VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1925.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31–36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages:

2. The marriages of residents in the proclaimed towns numbered 316 (273 General, 2 Kandyan, and 41 Muslim), as against 462 in the preceding month and 378 in the corresponding month of last year. In Colombo the number of marriages was 140 (112 General and 28 Muslim), as against 159 in the preceding month and 137 in the corresponding month of last year.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,803 (936 males and 867 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 34·08 per 1,000 of the population, as against 36·81 in the preceding month, 30·31 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·59 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The rate ranged from 14·34 in Mullaittivu to 65·84 in Matale. There were 1,662 (859 males and 803 females) births of children whose mothers were residents of the towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 31·42 and the rate ranged from 14·34 in Mullaittivu to 59·99 in Matale.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 668 (352 males and 316 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 30·72 per 1,000, as against 40·73 in the preceding month, 26·39 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·10 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 10·87 in Kollupitiya to 35·12 in New Bazaar. There were 608 (319 males and 289 females) births of children whose mothers were residents of the city, equivalent to an annual rate of 27·96.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,707 (938 males and 769 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 32·26 per 1,000. The rate (exclusive of Lunugala) ranged from 114·75 in Hatton and Dikoya to 13·22 in Nuwara Eliya. There were 1,310 (705 males and 605 females) deaths of residents in the towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 26·78, as against 30·22 in the preceding month, 29·53 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29·24 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The rate ranged from 55·59 in Anuradhapura to 11·85 in Nuwara Eliya.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 632 (351 males and 281 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 29·06 per 1,000. There were 535 deaths (296 males and 239 females) of town residents which corresponded to an annual standardized rate of 28·33, as against 32·54 in the preceding month, 29·31 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·43 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The crude rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 30·23 in Kotahena South to 11·51 in Maradana South.

7. The stillbirths registered during the month numbered 121 (67 males and 54 females), as against 109 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The deaths of children under one year amounted to 390 and corresponded to a rate of 237 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1925. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 216, as in the preceding month, and against 226 in the corresponding month of last year, and 226 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. The deaths of children whose mothers were residents of towns amounted to 367 and corresponded to a rate of 221.

9. In the city of Colombo the deaths of children under one year numbered 161 and corresponded to a rate of 257 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1925. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 241, as against 191 in the preceding month, 247 in the corresponding month of last year, and 238 the average for the corresponding months since 1915. There were 153 deaths of children whose mothers were residents of the city equivalent to a rate of 252.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 14 per cent. of the total deaths were due. *Debility* (of children under one year) caused 8 per cent.; *Convulsions*, 7 per cent.; *Phthisis*, 6 per cent.; *Diarrhoea, Dysentery, and Enteritis*, each 4 per cent.; *Bronchitis, Malaria, and Malarial Cachexia, Anchylostomiasis, Bright's Disease and Nephritis, Enteric Fever, and Prematurity*, each 3 per cent.; *Puerperal Septicaemia and Influenza*, each 1 per cent.

11. In Colombo too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 12 per cent. of the total deaths; *Phthisis* caused 9 per cent.; *Debility* (of children under one year) and *Convulsions*, each 8 per cent.; *Bronchitis*, 7 per cent.; *Enteric Fever and Enteritis*, each 4 per cent.; *Dysentery and Diarrhoea*, each 3 per cent.; *Influenza, Anchylostomiasis, and Bright's Disease and Nephritis*, each 2 per cent.; *Plague*, 1 per cent.

12. Nine deaths from *Plague* (7 in Colombo and 2 in Kalutara), were registered. The number is the same as in the preceding month and the corresponding month of last year.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 490 cases were reported (361 in Colombo, 43 in Moratuwa); *Phthisis* followed with 109 cases (90 in Colombo, 9 in Galle); *Measles* 108 (81 in Colombo, 15 in Ratnapura); *Enteric Fever* 66 (47 in Colombo, 9 in Galle); *Continued Fever* 30 (17 in Colombo); *Mumps* 25 (17 in Kandy); *Smallpox* 14 (in Colombo harbour); *Plague* 10 (8 in Colombo and 2 in Kalutara); *Dysentery* 2 (in Kalutara and Panadure); *Diphtheria* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall*.—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (18·41 in.). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 13·96 in. in Tangalla to 2·81 in. in Batticaloa. Colombo recorded 7·33 in.

15. *Mean Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 82·6° in Mannar to 59·4° in Nuwara Eliya, and was 80·4° in Colombo.
