VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1925.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

A new table (No. 2) is embodied for the first time in this report, showing by sex the deaths of residents and the births and deaths of children whose mothers were residents. The corresponding birth and infant death-rates corrected for non-residents should provide a more satisfactory index to the health conditions prevailing in the different towns than that afforded by the rates based on the total births and infant deaths, hitherto presented in Table I.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in the proclaimed towns numbered 405 (330 General, 6 Kandyan, and 69 Muslim), as against 319 in the preceding month and 340 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 157 (120 General and 37 Muslim), as against 118 in the preceding month and 120 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,991 (1,045 males and 946 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 37·64 per 1,000 of the population, as against 31·79 in the preceding month, 33·25 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·45 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The rate ranged from 17·04 in Trincomalee to 72·63 in Kegalla. There were 1,820 (952 males and 868 females) births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 34·40, and the rate ranged from 17·04 in Trincomalee to 58·31 in Kalpitiya and 66·55 in Lunugala.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 825 (427 males and 398 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 37·94 per 1,000, as against 31·28 in the preceding month, 29·89 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·60 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 12·76 in Kollupitiya to 36·34 in Wellawatta South. There were 719 (364 males and 355 females) births of children whose mothers were residents of the city equivalent to an annual rate of 33·06.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,992 (1,072 males and 920 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 37·65 per 1,000. The rate (exclusive of Lunugala) ranged from 78·95 in Kegalla to 15·53 in Ambalangoda. There were 1,554 (829 males and 725 females) deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 31·77, as against 30·86 in the preceding month, 34·86 in the corresponding month of last year, and 33·85 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The rate ranged from 100·00 in Lunugala and 58·68 in Anuradhapura to 14·14 in Kegalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 754 (418 males and 336 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 34·67 per 1,000. There were 649 deaths of town residents which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 34·37, as against 36·88 in the preceding month, 34·90 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·34 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The crude rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 32·68 in Katahena South to 12·76 in Kollupitiya.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 161 (87 males and 74 females), as against 138 in the preceding month.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 441 and corresponded to a rate of 274 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended January 31, 1925. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only, the rate was 221, as against 262 in the preceding month, 249 in the corresponding month of last year, and 256 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The deaths of children whose mothers were residents of towns amounted to 417 and corresponded to a rate of 229.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 172 and corresponded to a rate of 286 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended January 31, 1925. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 208, as against 300 in the preceding month, 234 in the corresponding month of last year, and 256 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. There were 166 deaths of children whose mothers were residents of towns, equivalent to a rate of 231.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under 1 year) caused 8 per cent.; *Convulsions*, 7 per cent.; *Phthisis*, 6 per cent.; *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, each 5 per cent.; *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 4 per cent.; *Prematurity*, *Enteritis*, and *Anchylostomiasis*, each 3 per cent.; *Bronchitis*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 2 per cent.; *Tetanus*, *Influenza*, and *Cancer*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused, 12 per cent. of the total deaths; *Phthisis* caused 10 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under 1 year), 9 per cent.; *Convulsions*, 7 per cent.; *Diarrhoea*, 5 per cent.; *Enteritis*, *Dysentery*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, each 4 per cent.; *Bronchitis*, 3 per cent.; *Prematurity* and *Enteric Fever*, each 2 per cent.; *Plague*, *Influenza*, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Cancer*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, each 1 per cent.

12. Six deaths from *Plague* (in Colombo) were registered, as in the preceding month, and against 42 in the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 180 cases were reported (129 in Colombo, 14 in Moratuwa, 10 in Galle); *Phthisis* followed with 150 cases (127 in Colombo, 9 in Galle); *Measles* 130 (98 in Colombo, 13 in Moratuwa); *Enteric* 77 (42 in Colombo, 13 in Galle, 8 in Moratuwa); *Continued Fever* 40 (34 in Colombo); *Mumps* 27 (18 in Colombo); *Dysentery* 6 (4 in Panadure and 2 in Kalutara); *Plague* 5 (in Colombo); *Diphtheria* 4 (3 in Colombo); *Whooping Cough* 4 (in Colombo); *Smallpox* 3 (in Colombo); *Cholera* 2 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Matale recorded the highest rainfall (14·53 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 12·54 in. in Badulla to 3·53 in. in Colombo.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 81·8° in Batticaloa to 56·8° in Nuwara Eliya, and 77·5° in Colombo.
