VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1924.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 319 (255 General, 9 Kandyan, and 55 Muslim), as against 337 in the preceding month and 297 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 118 (90 General and 28 Muslim), as against 128 in the preceding month and 101 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,661 (868 males and 793 females) and were equivalent to an annual rate of 31·79 per 1,000, as against 30·99 in the preceding month, 30·77 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·94 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate ranged from 7·27 in Mullaittivu to 80·68 in Hambantota.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 671 (345 males and 326 females) and were equal to an annual rate of 31·28 per 1,000, as against 28·47 in the previous month, 28·54 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·07 the average for the corresponding months since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 12·94 in Kollupitiya to 29·96 in Maradana North.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,916 (1,015 males and 901 females). There were 1,491 deaths of residents in the towns equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 30·86 per 1,000, as against 27·85 in the preceding month, 34·39 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·77 the average for the month of December in each year since 1914. The rate ranged from 56·25 in Vavuniya to 13·67 in Matara.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 775 (390 males and 385 females). There were 687 deaths of town residents, which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 36·88 per 1,000, as against 31·07 in the preceding month, 37·47 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·95 the average for the month of December in each year since 1914. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and Pettah Wards, ranged from 39·74 in Maradana East to 11·58 in Wellawatta South.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 138 (79 males and 59 females), as against 99 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 435 and corresponded to a rate of 275 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 262, as against 265 in the preceding month, 287 in the corresponding month of last year, and 276 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 201 and corresponded to a rate of 345 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December 31, 1924. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 300, as against 277 in the preceding month, 290 in the corresponding month of last year, and 290 the average for the corresponding months since 1914.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under 1 year) caused 8 per cent. of the deaths; *Convulsions* 7 per cent.; *Diarrhoea, Dysentery, and Phthisis*, each 6 per cent.; *Malaria and Malarial Cachexia* and *Anchylostomiasis*, each 4 per cent.; *Prematurity, Enteritis, Enteric Fever*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 3 per cent.; *Bronchitis* 2 per cent.; *Influenza and Puerperal Septicæmia*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 12 per cent. of the total deaths. *Debility* (of children under 1 year) and *Convulsions*, each 9 per cent.; *Phthisis* 8 per cent.; *Diarrhoea* 6 per cent.; *Enteritis* 4 per cent.; *Prematurity, Bronchitis, and Dysentery*, each 3 per cent.; *Influenza, Enteric Fever, Anchylostomiasis, and Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 2 per cent.; *Plague, Cancer, and Puerperal Septicæmia*, each 1 per cent.

12. Six deaths from *Plague* (in Colombo) were registered, as against 7 in the preceding month and 21 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 148 cases were reported (105 in Colombo and 20 in Kandy); *Phthisis* followed with 123 cases (94 in Colombo and 15 in Galle); *Measles* 120 (101 in Colombo); *Enteric Fever* 65 (25 in Colombo, 16 in Kalutara, 14 in Galle); *Mumps* 32 (17 in Colombo, 6 in Galle, 5 in Badulla); *Continued Fever* 14 (11 in Colombo); *Dysentery* 14 (6 in Panadure, 5 in Kalutara); *Plague* 4 (in Colombo); and *Diphtheria* 2 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall.*—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (16·84 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 12·49 in. in Kalmunai to 2·84 in. in Chilaw. Colombo recorded 10·83 in.

15. *Mean Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 80·6° in Ratnapura to 58·2° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 79·6° in Colombo.
