Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 6, 1925.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 131 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 21 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 26·8, as against 25·8 in the preceding week, 28·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 153 (3 Europeans, 2 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31·3, as against 27·6 in the previous week, 21·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 153 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 19 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 12 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Maradana North and Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and New Bazaar, as against 5 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

3. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya, as against 5 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

4. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 from *Debility*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Worms*, 2 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 53 from *Other Causes*.

5. Thirty-nine cases of *Chickenpox*, 16 of *Enteric Fever*, and 12 of *Measles* were reported during the week, against 25, 16, and 10, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported this week, but one was reported in the previous week.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 182 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 103 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 29 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 37·2, as against 31·3 in the previous week, 20·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 182 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Slave Island, 3 in Maradana North, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana East, Maradana South, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 20 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Maradana East. The number in the previous week was also 10, while the weekly average for last year was only 4.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in Kotahena South and Maradana South. The number in the previous week and the weekly average for last year were the same as this week's figure.

Examination for Appointment of Clerks and Draughtsmen, Survey Department.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter Class II. will commence on Tuesday, August 25, 1925.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Survey Department must be addressed to the Director of Education, bearing a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and in the prescribed form (Schedule A), which can be obtained either at the Education Office or at the Surveyor-General's Office on application. Applicants must be in possession of, at least, the English School Leaving Certificate or the Cambridge Junior School Certificate to enter for the examination. An applicant

should state the name and date of the examination which he has passed, the index number used by him at the examination should also be given. Certificates should not be sent to the Education Office, unless they are called for. In and after 1926, candidates will not be admitted to this examination unless they have passed in the first division of the Elementary School Leaving Certificate Examination or hold higher qualifications. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to have been born on or after August 26, 1902, but not later than August 25, 1908, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. Affidavits will not be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration

* If the candidate has been educated at a Government or assisted school, the certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or assisted school which he has attended.

from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition from the name by which the candidates is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900. Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination. This examination is confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in the Island.

3. A candidate who gives notice of withdrawal to the Education Office fifteen days before the date of commencement of the examination will have the value of stamps affixed to his entry form refunded to him. In cases where a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission, a refund of four-fifths the value of the stamps will be made. In no other case will a refund be made, but a candidate prevented by illness from taking up the examination for which he has entered will be permitted to re-enter for either of the two following examinations without further fee, provided notice of withdrawal accompanied by the entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified medical officer be sent to the Director of Education not later than the last day of the examination, and provided further that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

4. Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who have completed three years' service, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age, and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Surveyor-General.

5. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on July 15, 1925. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

6. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

7. The examination will be held at Colombo only, under the supervision of the Director of Education, in the places which will be notified to the candidates in due course.

8. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be five and for Departmental competition five.

9. Successful candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from the Government Medical Officer, testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island.

10. Candidates, on selection, will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve for a period of three years in the Department.

11. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. The papers of any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds the marks allotted for Handwriting or half those allowed for Spelling or for Arithmetic will not be considered for the second part of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given to candidates for English Composition, General Paper, and *visà voce* if they obtain less than 30 per cent. in the aggregate of the marks assigned to these three subjects or less than 30 per cent. of the maximum marks of each of the remaining papers. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

12. MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on May 16, 1925, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated May 11, 1925.

Present :—Mr. T. B. Russell, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E. ; the Hon. Mr. H. M. Macan Markar ; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe ; and Dr. E. P. Aserappa.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 25, 1925, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were amended by deleting the words "for his information" and substituting therefor the words "for distribution among possible tenderers" in item 6 (2) (i).

The Minutes as amended were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe asked—

Q.—(1) Are the answers to the questions put by me at the February meeting of the Council now ready ?

Q.—(2) If so, what are the replies ?

The Chairman replied—

A.—(1) Yes.

A.—(2) The Director of Public Works has replied as follows :—(a) The loads in the different districts were estimated according to the type of buildings and the size of cable selected so that the voltage variation will be within that prescribed by the Ordinance. (b) The mains will be able to carry 50 per cent. more load than that provided for in the present Power Station, subject to the additional portion of the load being uniformly distributed. (c) It is not feasible to transmit current 4 miles with the present cable system. (d) Electric energy can be transmitted a distance of 4 miles by having a transformer in the Power House to raise the pressure up to, say, 3,000 volts. Current at this pressure is then transmitted on a special main to the required area and then transformed down to the same pressure as at Galle.

Q.—(3) What services do the Municipal Council render to the persons residing in the areas served by the following roads :—(a) The Galle-Colombo road. (b) The Bope road from the cemetery to the Kalegana Junction, and the other roads between the Bope road and the Gintota Station. (c) Is there a reasonable possibility of these areas being included in the water and lighting area within the next 25 years ?

4.—(3) (a), (b) The Municipal Council renders the same services to the area (b) referred to as to those other parts of the town not served with water and lighting, e.g., road communication and sanitation. Street lighting extends as far as the Provincial Engineer's bungalow on the Galle-Colombo road, and water as far as the Segregation Camp. (c) I am not able to say. It would depend entirely on the financial position of the Council.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe was to have moved—That with reference to my motion of June 10, 1922, on the subject of a road connecting Morris road with Hirimbura Cross road, the Superintendent of Works be directed to prepare, with such assistance as the residents are prepared to render, a correct survey as mentioned in his report dated August 17, 1922, and in terms of my aforesaid motion.

Mr. Subasinghe asked the Council to let the motion stand over till the next meeting, and leave was granted.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved—That it is desirable that the Electric Lighting Scheme should be extended so as to include the Richmond Hill road, and the Galle-Wakwella road as far as Sebastopool, and that estimates be called for the same and the Electrical Engineer be requested to inform this Council whether this addition will involve the substitution or addition of new plant. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded the motion.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene moved, as an amendment—That the following words be added after the words "plant," "or delay in carrying out the scheme already sanctioned."—The mover and seconder accepted the amendment.

Mr. D. W. Subasinghe urged the claims of Elliott road to electric lights, and moved, as a further amendment, the inclusion of the words "and Elliott road as far as Mahinda College," after the word "Sebastopool."

The Chairman disallowed the amendment, and requested Mr. Subasinghe to bring in a motion to that effect after giving due notice.

Mr. Subasinghe asked leave of the Council to bring in the motion at this meeting.—The leave was refused.

Mr. Subasinghe spoke against the motion.

The motion as amended was put to the meeting and carried : 7 voting for and 1 against the motion.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinghe moved—That a dressing room for the exclusive use of females be built by the sea-bathing place at Victoria park ; and that the present building be enlarged and improved, and set apart for the use of males.

With leave of the Council he added the following :—And that an estimate be called for, for that purpose. Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe seconded.—Carried.

6. Circular from the Colonial Treasurer on the abolition of poll tax :—

Resolved—(1) That the power to impose a labour tax corresponding with the road tax imposed by the Road Committees should not be withdrawn from Local Authorities till the financial relations between the Central Government and Local Bodies are decided. (b) That while admitting the sufficiency of the taxing powers of Municipalities, it is not considered practicable to replace the money derived from the labour tax by substituted taxation. (c) That it is impracticable for the labour tax imposed by Local Authorities remaining in force after the abolition of the road tax imposed by the Road Committees and, conversely, for the road tax imposed by the Road Committees remaining in force after the abolition of the labour tax imposed by the Local Authorities.

(Mr. C. E. de Vos left at this stage of the proceedings).

7. The Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1924, submitted :—

Resolved that in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the report be submitted to His Excellency the Governor.

8. Papers *re* improvements to Victoria park :—

Mr. D. G. Goonewardene, M.B.E., moved—"That a garden park keeper be appointed on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem, and that inquiry be made of the Superintendent, Botanical Gardens, Peradeniya, if a man is available." Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

9. Papers *re* Electric Light Scheme :—

Resolved that the papers be circulated.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of May 16, 1925.*

(2) Application for the extension of water service, with an extra tap, at No. 92, Galupiadada.—Recommended that the application be refused.

(3) Application from Messrs. Walkers & Clark Spence to erect a two-storey building in Church Cross street.—Recommended that, with the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, the Fort area be exempted from the operation of rule 2 of the schedule to Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, on the ground of the high site value obtaining in the area.

(5) Papers *re* fire protection.—Recommended that the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province be requested to obtain information from the Police Training School and elsewhere as to the efficiency of the "Minimax" fire engine.

(6) To consider the following estimates :—

(a) Rs. 250 for repairs to the meat market.—Recommended.

(b) Rs. 1,500 for building an office and store room at the Infectious Diseases Hospital.—Recommended that tenders be invited.

(c) Rs. 715 for two road rollers.—Recommended.

(d) Rs. 1,050 for widening street corners at the entrance to the Fort.—Recommended that the estimate be approved, and that the work be carried out by the Superintendent of Works at once.

Resolution.

With reference to item (3) Mr. C. L. Wickramasinghe moved—That the consideration of the matter be deferred. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

With reference to item (5) Mr. J. E. Perera moved—That the Superintendent, Colombo Fire Brigade be consulted as to the efficiency of the "Minimax" fire engine. Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

With reference to the remaining items, it was resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of May 16 1925.*

(3) Application from Municipal Officers for Holiday Warrants.—Recommended that Municipal Officers drawing substantive salaries provided under personal emoluments be granted Holiday Warrants for one double journey or two single journeys by Railway per annum, with effect from January 1, 1926, provided the cost of such Holiday Warrants does not exceed Rs. 1,500 per annum.

(4) Reassessment of Wards 3, 4 and 5.—Recommended that Mr. M. A. Marikar, 4th clerk of the Secretariat be seconded to assist Mr. Eastman in the reassessment of Wards 3, 4, and 5 for two months, and that he be paid a salary of Rs. 4 per diem, or Rs. 120 per mensem, whilst so employed to be charged to vote 79 ; and that the rate collectors be paid Rs. 1 50 per diem out of the same vote for their services.

Resolution.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

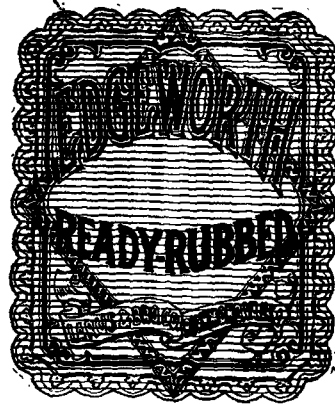
