“THE CEYLON MEDICAL COLLEGE ORDINANCE, 1905.”

RULE made by the Council of the Ceylon Medical College, under section 14 of “The Ceylon Medical College Ordinance, 1905,” and approved by His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council, in regard to Apothecary students, in substitution of rule 1 of the rules dated February 28, 1907, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,172 of March 1, 1907, and subsequently amended as appearing on page 83 of the Medical College Calendar, 1924-25, as rule 2—

“2. Candidates for the Apothecary Entrance and First and Second Apothecary Examinations must present themselves for all the subjects of an examination at one and the same time. Any candidate failing to satisfy the Examiners in any one subject of an examination shall be rejected in the whole examination. But at the Second Apothecary Examination a candidate who has obtained a pass mark (40 per cent.) in two subjects out of the three following, namely, *Materia Medica*, *Elementary Medicine* and *Hygiene*, and *Elementary Surgery* and *Midwifery*, is allowed to complete the examination in the other subject at a subsequent examination, and also in *Hospital Forms* if such candidate had not passed in that subject at the previous examination.”

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 7, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 168 (1 European, 14 Burghers, 109 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 18 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 34.4, as against 33.8 in the preceding week, 26.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 157 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 27 Moors, 4 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.1, as against 37.6 in the previous week, 32.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 157 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 46 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents, 2 each in Kotahena North and Kotahena South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 17 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 8 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 6 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 5 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana South, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 13 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Ten deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Wellawatta South, as against 9 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North, as against nil in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 9 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Diarrhœa*, 3 each from *Dysentery* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 each from *Worms* and *Tetanus*, and 50 from *Other Causes*.

6. Seventy-one cases of *Chickenpox*, 19 of *Measles*, 14 of *Enteric Fever* (2 in Port), and 1 of *Smallpox* (in Port) were reported during the week, as against 46, 8, 8, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported this week, but 1 was reported in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.7°, against 80.6° in the preceding week, and 80.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.916 in., against 29.896 in. in the preceding week, and 29.919 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0.81 in. in the preceding week, and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE MANANA MINES, LIMITED.

1. Subject as hereinafter provided the regulations contained in Table C in schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861," shall apply to this Company, and be deemed to be incorporated with these presents.

BUSINESS.

2. The business of the Company shall include the several objects expressed in the Memorandum of Association and all matters incidental thereto.

3. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit, and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

4. The business of the Company shall be carried on by all or any one of the Directors under the direction of the Board of Directors, subject only to such control of General Meetings as is provided for by these presents.

CAPITAL.

6. The following clause shall apply in place of Article 32 of Table C in the schedule to Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861:—

"No business shall be transacted at any meeting except the declaration of a dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and such quorum shall be ascertained as follows:—That is to say, if the Shareholders at the time of the meeting do not exceed seven, the quorum shall be three; if over seven but does not exceed fifteen, the quorum shall be five; if it exceeds, the quorum shall be seven."

7. In place of Article 45 the following shall apply:—

The Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration. (c) The Directors may from time to time borrow from Bankers or others for the temporary purposes of the Company on mortgage of any of the property of the Company including its uncalled capital, or on such other security or without any security as they may think fit, any sum or sums not exceeding the whole of the capital of the Company for the time being paid up.

(d) The Directors shall have power to make and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient, and in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, salesmen, clerks, accountants, and other officers, artisans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration, and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, accountants, officers, clerks, or other servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think fit, proper, and advisable, and without assigning any cause for so doing.

(e) In furtherance and not in limitation of and without prejudice to the general powers conferred or implied in any of the preceding clauses, or those contained in the Table C above referred to and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the following powers:—

I.—At their discretion to pay for any rights acquired by or for services rendered to the Company either wholly or partly in cash or in shares, and any such shares may be issued either as fully paid up or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon.

II.—To secure the fulfilment of any contract or engagement entered into by the Company with any person or persons.

III.—To accept from any member on such terms and conditions as shall be agreed a surrender of his shares or stock or any part thereof.

IV.—To give to any officer or servant of the Company a commission on the profits of any particular business or transaction or a share in the general profits of the Company, and such commission or share of the profits shall be treated as part of the working expenses of the Company.

V.—To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, sell, or abandon any action, suit, or proceedings, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company and any claim or demand made by or against the Company.

VI.—To confer upon and entrust the Managing Director or Manager all or any of the powers of the Directors (excepting the power to make calls, forfeit shares, or borrow money) that they may think fit. But the exercise of all powers by the Managing Director or Manager shall be subject to such regulations and restrictions as the Directors may from time to time impose, and the said powers may at any time be withdrawn, revoked, or varied.

TRANSFER.

11. MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 31, 1925, at 2.30 p.m., in accordance with Notice dated January 27, 1925.

Present.—Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. P. M. Bingham; Dr. R. F. La Brooy; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; and Mr. S. A. Wijayatilleke.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meetings held on December 20, 1924, and January 13, 1925, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1923, to December 31, 1924, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for December, 1924.
- Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1924.
- The reservoir readings for December, 1924.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during December, 1924.

- (a) Mr. Wijayatilleke presented petition from P. S. Fernando and Bros. *re* the sale of dry fish in Brownrigg street. Resolved that the petition be referred to the Medical Officer of Health for report.
 (b) Mr. Ismail presented petition from the Distraing Officers, asking for increased commission. Resolved that the matter be referred to the Finance Committee.

4. Correspondence :—(1) Letter No. 46 of December 22, 1924, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* loan for acquisition of lands and for Drainage Scheme.—Read.

(2) Letter of January 7, 1925, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, nominating Mr. F. G. Morley to be Auditor of the accounts of the Municipality for the year 1925.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 1 of January 12, 1925, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, authorizing the Municipal Council to charge a fee of Rs. 5 for every license issued for the use of any place as a dyeing-house.—Read.

(4) Letter of December 15, 1924, from Mr. W. Weerasinghe, asking for a special allowance in addition to his pension, in recognition of his long services.

Resolved that he be informed that there is no provision in the Pension Minute for the grant of such an allowance.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Ismail asked—(1) The scavenging carts that are now being used by the Council for collecting and transporting the rubbish and dust from the dustbins and street sweepings from the town are considered very unsatisfactory as they are ill-constructed and antiquated. It has also been noticed very often that sweepings, &c., that are loaded and carried in them are dropped through the openings between the planks along the streets and also when any putrified rubbish is loaded an obnoxious watery juice begins leaking along the streets through the openings.

Will the Council, in view of the above facts, be pleased to call upon the Medical Officer of Health to report at an early date as to the advisability of zinc-sheet-lining all the street-scavenging carts as a sanitary precaution?

The Council agreed to ask the Medical Officer of Health for a report as called for.

(2) Will the Chairman be pleased to table the following informations at the next Meeting :—

- (a) What is the total cost, up to date, of constructing all the Granaries and Rice Stores belonging to the Council?
 (b) What is the cost of each separately, their respective location, and dimensions?
 (c) What is the date of completion of each?
 (d) What is the total amount realized by the sale of the privilege to trade in each of these stores?
 (e) At what rate each of the Granaries and Rice Stores has been rented out and from when?
 (f) What is the total amount of rent recovered from each of the stores up to December 31, 1924?
 (g) Which of these stores are at present vacant and for how long are they so vacant?
 (h) Which of the stores were not at all rented out, or rented and unoccupied from the time they were built?
 (i) In respect of the vacant stores, how often were they advertised or applications called for in order to rent them out, and when was such last advertisement made?
 (j) Is there any demand at all for these vacant stores, if not what does the Council propose to do with them?

The Chairman stated that the information would be furnished at an early date.

(3) Will the Council be pleased to order an electric light to be installed inside the Band stand at the Esplanade with a view to prevent the place being misused by vagrants during night?

The Council agreed to ask for an estimate for an electric light inside the Band stand.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva asked—Is it true that the trees along Lady Blake's drive are being cut for firewood? If so, who has given the order to do this work?

The Chairman said that the trees had been cut on permits issued by the Forest Department.

It was agreed to ask the Conservator of Forests to issue instructions to leave the trees on the bank and on the islands for scenic purposes.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Pieris moved—That no fees be levied from business places under by-law 207A for removal of trade refuse unless the quantity removed daily exceeds the quantity a standard sized receptacle will hold. If the refuse removed is ordinarily more than the quantity a standard sized receptacle will hold, the fee to be fixed by the Chairman.

On Mr. de Silva's suggestion it was agreed to ascertain what revenue was now brought in by the levy of fees and to bring the matter up before the next Meeting of the Council.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Pieris moved—In view of applications for mutton stalls made recently having not been granted as all the stalls are occupied, that at least one other stall be set apart for the sale of mutton. Mr. Ismail seconded.—Carried.

It was further agreed to ascertain whether S. Vedamanikam Nadar who had applied for a stall is prepared to undertake to sell mutton at 75 cents per lb. with bone and 85 cents per lb. without bone, and if he is so prepared, to let stall No. 80 to him for the purpose, the present occupier of the stall being given a month's notice to vacate the stall.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—The drain along the Katugastota road near Marikar's Lodge is in a very insanitary condition and I move that this portion of the drain be built, in sections if necessary. Mr. Ismail seconded.

Mr. Pieris moved the following amendment.—That Government be asked to build the road-side drain from premises No. 57, Katugastota road as far as the culvert near the first milepost on the Katugastota road. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried unanimously.

10. Memorandum of January 15, 1925, from the Accountant on the subject of the organization of a system of internal audit with Colonial Auditor's report thereon.

Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration.

11. Report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the rents charged for stalls and spaces at the Kandy public market. Mr. de Silva moved that the report be adopted. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment.

That the stall-holders referred to in the report as paying excessive rent for stalls that had been auctioned be given a month's notice and the stalls be re-auctioned. Mr. Bingham seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and lost :—

Ayes.—The Chairman; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. P. M. Bingham; and Dr. R. F. La Brooy.

Noes.—Mr. Ratwatte; Mr. Pieris; Mr. de Silva; Mr. Ismail; and Mr. Wijayatilleke.

The original motion was then put to the Meeting and carried by 5 to 4.

Ayes.—Mr. Ratwatte; Mr. Pieris; Mr. de Silva; Mr. Ismail; and Mr. Wijayatilleke.

Noes.—The Chairman; Dr. G. P. Hay; Mr. Bingham; and Dr. R. F. La Brooy.

12. Electrical Engineer's report on the urgent need for additional generating plant at the Power Station. It was agreed to ask the Municipal Electrical Engineer what further capital expenditure is likely to be needed within the next three years.

13. Report of the Superintendent of Municipal Works on the reservation of residential areas in Kandy. Resolved that the report be referred to the Works Committee for consideration.

14. To sanction the following estimates :—

- (i.) Rebuilding portion of boundary wall at the back of Town Hall premises, Rs. 510.
- (ii.) Upkeep of Asgiriya road, Rs. 370.

Resolved that the estimates be passed.

15. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

S. C. (A.)

(1) That Mr. Vanderwall, the Council's legal adviser, be paid a fee of Rs. 52.50 for special services in connection with the case against the late storekeeper.

S. C. (C.)

(2) That contractor Pinna, mason be charged for only 50 per cent. of the water registered in the meter as occupiers of the model dwellings are also using water from the same tap.

(3) That the salary of the Electrical Engineer be raised from R. 9,000 per annum to Rs. 12,000 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 360.

(4) That the salary of Mr. Christiansz of the Water Works Department be raised from Rs. 960 to Rs. 1,200 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 60, and that an extra hand be employed on Rs. 480 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 48 to Rs. 960 per annum for work in connection with the Waste Detecting Deacon's Meters.

(5) That the Distraing Officer, W. D. C. Appuhamy be allowed an extra assistant at Rs. 10 per month.

(6) That the accounts clerk and the bookkeeper be paid overtime for work done during the Christmas holidays.

(7) That the vacant space in the granary near the market be rented out to E. N. Cader Saibo at Rs. 75 per mensem on the understanding that they occupy it for at least 3 years and that a door and two partition walls be constructed at an expense of Rs. 598.

(3) Special Committee appointed to make a list of dangerous curves and by-roads for purposes of regulating street traffic. (Mr. Ratwatta and Dr. Hay).

(4) Special Committee appointed to consider the feasibility of appointing a native doctor of repute to give free medical aid to the poor residents of the town. (Messrs. Pieris, de Silva, Ratwatta, Dr. Hay, and the Chairman).

Resolved that the Special Committees be re-appointed.

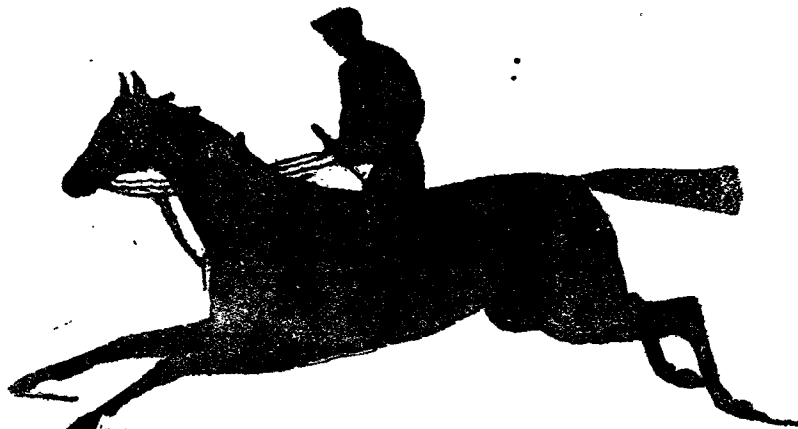
