CECIL CLEMENTI.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated July 1, 1882, the division of the Chief Headman of Matale South, in the Central Province, was brought within the provisions of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1871": And whereas it was enacted by section 53 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," that nothing in

that Ordinance shall prejudicially affect any Chief Headman's division or part thereof brought within the operation

of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1871":

And whereas under section 4 (3) of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," any Chief Headman's division or part thereof which at the commencement of that Ordinance is within the provisions of any Ordinance repealed by that Ordinance is deemed to be within the operation of that Ordinance, and the provisions of that Ordinance. nance applies to such division or part as if the same had been brought within the operation thereof; and whereas "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," has been repealed by section 100 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924":

And whereas by a Proclamation dated August 30, 1905, that portion of the said division of the Chief Headman of Matale South, lying within the limits of the Local Board of the town of Matale, as set forth in the schedule hereto,

was exempted from the operation of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889"

And whereas it is now expedient to alter and amend the said Proclamation dated August 30, 1905, by excluding from the operation of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924," the town of Matale in Kohonsiya pattu of the said division of the Chief Headman of Matale South, lying within the administrative limits of the Matale Urban District Council, as set forth in the schedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 5 (1) of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1924," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the date of the publication of this Our Proclamation, exclude the said town of Matale in Kohonsiva pattu of the said division of the Chief Headman of Matale South, lying within the administrative limits of the Matale Urban District Council, as set forth in the schedule hereto.

CECIL CLEMENTI.

WHEREAS by Chapter II., section 5, sub-section (b), of "The Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907," it is enacted that whenever the following event has occurred, viz., when lands have been declared the property of the Crown by an order passed under "The Waste Lands Ordinances, 1897 to 1903," the Governor may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, declare all or any of such lands or any part or parts thereof to be a reserved forest, and such Proclamation shall specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned have been declared the property of the Crown by an order No. 1,757 passed under "The Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903," on July 31, 1914, and appearing in the Government Gazette No. 6,636 of July 31, 1914, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all men that We, the said Officer Administering the Government, do by this Cur Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest from and after May 2, 1925; and We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 25, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 152 (4 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 18 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 31·1, as against 32·3 in the preceding week, 25·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 137 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 30 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.0, as against 24.3 in the previous week, 24.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 137 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 18 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Kotahena North, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 10 in the previous week, and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered, I each in Maradana North and Kollupitiya, as against 4 in the

previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

- (c) One death from Influenza was registered in Kotahena North, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 15 in the previous week. and 13 the weekly average for last year.
- 3. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
  - 4. One death from Smallpox was registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North.
- 5. Eight deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 7 each from Enteritis and Debility, 5 each from Diarrhaa, Dysentery, and Worms, 2 from Puerperal Septicæmia, 1 from Tetanus, and 62 from Other Causes.
- 6. Fifty eight cases of Chickenpox, 16 of Enteric Fever (2 in Port), and 7 of Measles were reported during the weeks as against 65, 17, and 9, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of Smallpox or Placue was reported this week, but one case of Smallpox (in Port) was reported last week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.2°, against 81.8° in the preceding week and 82.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.837 in., against 29.906 in. in the preceding week and 29.827 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.45 in., against 4.30 in. in the preceding week, and 0.70 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on March 14, 1925, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated March 9, 1925.

Present:—Mr. T. B. Russell, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E.; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe; Dr. E. P. Aserappa; and Mr. S. W. Dassanaike.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 14, 1925, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member were taken as read and confirmed.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe presented a petition from S. L. O. L. Marikar of No. 45, Church street, praying to be exempted from the payment of poll tax, on the grounds that he is over 55 years of age. The petition was read and the Council was agreed that the petitioner should be exempted for life.

3. Mr. D. G. Goonewardene presented a petition from certain residents of Noswatta and Radagodde asking for a road through the hamlet and for water and lights. Mr. Goonewardene recommended the opening of a road from Jail road past the Radagodella temple to Kandewatta road. The land for the purpose will be given free.—Resolved that the Superintendent of Works be asked for an estimate.

4. Monthly meeting of the Municipal Council for April-Resolved that the General Meeting of the Municipal Council be held on April 25, instead of April 11, which is a public holiday.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe asked—(1) Have any objections been received at this office against Captain Eastman's appraisement? If so, how many?

The Chairman replied—Yes. 142 objections have been received.

(2) Were the objections received investigated by the Chairman ? If so, with what results?

Reply: If by "investigated" is meant the holding of a formal nquiry as apparently contemplated by section 117 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, I have not investigated the objections. But each letter or petition received by me was considered by me personally in camera, with the help of whatever material there was in the office, and particularly the assessor, Mr. Eastman's notes. That has been the invariable practice for the last 7 years at least, including the last re-assessment

(3) Has the Council any intention of printing the Council's by-laws? If so, will they be printed only in English, as is desirable—in Sinhalese and Tamil as well? When were they last printed?

Reply: The Council, to my knowledge, has no intention of having the by-laws printed till they are revised. They were last printed in 1903.

(4) If the subject has not been considered, will the Chairman be pleased to call for an estimate for the purpose. as an early reprint of the Council's by-laws is urgently required only a very few copies of the by-laws being now available? Has the office any copies for sale?

Reply: I will call for an estimate if the Council so requires it. There are no copies for sale in the office.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe was to have moved—"That the appointment of an officer to raise the price of fish at the Fish Auction Shed be discontinued"; but, with the leave of the Council, he withdrew the motion upon being informed by the Chairman that there is no officer appointed for the purpose.

The Chairman agreed to put up a notice to this effect in the fish auction shed.

- 7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. E. Perera moved—(1) That Government be informed of the urgent necessity of widening the narrow portions of the Galle high street, which is a trunk road in charge of the Public Works Department, and forms the main thoroughfare through the town; and that Government be requested to set apart a sum of money from the surplus balances for the carrying out of the said urgent work. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded, and Mr. D. W. Subasinghe supported the motion.
- Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved, as an amendment "That application be made to Government for a share of the surplus balances of the Colony for the Municipal Council, but that when obtained it should be applied to the duplication of the main from Hiyare." Mr. C. E de Vos seconded the amendment.

The Chairman and the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar spoke to the motion.

Mr. S. W. Dassanaike suggested a 50-ft. road along the harbour front as being cheaper than the cost of acquisition

for widening the trunk road.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved, as a further amendment,—"That this Council, whilst urging on Government the necessity of widening without delay the trunk road belonging to Government, from the Galle esplanade to the bridge over the Wakgalmodera, appeals to Government to grant out of the surplus balances of the Colony a sum of money sufficient to carry out a most urgent work in Galle, viz., the duplication of the main in the water scheme originally carried out by Government for the Council and which now is found to be totally inadequate."

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, with the leave of the Council withdrew his amendment, and Mr. J. E. Perera withdrew

- The second amendment, which now became the substantive motion, was seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonewardene and carried
- 8. With the leave of Council, Mr. J. E. Perera withdrew the following motion of which he had given notice-"That the Superintendent of Police be requested to make a census of the in-coming and out-going traffic in detail, such as bullock carts, carriages, and motor vehicles on the Galle-Matara road at the triangle junction of the Galle high street. with a view to gauging the volume of traffic on that road.'

to be a member of the Municipal Council, in succession to Mr. W. R. W. Morgan.—Read.

An instrument for use in the tapping of rubber latex and like producing plants, characterized in that an elevated plate or heightening is provided on the outside of the instrument, this plate being applied or arranged in such a manner that the foremost edge thereof runs parallel or approximately parallel to the generatrix of the bent portion, and extends to or about to the active part of the cutting blade, for the purpose set forth.

The process for the production of a new food product from papaw fruit for use in the manufacture of bread, cake, biscuits, puddings, and the like by removing the skin or covering and the seeds of the papaw fruit, disintergrating the papaw fruit, heating it by steam for a certain period, squeezing out a part of the liquid contents, condensing by three-fourths the liquid squeezed out by the application of superheated steam, adding the pressed disintergrated papaw fruit to the condensed liquid, sweetening it with sugar, and then passing it through a desiceator to remove all moisture, substantially as described.
  - 2. The food product manufactured from papaw fruit by the process, substantially as described.
