SCHEDULE.

Divisions as defined by the Notification of June 8, 1915.

1.—Matale Town.

**Boundaries.**—A line beginning at the railway bridge over the Sudu-ganga river east of the North road and running north-east and parallel to the North road along the Railway road till it meets the bridge over the Brachmana-ela, thence along the Brachmana-ela eastwards till it meets the Sudu-ganga river, thence along the Sudu-ganga river till it meets the Godapola stream, thence along the Godapola stream northwards and passing to the east of the Godapola spring until it reaches a point 100 yards east of the North road at Mandandawela, from this point a line running 100 yards east of and parallel to the North road and Rattota road to a point 17½ miles from Kandy, thence crossing the Rattota road to a point 100 yards north-west of it, thence a line running south-west 100 yards north of and parallel to the Rattota road to a point 100 yards east of North road, thence a line running north parallel to and 100 yards to the east of the North road to a point in line with junction of the North road and Aluwihare road, thence a line crossing the North road to a point 100 yards west of it, thence a line running southwards 100 yards from and parallel to the North road to a point 100 yards north of the Pansala path, and thence north-westwards 100 yards from and parallel to the Pansala path to a point 100 feet north of Harasgama bathing place, thence a line running westwards 100 feet from and parallel to the dam of the Harasgama bathing place and across the paddy fields till it reaches a point 100 yards beyond and on the west of the Harasgama path, thence a line running southwards and westwards 100 yards west of and parallel to the Harasgama path till it reaches a point 100 yards to the north of Agalawatta path, thence a line running southwards and westwards 100 yards west of and parallel to the Agalawatta path till it reaches a point 100 yards west of the reservoir, thence a line running southwards 100 yards to the west of and parallel to the Ponamada path crossing the Wiltshire road to a point 100 yards to the west of the Wiltshire road, thence a line running southwards 100 yards west of and parallel to the Wiltshire road to a point 100 yards from the Hulangamuwa road, thence southwards 100 yards to the west of and parallel to the Hulangamuwa road to the Kumbiyangoda-oya, thence along the Kumbiyangoda-oya to a point 100 yards south of the Nagolla road, thence northwards 100 yards east of and parallel to the Nagolla road to a point 100 yards from the Moysey crescent, thence eastwards 100 yards south of and parallel to Moysey crescent till it meets the southern boundary of lot 6001 in preliminary plan 1,871 which belongs to the Crown, thence eastwards along this boundary and till it crosses the Sudu-ganga river, and thence along the eastern bank of the Sudu-ganga river till it meets the railway bridge, and thence along the railway bridge to the point at which the line started.

WHEREAS certain regulations relating to the branding of cattle were made under the provisions of section 4 of "The Cattle Ordinance, 1898," and duly published in the *Government Gazette* by Proclamation dated July 26, 1912, and republished in the *Government Gazette* of November 30, 1917:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said regulations:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in exercise of the power vested in Us by section 4 of "The Cattle Ordinance, 1898," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke regulations Nos. 2, 7, 9, 10, 15, 16, and 20 of the aforesaid regulations, and make in lieu thereof the regulations set forth in the schedule hereto, with effect as from and after the date hereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Nineteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-five.

SCHEDULE.

2. Branding irons when not in use shall be kept in charge of the Vidane Arachchi, Korala, Udaiyar, or Cattle Registrar of the division for which they are to be used, who shall be responsible for their safe custody. Branding irons for the purposes of rule 8 will be kept by the President, Chairman of Village Committee, or Police Magistrate, as the case may be. Within the Municipal limits of Colombo the irons shall be kept by an officer authorized by the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

7. The communal brand shall be as follows:—

- (1) The letter assigned to the district in which the village is situated. For list of letters see Appendix A.
- (2) The number assigned to the village as shown in the numerical register of the Province in which the village is situated, or within the Colombo Municipality to the ward or the cattle mart, provided that if the number consists of one figure only, two crosses (×) shall be branded between the district letter and the number, and if it consists of two figures only, one cross shall be similarly branded. The cross must be affixed thus (×) and not thus (+).

The above brands shall be of a uniform size, each letter not exceeding 3 in. by 2½ in., and shall be affixed on the near or left hip of the animal.

A × 3, A × 25, or A 173.

*Note.*—The letter A signifies the Colombo District (see Appendix A), and the figures signify the villages corresponding to those figures in the numerical register of the Western Province.

9. (1) In the case of animals already bearing private or caste brands at the time when these rules come into operation, no additional private or caste brands shall be affixed to such animal. Such private or caste brands shall be entered in the branding register hereinafter mentioned.

(2) In the case of other animals all private or caste brands must be affixed on the off or right side of the animal, and such brands shall be entered in the branding register.

(3) Provided that in the case of cattle already bearing private or caste marks purchased in the Wannu and removed to the Jaffna District, it shall be lawful for the owners, if they intend to send them back to the Wannu for grazing purposes, to have their own private or caste brands affixed to the off or right side of such animals in the presence of an officer authorized to brand cattle, and all such brands shall be entered in the branding register hereinafter mentioned.

10. Brands for sickness may be affixed at any time, but they shall not be affixed over or so as in any way to interfere with or deface any communal brand.

15. All cattle shall be branded in presence of the Cattle Registrar or of the Headman of the village in which the owner or keeper resides or of the authorized Municipal officer, provided that cattle belonging to any Cattle Registrar or Headman or authorized officer or any member of his family shall be branded in presence of the Headman of any adjoining village or of any Headman of superior rank to a village Headman or of any Municipal Officer of superior rank to such authorized officer. Before permitting any head of cattle to be branded, the officer in whose presence it is to be branded shall satisfy himself of the title of the person applying to have it branded. If the officer has reason to suspect the title, he shall forward the animal to the President or Chairman of the Village Committee or Police Magistrate, who shall deal with it under rule 19, and, if the title be satisfactorily proved, issue a written order to the Headman to permit it to be branded.

16. The village Headman (not being a Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar) or person authorized under rule 3 to brand cattle shall enter up a register in book form, in duplicate, according to Form A annexed, of all cattle branded in his presence, one copy to be kept in his custody, and the other in that of the Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, or officer authorized by the Chairman of the Municipal Council. When, however, the branding officer is a Cattle Registrar or a Vidane Arachchi, Korala, or Udaiyar, and attends to the duties of cattle register as well, only one copy of the register need be kept. The person keeping the register may on application issue a copy of any entry in the register, for which he shall be entitled to take a fee of 25 cents.

20. These rules shall apply only to pure bred Ceylon cattle known as neat or black cattle and to buffaloes.

1. Rule 1 of the Wireless Telegraph Rules published by Notification dated January 31, 1924, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,372 of February 1, 1924, is hereby amended by the addition of the following proviso at the end thereof, viz.:—

"Provided that where wireless telegraph apparatus forms part of the personal baggage of a person arriving in Ceylon, it shall be lawful for the Customs Authorities at the port of importation to grant a licence to import such apparatus in the Form G in the annexed schedule, subject to a declaration being made by the importer in the Form F in the annexed schedule."

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 20, 1925.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 135 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 12 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1925, viz., 254,867) was 27·6, as against 24·3 in the preceding week, 24·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 167 (1 European, 3 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 24 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34·2, as against 37·2 in the previous week, 26·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 29·8 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 167 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 32 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Thirty-three deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 12 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 5 in St. Paul's, 4 in Maradana North, 3 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta North, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta South, as against 29 in the previous week and 18 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Eighteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in St. Paul's, 3 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, 2 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena North, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 10 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North and Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Nine deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena North and Kotahena South, as against 8 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered in St. Paul's, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 each from *Dysentery* and *Enteritis*, 3 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Worms*, and 43 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-three cases of *Chickenpox*, 19 of *Enteric Fever*, 16 of *Measles*, and 5 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 24, 16, 13, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 82·2°, against 83·2° in the preceding week, and 81·6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·821 in., against 29·807 in. in the preceding week, and 29·857 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·64 in., against 2·54 in. in the preceding week, and 0·64 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1925.

## WESTERN PROVINCE.

## COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: fields have been sown for yala, and the paddy plants are thriving. Muttes crop has been harvested.

Dry grain: in some of the villages in Siyane korale west and Hewagam korale kurakkan has been sown.

Coconuts: flowering is good. The crop harvested for the month is about 66,900,000 nuts.

Other products: pineapples, oranges, mangoes, jak, and breadfruit can be had at moderate prices.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6 to Rs. 9 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 3 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 4 to Rs. 5 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 5 to Rs. 7 per 100 nuts; salt, 10 to 14 cents per measure.

Health of inhabitants: satisfactory, except for a few cases of chickenpox, measles, and dysentery.

Health of cattle: fairly satisfactory, but foot-and-mouth disease is prevailing in almost all the korales to some extent.

Weather: there was rain at intervals during the month. The rain fall at the Colombo Observatory for May was 8.02 inches on 29 days.

## KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the fields have been sown for yala, and the plants are 2 to 2½ months old.

Dry grain: there is very little dry grain cultivation in the district.

Coconuts: the month's yield of coconuts is estimated at 2,450,000 nuts.

Other products: fruits and vegetables were, as usual, scarce.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice is not available in the market; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 10 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 3.25 per bushel (not available for sale); maize, nil; salt, 10 to 12 cents per measure.

Health of inhabitants: on the whole good. There were a few cases of chickenpox, measles, fever, and dysentery.

Health of cattle: foot-and-mouth disease prevailed in the totamunes and Pasdun korale west. Two cases of suspected rinderpest were also reported from the latter korale.

Remarks applicable to particular districts: fish was scarce during the month.

Harvest prospects generally: too early to make a forecast.

Weather: there was heavy rain during the month.

General: nil.

## CENTRAL PROVINCE.

## KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy (prospects of coming crop, &c.): yala season fields being weeded and transplanted.

Dry grain (prospects of coming crop, &c.): kurakkan chenas being sown.

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, May 6, 1925, at 3 p.m.**

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated April 29, 1925.

*Present* :—Mr. H. E. Newnham, C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias, J.P.; Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. E. W. Jayewardene, K.C.; Mr. L. R. Pereira; the Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.L.C.; Mr. G. Adamjee Lukmanjee; Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy; Mr. A. J. Wickwar; the Hon. Mr. L. Macrae, M.L.C.; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. C. T. Young; the Hon. Dr. G. Thornton, M.L.C.; Mr. W. J. Thornhill; and Mr. A. H. Morgan.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 1, 1925, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of April 1, 1925, be confirmed with the omission of the following sentence in reference to the resolution appointing Mr. J. C. O. Ernst, Assistant Municipal Assessor, on page 159 of the Minutes :—"The Council was of opinion that, in the meantime, he should qualify himself in the examination of the Surveyors Institution, London (Valuation Division)."

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. De Mel, asked the Chairman the questions standing in his name :—

(1) To call the attention of the Chairman to the demolition of a large number of military buildings used for years as dwellings along Parson's road, and to ask whether he took any steps to prevent their demolition in view of the great shortage of dwellings in the city?

(2) Could not those premises have been used for re-housing purposes in that congested area under existing regulations?

(3) What parts of the city are yet badly served in the matter of public conveniences?

(4) Will the Chairman submit a report from the Medical Officer of Health with full details showing the necessity for further public lavatories throughout the city revising the old list?

(5) What roads, lanes, and alleys have not been provided with drains or been paved in order to avoid collection of foul water, &c., in the vicinity of dwellings? Will a report be furnished to Members of Council?

(6) How many private proprietors have been assisted to drain their premises to sewers? What is the total advanced to them?

(7) How many premises in the Pettah Ward have yet failed to be connected up with the sewers?

The Chairman replied as follows :—

(1) No notice was given to this Council of the proposal to demolish the buildings referred to and in any case this Council at present possesses no powers to prevent such demolition. The Chairman, however, made inquiries on the subject and learned that the buildings belonged to the War Department and were condemned by the Military Authorities for personal occupation and were ordered to be demolished by the War Office. It was also learnt that in the course of correspondence between the Military Authorities and the Colonial Government, the Director of Public Works put forward a proposal to improve the buildings and utilize them as dwellings—a course to which the Military Authorities did not agree. In these circumstances it was not possible for the Chairman to intervene in the matter.

(2) The premises were therefore not available for re-housing purposes.

(3) and (4) A map is tabled showing the existing public lavatories. A report is also tabled dated May 4, 1925, from the Medical Officer of Health giving a list of the fifty-three existing public lavatories; and the eight further lavatories already sanctioned by this Council for which funds have been voted. A list is also tabled of the further thirty-four lavatories which have from time to time in the past been proposed, but which have not yet been sanctioned by this Council. From this list it would appear that the Wards which are most in need of further lavatories are Kotahena (including Mutwal) eight, Maradana six. This list, however, requires revision and it is proposed fully to investigate the question and to submit a revised list to the Sanitation Committee for approval.

(5) This matter was raised at the Budget Meeting of Council on December 10, 1924, by the Members for Wellawatta and Maradana, and an exhaustive list of the drains which require to be built and which need repairs has been prepared and has just been received. It is tabled. It is proposed to submit it to the Works and Finance Committees for consideration towards the middle of the year when proposals for the allocation of the surplus revenue, if any, are under discussion.

(6) Thirty-eight private proprietors have been assisted to drain their premises to the sewers. Rs. 33,374.55 has already been advanced to them, while the value of further tenders accepted is Rs. 7,710.90, making a total of Rs. 41,085.45.

(7) A plan is tabled showing the present state of the Pettah Ward in the matter of drainage connections—593 premises are already drained; 148 premises do not require drainage; 35 premises are in process of connection; 14 premises have submitted plans for approval. The total, 790 premises, include more than 790 assessment numbers, of which there are 1,013 in all. The total number of premises still to be connected is therefore less than 223, the difference between the two figures. A house to house inspection has been started to ascertain the exact number of premises not yet dealt with and the figure will be available in about in three weeks. The owners of all premises in the Pettah Ward have already been noticed to connect.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Coorey, asked the Chairman the following questions standing in his name :—

(1) Will the Chairman be pleased to state whether the Chairman is aware that according to the Storekeeper's report, dated March 18, 1925, hora timber is returned as unserviceable by the various Overseers employed under the Drainage Engineer and that the Storekeeper issues such timber as firewood after it has been inspected by a Foreman?

(2) Whether in view of the fact that during the last three years 22,000 feet of timber, varying between 1 inch and 4 inches in thickness, and over 5,000 wedges have been so dealt with as unserviceable and in view of the ruling of this Council that it is undesirable for a Member to pay surprise visits to the Municipal Stores, the Chairman does not think it necessary in the public interest that timber returned as unserviceable by an Overseer or a Foreman should be inspected by some responsible officer before it is issued as firewood?

(3) Whether in view of the fact that during the last three years 34,000 feet of hora timber have been accounted for as buried in the course of works undertaken by the Drainage Department, the Chairman does not think that the Drainage Engineer, or some other responsible officer should inspect the works in order to ascertain the quantity of timber buried in the course of that work and in order to see if some of that timber cannot be dug out and used for some other purpose?

(4) What sum of money has been credited to the Drainage Engineer's special advance account for the miscellaneous revenue from hora timber found unserviceable and issued by the Storekeeper as firewood during the last three years?

(5) When timber is so issued as firewood, by whom is it weighed, and what responsible officer supervises or checks the weighing?

(6) Whether, in view of the fact that the return of timber issued and timber returned as serviceable or unserviceable has been signed by the Drainage Engineer, showing that these figures are easily available to him, it is not possible for the

Drainage Engineer, in preparing an estimate for any particular work, to take into consideration the amount of timber in stock available for that work without estimating for the purchase of the total timber required?

(7) If this is possible, was the estimate for 18th lane, Wellawatta, prepared after taking these figures into consideration and, if not, why not?

(8) What is the explanation for the estimate for timber for 18th lane, Wellawatta, submitted on January 26, 1925, being Rs. 12,237·50, whereas the estimate submitted on March 10, 1925, for Frances road, Wellawatta, which is even longer than the former, is only Rs. 9,055·20?

The Chairman replied as follows:—

(1) The Storekeeper's report of March 18, 1925, to the Municipal Engineer, was as follows:—

*Subject: Waste Timber.*

M. E.,—With reference to the attached, I beg to inform you that, when there is a collection of waste timber returned by Overseers under D.E., I always write to D. E. giving details of timber, who gets a Foreman to inspect them and authorize me to issue them as firewood.

Such timber is weighed and taken into stock at contract rate for firewood and the value credited to D. E's. special advance account, if they had been issued for same, otherwise to miscellaneous revenue.

It may be added that each Overseer is responsible for the timber issued to him until it is properly accounted for.

(2) The Chairman is of opinion that a Foreman, working under the supervision of the Drainage Engineer, is a sufficiently responsible officer to decide whether the timber returned as unserviceable by the Overseers should be used again for the Drainage Works, or be sold by the Drainage Department to the stores for use as firewood. There seems to be no inducement for a Foreman to condemn the timber as unserviceable, when it is in fact serviceable. The number of wedges returned to store as unserviceable in the three years in question was 2,590 and not over 5,000.

(3) The burial of timber takes place only on the orders of the Engineer in charge in the course of his inspections of the work. Before a trench is filled in, the timber to be buried is measured. The object of burying the timber is to ensure safe consolidation and to prevent subsidence and consequent damage to water, gas, and electric mains, sewers, &c., in close proximity to the trench and also to buildings in narrow lanes.

(4) During the three years, 1922 to 1924, Rs. 475·28 has been credited to the Drainage Engineer's special advance account and Rs. 110·40 to miscellaneous revenue, a total of Rs. 585·68, on account of timber found unserviceable and sold as firewood.

(5) The Storekeeper is the responsible officer who supervises and checks the weighing of timber by coolies on its issue as firewood. He also keeps a record of the sizes of the timber with the weights. This information is sent to the Drainage Engineer on a duplicate "Return to Store Note."

(6) It is the practice for the Drainage Engineer, in preparing an estimate for a particular work, to take into consideration the amount of available timber in stock.

(7) The officer who prepared the estimate for 18th lane, Wellawatta, is on leave. He, however, informed the Chairman that in preparing this estimate he provided for new timber, because this was the first of a series of similar works on the Wellawatta lanes under a lump vote of Rs. 50,000. He, therefore, proposed to start this series of works with new timber which would be reserved for them alone, and used in the various lanes in turn, only the proportionate amount of depreciation being ultimately charged to each job. This would prevent delay and interference with other works in progress.

(8) The cost of timber in the estimate dated January 26, 1925, for the proposed sewer in 18th lane, Wellawatta, is not Rs. 12,237·50, but Rs. 4,767 and in the estimate dated March 10, 1925, for the proposed sewer in Frances road, Wellawatta, is not Rs. 9,055·20 but Rs. 1,507. The timber provided for in 18th lane is new timber calculated to suffice for working 300 feet of trench at one time. Any timber still serviceable on the completion of 18th lane will be used in Frances lane, or whichever road is next taken up and its value at the time credited to the former estimate and debited to the latter. Should it be found that this timber is sufficient, it will not be necessary to buy the further timber provided for in the latter estimate and there will then be a saving of this amount. Owing, however, to the proximity of boundary walls to the trench in 18th lane, it may be necessary to bury a certain amount of the timber, in which case it will be necessary to buy more, and, therefore, provision has been made to meet this contingency. Similarly, the value of the timber left over after completing Frances lane will be credited to that estimate and debited to the next lane taken up.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 9 (inclusive) on the agenda. Mr. H. L. De Mel, seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

(a) To acquire the land and buildings for the south road, Rs. 39,000; (b) To acquire the land and buildings for the North road and Cross road and the square block lying south of the junction of them, Rs. 30,000. Total, Rs. 33,751·85.

*Note.*—A sum of Rs. 50,000 is provided under vote I. 88, in the 1925 Budget. Estimate of Rs. 12,237·50 had already been sanctioned in connection with the drainage of 18th lane. If all the estimates submitted above are sanctioned, a balance of Rs. 4,010·65 will be left over.—Recommended that the estimates be approved and that the work be undertaken in the following order:—Mary's road, Ridgeway place, Charlemont road, Alexandra road, Frances road, unless there be any reason on engineering grounds why the order should be changed.

(9) To consider the correspondence with regard to the question of feeding of poor school children.—Recommended that Rs. 500 a month be placed at the disposal of the Education District Committee, Colombo Municipal area, up to the end of the year for the purpose of feeding the children in Dematagoda, Maligakanda, and Green street schools, and that the Committee be required to submit a monthly statement showing the number of children fed and the expenditure incurred.

With regard to item No. 9 (corresponding to item No. 26 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of April 22, 1925), it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted and that a further sum of Rs. 500 be voted towards the cost of equipment.

The gratuity is based on the average monthly pay of Rs. 18·69 and his service of 134 months.—Recommended.

(26) To consider the correspondence with regard to the question of feeding of poor school children.—Recommended that Rs. 500 a month be placed at the disposal of the Education District Committee, Colombo Municipal area, up to the end of the year for the purpose of feeding the children in Dematagoda, Maligakanda, and Green street schools, and that the Committee be required to submit a monthly statement showing the number of children fed and the expenditure incurred.

(28) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer, dated April 18, 1925, with regard to aided drainage and recommending that a further sum of Rs. 50,000 be set apart for the purpose of making advances to the poor rate-payers to instal house drainage.—Recommended.

(29) To consider the correspondence with regard to the piece of Municipal Council's land, No. 26, Panchikawatta, sold to Mr. B. L. M. Haniffa.—Recommended that the land be sold by public auction.

(30) To consider two memoranda of the Municipal Treasurer with regard to leave to Mr. T. D. G. Vincent, Assistant Storekeeper, recommending that Mr. Vincent be granted further half-pay leave from November 13, 1924, to March 18, 1925, which, together with his previous half-pay leave, makes 6 months in all and that thereafter he should be placed on no pay up to September 25, 1925.—Recommended.

(31) To consider a report from the Municipal Treasurer, dated April 20, 1925, with regard to premises No. 12, Copiawatta, recommending that the sum of Rs. 45·70 due as rates to the end of the 1st quarter, 1925, be written off on grounds of extreme poverty.—Recommended.

(32) To consider—(a) A report of the Municipal Assessor, dated April 9, 1925, asking that peon Simeon of his Department, who was temporarily employed as from February, 1923, be confirmed in his post; (b) A memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer recommending that the post be created, as funds are provided in the 1925 Budget.—Recommended.

(33) To consider an application from the Municipal Treasurer for supplemental provision of Rs. 300 under vote D. 14, "Insurance of Municipal Buildings," as the vote of Rs. 5,000 is insufficient owing to the insurance, for the first time, of several buildings, e.g., Colpetty Market, Outbuildings New Town Hall, &c.—Recommended.

(34) To consider the applications received for the post of Prosecuting Surveyor, Private Building Branch, Municipal Engineer's Department.—Recommended that Mr. F. B. Vandersmagt be appointed on his present salary, with increments and travelling allowance attaching to the post of Prosecuting Surveyor.

#### Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 2, Mr. E. W. Jayewardene moved that the resignation of Mr. G. F. Lazenby as from July 7 next, be accepted. Mr. R. L. Pereira, in seconding the motion, expressed appreciation of Mr. Lazenby's services.—Carried.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene moved that, in this instance, the qualifications required by the Salaries Scheme of 1925, for the post of Assistant Municipal Treasurer be not insisted on. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that the matter of filling up of the vacancy be referred to the Finance Committee, as usual, and that applications for the post of Assistant Municipal Treasurer be called for from the Members of the Council's service only and that with regard to other appointment to fill the vacancies, permanent or temporary, consequent on the changes necessitated by the Municipal Treasurer going on leave, and on the Assistant Municipal Treasurer's resignation, applications should also be called for from outside the Council's service. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 12, the Chairman moved that the supplemental provision asked for be increased from Rs. 200 to Rs. 350 as the inquiry is still proceeding.—It was resolved that the supplemental provision of Rs. 350 be voted.

With regard to item No. 26, *vide* resolution of Council on page 166 of these Minutes in connection with the recommendation of item No. 9 of Sanitation Committee of April 20, 1925.

With regard to item No. 34, the Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be amended by the submission of the three following names:—(1) Mr. F. B. Vandersmagt; (2) Mr. S. T. Perera; (3) Mr. A. S. F. Fernando, with the special recommendation of Mr. F. B. Vandersmagt for the appointment.

It was resolved that Mr. F. B. Vandersmagt be appointed on his present salary, with increments and travelling allowance attaching to the post of Prosecuting Surveyor from the date of his assumption of duties.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

#### Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of April 25, 1925.

(2) To consider the following draft by-law proposed to be adopted in order to close Regent street to buses and lorries, under the provisions of section 18 (2) (j) of the Vehicles Ordinance No. 4 of 1916:—"The use of the road known as Regent's street between Dean's road and 3rd Division, Maradana, and of Norris Canal road between Regent street and 3rd Division, Maradana, by buses and motor lorries is hereby prohibited."—Recommended, and also Dean's road and Alexandra place from Foster lane to Rosmead place.

(3) To consider the question raised by Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E., M.M.C., in Council on March 4, 1925, regarding the framing of regulations for the storage of highly inflammable material in proximity to human dwellings.—Recommended that the storing of copra, wood, and timber, kapok, coconut oil be added to the dangerous trades in paragraph 4 of the by-laws dated March 4, 1925, under section 27 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended that by-laws, as suggested by the Superintendent of Fire Brigade, be framed.

(4) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer, dated March 24, 1925, suggesting that the rule 3 of the rules relating to dates of increments sanctioned by Council on November 5, 1924, be amended and a memorandum of the Chairman recommending that the following be substituted for rule 3:—

Rule 3.—(a) When an officer is promoted under section 20 of the Salary Scheme from one group to another group he shall receive the first increment of the scale in the new group on January 1, next, following such promotion.—Recommended with the substitution of the word "transferred" for "promoted" in first line and "transfer" for "promotion" in the last line of rule 3 (a).

(b) When an officer is promoted under section 21 of the Salary Scheme within a group, he shall receive the next increment of his new scale on January 1 next, following such promotion.—Rule 3 (b) recommended.

(5) To consider the following by-law, under the provisions of section 18 (2) (j) of the Vehicles Ordinance No. 4 of 1916 for the Municipal town of Colombo :—

“The use of the following roads—the part of 5th Cross street, Pettah, between Main street, and the motor bus stand in Gasworks street, and the part of the Kacheheri road between 5th Cross street and Gasworks street by motor buses is hereby prohibited.”—Recommended.

6. To consider the following by-law, under section 27 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 :—In any area declared to be a residential area :—(g) No building or premises shall be used for the treatment of tuberculosis.—Recommended that no building or premises within 50 yards of any other building or public thoroughfare shall be used as a hospital or nursing home or other institution for the housing and treatment of patients suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis, except such buildings or premises as are so in use when this by-law comes into force.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene moved that the Council do resume, and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted, as amended. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

Mr. R. L. Pereira, in Council, moved that the recommendation of the Law Committee, item No. 6, be adopted in place of the resolution on the subject by the Council in Committee. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene opposed the motion and suggested that the consideration of the matter be deferred.

The Hon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Law Committee be adopted, omitting the words “except such buildings or premises as are so in use when this by-law comes into force.” Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the remaining resolutions of Council in Committee and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The Council proceeded to elect by ballot Members for the following Standing Committees in place of Members who are absent from the Island :—

(10) Standing Committee on Municipal Works, in place of the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader. Dr. E. A. Coorey was declared elected.

(11) Standing Committee on Finance, in place of Mr. W. Philips. Mr. W. E. V. de Rooy was declared elected.

(12) To appoint a Member for the Special Committee regarding the building of the New Town Hall, in place of Mr. G. W. Dodds, resigned.

It was resolved that Mr. A. H. Morgan be appointed.

(13) To appoint a Member for the Special Committee regarding the proposed Free Public Library in place of Mr. Jos. I. Gnanamuttu, resigned.

It was resolved that the Rev. Father Y. M. Le Jeune, O.M.I., D.D., M.A. (Cantab), be appointed.

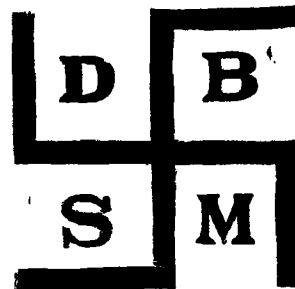
