#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency CECIL CLEMENTI, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

CECIL CLEMENTI.

HEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare a certain portion of a road which the railway crosses to be a "minor crossing" for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and that such "minor crossing" be closed by gates:

Now know Ye that We, the said Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do hereby declare that the road which the Ceylon Government Railway crosses between the stations of Dodanduwa and Gintota, in the Southern Province, which is set out in the schedule hereto, shall from April 7, 1925, to April 24, 1925, be a "minor crossing for the purpose of the said Ordinance, and that such "minor crossing" be closed by gates.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-five.

Clause 10.—Alter to read as follows:—

Object and limitation of grants.

10. The object of the grant is to aid local exertion (a) to promote education, (b) to maintain schools, and (c) to train teachers.

Grants cannot be claimed for any new school, irrespective of the circumstances of the case and the limits of the sum placed at the disposal of the Director by the Legislative Council. Should a grant be refused, the reason for its refusal will be communicated to the applicants.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 4, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 148 (8 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 27 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 30·3, as against 32·9 in the preceding week, 24·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 136(5 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 20 Moors, 2 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.8, as against 31.7 in the previous week, 26.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 136 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 41 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 3 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana North, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 25 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Seven deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in Maradana North and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Maradana hospitals, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, I each in Pettah, San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Slave Island, as in the previous week, and the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South, and I each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 13 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Eight deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as in the previous week, and against 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Two deaths from Plague were registered, I each in San Sebastian and Wellawatta North, as in the previous week, and against 3 the weekly average for last year.
- 5. Twelve deaths were registered from Debility, 9 from Infantile Convulsions, 5 from Diarrhea, 4 from Enteritis, 3 from Dysentery, and 56 from Other Causes.
- 6. Forty-seven cases of Chickenpox, 15 of Measles, 13 of Enteric Fever, 3 of Plague, and 2 of Smallpox (in Port) were reported during the week, as against 115, 17, 13, 2, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.3°, against 81.3° in the preceding week, and 82.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.848 in., against 29.836 in. in the preceding week and 29.852 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.09 in., against 0.39 in. in the preceding week and 5.49 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.


