And whereas the Chief Headmen's divisions of the Four Gravets, Talpe pattu, Gangaboda pattu, Hinidum pattu, and Wellaboda pattu of the Galle District, Southern Province, were brought within the operation of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1871," and "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," and subdivided into villages or convenient groups of villages under the provisions thereof:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the aforesaid Chief Headmen's divisions shall be subdivided into the villages or groups of villages as set forth in the schedule hereto.

 - "(5) For the purposes of this rule the number of votes polled shall be deemed to be the number of votes counted, exclusive of those rejected."

ORDER IN COUNCIL REFERRED TO.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 6th day of February, 1925.

Present:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any lighthouse, buoy, or beacon has either before or after passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coast of any British Possession, by or with the consent of the Legislature of that Possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such Dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light Dues) to be paid in respect of that lighthouse, buoy, or beacon by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminsh, or repeal such Dues, and those Dues shall from the time mentioned in the Order be leviable throughout His Majesty's Dominions, and further that Colonial Light Dues shall not be levied in any British Possession, unless the Legislature of that Possession has, by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly passed, signified its opinion that the Dues ought to be levied:

And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are Lighthouses which have been duly erected under and pursuant to the said section:

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883; the 9th day of May, 1892; the 29th day of June, 1896; the 10th day of August, 1903; the 21st day of October, 1912; and the 6th day of February, 1917; the Dues leviable in respect of the said Lighthouses for the classes or ships therein respectively mentioned were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 14th day of July, 1922, His Majesty directed that, as from the 1st day of October, 1922, or from the time of the receipt of notice of that Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied should be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-eighths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse, one-eighth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said lights respectively, subject in each case to a reduction of 25 per cent.:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Dues should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers so vested in Him by the above recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth by this Order in Council order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Colonial Light Dues (Great and Little Basses and Minicoy) Order, 1925."
- 2. As from the 1st day of April, 1925, or from the time of the receipt of this Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-sixteenths of one penny per ton, a d in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse, one-sixteenth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said lights respectively.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. Offensive or Dangerous Trades.—The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive or dangeours trades:—
 - (1) Storage or manufacture of artificial manure.
 - (2) Tanning.
 - (3) Fibre dyeing.
 - (4) Coconut oil manufacture (where machinery is employed).
 - (5) Manufacture or storing of fibre.
 - (6) Storing of hides or bones or materials for manufacture of artificial manure in quantity over one gunny bag.
 - (7) Manufacture of bricks and tiles.
 - (8) Manufacture of lime.
 - (9) Manufacture of ice or aerated waters.
 - (10) Storing or curing of plumbago.
- 2. Licenses.—No person shall within the limits of the Matara Urban District Council keep any bakery, boutique in which fresh fish is sold, eating or lodging house, tea or coffee boutique, dairy, cattle gala, laundry, or carry on or suffer to be carried on in any premises an offensive or dangerous trade without an annual license from the Chairman of the said Council, which license the Chairman is hereby empowered to refuse to any person failing to comply with any of the rules passed for the regulation, supervision, protection, or control of the places and trades aforesaid. Such license shall be subject to the fees indicated in the schedule hereto, and every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until such license is cancelled.
- 3. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of any of the rules providing for the regulation, supervision, protection, or control of the places or trades aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person by the Chairman. Upon such cancellation of a license by a court the Chairman is further empowered in his discretion to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person. Provided that these rules shall not apply to stalls in markets established
- by or vested in any public body.

 4. Any person who, without taking out a license and paying the fees thereon, keeps a place or carries on or suffers to be carried on in any premises a trade for which a license is required under these by-laws, shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding rupees fifty (Rs. 50), and shall further be liable to pay an additional fine not exceeding rupees five (Rs. 5) for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction.

Member's License.—(a) Every member shall, on application to the Secretary, be entitled to a license on paying therefor a fee of Rs. 10 for the period of one day; or Rs. 25 for the period of one week; or Rs. 40 for the period of one month; or Rs. 80 for the open season as published in the Ceylon Government Gazette from time to time. Special licenses shall be issued to members on payment of a fee of Rs. 15.
 - "(b) Any lady relative of a resident member shall be entitled to a license corresponding in terms to each and every license taken out by the resident member during the year on payment of a sum of Rs. 10 for the year. All fish killed on such lady relative's license shall be reckoned against the corresponding member's license.
 - "(c) Children under 12 years of age of a resident member shall, on payment of a fee of Rs. 5 each, be entitled to a license similar in all respects to any license then in force of such resident member. All fish killed on such children's license shall be reckoned against the corresponding member's license. Licenses issued to children are further conditional on such children fishing in the company of a resident member, and only in such waters as are open to them each year by the Managing Committee."
- 2. Rule 5 (c) of the Ceylon Fishing Club rules is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor, viz.:—
 - "(c) Every applicant to whom a license shall be issued under this section shall pay therefor a fee of Rs. 15 for a period of one day; or Rs. 60 for a period of one week; or Rs. 120 for a period of one month; or Rs. 250 for the open season as published in the Ceylon Government Gazette from time to time. Special licenses may be issued to non-members on payment of a fee of Rs. 35."
- 3. By-law 12 of the by-laws in the First Schedule to the Ceylon Fishing Clubrules is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor, viz.:—
 - "12. Only single-hooked flies shall be used in fly fishing. The size of the fly is limited to $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch in length, measured from the end of the shank to the point along the bend of the hook."

P'LAWS made by the Local Board of Bandarawela, under section 56 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898," as amended by Ordinances No. 27 of 1916 and No. 25 of 1921, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council.

BY-LAWS.

- 1. No person shall within the limits of the Local Board, Bandarawela, keep any dairy, manure manufactory, place for boiling or drying offal or blood, bakery, tannery, place for storing of hides, bones, artificial manure or materials for manufacturing artificial manure in quantity over one gunny bag, brick or tile manufactory, lime kiln, or aerated water manufactory without an annual license from the Chairman of the said Board, which license the Chairman is hereby empowered to refuse to any person failing to comply with any of the rules providing for the regulation and control of the places aforesaid. Every such license shall remain in force until December 31 of the year in respect of which such license is issued or until such license is cancelled. Such license shall further be subject to such fees as the Local Board shall from time to time determine with the sanction of the Governor in Council.
- 2. If any person shall have been convicted twice or oftener by any court of the breach of any of the rules providing for the control of the places aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the court recording such second or subsequent conviction to cancel the license issued to such person under this chapter by the Chairman of the Local Board. Upon any such cancellation of a license by a court, the Chairman of the Local Board is empowered in his discretion to refuse to issue any fresh license to such person. Provided that these rules shall not apply to stalls in markets established by or vested in any public body.

Dangerous and Offensive Trades.

3. Dangerous and offensive trades shall for the purpose of these rules mean and include any of the following:—Storage or manufacture of artificial manure, boiling of blood or offal, drying blood or offal, tanning, fat melting, fat extracting, soap making, soaking of coconut husks, fibre dyeing, coconut oil manufacture (where machinery is employed), manufacture or storing of fibre, storing of hides, bones, artificial manure, storing of maldive fish in quantity over 5 cwt. in weight, quarrying for metal, cabook, or gravel, the manufacture of aerated waters, storing or curing of plumbago.

4. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the limits of the Local Board or other person shall carry on or suffer to be carried on upon such lands or premises any offensive or dangerous trades or manufacture without a license from the Chairman of the Local Board, who is further empowered to refuse such license to any person failing to comply with any of these or other already existing Local

Board rule.

Such license shall be subject to such fees as the Local Board from time to time may determine with the sanction of the Governor in the Council.

STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 28, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 161 (2 Europeans, 15 Burghers, 91 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 19 Moors, 6 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 32.9, as against 30.7 in the preceding week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 155 (11 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 18 Moors, 5 Malays, and 4

Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·7, as against 27·4 in the previous week, 30·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 155 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death. -- 1. (a) Twenty-five death's from Pneumonia were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 4 in New Bazaar, 3 in Maradana North, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last vear.

(b) Nine deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South, as against 8 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South,

as against 1 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from Phthisis were registered, 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in Fort, St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana hospital, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 14 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Eight deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents)

and 1 in Wellawatta North, as against 1 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from Plague were registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eleven deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions 10 from Debility, 7 from Dysentery, 6 from Enteritis,

5 from Diarrhæa, 1 from Tetanus, and 56 from Other Causes.

6. One hundred and fifteen cases of Chickenpox, 17 of Measles (1 in Port), 13 of Enteric Fever (2 in Port), 2 of Plague, and 1 of Smallpox (in Port) were reported during the week, as against 68, 18, 4, 3, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81·3°, against 79·8° in the preceding week and 82·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·836 in., against 29·835 in. in the preceding week and 29·803 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·39 in., against 0.55 in. in the preceding week and 1.26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

 (2) Letter No. 4 of February 11, 1925, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning payment of gratuity of Rs. 22.50 to each of the wo minor of the late Bakin Saideen, Kangany, Scavenging Department.—Read.
- (3) Letter of January 21, 1925, from Sister Suddhammachari, applying for a grant of Rs. 500 a year to the Buddhist Nuns Free School at Katukele.—Resolved that a grant of Rs. 250 per annum under section 45 (j) of the Municipal
- Councils Ordinance be given, subject to approval of Government.

 (4) Letter of February 20, 1925, from the residents of Malabar street, requesting the Council to prevail on the Public Works Department to tar Malabar street, as far as the Lewella junction.—Resolved that the letter be forwarded to Provincial Engineer, Central Province, and that he be asked to tar as much of the road as his funds will permit and also as much as possible of the Peradeniya and Katugastota roads.
- (5) Letter of January 28, 1925, from the Municipal Electrical Engineer, on matters in connection with the management of the Ecctricity Department.—Resolved that it be noted that the Accountant has not in any way attempted to mislead the Council.

It was also resolved to request the Colonial Auditor to report on the following:—(a) Whether it is desirable that the Municipal Accountant should be relieved of all responsibility in regard to the accounts of the Electricity Department? (b) If so, would the Colonial Auditor's Department undertake full responsibility for the control and correctness of the social solution is the Electricity Department? (c) If his Department would undertake such responsibility, what grade officer would he be able to spare for this work, and how often would such officer be able to pay visite of inspection? (d) What would be the cost of such audit by his Department? (c) Whether the proposal to credit moneys to the Municipal Electrical Engineer's account as contained in his letter is in keeping with the provisions of section 74 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva asked.—(1) Why tarring was done only up to Mr. Sargent's bungalow at Malabar street and not further, and why the road is never watered? (2) What did it cost the Municipality for constructing

the grain sheds at Katugastota? (3) Did this Council receive any rent since they were built?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) The road is in charge of the Public Works Department and the tailing was done by that Department. Tarred roads are not watered as the four carts we have are more needed to water the reads (3) Yes. Rs. 600: 50, that are not tarred. (2) Granary, Rs. 13, 02.81; Retail Sheds, Rs. 3,023.24; total Rs. 16,626.05.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatileke asked.—(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to instruct the Municipal Meetrical Engineer to instal a few post-lights in the area of the Mahaiyawa and Katukele Model Tenements? (2) Will the Chairman be pleased to instruct the Municipal Electrical Engineer to instal a few post-lights on Cemetery road ? (3) Will the Chairman be pleased to state when it is proposed to supply electric post-lights to Peradeniya road, from Mulgampels to Peradeniya? (4) Will the Chairman be pleased to state what steps have been taken to give effect to the following motions passed by this Council:—(a) That an estimate be submitted for building a small market at Getambe or in the maighbourhood of Peradeniya; (b) That an estimate be submitted for building a public latrine between Mulgampola and Paradeniya. (5) Will the Chairman be pleased to table for the information of the Members, the reports of the Superintendent of Works on-(a) The improvement of a section of the Meda-cla between the Post Office and the Petrol Depot: (b) To widen the curve almost opposite the Hantane Estate Store on the road leading to the Hospital; (c) The selection of a site for building a shed to house the hearse belonging to the Rickshaw Men's Association.

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) and (2) Report and estimates will be called for from the Municipal Electrical Engineer; (3) The extension cannot be undertaken till further generating plant is provided; (4) (a) No suitable site has been yet selected and so no estimate has been prepared, (b) Difficulty as regards site. Besides the Superintendent of Works is now constructing a Septic tank public latrino in Torrington road. After observing the working of this he proposes to suggest that all public latrines to be constructed in the future should be on this principle; (5) (a) Tabled; (b) Estimate and plan tabled; (c) The site recommended by the Superintendent of Works is that acquired for a public latrine behind premises No. 322. Peradeniya road.—Report tabled.

As regards 5 (a) it was agreed to ask Government for a grant towards improvement of the Meda ela and as regards (5) (c) to ask the Superintendent of Works to find a site by the Mahaiyawa cometery.

- 7. With the leave of the Council the Chairman moved "That this Council de request permission of Her Excellency Ledy Manning to name the new Asgiriya road after her." Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried unanimously.
- 8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Pieris moved-That no fees be levied from business places under by-law 207A for removal of trade refuse, unless the quantity removed daily exceeds the quantity a standard-sized receptable will hold. It the refuse removed is ordinarily more than the quantity a standard-sized receptacle will hold, the fee to be fixed by the Chairman. Mr. de Silva seconded - Carried.

It was agreed to ask the Medical Officer of Health to submit a list of places where the quantity of refuse to be removed exceeds that which a standard-sized receptacle will hold.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. Pieris moved-That a new reservoir be constructed of reinforced concrete in the Dunumedalawa Valley above the present reservoir, capable of storing 22 million gallons of water, the bund admitting of being raised, if necessary later to store double this quantity, and that the proposals contained in paragraphs 27 and 39 of Mr. Tomalin's report be carried out immediately. Mr. Wijayatileke seconded.

Mr. Ratwatte moved as an amendment that the opinion of the Director of Public Works be obtained on the Scheme for augmenting the water supply by the diversion of the Conapilikanu stream and on the proposed new reservoir and the matter brought up for consideration at the next Meeting of Council. Mr. Wijayatileke seconded .-- The amendment was

put to the Meeting and carried unanimously.

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- Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva moved—As the Grain Sheds at Katugastota are of no practical use. I move that the said sheds at the premises be sold by public auction or in the alternative if it is impracticable to sell the land on which the sheds stand that the materials be sold. Mr. Wijayatileke seconded .-- It was agreed to call for tenders for lease of building or for purchase of materials.
- 11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatileke moved-That a motor car stand be built on a part of the vacant Municipal land between the Ward street and the Katukele road opposite the Masonic Hall for the purpose of parking all trensed motor vehicles, and that a supplementary vote be granted for the purpose. Mr. Ismail seconded.—Carried.
- 12. Papers re acquisition of a portion of Hantane Estate, in connection with improvements to the Kandy water apply.-Resolved that the matter be deforred for consideration at the next Meeting.
- Application from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for sanction to purchase an additional engine and dynamo sta cost of Rs. 60,000, approximately.—Resolved that sanction of Government be obtained to overdraw the Council's current account at the Mercantile Bank to a maximum of Rs. 100,000 at 8 per cent. interest, subject to final settlement by June 30, 1927, to meet the cost of additional generating plant at the Power Station.
- 14. Estimate for Rs. 1,725 to lay a 2-inch water main along Lady McCarthy's drive. Resolved that a sum of B. 2,500 be voted to admit of the main being extended as far as premises No. 194, Lady McCarthy's drive.
- 15. To sanction the following excesses on vote for 1924:—(1) Treating Victoria drive with tar, Rs. 217.60. (2) Maintenance of Waterworks, Rs. 335.63; House service, Rs. 580.63. (3) Maintenance of grass land, Rs. 117.18; sick pay and orderly, Rs. 23.76.—Resolved that the excesses on votes be passed.
- 16. Papers re the appointment of a Health Visitor.—Resolved that Miss McGregor be appointed as Health Waitor on a salary of Rs. 85 per mensem and a rickshaw allowance of Rs. 15 per mensem.
