WHEREAS by Chapter II., section 5 and sub-section (b), of "The Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907," it is enacted that whenever the following event has occurred, viz., when lands have been declared the property of the Crown by an order passed under "The Waste Lands Ordinances, 1897 to 1903," the Governor may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare all or any of such lands or any part or parts thereof to be a reserved forest, and such Proclamation shall specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned have been declared the property of the Crown by orders Nos. 260, 311, and 392 passed under "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903," on October 31, 1913; September 25, 1914; and November 21, 1919, and appearing in the *Government Gazettes* Nos. 6,588 of October 31, 1913; 6,665 of September 25, 1914; and 7,065 of November 21, 1919, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest from and after March 7, 1925; and We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

"THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE, No. 19 OF 1915."

THE following by-laws made by the "local authority," to wit, the Municipal Council of Colombo, under the provisions of section 27 of "The Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915," and approved by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

The by-laws dated December 12, 1921, and published in the *Gazette* of December 16, 1921, are hereby repealed.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Definitions.

1. For the purposes of these by-laws :—

- (a) "Warehouse" means any premises other than a retail shop, which taken as a whole, are used for the storage of goods or wares for purposes of trade.
- (b) "Factory" means any premises where manual labour is exercised by way of trade or for purposes of gain, in making, altering, repairing, ornamenting, or finishing articles, or adapting them for sale, and where mechanical power is also used.
- (c) "Workshop" means any premises where manual labour is exercised by way of trade or for purposes of gain, in making, altering, repairing, ornamenting, or finishing articles, or adapting them for sale, and where mechanical power is not used.

Residential Areas.

2. In any area declared to be a "residential area" :—

- (a) No building other than a domestic building, public building, or Municipal building shall be erected henceforth; and no building which is not being used as a warehouse or factory at the time of the passing of these by-laws shall henceforth be used otherwise than as a domestic building, public building, or Municipal building.
- (b) No building used as a dwelling house at the time of the passing of these by-laws shall be used otherwise than as a dwelling house, except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing.
- (c) The Chairman shall refuse to grant permission to erect or re-erect in a residential area, tenements or small shops, commonly known as boutiques, if the sites selected for such tenements or shops are, in the opinion of the *Building Committee*, in close proximity to valuable dwelling houses, or if the sites are in prominent positions where, in the opinion of the *Building Committee*, the erection of the buildings in question would mar the amenities of the residential area.
- (d) The Chairman shall refuse to grant permission for the setting up in a residential area of a workshop or of a stable, dairy, gala or cattle pen at which more than five horses or five head of cattle or five goats or sheep are kept, if the site of such workshop, stable, dairy, gala or cattle pen is, in the opinion of the *Building Committee*, in close proximity to valuable residential property.
- (e) Where a factory or warehouse existed in an area herein declared to be a residential area at the time the Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 came into force, and where an extension of the buildings of such factory or warehouse is required by the owners thereof, the Chairman may, if, in the opinion of the *Building Committee*, the extension cannot be made in a non-residential area without serious loss or expense to the owners, allow the buildings used for the purposes of a factory or warehouse to be extended at the place where the existing warehouse or factory is situated, provided that the floor space of such additional buildings shall not be more than one-fourth of the floor space of the buildings used as a factory or warehouse at the time the Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 came into force.
- (f) No building or premises shall be used for carrying on any one of the offensive or dangerous trades referred to in these by-laws except such buildings or premises as are so in use when these by-laws come into force.

3. The following shall be the boundaries of the "residential areas" :—

- (a) The Mutwal "residential area" shall be bounded as follows: north by the Fishery Harbour, the sea, Temple lane, and Madampitiya road; east by Blomendahl road, St. James' street, and Alutmawata road; south by New Fishers' quarters; west by Fishers' Hill and Marshall street to the Fishery Harbour.
- (b) The Kotahena "residential area" shall be bounded as follows: north by the Harbour Railway line; east by Blomendahl road, Wasala road, and Wall street; south by St. Lucia's street, Kotahena street, and Pickering's road; west by Santiago street, College street, and Alutmawata road.
- (c) The South Colombo "residential area" shall be bounded as follows: north by the Galle Face outlet from the lake to the sea, the Galle Face lake, the Hunupitiya lake, the open masonry public drain from the Hunupitiya lake to Mohandiram's road, Polwatta road, Boyd place, Alston place, Park street, Hyde Park corner, Union place, Darley lane, Dean's road, De Saram place, Norris Canal road, Hedges Court, Stafford place, De Saram place, and Kynsey road; east by Kanatta road, Koswatta road, Kelani Valley Railway Line to the Kirillapone canal; south by the Kirillapone and Dehiwala canals; west by the sea.

Offensive and Dangerous Trades Areas.

4. In any areas declared to be "offensive and dangerous trades areas" and in no others (except as provided for in by-laws 2 (f) 6 and 7) the following trades, which are hereby declared to be "offensive trades," and "dangerous trades" may be carried on and buildings may be erected or existing buildings may be used for the purpose of carrying on such trades :—

Offensive Trades.

- (1) Plumbago curing.
- (2) Lime burning.
- (3) Brick making.
- (4) Tanning.
- (5) Storing green hides.
- (6) Manufacturing manure.
- (7) Storing manure.
- (8) Storing green bones.
- (9) Boiling offal or blood.
- (10) Soap making by means of animal fat or oil.
- (11) Boiling oil or animal fat.

Dangerous Trades.

- (1) Manufacturing gunpowder.
- (2) Manufacturing fireworks.
- (3) Manufacturing matches.
- (4) Storing of fibre.
- (5) Storing of cotton.
- (6) Storing of straw.

5. The following shall be the boundaries of the "offensive and dangerous trades areas":—

- (a) The Mattakkuliya "offensive and dangerous trades area" shall be bounded as follows: north and east by the Kelani river; south by Prince of Wales' Avenue and Madampitiya road; west by Vine street south, Alutnawata road, Vine street north, Ferguson's road to the Kelani river, and by the Kelani river.
- (b) The Dematagoda "offensive and dangerous trades area" shall be bounded as follows: north by the San Sebastian canal to its junction with the Municipal limits; east by the Municipal limits; south by Mart road and an imaginary continuation thereof to the Dematagoda-ela; west by the Kelani Valley Railway Line to the Main Line, the Main Line to a point opposite Floor's lane, and thence by a straight line to the junction of San Sebastian canal with Skinner's road south.

Special Trades Areas.

6. In any areas declared to be special trades areas the following "offensive trades" and no other "offensive trades" may be carried on and buildings may be erected or existing buildings may be used for the purpose of carrying on such trades:—

Plumbago curing. | Lime burning. | Brick making.

7. The following shall be the boundaries of the "special trades area": north by the boundary of the Dematagoda "offensive trades area"; east by the Kinda-ela; south by the Kinda-ela to its junction with the Kelani Valley Railway Line, thence in a northerly direction by the Kelani Valley Railway Line to its junction with Koswatta road, thence by Koswatta road; west by Kanatta road to its junction with Buller's road and by Buller's road to its junction with Cotta road, and thence by the Kelani Valley Railway Line as far as its junction with Mart road.

Commercial Areas.

8. In any areas declared to be "commercial areas" existing or future buildings may be used for any lawful purpose other than that of carrying on therein the offensive and dangerous trades specified in the definition (4) above.

9. The following shall be a "commercial area":—

All that part of Colombo within Municipal limits shall be a "commercial area," except those portions herein set apart as "residential" or "offensive and dangerous trades" areas.

Storage of Copra.

10. It shall not be lawful to use any building for storing copra, if any part of such building is less than 50 feet distant from any part of a domestic building.

Provided that this restriction shall not be in force in the Grandpass area bounded as follows: north by Layard's roadway to its junction with Prince of Wales' Avenue and by Prince Wales' Avenue to the Kelani river; east and south by the Kelani river and the San Sebastian canal; west by Skinner's road south and Armour street.

Notice under Land Sale Regulations 59 and 60 for Sale of Bandarawela Hotel.

IN pursuance of Land Sale Regulations 59 and 60, notice is hereby given that application has been made by Mr. W. Philips on behalf of Messrs. Miller & Company, Limited, Colombo, for the outright sale of the land and buildings known as Bandarawela Hotel, bearing No. 2,909½ in preliminary plan No. 725 (Bandarawela).

REGULATION REFERRED TO.

During the continuation of the Pearl Fishery at Marichchukkaddi, which commenced on February 21, 1925, the port of Pukulam will be open to passengers and goods coming to the fishery direct from India by the Paumben-Marichchukkaddi and the Kilakarai-Marichchukkaddi routes.

WITH reference to the Notifications in the *Government Gazettes* dated April 4, 1924, June 27, 1924, and August 29, 1924, respectively, the following additional information in connection with the visa of passports is hereby published :—

The arrangement with the Swiss Government for the abolition of visas to passports has been extended to the Principality of Liechtenstein. Consequently, visas will not be required in the case of British subjects proceeding to Liechtenstein from any part of the world and in the case of Liechtenstein citizens proceeding to the United Kingdom or to any British Colony or Protectorate. The Swiss Government has also waived the special condition hitherto applied in the case of workmen; and British subjects proceeding to Switzerland (or to Liechtenstein) to take up employment there need not secure the Consular visa to their passports.

Ceylon Pearl Fishery, 1925.

WITH reference to paragraph 10 of the Notification dated December 15, 1924, appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 7,436 of December 19, 1924, it is hereby notified that the following quarantine arrangements will be in force during continuance of the forthcoming Pearl Fishery :—

- (1) Direct traffic by sea from South India to the Pearl Fishery Camp at Marichchukkaddi will be allowed only from Paumben and Kilakarai, where separate Medical Officers will be stationed who will issue passes at their discretion to enable passengers to cross over from Paumben and Kilakarai to Marichchukkaddi without detention at Paumben and Kilakarai. All such passes will be marked "Fishery Pass." Passengers travelling by this route will be liable to such further medical examination and quarantine as may be considered necessary by the Medical Officer at Marichchukkaddi.
- (2) Passengers travelling *via* Dhanushkodi-Talaimannar or Tuticorin-Colombo will be subject to the usual quarantine regulations. Passes for those travelling direct to the fishery from Talaimannar will be marked "Fishery Pass."
- (3) Boats arriving at Marichchukkaddi will be subject to the usual regulations regarding pratique.
- (4) The Notification dated February 10, 1925, appearing in the *Government Gazette* of February 13, 1925, is hereby cancelled.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 28, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 165 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 18 Moors, 5 Malays, and 8 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 33.8, as against 48.9 in the preceding week, 31.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 184 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 108 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 25 Moors, 4 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37.6, as against 32.3 in the previous week, 34.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 184 total deaths, 46 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 15 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospital, Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in Pettah and Kotahena South, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, as against 17 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Nine deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 7 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twenty-three deaths were registered from *Debility*, 10 each from *Diarrhea* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Puerperal Septicemia*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, and 69 from *Other Causes*.

The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.896", in. against 29.989 in. in the preceding week, and 29.935 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.81 in., against nil in the preceding week and 1.30 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

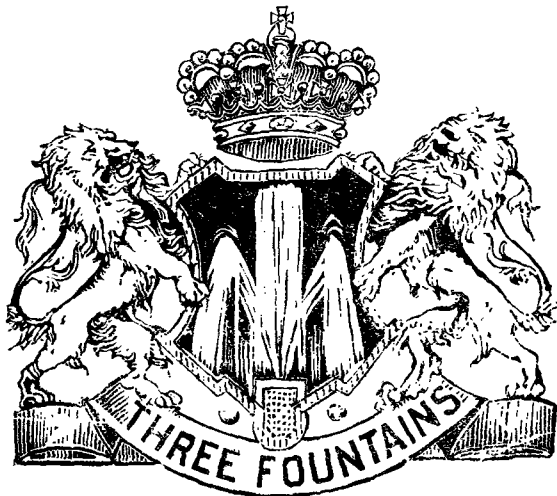

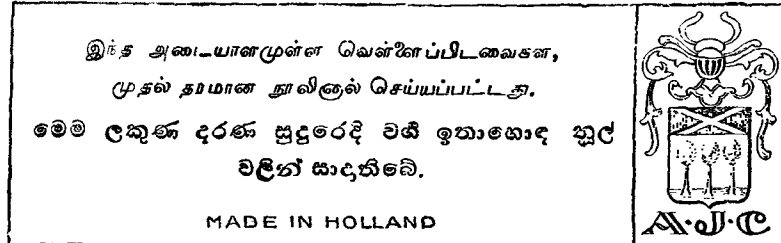
