**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF JULY, 1924.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in the proclaimed towns numbered 357 (278 General, 8 Kandyan, and 71 Muhammadan), as against 400 in the preceding month, and 391 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 132 (89 General and 43 Muhammadan), as against 144 in the preceding month, and 144 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,554 (812 males and 742 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·74 per 1,000 of the population, as against 27·62 in the preceding month, 31·41 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·87 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate ranged from 12·02 in Vavuniya to 66·87 in Lunugala.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 528 (270 males and 258 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 24·62 per 1,000, as against 26·11 in the preceding month, 21·40 in the corresponding month of last year, and 20·74 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 12·17 in St. Paul's to 27·35 in Wellawatta North.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,666 (873 males and 793 females). There were 1,313 deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 27·18 per 1,000, as against 24·83 in the preceding month, 32·28 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·57 the average for the month of July in each year since 1914. The rate ranged from 77·14 in Anuradhapura to 10·52 in Ratnapura.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 547 (293 males and 251 females). There were 446 deaths of town residents, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 23·95 per 1,000, as against 21·75 in the preceding month, 35·84 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·32 the average for the month of July in each year since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 29·15 in Maradana East to 10·53 in Wellawatta South.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 93 (48 males and 45 females), as against 111 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 344 and corresponded to a rate of 216 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended July 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 221, as against 226 in the preceding month, 260 in the corresponding month of last year, and 269 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 114 and corresponded to a rate of 198 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended July 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 216, as against 214 in the preceding month, 345 in the corresponding month of last year, and 319 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 16 per cent. of the total deaths were due, *Phthisis* and *Debility* (of children under 1 year) each caused 7 per cent. of the total deaths; *Convulsions* 6 per cent.; *Diarrhoea*, *Enteritis*, *Dysentery*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, each 4 per cent.; *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Prematurity*, each 3 per cent.; *Anchylostomiasis*, *Bronchitis*, *Influenza*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, each 2 per cent.; and *Cancer* and *Tetanus*, 1 per cent. each.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 14 per cent. of the total deaths. *Phthisis* caused 10 per cent. of the deaths; *Convulsions*, 7 per cent.; *Enteritis* and *Enteric Fever*, each 6 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under 1 year) 5 per cent., *Diarrhoea*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Bronchitis*, and *Influenza*, each 3 per cent.; *Dysentery* and *Cancer*, each 2 per cent.; and *Plague*, *Prematurity*, *Anchylostomiasis*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 per cent. each.

12. Eight deaths from *Plague* (in Colombo) were registered, as against 5 in the preceding month and, 19 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 124 cases were reported (104 in Colombo, 11 in Galle). *Enteric Fever* followed with 77 cases (34 in Colombo, 8 each in Kalutara and Galle, 7 each in Panadure and Kandy), *Measles* 72 (45 in Colombo, 21 in Jaffna), *Chickenpox* 59 (40 in Colombo, 8 in Matale), *Continued Fever* 36 (18 in Colombo, 11 in Galle, and 7 in Moratuwa), *Mumps* 12 (6 in Badulla, 4 in Colombo), and *Plague* 9 (in Colombo). There were also 1 case of *Dysentery* in Weligama, 1 each of *Smallpox* and *Diphtheria* in Colombo, and 1 of *Whooping Cough* in Badulla.

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (32·85 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 18·57 in. in Hatton to 0·07 in., in Jaffna. Colombo recorded 13·76 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 85·2° in Trincomalee to 60·2° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 80·9° in Colombo.
