VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 14, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 149 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 15 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 30.5, as against 34.4 in the preceding week, 26.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 157 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.1, as in the previous week, against 24.5 in the corresponding week of last year, 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 157 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths were registered from *Pneumonia*, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 4 in New Bazaar, 3 each in Kotahena South and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kollupitiya, as in the previous week and the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 17 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Eight deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Maradana North, as against 10 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Diarrhæa*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Enteritis*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 59 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eighty cases of *Chickenpox*, 19 of *Measles* (1 in Port), 10 of *Enteric Fever*, 7 of *Smallpox* (in Port), and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 71, 19, 14, 1, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.859 in., against 29.916 in. in the preceding week and 29.883 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 6.30 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.41 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE MANANA MINES, LIMITED.

1. Subject as hereinafter provided the regulations contained in Table C in schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, No. 4 of 1861," shall apply to this Company, and be deemed to be incorporated with these presents.

BUSINESS.

2. The business of the Company shall include the several objects expressed in the Memorandum of Association and all matters incidental thereto.

3. The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit, and if the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

4. The business of the Company shall be carried on by all or any one of the Directors under the direction of the Board of Directors, subject only to such control of General Meetings as is provided for by these presents.

CAPITAL.

5. The nominal capital of the Company is Rs. 150,000 divided into 1,500 shares of Rs. 100 each.

6. The following clause shall apply in place of Article 32 of Table C in the schedule to Ordinance No. 4 of 1861:—

"No business shall be transacted at any meeting except the declaration of a dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and such quorum shall be ascertained as follows:—That is to say, if the Shareholders at the time of the meeting do not exceed seven, the quorum shall be three; if over seven but does not exceed fifteen, the quorum shall be five; if it exceeds, the quorum shall be seven."

7. In place of Article 45 the following shall apply:—

"The number of Directors shall be not less than three nor more than five, but this clause shall be construed as being directory only, and the continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any number of vacancies."

8. Article 46 shall not apply.

9. In place of Articles 48 and 63 the following two Articles respectively shall apply:—

I.—The office of Director shall be vacated—

(a) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs or compounds with his creditors.

(b) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.

II.—The Company may by a special resolution remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may by an ordinary resolution appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Directors in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

10. In addition to the above Articles, and those contained in Table C above referred to, the following clauses shall apply:—

(a) The first Directors shall be Messrs. H. Bastian Fernando, Michael Joseph Jerome de Jong, and Cathiravelu Arumugam.

(b) As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to a payment of Rs. 10.50 for each meeting or adjournment thereof they attend. The Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration. The Managing Director, if any appointed, shall be paid a monthly salary, the amount of which shall be fixed from time to time by the Directors.

(c) The Directors may from time to time borrow from Bankers or others for the temporary purposes of the Company on mortgage of any of the property of the Company including its uncalled capital, or on such other security or without any security as they may think fit, any sum or sums not exceeding the whole of the capital of the Company for the time being paid up.

(d) The Directors shall have power to make and may make such rules or regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient, and in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, salesmen, clerks, accountants, and other officers, artisans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration, and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, accountants, officers, clerks, or other servants of the Company for such reasons as they may think fit, proper, and advisable, and without assigning any cause for so doing.

(e) In furtherance and not in limitation of and without prejudice to the general powers conferred or implied in any of the preceding clauses, or those contained in the Table C above referred to and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the following powers:—

I.—At their discretion to pay for any rights acquired by or for services rendered to the Company either wholly or partly in cash or in shares, and any such shares may be issued either as fully paid up or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon.

II.—To secure the fulfilment of any contract or engagement entered into by the Company with any person or persons.

III.—To accept from any member on such terms and conditions as shall be agreed a surrender of his shares or stock or any part thereof.

IV.—To give to any officer or servant of the Company a commission on the profits of any particular business or transaction or a share in the general profits of the Company, and such commission or share of the profits shall be treated as part of the working expenses of the Company.

V.—To institute, conduct, defend, compromise, sell, or abandon any action, suit, or proceedings, or other legal proceedings on behalf of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due to or from the Company and any claim or demand made by or against the Company.

VI.—To confer upon and entrust the Managing Director or Manager all or any of the powers of the Directors (excepting the power to make calls, forfeit shares, or borrow money) that they may think fit. But the exercise of all powers by the Managing Director or Manager shall be subject to such regulations and restrictions as the Directors may from time to time impose, and the said powers may at any time be withdrawn, revoked, or varied.

TRANSFER.

11. The instrument of transfer of any share in the Company shall be in writing, and shall be executed both by the transferor and transferee and duly attested, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

12. A share may be transferred by a member or other person entitled to transfer to any member selected by the transferor; but save as aforesaid and save as provided by clause 18 hereof no share shall be transferred to a person who is not a member so long as any member or any person selected by the Directors as one whom it is desirable in the interests of the Company to admit to membership in willing to purchase the same at a fair value.

13. Except where transfer is made pursuant to clause 12 hereof the person proposing to transfer any shares (hereinafter called the proposing transferor) shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called the transfer notice) to the Company that he desires to transfer the same. Such notice shall specify the sum at which he is willing to sell the same, and shall constitute the Company his agent for the sale of the share to any member of the Company or person selected as aforesaid at the price so fixed. The transfer notice may include several shares, and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate notice in respect of each. The transfer notice shall not be revokable except with the sanction of the Directors.

14. 15. Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, February 4, 1925, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated January 28, 1925.

Present:—Mr. H. E. Newnham, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.L.C.; Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E.; Mr. W. Philips; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Mr. R. L. Pereira; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. J. Wickwar; the Hon. Mr. L. Macrae, M.L.C.; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. G. W. Dodds; Mr. B. W. Leefe; the Hon. Dr. G. Thornton, M.L.C.; and Mr. W. J. Thornhill.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 14, 1925, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of January 14, 1925, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. de Silva asked the Chairman the following questions:—(1) Whether the fibre sheds at Messrs. Hayley & Kenny's stores in Dean's road, recently burnt down, were roofed with cadjans? (2) If so, how many of the sheds were so roofed? (3) Whether Messrs. Hayley & Kenny had obtained permission to roof with cadjans? (4) If so, when?

The Chairman replied as follows:—Answer to question No. 1.—No; Answer to question No. 2.—None; In view of these answers, questions Nos. 3 and 4 do not arise.

Arising out of these questions Mr. A. E. de Silva wished to know whether any other sheds on these premises were roofed or partly roofed with cadjans.

The Chairman stated that he was informed that some other sheds, ordinarily used for storing plumbago but temporarily containing fibre, were roofed with cadjans. These, curiously, did not take fire. He promised to go into the matter and send the papers to Mr. A. E. de Silva.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 3 to 7 (inclusive) on the Agenda. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of January 17, 1925.

(2) To consider the correspondence with regard to the acquisition of land for the proposed public latrine at Campbell place, and a memorandum of the Chairman, dated December 2, 1924, suggesting the sale by public auction, as the claimant is anxious to clear up the matter.—Recommended that the land be sold by auction, as suggested by the Chairman in his memorandum of December 2, 1924.

(3) To consider local Council's opinion with regard to the assessment of Colombo Tramways.—Recommended that the matter be dropped and that no further steps be taken.

(4) To consider the correspondence with regard to congested areas.—Recommended that the by-law (*vide* annexure A) proposed by the Chairman, should be approved to apply to the major slum areas.

(5) To consider the proposed amendments to sections 63 to 66 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, with regard to contracts and the procedure regarding purchase of stores.—Recommended that the proposed amendments to Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 (*vide* annexure B) be approved.

(7) To consider the proposed amendments to the Municipal Council Pension Minute.—Recommended that the proposed amendments (*vide* annexure C) be approved.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(3) To consider an application from the Visiting Dispenser, Labugama Reservoir, asking that his monthly fee of Rs. 15, be increased to Rs. 25, as from January 1, 1925, in view of the steady increase in the number of patients seeking treatment.—Recommended that the monthly fee be raised to Rs. 20 per month.

(4) To consider the correspondence with regard to congested areas.—Recommended that the by-law (*vide* annexure A) proposed by the Chairman, should be approved to apply to the major slum areas.

With regard to item No. 3 (corresponding to item No. 17 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of January 22, 1925), it was resolved that the matter be considered in connection with the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining item be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 22, 1925.

(2) To recommend street lines for Modera lane, as indicated in plan No. 266, dated December 9, 1924, signed by Mr. J. M. Blizard, Acting Municipal Engineer, to be declared a minor street and to be allowed as 30 feet wide, under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended.

(3) To recommend street lines for Piachaud's lane, as indicated in plan No. 214, dated December 15, 1924, signed by Mr. J. M. Blizard, Acting Municipal Engineer, to be declared a street and to be allowed as 40 feet wide, under section 18 (a) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.

Note.—This is a public road and the Council is liable to pay compensation for the land required for the proposed widening.—Recommended.

Blizard, Acting Municipal Engineer, to be declared a minor street and to be allowed as 30 feet wide, under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended.

(5) To consider:—(a) A schedule of quotations received through the Council's Agents for plant necessary for Biyagama quarry.—(a) Considered; (b) The recommendation of the Acting Municipal Engineer that the plant be purchased at an approximate cost of Rs. 73,320, excluding insurance and freight on item 1 (c), Agents commission, and local expenses.

Note.—The cost could be met from the sanctioned vote of Rs. 135,000 (L. 79).—(b) Recommended.

(6) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated January 13, 1925, with regard to the proposed extension of Albion road.—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 5,500 be voted for the purpose of the acquisition of the land required for the extension of Albion road to the Dematagoda bridge.

(7) To consider:—(a) The tenders received for the supply of Natal, Transvaal, or Indian coal suitable for use in steam rollers.—(a) Considered; (b) A memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer on the recommendation of the Acting Municipal Engineer that the tender of Messrs. (13) To consider:—(a) The quotations received through the Council's Agents for the supply of hose, &c.—(a) Considered; (b) The recommendation of the Superintendent of the Fire Brigade that the following quotations be accepted:—

- (1) Messrs. George Angus & Co.—Hose, 40 lengths of 100 ft. each at £9 13s. 6d. each length; (2) Messrs. John Morris & Co.—Suction hose, stand pipes, nozzles, &c., as per schedule attached to papers.

Note.—The cost will be charged to sanctioned Votes in the 1925 Budget.—(b) Recommended.

(14) To recommend the purchase for the Municipal Engineer's Department of 3,000 barrels of Hand Brand cement through the Council's Agents at 11s. 6d. per barrel.

Note.—The cost will be charged to Advance Account, Stores, and debited to votes as and when used.—Recommended.

(16) To consider:—(a) An application from Mr. W. Peter Fernando for water service to his block of land bearing assessment No. 441, Fussel's lane, Wellawatta.—(a) Considered; (b) A plan and an estimate of Rs. 1,379 from the Acting Waterworks Engineer for laying a 3-inch diameter water main for a distance of 167 yards in the lane. The lane being a private lane, the application will have to be dealt with under Ordinance No. 9 of 1916. The under-mentioned property owners have expressed their willingness to contribute their respective shares which amount to Rs. 1,086·48:—Mr. B. K. Iye, Rs. 152·35 to be paid by 10 quarterly instalments of Rs. 15·23, with 6 per cent. interest; Mrs. W. James Fernando, Rs. 162·75; Mr. W. Peter Fernando, Rs. 771·38 to be paid by monthly instalments of Rs. 25 with 6 per cent. interest. Total, Rs. 1,086·48. The Acting Waterworks Engineer recommends that the main be laid on payment of the above amount of Rs. 1,086·48. Funds are available.—(b) Recommended.

(17) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated January 20, 1925, with regard to Dean's road—Symond's road street scheme and the draft resolution to be adopted by the Council.—Recommended that the following resolution be adopted by the Council:—That in order to increase the facilities for traffic between Cinnamon Gardens, Maradana Station, and Panchikawatta road within the administrative limits of this Council, it is expedient to alter the existing public streets known as Dean's road and Symond's road and that a street scheme for this purpose should be framed, as provided for by section 46 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.

(19) To consider an invitation for the appointment of a representative to attend the Fourth International Congress of Building and Public Works, which will take place in Paris from June 15 to 19, 1925, and a memorandum of the Chairman thereon.—Recommended that Mr. H. Mr. R. L. Pereira withdrew his amendment, and moved, instead, that Mr. O. T. F. Senaratne be appointed as a Grade III Engineer in the Council's service. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Mr. R. L. Pereira moved that the post in Grade II, be not filled for the present. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

*Annexure A.***Congested Areas.**

1. In any area declared to be a " Congested Area " :—
 - (a) No building other than a dwelling house shall be erected henceforth except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing and on such terms as he may direct.
 - (b) No dwelling house shall be demolished except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing or except on the orders of the Chairman and on such terms as he may direct.
 - (c) No building used as a dwelling house at the time of the passing of these by-laws shall be used otherwise than as a dwelling house except with the permission of the Chairman granted in writing and on such terms as he may direct.
 - (d) The Chairman shall refuse to grant permission under the above by-laws if in the opinion of the Building Committee the proposal will reduce either the total accommodation in the area available for the housing of the inhabitants thereof or the land in such area available for the building of such accommodation or render such accommodation or such land unsuitable for such purposes ; and he may make the provision of alternative accommodation for such housing in or in close proximity to such area a condition of the granting of such permission.
2. The following shall be the boundaries of the " Congested Areas " :—

*Annexure B.***Municipal Council Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910.**

Sections 63, 64, 65, and 66 to be repealed and the following to be substituted therefor :—

63. Any contract for any of the purposes of this Ordinance involving any expenditure or expected to involve an expenditure exceeding one thousand five hundred rupees or any contract enduring or expected to endure for a period exceeding six months shall be reduced to writing and shall specify.—

- (a) The work or service to be performed or, the materials to be used or the articles to be supplied.
- (b) The price or rate to be paid for such work, service, materials, or articles.
- (c) The time or times within which the work or service is to be completed or the materials or articles which are to be supplied.
- (d) The penalty or penalties to be imposed in case of breach.

64. The previous consent of the Council shall be obtained before any such contract is entered into on behalf of the Council.

Provided that in the case of the supply of articles to be imported from countries outside Ceylon, the Council may by resolution appoint an Agent or Agents resident outside Ceylon, and may delegate to such Agent or Agents authority to enter into contracts for the supply of such articles for and on behalf of the Council, provided further that such Agent or Agents shall call for tenders for the supply of such articles save and except where the Chairman specifies that an article of one particular make or description is to be purchased, and provided that such Agent or Agents shall place before the Council copies of their invitations to tender and the tenders received by them.

65. Before any contract as set out in the two preceding sections be entered into, the Chairman shall call for tenders by advertisement unless otherwise authorized by a resolution of the Council.

66. The Council may from time to time make, and when made may revoke, amend, alter, or vary such by-laws as may appear necessary and expedient for carrying out the provisions contained in this part of this Ordinance in accordance with the procedure laid down in section 109 of this Ordinance.

*Annexure C.***Proposed Amendments to Pension Minute.**

The first portion of section 2 to be deleted and the following substituted :—

Section 2 : Subject to the exceptions and provisions hereinafter contained every Municipal Officer or Servant holding a permanent office in the service of the Council, which has been declared to be pensionable by resolution of Council and drawing a salary at a yearly rate, either in respect of one or of several offices held permanently and conjointly, may be awarded a pension as under :—

Section 4 : Delete " but may count minute " at the end of the section.

Gratuities.

The paragraphs 1, 2, and 3 of section 21 to be deleted and the following substituted :—

Section 21 : Daily-paid employees with continuous service of 10 years and upwards may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-thirty-sixth of a month's pay for each complete month's service.

Provided in the case of daily-paid employees of 60 years of age and under that the Council is satisfied from the report of a Medical Board nominated by the Chairman and approved by the Finance Committee that they are physically unfit to discharge the duties of their employment owing to infirmity either of mind or body and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous.

The following section to be inserted after section 21 :—

Section 21A: Municipal Officers or Servants drawing a salary at a yearly or monthly rate whose service has been entirely in a non-pensionable office may be awarded a retiring allowance not exceeding three-fourths of the amount payable under Rule 2. Provided that to become eligible for an allowance under this rule an officer or servant of 60 years of age or under shall have been reported upon by a Medical Board nominated by the Chairman and approved by the Finance Committee, to be permanently unfit for further active service or shall be retired on abolition of office after serving continuously for a period of not less than 15 years. Provided further that this privilege shall not in any way interfere with the power of the Council to dispense with the services of any such officer or servant or to reduce his salary in case of reorganization or abolition of office and no claim to any additional grant on account of such reduction or abolition shall in any case be recognized. Any such officer or servant shall continue to be liable to suspension, dismissal, or removal from office in the same manner as if this rule did not exist.

*Annexure D.***17 C. Leave to Daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employees.**

(i) Daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employees who have served the Council satisfactorily for two years or upwards may be allowed leave without pay as follows :—

Two years' and under three years' service	..	Six weeks' leave.
Three years' and under four years' service	..	Three months' leave.
Four years' and under five years' service	..	Four months' leave.
Five years' and under six years' service	..	Five months' leave.
Six years' service and upwards	..	Six months' leave.

(ii.) Such employees on their return will receive a rate of pay not less than the rate of which they were in receipt when they proceeded on leave, provided that their efficiency is not impaired.

(iii.) A minimum of two years' continuous service must be performed between periods of leave.

(iv.) In computing service for purposes of leave granted under (i.) such leave shall not be included as service.

(v.) Such employees irrespective of length of service will, as regard illness due to accidents arising out of their employment, come under the provisions of 17 B. (ii.).

(vi.) When an employee does not return on the expiration of any leave granted under the above rules he shall be considered as having left the service of the Council.

The following paragraph is proposed to be added to section 21 of the Council's Pension Minute :—

In the case of a daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employee any leave without pay shall not count as a break in his service but shall not be included for purposes of computing any gratuity to which he may be entitled under the Pension Minutes.

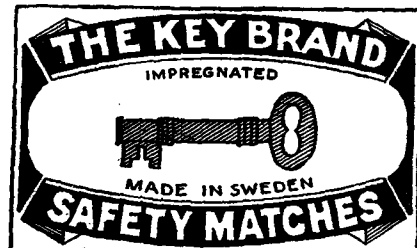

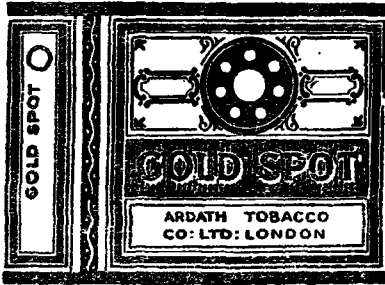
