Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 14, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 149 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 30.5, as against 34.4 in the preceding week, 26.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 157 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 21 Moors 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32·1, as in the previous week, against 24·5 in the corresponding week of last year, 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 157 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths were registered from Pneumonia, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 4 in New Bazaar, 3 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, and I each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, I each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kollupitiva. as in the previous week and the weekly average for last year.

- 2. Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and I each in Sty Paui's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 17 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.
- Eight deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents). and 1 in Maradana North, as against 10 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.859 in., against 29.916 in. in the preceding week and 29.883 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 6.30 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.41 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE MANANA MINES, LIMITED.

1. Subject as hereinafter provided the regulations contained in Table C in schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861," shall apply to this Company, and be deemed to be incorporated with these presents.

BUSINESS.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: maha crop is being harvested and a fair crop is expected. Preparations are being made for the cultivation of yala season.

Dry grain: preparations are being made for cultivation

Sizesa kovale west.

Coconuts: prospects of the coming crop are fair, flowering is fair. The crop harvested for the month is about 59,800,000 nuts.

Other products: oranges, pineapples, and jak can be had

at moderate prices.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6.50 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2.50 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 7 to Rs. 9 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 4 to Rs. 4 50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6.50 per 100 nuts; salt, 12 to 14 cents per measure.

Health of inhabitants: satisfactory, except for a few

cases of chickenpox and measles.

Health of cattle: rinderpest epidemic is now dying out, but foot-and-mouth disease is on the increase in the Colombo District.

Weather: dry. There were two showers during the month.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the greater part of the maha crop was reaped during the month.

Dry grain: there was very little dry grain cultivation in the district.

Coconuts: the month's yield of coconuts is estimated at 2,400,000 nuts.

Other products: fruit and vegetables were, as usual, scarce, except in the totamunes where the supply was fair.

Arising out of these questions Mr. A. E. de Silva wished to know whether any other sheds on these premises were

roofed or partly roofed with cadjans.

The Chairman stated that he was informed that some other sheds, ordinarily used for storing plumbago but temporarily containing fibre, were roofed with cadjans. These, curiously, did not take fire. He promised to go into the matter and send the papers to Mr. A. E. de Silva.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 3 to 7 (inclusive) on the Agenda.

Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

(A sum of Rs. 68.12 has been paid up to and including the 3rd quarter, 1924.)

(2) To recommend reconveyance of premises No. 740/20, Fife road, vested in Council, to Samsudeen Shroff Mohamed Cassim Hadjiar, on payment of all rates and costs which would have been due up to the end of the quarter in which the reconveyance may be signed, had the property not been vested in the Council. (A sum of Rs. 782.35 has

been paid up to and including the 4th quarter, 1924.)

Annexure A.

Congested Areas.

- In any area declared to be a "Congested Area":-
 - (a) No building other than a dwelling house shall be erected henceforth except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing and on such terms as he may direct.
 - (b) No dwelling house shall be demolished except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing or except on the orders of the Chairman and on such terms as he may direct.
 - (c) No building used as a dwelling house at the time of the passing of these by laws shall be used otherwise than as a dwelling house except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing and on such terms as he may direct.
 - (d) The Chairman shall refuse to grant permission under the above by-laws if in the opinion of the Building Committee the proposal will reduce either the total accommodation in the area available for the housing of the inhabitants thereof or the land in such area available for the building of such accommodation or render such accommodation or such land unsuitable for such purposes; and he may make the provision of alternative accommodation for such housing in or in close proximity to such area a condition of the granting of such permission.
- The following shall be the boundaries of the "Congested Areas":—

Annexure B.

Municipal Council Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910.

Sections 63, 64, 65, and 66 to be repealed and the following to be substituted therefor:

- 63. Any contract for any of the purposes of this Ordinance involving any expenditure or expected to involve an expenditure exceeding one thousand five hundred rupees or any contract enduring or expected to endure for a period exceeding six months shall be reduced to writing and shall specify .-
 - (a) The work or service to be performed or, the materials to be used or the articles to be supplied.(b) The price or rate to be paid for such work, service, materials, or articles.

(c) The time or times within which the work or service is to be completed or the materials or articles which are to be supplied.

(d) The penalty or penalties to be imposed in case of breach.

- The previous consent of the Council shall be obtained before any such contract is entered into on behalf of the Council.
 - Provided that in the case of the supply of articles to be imported from countries outside Ceylon, the Council may by resolution appoint an Agent or Agents resident outside Ceylon, and may delegate to such Agent or Agents authority to enter into contracts for the supply of such articles for and on behalf of the Council, provided further that such Agent or Agents shall call for tenders for the supply of such articles save and except where the Chairman specifies that an article of one particular make or description is to be purchased, and provided that such Agent or Agents shall place before the Council copies of their invitations to tender and the tenders received by them.
- Before any contract as set out in the two preceding sections be entered into, the Chairman shall call for tenders by advertisement unless otherwise authorized by a resolution of the Council.
- The Council may from time to time make, and when made may revoke, amend, alter, or vary such by-laws as may appear necessary and expedient for carrying out the provisions contained in this part of this Ordinance in accordance with the procedure laid down in section 109 of this Ordinance.

Annexure C.

Proposed Amendments to Pension Minute.

The first portion of section 2 to be deleted and the following substituted:-

Section 2: Subject to the exceptions and provisions hereinafter contained every Municipal Officer or Servant holding a permanent office in the service of the Council, which has been declared to be pensionable by resolution of Council and drawing a salary at a yearly rate, either in respect of one or of several offices held permanently and conjointly, may be awarded a pension as under :-

Section 4: Delete "but may count......minute" at the end of the section.

Gratuities.

The paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 of section 21 to be deleted and the following substituted:-

Section 21: Daily-paid employees with continuous service of 10 years and upwards may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-thirty-sixth of a month's pay for each complete month's service.

Provded in the case of daily-paid employees of 60 years of age and under that the Council is satisfied from the report of a Medical Board nominated by the Chairman and approved by the Finance Committee that they are physically unfit to discharge the duties of their employment owing to infirmity either of mind or body and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous.

The following section to be inserted after section 21:-

Section 21A: Municipal Officers or Servants drawing a salary at a yearly or monthly rate whose service has been entirely in a non-pensionable office may be awarded a retiring allowance not exceeding three-fourths of the amount payable under Rule 2. Provided that to become eligible for an allowance under this rule an officer or servant of 60 years of age or under shall have been reported upon by a Medical Board nominated by the Chairman and approved by the Finance Committee, to be permanently unfit for further active service or shall be retired on abolition of office after serving continuously for a period of not less than 15 years. Provided further that this privilege shall not in any way interfere with the power of the Council to dispense with the services of any such officer or servant or to reduce his salary in case of reorganization or abolition of office and no claim to any additional grant on account of such reduction or abolition shall in any case be recognized. Any such officer or servant shall continue to be liable to suspension, dismissal, or removal from office in the same manner as if this rule did not exist.

Annexure D.

17 C. Leave to Daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employees.

(i) Daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employees who have served the Council satisfactorily for two years or upwards may be allowed leave without pay as follows:-

Two years' and under three years' service Six weeks' leave. Three years' and under four years' service Three months' leave. Four years' and under five years' service Four months' leave. Five years' and under six years' service Five months' leave. Six years' service and upwards Six months' leave.

- (ii.) Such employees on their return will receive a rate of paynot less than the rate of which they were in receipt when they proceeded on leave, provided that their efficiency is not impaired.
- (iii.) A minimum of two years' continuous service must be performed between perods of leave.
- (iv.) In computing service for purposes of leave granted under (i.) such leave shall not be included as service.
- (v.) Such employees irrespective of length of service will, as regard illness due to accidents arising out of their employment, come under the provisions of 17 B. (ii.).
- (vi.) When an employee does not return on the expiration of any leave granted under the above rules he shall be considered as having left the service of the Council.

The following paragraph is proposed to be added to section 21 of the Council's Pension Minute: ---

In the case of a daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employee any leave without pay shall not count as a break in his service but shall not be included for purposes of computing any gratuity to which he may be entitled under the Pension Minutes.


