of the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865 it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time as occasion may require, by Proclamation, to alter or vary such limits:

And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date May 14, 1879, the limits of the said town of Matara, in the Southern Province, were altered and varied, as specified and defined in the schedule attached to the said Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient further to vary the limits of the said town of Matara, and to re-define the same for the purposes aforesaid:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested under section 13 of the said Ordinance No. 16 of 1865, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, as and from January 1, 1925, vary the limits of the said town of Matara as specified and defined in the schedule attached to the said Proclamation dated May 14, 1879, and do hereby specify and define the limits of the said town to be those specified in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries.

North.—The road at Naimana ferry where the road reaches the Nilwala-ganga, thence the southern edge of the road westwards for a distance of 900 feet to the point where the road referred to meets the road leading towards Tannehena, thence along the southern edge of the latter road as far as the foot of the hill to Tannehena, thence along the foot of the hill westwards to the Walpola paddy fields, thence along the southern edge of these fields to the Hakmana road 150 feet south of the Kitulawala iron bridge, thence westwards along the road trace through Tudawa, thence along the southern edge of the road from the Nupe canal to the Akuressa road at the $\frac{3}{4}$ milepost.

West.—The eastern edge of the Akuressa-Matara road, from the \(\frac{3}{4} \) milepost to a point 270 feet south of that post, thence by the eastern edge of the Gansabhawa road southwards to the first milepost on the Matara-Welagoda road, thence westwards along the southern edge of the latter road to a point 550 feet from the first milepost thereon, thence southwards along the eastern edge of the Gansabhawa road as far as the 981 milepost on the Galle-Matara main road, thence along the southern edge of the latter road westwards as far as the 98th milepost, thence a straight line southwards at right angles to the road as far as the Talanwila canal, thence along the southern bank of the canal westwards as far as the Polhena Cross roads, thence southwards along the eastern edge of the latter road as far as its junction with the Madhiya-Polhena road, thence a line to the sea at right angles to the latter road.

South.—The sea.

East.—A line from the sea to the Eliyakanda Wesleyan Mission school, the line being a continuation of the direction of the Eliyakanda-Maddewatta road, thence the western edge of the Eliyakanda-Maddewatta road to the Tangalla road, thence a line at right angles to the Tangalla road to a distance of 700 feet north of the Tangalla road, thence in a westerly direction a line to the Nilwala-ganga crossing the Kekanadure and Naimana roads at points respectively 700 feet from the Tangalla road, thence the Nilwala-ganga in a northerly direction as far as the Naimana ferry.

And whereas the said Anna Caroline Wagner has produced to Us a certificate of her having taken and subscribed the oath of allegiance prescribed by the said Ordinance, and We are satisfied that the said Anna Caroline Wagner has duly taken the prescribed oath within the period specified in section 4 of the said Ordinance:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, Sir William Henry Manning, G.C.M.G., K.B.E., C.B., Governor of Ceylon, do hereby issue these Our Letters Patent granting to the said Anna Caroline Wagner all the rights and privileges of a British subject, and declare that the said Anna Caroline Wagner shall, within the limits of this Colony, be entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and be subject to all obligations to which a natural-born British subject is entitled or subject.

"THE CEYLON PASSPORT ORDINANCE, No. 20 of 1923."

PART I .- General.

- 1. No person shall depart from the Colony nor enter the Colony, unless such person is the bearer of a valid passport issued or renewed not more than two years previously by or on behalf of the country of which the person to whom it relates is a subject or citizen. Provided, however, that no passport shall be required of any British subject travelling between India and Ceylon nor of Asiatic residents of Ceylon or India travelling between the Federated Malay States or the Straits Settlements and Ceylon.
- 2. Every passport shall state the name and nationality of the person to whom it relates, and shall contain a description of the said person, together with such person's photograph permanently affixed to the passport. The photograph shall bear the seal or stamp of the office issuing the passport.
- 3. Whenever it may appear to a Passport Issuing Authority inadvisable that a passport should be granted, such Issuing Authority may at his discretion issue an Emergency Certificate in place of a passport. Such Emergency Certificate shall be valid only for a single specified journey to or from Ceylon, and shall be subject to any other conditions contained therein which the Issuing Authority may think fit to prescribe, and may, for the purpose of rule 1, be regarded as a passport for the specified journey.
- 4. A passport shall be available only for those countries for which it bears a sufficient $visa_h$

PART II.—Issue and Renewal of British Passports in Ceylon.

- 5. The authority for the issue or renewal of passports in Ceylon shall be His Excellency the Governor or the Officer Administering the Government for the time being.
- 6. Applications for passports or for the renewal of passports already in possession shall be made on forms prescribed by the Issuing Authority. All applications shall be addressed to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, Colonial Secretary's Office, Colombo.
- 7. The Passport Issuing Authority may require such evidence as is necessary either in the form of a declaration or otherwise, to satisfy himself of the national status of any applicant for a passport.
- 8. (a) Married women travelling with their husbands may be included on the husband's passport, if application is made to be so included at the time of the issue of the passport.
- (b) Children under the age of sixteen years may be included on the passports of their parent or guardian.
- 9. Any Indian ordinarily resident in India leaving Ceylon for any destination other than India, and not exempted by the proviso to rule 1 shall possess a valid passport issued to him in India according to the regulations for the time being in force in India allowing him to leave India for the same destination, and no passport shall be issued to such person in Ceylon.
- 10. Passports shall not be available beyond two years from the date of issue. They may be renewed for four further periods of two years each, after which fresh passports must be obtained.
 - 11. (a) The charge for a passport shall be Rs. 5.
- (b) The charge for renewal of a passport shall be Rs. 2 in respect of each period of two years.

PART III.

- 12. Nothing contained in rule 1 shall apply to-
 - (a) Any members of His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces entering or leaving the Colony on duty;
 - (b) Any member of the crew of any vessel who has been lawfully engaged in the Colony, or lawfully engaged in India and sent to the Colony, for an oversea voyage:
 - (c) Any person landing under a special permit in writing issued by the Colonial Secretary, the Principal Collector of Customs, or the Inspector-General of Police, and acting in accordance with the conditions of such permit.
- 13. Any person acting contrary to the above rules or attempting so to do, and any person aiding or abetting such person to act contrary to the above rules, shall be guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction before a Police Magistrate, with imprisonment, simple or rigorous, for a period not exceeding three months, or a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees, or both.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 16, 1924.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (4 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils 11 Moors, 8 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1924, viz., 253,224) was 21·3, as against 22·3 in the preceding week, 28·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 28·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 145 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 27 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29 9, as against 33 7 in the previous week, 37 3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 35 6 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 145 total deaths 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 38 in the preceding week, 46 in the corresponding week of the prevous year, and 37 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-four deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 6 each in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and Slave Island, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Maradana East, and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 18 in the previous week, and 24 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Seven deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospital, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for

last year.

(c) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, as against 1 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

- 2. Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 15 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 7 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 5. Nine deaths were registered from Debility, 8 each from Enteritis and Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Dysentery, 5 from Worms, 2 from Diarrhea, 1 each from Measles and Puerperal Septicamia, and 49 from Other Causes.
- 6. Eighteen cases of *Meases*, 8 of *Enteric Fever*, 5 of *Chickenpox*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 8, 11, 7, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.7°, against 82.5° in the preceding week, and 79.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.831 in., against 29.822 in. in the preceding week, and 29.886 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.42 in., against 2.76 in. in the preceding week, and 2.93 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Special Committee appointed by Council on May 14, 1924, "to consider the question as to whether permission should be granted in future to Clubs to erect Pavilions in Public Parks" of July 1, 1924.

- 1. The Committee are of opinion that the rights of the public to the use of the City Parks must be preserved and that this can be done and is being done by the system of temporary leases on nominal rentals now being granted to clubs.
- It is realized that, as athletics extend, there may be rival claims to the use of grounds from several clubs. that case grounds must be shared, or some other suitable rotation arrangement must be made or the matter may be settled by ejection of a club or clubs.
- If a time arrives, which is not the case at present, when the free use of the parks by the public is hampered by the leases granted to clubs, then these leases must be cancelled, the clubs ejected and the prior rights of the public
- Where clubs build pavilions, they must be given to understand that they build them at their own risk and that they may be ordered to leave them whenever the Municipality decides that this is necessary.
- 5. Till conditions alter it seems advisable in the interests of health and recreation to allow clubs organized for athletics to use portions of the grounds in public parks, provided that no exclusive use of anything except the pavilions, is allowed. The lease form now in use should be slightly altered so as to make this clear to the lessees.
 - 6. In the case of leased grounds not already enclosed or fenced, no enclosures of any kind should be allowed.
- 7. Clubs should be allowed to build pavilions on leased grounds where the erection of such is in no way detrimental to the amenities or convenience of the public.
- 8. In the cases of the Havelock Sports Club and the Bloomfield Cricket and Athletic Club it is recommended that, as their pavilions would in no way interfere with the amenities of Havelock Park or Campbell Park, these clubs should be allowed to erect the same.

Resolutions.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

With the permission of the Council, the Chairman moved that Dr. E. A. Cooray, who ceased to be a member in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings be restored to office under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded.—Carried.

At this stage Mr. A. E. de Silva wished to reopen the matters dealt with by the Special Committee on Pavilions.

The Council consenting Mr. A. E. de Silva moved as regards paragraph 8 of the report that the erection of the two pavilions in Havelock Park and Campbell Park be not allowed. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

After discussion Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved, as an amendment, that in future no new permanent pavilions be

allowed to be erected in public parks in the city. The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

"Improvements relating to collars for wear."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a method of joining the top and band of a linen collar. A strip of material is folded to S-shape and pressed. The top and band are placed with overlapping edges and are stitched to the binding strip which lies along the outer side of the top, between the top and the band and along the outer side of the band. Preferably the edges of the binding strip are folded inwards. A device for folding the binding strip consists of a metal plate with an S-shaped aperture; after passing through which the strip is pressed between a pair of rollers. A device to form a W-shaped strip is also described.

The claims are :--

- 1. A collar for personal wear comprising a separate top and band of single ply or multiply fabric, joined together by simply overlapping the edges to be joined and by stitching to them a binding strip which lies along the outer side of the top, passes round the edge thereof to the other side between the overlapped portions, passes round the edge of the band, and to the outer side thereof.
- 2. A collar as claimed in claim 1, in which the outer edges of the binding strip are folded inwardly for the purpose specified.
- 3. A collar as claimed in claim 1, or 2, or 3, in which the binding strip is continued past the end of the top and acts as a binding strip and stiffener for the upper and end edges of the tabs at either end of the band.
- 4. The manufacture of a collar for personal wear, comprising a separate top and band of single ply or multiply fabric, by simply overlapping the edges to be joined and by stitching to them a binding strip of S or W-shape in such manner that the edges of the top and band lie within the bends thereof, the binding strip being folded by means of a folder adapted to form, in co-operation with rollers, the strip into the proper shape.

- 5. For use in the manufacture of a collar according to claim 1 or claim 4, a binding strip of a flattened S or W-shape in cross-section, with or without in-turned edges.
- 6. For use in folding the binding strip according to claim 5, a folder such as shown at Fig. 6 for forming an S-shaped strip or a folder such as shown at Figs. 9, 10, and 11, for forming a W-shaped strip.
 - 7. A collar for personal wear made substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings. One sheet of drawings.

"Improvements in machines for cutting tea and for separating stalk from tea in the process of manufacture."

Abstract.—An adjustable hopper is fitted over a pair of rollers. The rollers have cells on their surfaces. A blunt cutter blade is resiliently mounted so that its edge is near the surface of the roller. A hard obstruction bends this blade back, a stalk is flattened against the periphery of the roller. Lower down is a bevelled edged sharp cutter which may or may not be resiliently mounted and which is closer to the surface of the roller than the first; hard obstructions and stalk strike the bevelled edge and pass over it; leaf projecting from the cells is cut off and passes over the blade. The contents of the cells which are then of uniform size pass below the blade and collect at the bottom.

The claims are :-

- 1. A tea cutting and stalk separating machine comprising in combination an adjustable hopper, fitted over rollers having cells on its outer periphery, resiliently mounted upper and lower knives engaging said rollers and characterized that said upper knives are blunt, and are spaced a suitable distance from said rollers, and that said lower knives are sharp and adjusted close to said rollers, deflecting plates for separating the stalks from the graded leaves substantially as and for the purpose described.
- 2. A tea cutting and stalk separating machine as in claim 1, characterized that the lower sharp knives may be independently and non-resiliently mounted as and for the purpose described.
- 3. In a tea cutting and stalk separating machine as in claim 1 and 2 an adjustable hopper substantially as described.
