WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgment Ordinance, No. 41 of 1921," it is enacted that where the Governor in Executive Council is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His dominions of judgments obtained in any District Court or in the Supreme Court of the Colony, the Governor in Executive Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that this Ordinance shall extend to judgments obtained in a superior court in that part of His dominions in like manner as it extends to judgments obtained in a superior court in the United Kingdom, and that thereupon the Ordinance shall extend to such judgments as if they had been made in the United Kingdom :

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council is satisfied that reciprocal provisions as aforesaid have been made by the Legislature of the British Protectorate appearing in the schedule hereto for the enforcement within the said protectorate of judgments obtained in any District Court or in the Supreme Court of the Colony :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare that "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgment Ordinance, No. 41 of 1921," shall extend to judgments obtained in a superior court within the said protectorate.

“THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ORDINANCE, NO. 25 OF 1909.”

**R**EGULATIONS made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 9 of “The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, No. 25 of 1909,” as amended by Ordinance No. 26 of 1921.

### REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

#### I.—Regulations relating to Cattle and Animal Diseases.

##### A.—Disposal of Carcasses of Diseased Cattle and Animals.

1. (a) It shall be the duty of all owners of cattle or animals and persons in charge of cattle or animals which die of disease to burn or bury or cause to be buried within six hours after death every part of the carcase of cattle or animals so dying in a grave at least six feet deep from the surface, and such carcase shall be covered with quicklime, when procurable, before the grave is filled in.

(b) Every person who finds the carcase of any cattle or animal lying dead and unburied shall inform the nearest headman or police officer, who shall cause such carcase to be forthwith buried in the manner aforesaid.

(c) The possessor or occupier of land on which disease exists or has existed or the owner of cattle or animals or person in charge of cattle or animals on such lands shall cause the fresh dung and other excreta of all diseased cattle or animals on such land, together with litter (if any), to be burned; tar, when available, being sprinkled over it before burning.

(d) It shall not be lawful for any person at any time to preserve or dig up any part of the carcasses of any cattle or animals which have died in an area which is or has been infected with cattle or animal disease, provided that the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent may issue permits in writing to preserve the hides, horns, hoofs, or bones of healthy cattle or animals which have been slaughtered for meat for human consumption. Every such permit shall contain the conditions under which such hides, horns, hoofs, or bones may be preserved. In cases where a permit is not granted it shall be the duty of the person in possession of such hides, horns, hoofs, bones, &c., to burn them forthwith. In default the Government Agent may cause them to be destroyed and recover the cost of destruction from the owner.

(e) It shall not be lawful during the existence of rinderpest in any part of the Island, or for a period of five years after it has ceased to exist, to remove by land or sea any part of the carcasses of cattle or animals or wild animals whether taken from an infected area or not, without a permit in writing from the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district.

2. It shall be the duty of every person who buries or assists to bury the carcasses of any diseased or suspected cattle or animals or is employed in tending diseased or suspected cattle or animals before he approaches healthy cattle or animals thoroughly to bathe his body and cause his clothes to be boiled in water or to be otherwise disinfected.

##### B.—Control of Diseased and Suspected Cattle and Animals.

3. No person shall expose for sale diseased or suspected cattle or animals in any market, gala, garden, or other public or private place.

4. No person shall carry or cause to be carried along any line of railway, canal, or river, or in any truck, vessel, or boat or otherwise, any diseased or suspected cattle or animals, or any dung, or other excreta of such cattle or animals.

5. No person shall carry, drive, or lead, or cause to be carried, driven, or lead, along any thoroughfare, road, highway, or in any park or public place, any diseased or suspected cattle or animals except upon a permit of the Government Agent or other person duly authorized.

6. It shall not be lawful for any person to keep any diseased or suspected cattle or animals in any chena or unenclosed land or field, or in any land or field immediately adjoining a thoroughfare or highway, without a permit from the Government Agent of the Province or from the Assistant Government Agent of the district in which such person resides, or from some person duly authorized by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent aforesaid to issue such permit.

7. It shall not be lawful for any person in charge of diseased or suspected cattle or animals to allow such cattle or animals to drink at or bathe in any running stream, or at any pond, reservoir, or lake.

8. The Government Agent may prohibit the bathing or washing of cattle or animals in any stream, public bathing place, pond, or lake near any area where disease exists or is suspected to exist.

9. Any officer appointed under the Ordinance, who is authorized in writing by the Government Agent for the purpose, or any other person so authorized, may destroy (a) any diseased cattle, animals, or dogs; (b) any suspected cattle, animals, or dogs.

10. (a) No compensation shall be paid in respect of cattle, animals, or dogs destroyed under regulation 9 (a).

(b) In respect of cattle, animals, or dogs destroyed under regulation 9 (b), compensation shall be paid to the owner out of the moneys voted by the Legislative Council.

(c) The amount to be paid as compensation shall be assessed at the time by the person by whose order the head of cattle, animal, or dog is destroyed, and where possible a note of the assessed value shall be given to the owner. Such amount shall be one-half the value of the head of cattle, animal, or dog immediately before it was destroyed; provided that in case of cattle the amount does not exceed the amount which in the schedule hereto is mentioned as the maximum amount payable for cattle of the class to which the head of cattle destroyed belongs.

11. Any headman, police officer, officer appointed under the Ordinance, or other officer authorized by the Government Agent may seize and detain any diseased or suspected cattle or animals exposed, carried, kept, or otherwise dealt with in contravention of the regulations made under this Ordinance, and shall forthwith report the seizure and detention of such cattle or animals to the Government Agent; and cattle or animals detained under the authority of the provisions of this Ordinance or of the regulations framed thereunder shall be supplied with food and water by their owners or by the person in charge of such cattle or animals at the time of seizure.

12. The owner or person in charge of cattle or animal sheds or other places in which diseased or suspected cattle or animals have been kept shall cause them to be well cleansed and swept and the refuse burnt. The floor and the woodwork shall be washed or sprayed or brushed over with a solution of Cyllin or similar disinfectant in water in the proportion of not less than two table-spoonful to one bottle, and the walls shall be limewashed before the sheds are used for healthy cattle or animals.

13. Cattle or animals that have recovered shall not be allowed to come in contact with healthy cattle or animals for at least fifteen days after recovery from rinderpest or foot-and-mouth disease, and such cattle or animals before being released from isolation shall be washed with a solution of Cyllin or similar disinfectant in water in the proportion of one table-spoonful to two bottles.

#### C.—Infected Areas.

14. No person shall move into, in, or out of an infected area any carcase, dung, or other excreta, fodder, litter, or milk without a permit from the Government Agent.

15. All cattle or animals within an infected area shall be kept within properly fenced enclosures, or shall be securely tied or tethered, or shall be detained and segregated at such place and in such manner as the Government Agent shall appoint. Such cattle or animals shall not be allowed to stray or run loose or to drink at any stream or at any pond, reservoir, or lake.

16. (a) It shall not be lawful to move cattle or animals whether attached to a cart or not, into, out of, or within an infected area, without a permit from the Government Agent or from some person authorized by him to issue such permits. Every application for a permit shall state clearly the number, age, sex, and the brandmarks (if any) of the cattle or animals to be included in the permit, the object for which such permit is required, and the line of road (if any) along which such cattle or animals are to be moved or transported; and must contain an undertaking by the applicant to pay for the cost of disinfecting any cart, wagon, boat, vessel, truck, or other conveyance used for the transport of such cattle or animals. Whenever any person desires to remove any cattle or animals from an infected area by rail, it shall be lawful for the General Manager of the Ceylon Government Railway or any officer authorized by him in writing to call upon the applicant to satisfy him by the production of a certificate from a Government Veterinary Surgeon or otherwise that the said cattle or animals are free from disease, and in the event of the said General Manager or said officer not being so satisfied, he may refuse to permit the said cattle or animals to be carried by rail. The permit for removal of cattle or animals attached to a cart shall be in the form A attached to the schedule hereto, and for other cattle or animals shall be as nearly as is material in the form B attached to the schedule.

(b) It shall be lawful for the Government Agent in his discretion to refuse to issue a permit where in his opinion any particular form of cattle or animal traffic is likely to spread disease, and to prescribe the number of cattle or animals which may be removed at any time, and any further conditions as regards inspection, route, and halting places which he may consider necessary.

(c) Permit when issued must be retained in the custody of the applicant, who shall produce the same to the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district, the Police Magistrate of the division, or the President of the Village Tribunal within whose jurisdiction the applicant resides, or to any officer appointed by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent for the purpose of issuing permits, or to any village headman within the limits of his local jurisdiction, whenever called upon to do so.

17. Any officer appointed under the Ordinance, or any person specially authorized in writing by the Government Agent, may destroy cattle, animals, or dogs found straying or running loose within an infected area or which have strayed or run loose therefrom or which have been kept or dealt with in contravention of this Ordinance or of any regulations made thereunder.

#### D.—Protective Zones.

18. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to establish a protective zone; and when such a zone has been established, the owner or person in charge of any cattle or animals within the zone shall forthwith remove such cattle or animals out of the zone to other land occupied by the owner, or to such other place as the Government Agent may appoint; provided that it shall be lawful for the Government



Agent to allow cattle or animals to be kept within the zone in fenced enclosures or tethered or otherwise secured as he may direct. No person shall move any cattle or animals in or into or out of a protective zone without a permit from the Government Agent or from an officer appointed by him in that behalf.

E.—*Isolation and Inoculation.*

19. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent to establish quarantine, isolation, or inoculation stations in any part of a Province, and to cause any cattle or animals to be moved thereto and detained for such period as may be necessary, and to cause inoculation to be carried out in any place he may consider suitable.

All cattle or animals so detained shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of such cattle or animals, and where any cattle or animal so detained is unclaimed, and remain unclaimed for fifteen days after the recovery of such cattle or animal has been notified by a notice posted up at the entrance to the building, it shall be lawful for the Government to authorize the sale by public auction of such cattle or animal to defray the cost of feeding and attention. The remainder of the proceeds of such sale, if any, shall be paid to the owner, if claimed within three months of the sale, and, if not so claimed, shall be credited to the general revenue, or, if the sale is effected within the limits of a local authority, to the revenue of such local authority.

20. It shall be lawful for any person acting under authority for the purpose of these regulations or for the purpose of building temporary segregation camps for diseased cattle or animals or contacts, to enter upon and temporarily to take possession of any lands required for the purpose within an infected area.

21. The Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent may appoint officers from time to time to carry out the provisions of this Ordinance and of the regulations framed thereunder, and shall pay them such remuneration for their services as the Governor may be pleased to appoint.

II.—*Regulations relating to Quarantine at Colombo.*

1. It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council, Colombo, to establish a station in or near Colombo for the purpose of quarantine of all cattle, sheep, goats, and other animals imported to Colombo from Asiatic and African ports.

2. All cattle, sheep, goats, and other animals imported from Asiatic and African ports shall be removed from the Wharf to the quarantine station within twelve hours of the last animal being landed on the shore in the case of each shipment, and shall be detained at the quarantine station for a period of fifteen days from the date of arrival, except as provided for in regulation 3.



3. All cattle, sheep, goats, and other animals that are required for slaughter in Colombo or for reshipment may be removed direct to the Municipal slaughter-house, or to the ship, if required, before the expiration of fifteen days, under dues supervision.

4. The Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, or any officer appointed by the said Chairman for the purpose, shall have the power to detain any cattle or animal for a longer period than fifteen days, or to refuse to allow any cattle or animal to be removed from the quarantine station if, in his opinion, such detention or refusal is necessary for the prevention and control of diseases of cattle or animals.

5. All cattle and animals detained at the quarantine station shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of such cattle and animals.

6. When such owner neglects to feed or attend on such cattle or animals, the officer in charge of the establishment, or any other person authorized by the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, is empowered to feed and attend on such cattle or animals, and the cost of such feeding and attention shall be paid by the owner of such cattle or animals.

7. Owners shall pay the following scale of fees for cattle or animals admitted to the quarantine station :—

8. When any owner fails to pay any charges due under regulation 6 or 7, the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, or any officer appointed by the said Chairman, shall be empowered to sell by public auction the cattle or animals in respect of which such charges are due. Provided that if in the opinion of the Chairman, Municipal Council, the cattle or animals cannot safely be sold, he may cause them to be destroyed. If the proceeds of such sale are insufficient, or in the event of death of such cattle or animals, then any other cattle or animals in the quarantine station belonging to such owner may be sold by public auction after due notice for the recovery of such dues, and the proceeds of sales, after deducting the amount of such dues, together with a further charge of 10 per cent. of the proceeds to meet the expenses of the sales, shall be payable to the owner of the cattle or animals concerned.

### III.—Regulations relating to Quarantine at Kayts.

1. No person shall import or cause the importation into Ceylon of any cattle, sheep, goats, or any other animals through any port other than the port of Colombo or the port of Kayts.

2. It shall be lawful for the Collector of Customs or any officer of Customs authorized by him to prevent the landing of cattle or animals at any port of this Island other than the ports of Colombo or Kayts, and no person shall be entitled to any compensation for any loss or damage incurred by him by reason thereof.

3. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent, Northern Province, to maintain a station in or near Kayts for the purpose of quarantine of all cattle and animals imported to Kayts from oversea ports.

4. All cattle and animals imported from oversea ports shall be detained at the quarantine station for a period of fifteen days from the date of arrival.

5. The Government Agent, Northern Province, or any officer appointed by the said Government Agent for the purpose, shall have the power to detain any cattle or animals for a longer period than fifteen days, or to refuse to allow any cattle or animals to be removed from the quarantine station if, in his opinion, such detention or refusal is necessary for the prevention and control of diseases of cattle, sheep, goats, and other animals.

6. All cattle or animals detained at the quarantine station shall be fed and attended to at the expense of the owner of cattle or animals.

7. When such owner neglects to feed or attend to such cattle or animals, the officer in charge of the establishment or any other person authorized by the Government Agent, Northern Province, is empowered to feed and attend to such cattle or animals, and the cost of such feeding and attention shall be paid by the owner of such cattle or animals.

8. Owners shall pay the following scale of fees for each cattle or animal admitted to the quarantine station :—

9. When any owner fails to pay any charges due under regulation 8 or 9, the Government Agent, Northern Province, or any officer authorized by the said Government Agent shall be empowered to sell by public auction the cattle or animals in respect of which such charges are due, provided that if in the opinion of the Government Agent the cattle or animals cannot safely be sold, he may cause them to be destroyed. If the proceeds of such sale are insufficient, or in the event of the death of such cattle or animals, then any other cattle or animals in the quarantine station

belonging to such owner may be sold by public auction after due notice for the recovery of such dues, and the proceeds of sales after deducting the amount of such dues together with a further charge of 10 per cent. of the proceeds to meet the expenses of the sales shall be payable to the owner of the cattle or animals concerned.

#### IV.—Regulations relating to "Galas."

1. In these regulations the word "gala" means any halting place, enclosure, or shed provided on or near any thoroughfare for the accommodation of cattle or animals or carts plying for hire or otherwise on any thoroughfare.

2. No person shall keep a gala unless the same has been duly registered in accordance with these regulations.

3. The owner or lessee of every place used as a "gala" shall apply to the Government Agent of the Province or the Assistant Government Agent of the district to have the same registered, and shall forward the particulars specified in the form A annexed hereto.

4. Any person intending to open a gala shall apply in the manner mentioned in the last preceding regulation to the Government Agent of the Province or to the Assistant Government Agent of the district to have the same registered.

5. The Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent shall on receipt of the necessary particulars register the gala assigning to it a number, in the form A annexed hereto, and shall forward a copy of the registration to the owner or lessee. But the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent may in his discretion refuse to register a gala, and may cancel the registration of any gala which has already been registered, provided that he is satisfied that the operations of cleansing and disinfecting the gala have not been adequately performed.

6. The owner or lessee shall keep affixed on the outside of his gala in a conspicuous position, a board with the words legibly painted thereon in the English and vernacular languages "Registered Gala No. ——" with the addition of his name and address.

7. The owner or lessee or manager shall keep a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil permanently fixed up in some conspicuous place in every gala.

8. Every gala shall be swept and cleansed daily, and the dung and rubbish therein buried or burned daily, or as the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent may require, and every gala shall be whitewashed or otherwise disinfected every three months or whenever the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent may require.

9. A stock of disinfectants shall always be kept at the gala, including at least one bottle of Jeyes' Fluid or Cyllin or similar disinfectant.

10. Upon the occurrence among the cattle or animals in the gala of any suspected case of rinderpest (Sinhalese, *wasangatharoga*; Tamil, *mattukotari*), or foot-and-mouth disease (Sinhalese, *kura-leda saha kata-leda*; Tamil, *kalni* and *vainoi*); the owner, lessee, manager, or person in charge of the gala shall at once report the fact to the nearest headman, police, or veterinary officer.

11. The owner, lessee, manager or person in charge of the gala shall segregate the sick cattle or animal or animals, detain in the gala all the remaining cattle or animals, and close the gala until it has been inspected and declared fit to be reopened by some one deputed by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent or by an officer of the Veterinary Department.

12. The walls, floor, and mangers of the gala must be sprinkled with a solution of disinfecting fluid in water once daily, while the disease lasts.

13. Any gala, the registration of which has been refused or cancelled, shall be closed immediately.

14. The registration of every gala shall be renewed annually.

15. The person in charge of any gala shall when so required by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent in anticipation of or during an outbreak of disease keep a register in the annexed form B, in which he shall enter particulars of all cattle or animals accommodated by him in such gala daily.

16. This register shall at all times open to the inspection of the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, officers of the Government Veterinary Department, and any other person deputed by the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent.

## SCHEME REFERRED TO.

(a) That in consideration of the extension already constructed of the right and left bank channels leading from Illakantai tank, and of the maintenance of the tank and channels to be undertaken by Government, the proprietors agree to pay an irrigation rate in perpetuity which shall be Rs. 2 per acre per annum for five years, and which shall further be variable in amount by His Excellency the Governor, but which at the maximum shall never exceed the average annual cost of maintenance per acre (arrived at in manner provided in section 50 (2) of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917), together with a sum per acre per annum which shall be arrived at by dividing the annual amount of interest at 6 per centum on the capital cost of the tank and channels between all the acres which are declared by the Director of Irrigation to be irrigable under the scheme; that the above rate be imposed from 1925, and that the former construction and maintenance rates be cancelled from that year; and

(b) That for the purpose of the preceding, the item “ capital cost ” includes all unrecovered expenditure on works due to construction, special improvements, or maintenance, whether incurred already or to be incurred in the future.

WITH reference to the Notifications in the *Government Gazettes* dated April 4, 1924, June 27, 1924, and August 29, 1924, respectively, the following additional information in connection with the visa of passports is hereby published:—

The arrangement with the Swiss Government for the abolition of visas to passports has been extended to the Principality of Liechtenstein. Consequently, visas will not be required in the case of British subjects proceeding to Liechtenstein from any part of the world and in the case of Liechtenstein citizens proceeding to the United Kingdom or to any British Colony or Protectorate. ## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 21, 1925.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 239 (14 Burghers, 150 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 39 Moors, 7 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 48·9, as against 42·3 in the preceding week, 27·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 158 (7 Burghers, 83 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32·3, as in the previous week, against 31·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 158 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 10 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 4 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 21 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana East, and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospital, Maradana North, and Maradana South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Maradana hospitals, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered at the Infectious Diseases hospital, Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twenty deaths were registered from *Debility*, 8 from *Diarrhæa*, 6 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 4 from *Worms*, 3 each from *Enteritis* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 2 each from *Dysentery* and *Tetanus*, and 61 from *Other Causes*.

6. Fifty cases of *Chickenpox*, 13 of *Measles* and 11 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week, as against 40, 11, and 23, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported during the week, but 4 were reported in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 77·2°, against 79·5° in the preceding week, and 80·7° in the corresponding week, of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·899 in., against 29·926 in. in the preceding week, and 29·877 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 2·43 in. in the preceding week, and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.

#### NORTHERN PROVINCE.

##### MANNAR DISTRICT.

Paddy (prospects of coming crop, &c.): kalapokam cultivation is being reaped. The prospects of the crop are fair.

Dry grain (prospects of coming crop, &c.): nil.

Coconuts (prospects of coming crop, &c.): in good condition. Estimated crop in Mannar Island division is 68,000 nuts.

Other products (prospects of coming crop, &c.): vegetable gardens in good condition and bearing.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 6.40 to Rs. 8 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2.25 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6 to Rs. 9 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.50 per bushel; maize, nil; coconuts, Rs. 7 to Rs. 15 per 100 nuts; salt, 10 to 12½ cents per measure; any other prices of interest, nil.

Health of inhabitants: good. Fever prevails to some extent.

Health of cattle: good.

Remarks applicable to particular district, e.g., condition of tanks or fisheries, &c.: tanks are about half full. A slight improvement in sea fisheries. Works in connection with pearl fishery are in progress.

Weather (general remarks only): 4.67 inches of rain fell.

Harvest prospects generally: fairly good.

General (any other remarks of interest): nil.

#### NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

##### ANURADHAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy: maha cultivation being reaped. It has not been satisfactory owing to the usual rains being late this year.

Dry grains: kurakkan crops are being gathered in. A number of kurakkan chenas have failed for want of rain.

Coconuts: crops and prospects satisfactory.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5.50 to Rs. 7.50 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6.50 to Rs. 9 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2.50 to Rs. 3 per bushel; kurakkan, Re. 1.75 to Rs. 2.50 per bushel; maize, Rs. 2 to Rs. 2.50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 14 per 100 nuts; salt, 15 to 20 cents per measure.

Health of inhabitants: satisfactory. Malarial fever and measles prevail in a few villages in Nuwaragam and Hurulu palatas.

Health of cattle: hoof-and-mouth disease prevails in Nuwaragam, Hurulu, and Kalagam palatas. Prompt measures have been taken to prevent the spread of infection.

Weather: wet. Average rainfall for the month, 10.14 in.

Tanks: most of the tanks are full.

Harvest prospects: not very satisfactory.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on January 10, 1925, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated January 5, 1925.

*Present* :—Mr. T. B. Russell, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe ; and Dr. E. P. Aserappa.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting and the Special Meeting of December 13, 1924, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. I. Durham asked—"What is the position at date *re* widening corner of Jail road at junction to Colombo road ?"

The Chairman replied—"A Crown requisition has been forwarded to the Surveyor-General for the survey of the corner in question, to enable the Government Agent, Southern Province, to transfer the same to the Municipality for the purpose of widening the junction."

The Chairman added, that he, as Government Agent, had given the Council permission to go on with the work.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., asked—

(1) Has the delay of about six weeks in spreading and consolidating the metal piled on Richmond Hill road been owing to scarcity of labour ?

(2) If not for what cause ?

(3) In view of the fact that allowing metal to remain piled on this narrow road without proper lights for a considerable length of time is a source of danger to traffic, particularly at nights, and a matter of much inconvenience at all times, will the Chairman be pleased to take necessary steps to prevent a repetition of the delay that has occurred recently on this road ?

(4) What was the amount allocated for upkeep of Richmond Hill road for 1924 ?

(5) How much has actually been spent on that road for its upkeep up to December 31, 1924 ?

The Chairman replied—

(1) No.

(2) The delay was due to the failure of the contractor to supply metal. His contract was terminated in July since when the Superintendent of Works has made his own arrangements for the supply of metal. Metal was piled in December, and it will be consolidated without further delay.

(3) The Superintendent of Works is confident that there will be no unnecessary delay in future as metal is procurable ; and I will take necessary steps to prevent, as far as possible, inconvenience to the public.

(4) and (5) Rs. 1,363·50 was allocated for the upkeep of this road, and Rs. 1,229·04 was spent up to December 31, 1924.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. E. de Vos moved—"That steps be taken to widen the street corners opposite the new building of the A. R. Ephraums Co-operative Stores, Limited, and that the Superintendent of Works be requested to prepare an estimate for the purpose." Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

5. Election of Members for the four Standing Committees for 1925, voting by ballot. The result of the ballot was as follows :—

6. Letter No. 22/29,775 of December 16, 1924, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council to the proposed by-law restricting the use of motor omnibuses upon certain roads within the Municipal limits of Galle.—Read.

7. Letter No. 23/29,227 of December 16, 1924, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council to the rules relating to the grant of temporary increases to pensioners.—Read.

8. Letter No. 07846 of January 7, 1925, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, notifying the nomination of Mr. F. G. Morley, Colonial Auditor, as Auditor of the accounts of the Municipality for the year 1925.—Read.

With the leave of Council the following items 9–13 were considered :—

9. Grant to the Galle Police Band.—Resolved (1) that the payment for 1924 be called back and (2) that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council be requested to sanction payment of Rs. 900 for the current year to the Galle Police Band, so as to cover the amount called back.

10. Application from Messrs. Walkers & Clark, Spence & Co. to erect a two-storey building at the junction of Church Cross street with Lighthouse street.—Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 13, 1924, be adopted, viz., (a) that the by-law, requiring the building to be set back eight feet from the side drain, should be enforced ; (b) that the rule regarding the rear space be relaxed, provided that verandah along Lighthouse street is gifted to the Council for the widening of the street.

11. Estimate of Rs. 550 for widening the approaches from Esplanade road to the New Gate, Fort.—Resolved that the item of Rs. 157·50, for railings, be deleted ; and the item of Rs. 45, for turfing, be reduced to Rs. 22·50. The amended estimate of Rs. 370 was passed.

12. To sanction revote of Rs. 623·79 for 1925 on estimate No. 75 of 1924, alterations to the meat market.—Resolved that the revote be sanctioned.

13. To consider applications for the lease of four open meat stalls.—Resolved (1) that the four meat stalls be rented at Rs. 15 each per mensem, without any promise of enclosing them ; (2) that the four meat rooms at the western end of the market be converted into boutiques, and that an estimate be framed for that purpose.
