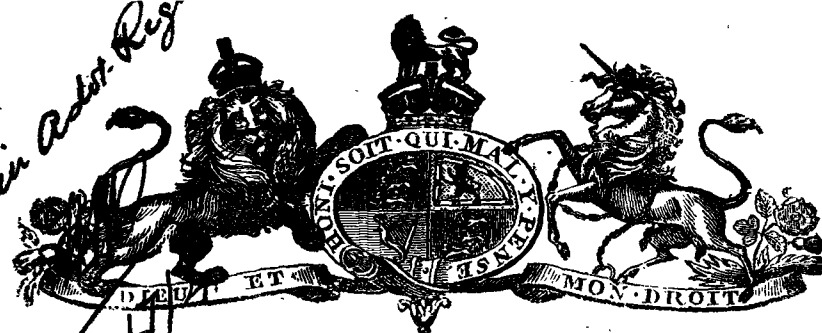

CODE FOR ASSISTED ENGLISH SCHOOLS.

AMENDMENT REFERRED TO.

Clause 10.—Alter to read as follows :—

10. The object of the grant is to aid local exertion (a) to promote education, (b) to maintain schools, and (c) to train teachers.

Object and
limitation of
grants.

Grants cannot be claimed for any new school, irrespective of the circumstances of the case and the limits of the sum placed at the disposal of the Director by the Legislative Council. Should a grant be refused, the reason for its refusal will be communicated to the applicants.

CODE FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR AND ANGLO-VERNACULAR SCHOOLS.

THE following amendments to the Code for Assisted Vernacular and Anglo-Vernacular Schools, which have been passed by the Board of Education and confirmed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, are hereby published in accordance with section 10 (3) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 10.—Alter to read as follows :—

10. The object of the grant is to aid local exertion (a) to promote education, (b) to maintain schools, and (c) to train teachers.

Object and
limitation of
grants.

Grants cannot be claimed for any new school, irrespective of the circumstances of the case and the limits of the sum placed at the disposal of the Director by the Legislative Council. Should a grant be refused, the reason for its refusal will be communicated to the applicants.

Clause 23.—For the fourth sentence reading "The certificate may be refused . . . for irregular attendance," substitute the following :—

No teacher can refuse to issue a leaving certificate to a parent or guardian who applies for one; but in the case of a pupil against whose parent or guardian a prosecution has been instituted for the irregular attendance of the child, the certificate shall be on the form known as Q 1.

Building and Equipment Grants.—On page 14, after clause 40, insert the following additional clause :—

(c) *Building and Equipment Grants.*

40 A. In cases where additional buildings and equipment are required in schools carried on by local authorities or governing bodies of assured stability, the Director may make a grant towards the cost of same. Applications for building grants for payment during the next financial year (October 1 to September 30) should reach the Director not later than the end of December, and must be accompanied by plans and an estimate of cost.

Terms and Conditions regarding Lease of Sites for Oil Installations in or adjoining Railway Premises.

The arrangements set out below to apply to minor Oil Installations, private siding, and private goods shed:—

(1) *Provision of Sites.*—Where practicable, the party requiring the facility to provide the necessary site, but where this is not practicable, Government to provide the site, if in the opinion of Government it is desirable to do so, either on land already in the possession of Government or on land specially acquired.

(2) *Occupation of Sites provided by Government.*—Sites provided by Government to remain the property of Government and to be leased to the parties requiring them.

(3) *Rent.*—A sum calculated as nearly as may be on the basis of 8 per cent. of the value of the site as assessed by the Government Agent in cases where the site is on land already in the possession of Government, and on the basis of 8 per cent. of the purchase price of the site in cases where the site is on land acquired by Government to be paid to Government as rent. Where a site is used for more than one lessee, the proportion of the rent to be paid by each lessee to be determined by Government.

(4) *Commencement of Lease.*—All leases to be operative and rent to be payable as from October 1 or April 1 next preceding the date on which the land is placed at the disposal of the lessees, irrespective of the date of occupation.

(5) *Duration of Lease.*—All leases to be for a period of 20 years with the option of renewal for a further period of 20 years, and to be subject to revision of rent at the end of the original period of 20 years.

(6) *Termination of Lease.*—Either party to have the right to terminate the lease before the expiration of the original period of 20 years, or, in the case of a renewed lease, before the expiration of the further period of 20 years, by giving six months' notice. If such notice is given by Government, the lessee to be entitled at the cost and option of Government to one of the following alternatives, viz.: (a) Equivalent facilities elsewhere, Government being entitled to remove and use all existing plant, &c., on the original site; or (b) compensation. The sum payable as compensation to be the capital cost incurred by the lessee on any immovable works, plant, &c., less depreciation on a 20 years' basis, provided that Government shall only be liable to pay compensation in respect of capital expenditure duly notified to and accepted by the General Manager within three calendar months of the completion of the works, or installation of the plant, &c., to which the expenditure relates. If notice is given by the lessee, Government to be entitled to such compensation as it may determine, not exceeding in the case of a site specially acquired the cost of acquisition of such site, and in the case of a site not specially acquired the cost of restoring to its original condition such site or so much of it as is required by the Railway Department to be so restored.

(7) *Cesses, Rates, and Taxes.*—All cesses, rates, and taxes to be paid by lessees.

(8) *Obligation to use the Railway.*—An obligation to use the railway whenever possible for traffic to and from a dépôt or goods shed on a site provided by Government to be one of the covenants of the lease.

(9) *Existing Leases.*—Whenever possible, leases already in force to be replaced as from April 1, 1925, by mutual consent by fresh leases based on these revised conditions. Pending cases to be similarly dealt with.

(10) *Construction and Maintenance of Works.*—The cost of clearing land, constructing and maintaining roads, constructing and maintaining sidings, or constructing and maintaining other works to be borne in all cases by the party for whom the facilities are provided. The maintenance of all works used by the Railway Department to be carried out by the Railway Department on sites provided by Government and to the satisfaction of the Railway Department on private sites.

(11) *Freight on Traffic to and from Private Sidings.*—To cover extra haulage and shunting: (a) One end terminal to be retained in the rate in all classes; and (b) an additional charge to be levied at the discretion of the General Manager in the case of shunting into distant sidings.
