### VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF MAY, 1924.

#### REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

##### Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 375 (322 General, 4 Kandyan, and 49 Muhammadan), as against 194 in the preceding month and 339 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 167 (135 General and 32 Muhammadan), as against 72 in the preceding month and 126 in the corresponding month of last year.

##### Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,563 (842 males and 721 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·91 per 1,000 of the population, as against 29·72 in the preceding month, 33·20 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·13 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate ranged from 13·43 in Anuradhapura to 48·18 in Kegalla.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 556 (312 males and 244 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 25·92 per 1,000, as against 25·78 in the preceding month, 28·96 in the corresponding month of last year, and 23·19 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 10·06 in Kollupitiya to 29·51 in Wellawatta North.

##### Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,668 (903 males and 765 females). There were 1,311 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 27·07 per 1,000, as against 26·73 in the preceding month, 30·43 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·03 the average for the month of May in each year since 1914. The rate ranged from 126·06 in Kalpitiya to 10·79 in Kegalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 525 (291 males and 234 females). There were 435 deaths of town residents, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 23·35 per 1,000, as against 27·35 in the preceding month, 31·18 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·90 the average for the month of May in each year since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 23·76 in Slave Island to 8·63 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 91 (50 males and 41 females), as against 102 in the previous month.

##### Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 337 and corresponded to a rate of 209 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended May 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 216, as against 212 in the preceding month, 213 in the corresponding month of last year, and 228 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 116 and corresponded to a rate of 201 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended May 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 209, same as in the previous month, and against 219 in the corresponding month of last year and 244 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

##### Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 18 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Convulsions* caused 7 per cent. of the total deaths, *Debility* (of children under one year) and *Phthisis*, each 6 per cent., *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* 5 per cent., *Dysentery* and *Diarrhoea*, each 4 per cent., *Anchylostomiasis*, *Enteric Fever*, *Enteritis*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 3 per cent., *Prematurity* and *Bronchitis*, each 2 per cent., *Puerperal Septicæmia*, *Influenza*, *Cancer*, and *Diabetes (Mellitus)* 1 per cent. each.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 12 per cent. of the total deaths. *Phthisis* caused 10 per cent. of the deaths, *Convulsions* 8 per cent., *Debility* (of children under one year) 6 per cent., *Enteric Fever* 5 per cent., *Enteritis* 4 per cent., *Bronchitis* 3 per cent., *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Diarrhoea*, *Influenza*, *Prematurity*, *Cancer*, and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, each 2 per cent., *Plague*, *Dysentery*, *Diabetes (Mellitus)*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia* 1 per cent. each.

12. Eight deaths from *Plague* (7 in Colombo and 1 in Kandy) were registered, as against 23 in the preceding month and 13 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Measles*, of which 85 cases were reported (69 in Colombo, 9 in Jaffna), *Phthisis* followed with 78 cases (65 in Colombo), *Enteric Fever* 66 (43 in Colombo, 11 in Galle), *Chickenpox* 45 (25 in Colombo, 6 in Moratuwa), *Continued Fever* 28 (21 in Colombo, 5 in Galle), *Plague* 12 (11 in Colombo and 1 in Negombo), *Mumps* 4 (2 each in Colombo and Galle), and *Diarrhoea* 2 (1 each in Colombo and Kurunegala). There were also reported 1 case of *Cholera* in Colombo Harbour, 1 of *Whooping Cough* in Badulla, 1 of *Dysentery* in Weligama, and 1 of *Diphtheria* in Colombo.

##### Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Kalutara recorded the highest rainfall (25·37 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 24·78 in. in Nawalapitiya to 0·35 in. in Jaffna. Colombo recorded 21·74 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 86·5° in Trincomalee to 63·4° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 82·2° in Colombo.
